END OF TRAIL TERRITORIAL GOVERNORS MEETING

Coyote Calhoun presided over the meeting. Annabelle Bransford took minutes.

Power Factor Issue: Coyote Calhoun stated the Wild Bunch has not come to a decision about what to do regarding a Power Factor. Until there is an agreement, they will not publish a policy. The primary concern is with competitors shooting .32s at under 300 fps. This is not the Cowboy Way. At the same time, there is no desire to penalize those who need to shoot lighter loads due to health/physical reasons. Coyote Calhoun asked whether people would be opposed to establishing a minimum velocity and possibly a minimum bullet weight. He said if this is done, it would basically define a defacto minimum

power factor. The Wild Bunch has been chronographing and gathering data at major shoots and will look at all this information before a decision is made. There is no interest in driving members away. Any minimum velocity would be something low, perhaps as low as 500 fps.

J. T. Wild asked if this will be discussed at the TG Summit or if it will be decided at the Wild Bunch level. Coyote Calhoun stated most likely this will be decided at the Wild Bunch level. No matter what is decided, it will not be popular with some people.

Rattler John indicated it's not just the .32s. Many people using .38s shoot very light loads as well. Coyote Calhoun said they want to be fair across the board and not disenfranchise any calibers.

Coyote Calhoun again asked how many people would be opposed to having a minimum velocity. Only one person was opposed. The idea of establishing a minimum velocity was much more popular than a power factor.

Issues for possible discussion/vote at the TG Summit:

(1) Should the rules be changed to require Classic Cowboys to wear spurs and chaps, chinks, or botas and to drop the number of optional clothing items to three? This would take the classic townie and railroad guy

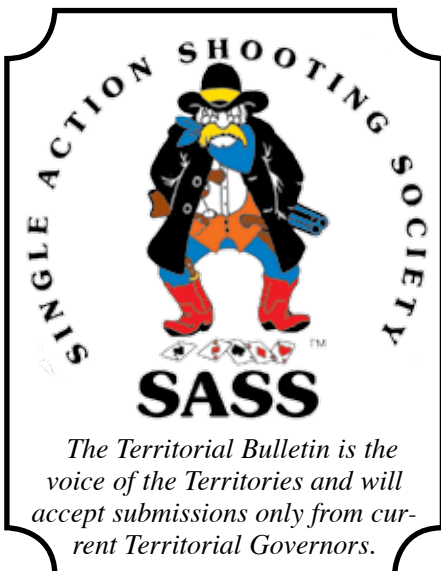
TERRITORIAL GOVERNOR'S SUMMIT

The annual SASS Territorial Governor Summit is just around the corner. It brings together representatives of SASS Affiliated Clubs from around the world to discuss and vote on issues concerning the sporting end of SASS, including proposed rule changes and modifications, national shooting programs and policies, shooting categories, membership concerns, and safety. The following is an outline of the procedures and schedules that will be followed this year:

- The Territorial Governor Summit will take place over a three-day period, Thursday through Saturday.
- The first two days will be devoted to open discussion of agenda items. Each agenda item will be addressed in order and allowed adequate time for discussion. The discussion periods will be limited to a maximum of three hours each day. The Summit Moderator will monitor the discussion to ensure the group stays on subject. Points not relative or pertinent to the agenda item will not be allowed.
- At the end of the second discussion session, voting issues will be confirmed and ballots handed out. Ballots must be returned to the Rivera Hotel West Registration Desk by 4:00

out of this category. This would be required for State and higher matches.

Snakebite asked if there were any perceived safety problems with spurs. Coyote Calhoun said he was not aware of any problems in the B-Western category, which is the only category that currently requires them. Dirty Bob said he saw nothing wrong with the proposal but wondered about requiring four, rather than three, additional items.

Coyote Calhoun called for a Straw Vote on whether to change Classic Cowboy to reduce the number of optional clothing items needed and to require chaps and spurs. This passed with a majority indicating approval. A question was raised as to whether lace-up boots should be eliminated in Classic Cowboy. It was noted if the requirement for boots is changed, it would need to be changed in the Shooters Handbook so everyone knows. Coyote Calhoun said this would be left on the agenda for a vote at the TG Meeting in December.

