THE 2006 TERRITORIAL GOVERNORS SUMMIT

The SASS Territorial Governor Summit has been a huge success since its inception, in 1999. It has brought together representatives of SASS Affiliated Clubs from around the world to discuss and vote on issues concerning the sporting end of SASS, including proposed rule changes and modifications, national shooting programs and policies, shooting categories, membership concerns, and safety. This year will be no exception. The following is an outline of the procedures and schedule that will be followed this year:

- The Territorial Governor Summit will take place over a four-day period, Thursday through Sunday.
- The first two days will be devoted to open discussion of agenda items. Each agenda item will be addressed in order and allowed adequate time for discussion. The discussion periods will be limited to a maximum of three hours each day. The Summit Moderator will

monitor the discussion to ensure the group stays on subject. Points not relative or pertinent to the agenda item will not allowed.

- At the end of the second discussion session, voting issues will be confirmed and ballots handed out. Ballots must be returned to the Rivera Hotel West Registration Desk by 4:00 P.M. Friday.
- The first order of business Saturday morning will be Committee Meeting Reports. This will take approximately an hour. After the Committee Meeting Reports we are planning a Rules Clarification and Refresher Course. This will be an

open session, in which we will discuss rule clarifications and interpretations. We have several rules where interpretations widely vary, and we will be correcting this. This should be a very interesting session, and you will not want to miss it.

- Votes will be tabulated for distribution Sunday morning. Voting issues that receive a two-thirds or better majority vote are binding. Voting issues that receive between one-half and two-thirds vote will be sent out for ratification to all Territorial Governors. After the vote discussion there will be a discussion of items from the floor.

SASS INDOOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP OF COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING

DECEMBER 7, 8 & 9, 2006

THE MATCH:

The SASS Indoor World Championship of Cowboy Action Shooting™ is a three-day, nine-stage shooting competition to be held December 7-10, 2006 in Las Vegas' Riviera Hotel during the 5th Annual SASS Convention and Wild West Christmas. Competitors will shoot provided firearms and wax bullets at steel targets in a variety of Cowboy Action Shooting™ scenarios. Competitors will be assigned to posses that will shoot in one of three shifts beginning on Thursday, December 7—early morning, late morning, or afternoon. Shifts are designated as Red, White, and Blue, and each competitor will

shoot three consecutive stages per day, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday. Awards will be presented Sunday at the Convention Hall Stage.

Red - 8:30 - 10:30 a.m.

White - 10:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m.

Blue - 1:30 p.m. - 3:30 p.m. -

Switching or combining slots is NOT permitted.

The match is limited to the first 150 shooters.

SASS RULES APPLY

- You must be a registered SASS Convention Conventioneer
- You must be a SASS Member in good standing

TG SUMMIT 2006 TERRITORIAL GOVERNORS MEETING AGENDA

1) Should the Uberti 1873 percussion revolver be allowed as a Frontiersman Category revolver?

This was miss-worded last year and is being voted on again. It was voted on in previous years as a legal main match revolver but not as a Frontiersman Category legal revolver.

2) Should the Senior and Elder Statesman Categories be divided into smaller divisions by dividing both by age: 60 to 65, 66 to 72, and 73 and up?

This would accomplish dividing both categories and creating only one new category.

3) Should we adopt the following Stage Conventions and document them in the SASS Match Directors Guide?

It is time we addressed a standard in "Understood Stage Behavior." A set of Stage Conventions are a list of standards every shooter is expected know and follow on every stage. These conventions are not "rules" since they can be over-ridden by stage design. They are the standard defaults when nothing is specified. They are as follows:

STAGE CONVENTIONS

Unless stated otherwise in stage descriptions, all of the following applies in SASS matches:

1. All knockdown shotgun targets may be reengaged until down.
2. All knockdown targets (shotgun, rifle, or revolver) must go down to count.
3. All staged guns shall have their barrels pointed safely down range and, where possible, all long guns staged horizontally shall be staged where no part of the firearm hangs over the edge.
4. Staged shotguns shall be open and empty.
5. Shooters may not start a stage with ammunition in hand.
6. Long guns shall be discarded open and empty with their barrels pointed safely down range.
7. Revolvers shall be returned to leather after the shooting string.
8. Revolvers shall be drawn and used in accordance with the shooter's category.
9. Safe gun handling is the shooter's responsibility. The 170-degree safety rule is in

effect. The basketball traveling rule is in effect when there is a live round under the hammer.

10. If no starting position is given, the shooter shall stand fully erect with revolvers holstered, hands at his/her side, not touching any firearm.
11. Cowboy port arms is defined as the butt of the long gun at or below the waist of the shooter, the muzzle at or above the shoulder, and the long gun held with both hands.
12. Interpersonal Conflicts **WILL NOT** be tolerated at this event.

4) Should we outlaw all short and long sleeve tee shirts and tank tops in all categories?