(2) Should the rules for minor safeties be changed to allow one PER FIREARM per stage, rather than only one safety per stage? This would mean shooters could earn up to four safeties per stage. One of the main issues seemed to be with the situation arising when a shooter loads too many rounds in his firearm, putting himself in a position of “double jeopardy.”

Snakebite said we should be able to address the issue regarding how many rounds are loaded by having good loading officers. Pale Wolf said he was in favor of allowing one safety per firearm. J. T. Wild was in favor of only one safety per stage. He thinks most safeties happen to new shooters, and he does not want to scare them away by piling on penalties. Wild Colt Kate said she felt if someone made two separate mistakes with their firearms, we should not cut them any slack since safety is priority #1. Shakey Shooter said if someone earns a penalty, they should get a penalty. Shenandoah said he did not think there was a safety issue if the shooter loaded too many rounds.

Coyote Calhoun called for a Straw Vote, asking how many people would be in favor of changing the rules to one minor safety per firearm per stage. Approximately 2/3 agreed with this. Coyote Calhoun then asked for a straw vote on how many people would be in favor of dropping the penalty for loading too many. This vote was split about 50-50.

(3) Should a stage start (i.e., the shooter be committed) when the timer goes off rather than when the first round goes downrange? Coyote Calhoun explained the intent of the original rule for restarts. It was supposed to be for equipment problems, but it has been noted some people are abusing this and asking for a restart simply because

they fumble their shotgun shells or whatever.

Diamond Dick said he feels once a shooter indicates ready, they should be committed. Tex asked what happens if a shooter does not hear the buzzer. Someone else asked about instances when the shooter is not given a proper “Standby” before the beep. Further discussion ensued. Coyote Calhoun said if a change is made to start the stage when the timer sounds, there should be a caveat of “as long as the shooter is properly started.” Quick Cal said we need to draw a definitive line. If the shooter makes a move towards engaging the stage, then he should be committed. Twin noted ROs should not give the ‘Standby’ and the buzzer at the same time (faulty start). Coyote Calhoun said the timer operator should acknowledge back to the shooter he knows the shooter is ready to start the stage. J. T. Wild noted sometimes shooters jump the buzzer. Hipshot said the RO should not let this happen. Coyote Calhoun restated—the whole idea is if the problem is mechanical (equipment failure), they should be given a restart.

A Straw Vote was held asking how many people would be in favor of having the shooter committed to the stage (no alibi) once the timer sounds with a caveat that the shooter is started properly? Approximately ¾ agreed. Wording of the caveat will be determined at the TG Summit.

(4) Should the required shot size be changed? Currently the rules require #4 or smaller. It has been noted that most people use 7 ½ shot.

The question of reclaimed shot was raised. Diamond Dick said he thought this was best left alone. If a particular range has a different shot size requirement, so be it.

A Straw Vote was held asking how many people would be in favor of changing the required shot size. Everyone

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felt that this should be left "as is." This will not be put on the agenda for the TG Summit.

(5) Should a long-range optical sight category be established for side matches? This would be a new category following NRA rules except for the gun weight. Hipshot showed an example of an optical sight on a Marlin. This would be one category for now, but could later be broken down into lever versus single shot categories if enough people are interested.

Snakebite noted optical sights are currently allowable in the Open Category, but he still thinks having a specific optical sight category is a good idea. Happy Jack thinks this is good idea, especially for long-range single shot, if it makes people happy, but he does not think it is necessary.

A Straw Vote was held asking how many people would be in favor of adding a long-range optical sight category for side matches. This was approved.

Open Discussion:

T. A. Chance said the Shooters Handbook currently says Classic Cowboy attire must be worn appropriately. It does not say this for B-Western. He feels we should add this language for B-Western as well. Coyote Calhoun said he can add this verbiage without requiring a vote.

Dirty Bob said the Shooters Handbook says Classic Cowboy and B-Western attire should be worn all the time. Coyote Calhoun clarified this, stating this refers to during SHOOTING time, i.e., any time on the range during any kind of shooting activity (warmup, side matches, main match), as well as at the awards ceremony.

Twin asked why you can have a live round in a pistol when you get to the unloading table without incurring a penalty but not a round in the rifle or a hull in the shotgun. Coyote Calhoun said each type of firearm is different and needs to be considered differently in this regard. In the case of a pistol, the RO really should clear the live round on the line to determine whether the round is under the hammer or not. Arizona Ranger noted usually the shooter will be asked to hand off the gun, so it would not be possible to clear it on the line. Coyote Calhoun said if this happens, the RO should go to the unloading table with the shooter to check the location of the live round and should not allow the shooter to clear the gun on his own.

Manatee noted Blackpowder Gunfighter is becoming popular. He asked if there had been any discussion about adding any more categories. Coyote Calhoun said Regional or State shoots have the option of adding new categories if they want to, but that right now, no other SASS categories are planned.

TERRITORIAL GOVERNOR SUMMIT AGENDA

1. Change Classic Cowboy to require Chaps and Spurs at all times and drop the other clothing requirements to three choices.
2. As of now you may get as many Minor Safeties as you incur. Change the rules to limit Minor Safeties to one per firearm.
3. As of now you are not committed to the stage until the first round goes down range. Change the rule to read a shooter, if properly started, is committed to the stage once the timer sounds.
4. The largest maximum shot size allowed is a #4. Change the maximum shot size to a #7½ .
5. Proposed New Long Range Optical Category with rules as follows:
 - (a) No length or power limitation on the scope. Scope tube body to be ¾" or less in diameter and any ocular or objective lenses, adjusting or assembly rings to be less than 1" in diameter.
 - (b) No internal scope adjustments for windage or elevation.
 - (c) Mounts are to be of a traditional style of the period, and contain the windage and elevation adjustments for the scope in either, or both, the front or rear mounts. No click adjustments in the mount. Either dove tail mounting or scope block mounting is allowed.

Original scope mounts of either the Cataract or Malcom style or variations thereof, or replicas or derivative conforms to the criteria of paragraph (c) above."

This rule matches exactly with the NRA Rifle Silhouette Rules. March 2005.

Discussion Items

- Proposal to create a SASS sanctioned "Blackpowder / Frontier Cartridge Gunfighter" shooting category.
Said category would follow the equipment and ammo guidelines of the current "Frontier Cartridge" category AND follow the shooting style requirements of the current "Gunfighter" Category.
- Boots - Will we ever stop arguing about them.
- Should we allow 22 caliber Pocket Pistols?
- Should the Beretta Laramie be allow to be shot in the Traditional Category?

Winter Range March 15, 2007

Presiding: Coyote Calhoun

- END of TRAIL in June still needs Range Officers, see Hipshot.
- Buffalo Stampede and New Mexico State Championship will be at Founders Ranch in April.

Agenda item: Change Classic Cowboy to require chaps and spurs at all times and drop the other clothing requirements to three choices.

Straw vote was about even

Agenda item: Minor Safeties should be limited to one per firearm. As of now you may get as many Minor Safeties as you incur.

Discussion: Cody Conagher, limit one per firearm. Solomon Star, bullet should clear gun. JT Wild, limit one per firearm.

Straw vote: Majority voted to limit one per firearm.

Agenda item: Should the stage start when the timer sounds? As of now you are not committed to the stage until the first round goes down range.

Discussion: Pecos Clyde, don't need any new rules. Tex, restart the shooter only if RO stops shooter. San Juan, sees restarts often. Two Dot, has seen restart only once. Irish Thunder, this is like an honor society, there should be no cheating. Ole Deadeye, saw 12 restarts on his posse. Lineas A Puffbuster, rule needs to be adjusted. Ol #4, don't make hard, fast rule. Lassiter, here to have fun, don't make more rules.

Straw vote: Majority voted to leave it like it is.

Agenda item: Proposed New Long Range Optical Category.

Verbiage from NRA Rifle Silhouette Rules (March 2005) (This is an exact quote)

“(b) No length or power limitation on the scope. Scope tube body to be $\frac{3}{4}$ ” or less in diameter and any ocular or objective lenses, adjusting or assembly rings to be less than 1” in diameter.

(c) No internal scope adjustments for windage or elevation.

(d) Mounts are to be of a traditional style of the period, and contain the windage and elevation adjustments for the scope in either, or both, the front or rear mounts. No

click adjustments in the mount. Either dove tail mounting or scope block mounting is allowed.

Original scope mount of either the Cataract or Malcom style or variations thereof, or replicas or derivative conforms to the criteria of paragraph (d) above.”