Note: Short sleeve blouses would remain acceptable only in ladies categories.

5) Should we change the penalty for shooting out of category as follows?

- **First offense in a match is a Procedure Penalty.** The shooter must subsequently comply with the category requirements or change category.
- **Second offense in the same match is a Stage Disqualification.**
- **Third offense in the same match is a Match Disqualification?**

At the present time the penalty for shooting out of category is a procedure for each stage the shooter violates the rule. This includes, but is not limited to, not wearing the specified number of items in Classic Cowboy, not making enough smoke in the blackpowder categories, and shooting with a two handed grip in a Duelist category

6) Should we make the following changes in our scoring processes for both time and rank scored matches?

- **Match Disqualification**
Eliminate the shooter from ALL AWARDS. All times are erased.
- **Stage Disqualification**
Shooter is given a disqualification for the stage only. Shooter can overcome the penalty and may win a category award over another shooter.

• Did Not Finish

Disregard overall scores so the shooter cannot finish in front of anyone who shoots all the stages. Does not affect other potential awards such as stage wins.

These following items were discussed at Regional and state Territorial Governor Meetings and were found to have no merit, therefore they will not appear on the TG Summit Agenda and will not be voted on.

- Should we re-instate the requirement of a "minimum velocity." If so, should this requirement of a minimum velocity be by caliber?
- Should all of the Traditional Shooting categories be allowed to use the Gunfighter Style when appropriate?
- Is it time to limit the number of shot shells a shooter can pull at one time regardless of what model shotgun they are using? Double barrel shotgun shooters are limited to pulling two shells, which already places the double barrel shooter at a disadvantage.
- Is it time to eliminate the Modern category?
Should we allow the use of .410 caliber or 28-gauge shotgun in the Senior or Elder Statesman Categories?

the Traditional Categories? An idea was discussed at the New England and Mid-West Regional Territorial Governors Meeting to make the Modern Category an open category in which all SASS legal firearms (Fixed or Adjustable Sighted) and ammunition can be used. Then, redefine the Traditional Category as a true "Traditional" Category, allowing only the traditional calibers of .25-20, .32-20, .38-40, .44-40, and .45 Colt. Ammunition could be smokeless or blackpowder. Revolvers would be limited to full-size fixed-sight handguns. Rifles and shotguns would be all SASS legal rifles and shotguns. There would be no clothing requirements other than the SASS minimum.

- In light of a recent accident, should we mandate all firearms remain on the loading table until the shooter is called to the shooting line or to the expeditor position?

Minutes from END of TRAIL 2006 Territorial Governors Meeting Wednesday, June 21, 2006 Belle Union Saloon 3:00 PM – 5:00 PM

There were 76 Territorial Governors present.

Coyote Calhoun opened the meeting by thanking all the Territorial Governors working as Range Officers. The items for discussion were:

1. Should the Senior Category be divided into smaller divisions?

A Territorial Governor stated he hosted a State Championship and split the Senior category in half. It was a big success.

The majority vote was in favor of dividing the Senior category.

2. Should we re-instate the requirement for a "minimum velocity?"

There was no discussion.

The majority vote was to leave the present non-rule alone.

3. Should all of the Traditional-style shooting categories be allowed to use the Gunfighter-style when appropriate?

The majority vote was no.

4. Is it time to limit the number of shot shells a shooter can pull at one time regardless of what model shotgun they are using?

There was no discussion.

Majority voted no.

5. Is it time to eliminate the Modern category?

Coyote Calhoun stated there are 36 shooting categories. The Modern category has dwindled in recent

years. The largest category at END of TRAIL is 49'er with 147 (Ladies 49'er total 50 and 49'er totaled 97 shooters) and Modern only 65 (Ladies Modern 19 and Modern 46 shooters).

A Territorial Governor stated, if we eliminate Modern, those 65 will move into the 49er category. Leave it alone.

Barkeeps stated he shoots Modern and likes it.

The majority vote ruled in favor of keeping the Modern category.

6. Is it time we addressed a standard in stage writing and a standard in "Understood Stage Behavior?" Should Stage Conventions be added in the SASS Shooters Handbook?

PROPOSED

STAGE CONVENTIONS

... or a few things you should know about every stage ...

1. *All knockdown shotgun targets may be reengaged until down.*
2. *All knockdown targets (shotgun, rifle, or revolver) must go down to count.*
3. *All staged guns shall have their barrels pointed safely down-range.*
4. *Staged shotguns shall be open and empty.*
5. *Shooters may not start a stage with ammunition in hand.*
6. *Long guns shall be discarded open and empty with their barrels pointed safely down range.*
7. *Unless otherwise stated, revolvers are returned to leather after the shooting string.*
8. *Revolvers are drawn and used in accordance with the shooter's category.*

9. *Safe gun handling is the shooter's responsibility. The 170-degree safety rule is in effect. When there is a live round under the hammer, the basketball traveling rule is in effect.*

10. *Where possible, all long guns shall be staged where no part of the firearm hangs over the edge.*

11. *Unless otherwise stated in the stage description, shooters shall start with revolvers holstered and hands not touching any firearm.*

12. *If no starting position is given, the shooter shall stand fully erect with hands at their side not touching revolvers.*

13. *Interpersonal Conflicts WILL NOT be tolerated at this event.*

Coyote Calhoun suggested adding Stage Conventions to the SASS Shooters Handbook. This issue sparked considerable discussion.