Discussion: Cody Conagher, no advantage over iron sights. TJ Wild, would rather see another shooting category rather than another long range category.

Straw vote wasn't taken.

Agenda item: Power Factors - can of worms

Discussion: Pecos Clyde, will it outlaw .32's? Coyote Calhoun responded the Wild Bunch does not want to penalize .32's. Cody Conagher, older guns were so sloppy they varied in velocity a lot. Rowdy Yates, minimum velocity would create a rush to smaller caliber. Ol #4, how about blackpowder? Coyote Calhoun responded, just smokeless. San Juan, no rule, low velocity just hurts yourself. J T Wild, don't we use power factor, weight x velocity = cowboy minimum? Tex, set minimum for safety – but give hits a hit, and a bonus if you knock a reactive target down. O Bar Freddie shoots .32's 78 grs at 600 fps because 115 grs at 800 fps high power loads hurt too much.

NO decision was made, more information is needed.

Discussion item: limit shotgun to #7 $\frac{1}{2}$ shot instead of #4's .

Discussion: Most agrees it need to be left alone.



The Shootout At Mule Camp

May 24, 2007

Coyote Calhoun presided over the meeting.

Agenda item: Power Factors - can of worms?

There was much discussion on this item. Some in favor some not. Two straw poles were taken.

All but one TG said, it is not broke so don't fix it. All were apposed to a minimum velocity.

Agenda item: Change Classic Cowboy to require Chaps and Spurs at all times and drop the other clothing requirements to three choices.

TGs were split on adding any new requirements to Classic Cowboy but all were in favor of no lace up boots.

Agenda item: Minor Safeties should be limited to, one per firearm. As of now you may get as many Minor Safeties as you incur.

Good discussion on this item, all were in favor of one minor safety per stage.

Agenda item: Should the stage start when the timer sounds? As of now you are not committed to the stage until the first round goes down range.

Discussion was centered around a lot of what if's. The majority voted to leave it like it is.

Agenda item: Should we change the maximum SASS legal shot size from 4 to 7 1/2.

Little discussion, the majority voted to change to 7 1/2.

Agenda item: Proposed New Long Range Optical Category.

Verbiage from NRA Rifle Silhouette Rules (March 2005) (See page 5 this document)

Again there was little discussion; the majority had no opposition to creating the new category.

Open Discussion:

There was a discussion on footwear, recoil, and other issues with no conclusions.



The Great Nor'easter

July 26, 2007

Capt. Morgan Rum presided over the meeting.

Agenda item: Change Classic Cowboy to require Chaps and Spurs at all times and drop the other clothing requirements to three choices.

Governors in attendance were unanimous in suggesting that the Classic Cowboy requirements be left as they are now.

Agenda item: Minor Safeties should be limited to, one per firearm. As of now you may get as many Minor Safeties as you incur.

Consensus was that safeties should be limited to one per firearm to avoid double jeopardy.

Agenda item: Should the Stage start when the timer sounds? As of now you are not committed to the stage until the first round goes down range.

Governors were evenly split between leaving things as they are and changing to the shooter being committed to the stage when the timer sounds.

Agenda item: Change shot size from 4 to 7 1/2 .

Most felt that a smaller shot size might reduce the potential for splatter to be injurious to the shooter or posse members.

Agenda item: Power Factors – Can of Worms

Consensus was that unless the Wild Bunch was committed to changing the current ammo guidelines to include a minimum, things are better left alone.

Agenda item: Proposed New Long Range Optical Category

Verbiage from NRA Rifle Silhouette Rules (March 2005) (See page 5 this document)

All in attendance were OK with adding the optical long range rifle category as written.

Proposal to create a SASS sanctioned "Frontier Cartridge Gunfighter" shooting category.

Said category would follow the equipment and ammo guidelines of the current "Frontier Cartridge" category AND follow the shooting style requirements of the current "Gunfighter" Category.

Governors in attendance were unanimous in agreement that the "Frontier Cartridge Gunfighter" category should become a SASS sanctioned shooting category.



Guns of August

August 9, 2007

Highweeds presided over the meeting.

Agenda item: Change Classic Cowboy to require chaps and spurs.

- Straw vote was 10-1 to leave as is.
- Heat is an issue wearing chaps

- Originally called Classic not Classic Cowboy. No official change of category name.

- Good category for shooting the bigger calibers

Agenda item: Minor safeties limited to one per firearm.

- Unanimous vote to go to one per firearm.

Agenda item: Should the stage start when the timer sounds?

- Unanimous vote to leave this alone.
- It is not a problem
- R.O. can address if it becomes a problem

Agenda item: Change shot size from 4 to 7 ½

- Not necessary.
- Clubs usually control shot size

Agenda item: Power factors

- Leave it alone
- Cannot police this easily

Agenda item: Proposed new long range category

- 8-3 against adding category
- Clubs can offer it if they want

Agenda item: Frontier Cartridge Gunfighter

- 7-4 in favor of adding it.

Discussion Items:

- Footwear – Should Classic Cowboy wear boots and not lace ups? Suggestion was offer to require 1 ½ inch heels regardless of what boot is worn. There is a need to address footwear better in rule book and not R.O. manual. Request this issue of footwear be put on Las Vegas agenda.

- Discussed TG voting at Las Vegas. The agenda items should not change at Summit because it puts TG's in a bind in voting their club's wishes. Others said discussion and changes were a necessary part of the voting process.

- It was felt that there is a problem with things being moved from the rule book to the R.O. I book. This creates confusion as to what the rules really are. There was a suggestion that the R.O. 1 book become the official rule book.

- Rules committee decisions should be voted on by the TG's for approval.



Rocky Mountain Regional Raid

July 26, 2007

Action and Mounted Meeting

Agenda item: Change Classic Cowboy to require chaps and spurs at all times and drop the other clothing requirements to three choices. Vote: 3 No, 2 Abstain. Discussion: This would eliminates some shooters (Town's people). There are too many categories. Rules should be simpler. Spurs could be a safety issue.

Agenda item: Minor Safeties should be limited to, one per firearm. As of now one may earn as many-Minor Safeties as you incur. Vote: 4 Yes, 1 No. Discussion: How many minors to make a major (three to a match). How about a requirement to shoot four stages before new shooter can do a full match?

Agenda item: Should the Stage start when the timer sounds? As of now you are not committed to the stage until the first round goes down range. Vote: 2 Yes, 3 No. Discussion: Leave it alone.

Agenda item: Change shotgun shot size from 4 to 7 1/2. Vote: 5 Yes

Agenda item: Power Factors. Vote: 1 Yes, 4 No. Discussion: Need something concrete to work with, what are minimum or maximum. Nightmare to enforce.

Agenda item: Proposed New Long-Range Optical Category. Vote: 3 Yes, 2 No. Discussion: Restrict power to be more period correct.

Agenda item: Mounted Shooting Clothing Requirements. Submit to Advisory Committee in Las Vegas at the Convention.

Open Discussion: Clean up rules (be more specific). Ear protection should be mandatory. Port Arms definition needs work. How about allowing .22 caliber Pocket Pistols?



MODIFICATION COMMITTEE REPORT

Beretta Laramie Revolvers

A question was raised about the status of Beretta's new Laramie revolver. It is essentially a replica of a SW #3. Beretta's design added a limited amount of lateral

adjustment to the rear latch mounted sight to compensate for the fact that POI can not be adjusted due to the fixed barrel design of the SW Model 3. This minor adjustment and a required top mounted safety appear to be the only deviations from the original design. The Mods committee is in agreement that the Laramie is a legitimate replica of the SW model 3, but the rear sight adjustment puts the gun into the Modern Category. The fact that the barrel can not be twisted to allow for POI adjustments

could be a viable reason to allow an exemption for the gun to be used in the Traditional Category, such as the Open top frames. This, of course, is a decision for the TGs to make, not the Mods committee. At the present time, the Beretta Laramie is a SASS legal revolver, but only in the categories that allow modern sights.

Ruger Montado Revolver

Ruger's web site describes the Ruger Vaquero Montado as a single action revolver designed to meet the needs of the cowboy mounted shooter. It is basically a Ruger Vaquero with a 3 3/4 inch barrel, a low, wide hammer spur like a Bisley model, and a grooved grip frame. This is indeed a revolver designed for mounted shooting and legal for SASS Mounted Shooting but it is *not legal for SASS Action Shooting*.