Defining port arms was left out of the list and is described as butt of long gun at or below the waist and muzzle at or above the shoulder. San Juan asked it also be defined as holding it with two hands.

The Elder Kate stated she wants to run the match the way she wants to. Coyote Calhoun stated we are not trying to tell you how to run your match. Any of these standard behaviors can be overridden by stage description. It may be best stated at the beginning of the list that "unless otherwise stated in the stage description one must adhere to the following:"

Questions from Territorial Governors: Stage Convention #1

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we pick up shotgun targets. Some did not like being able to pick up shotgun targets, but it was pointed out picking up a shotgun target is optional.

Stage Convention #10

This gave the impression to some TG's they would have to build boxes. Coyote Calhoun replied, absolutely not. This rule has been used at END of TRAIL for the last four years, and if the area was not long enough the long gun was staged safely with at least the back of the trigger guard staged on the table. It was also asked if this was to eliminate vertical staging of long guns? Coyote Calhoun answered "no." You can still vertically stage long guns, and this rule would only apply to horizontally staged long guns.

Stage Convention #12

San Quinton explained, the problem is people starting with their hands on the gun trying to find every loop hole in the stage. Coyote Calhoun stated this will give the shooter a starting place, unless otherwise stated in the stage description. One Territorial Governor suggested changing hand position to hat, not side.

The majority vote ruled in favor of the Stage Conventions to the SASS Shooters Handbook.

OPEN FLOOR

1. Propose only make rule changes once every two years.

A Territorial Governor asked, "does this mean the Territorial Governor Summit only be every two years?" This would not be feasible, Coyote Calhoun stated.

2. The question was asked as to why no penalties were specified for some infractions.

Coyote Calhoun stated the RO Committee has been working on correcting some of the omissions in the RO Materials.

3. It was suggested we shouldn't add a rule about taking one out.

Laughter from audience.

4. Shooters are looking less and less period correct, and the clubs are noticing less period clothing on ladies.

A Territorial Governor stated if a Match Director sees it to be a problem the Match Director needs to address it. Tex stated, we expect people to do it. There is no need for a penalty. Just tell them to fix it. A Territorial Governor stated

the problem needs to be solved at a local level, and it is a problem for both men and women.

5. Lobo Joe suggested rank points by category should be used to score major matches instead of overall.

Coyote Calhoun stated State and local Championships can score any way they wish. Regional officials voted to do all Regional Championships using overall rank. San Quinton stated State and Territorial Blackpowder Matches are rank scored by category. Categories are not equal.

6. Happy Jack stated shooter "restarts" are getting out of hand.

People are asking for too many and not giving good reasons. He stated he can't refuse. Coyote Calhoun stated you can request a restart, but you don't always have to give it. Happy Jack stated he thinks there needs to be a change in the rules. Coyote Calhoun stated he is not personally seeing the problem being abused. (Clapping hands) The Range Officer should notice the situation and correct it if abused.

7. A clarification was requested ... does the stage start when the trigger is first pulled, even if the round is a squib ... or not until the first round actually goes down range?

A reshoot is warranted until the first round actually goes down range. If the first round is a squib, the shooter gets a reshoot.

8. Gunfighter can shoot five and holster, then redraw and shoot five more.

Coyote Calhoun stated the Territorial Governors changed the Gunfighter rules at the last Summit. The Gunfighter may shoot five, place the revolvers on a safe place (i.e., table or bar), perform another sequence, and then pick the revolvers back up and shoot five more. There was some confusion at Mule Camp as to whether the Gunfighter could do this or it had to be written into the scenario. Coyote stated we don't have to tell the Gunfighter how to handle his guns. If there is a safe place to stage the revolvers, the Gunfighter makes up his own mind as to what works best for him.

9. Why can gunfighters set down two revolvers and then pick

them up, and you can't set down a long gun and pick it up?

Coyote answered revolvers and rifles are not the same. All three guns are different and rules that apply to revolvers do not apply to rifles or shotguns. All this information is in the SASS Shooter's Handbook.

10. When is the penalty assessed when an empty round is left on the carrier of a rifle or in a shotgun?

The penalty is a minor safety, and it is not assessed until you engage the next firearm.

11. If the shotgun is the last firearm, the Shooters Handbook says the shells are to be removed at the end of the string, is it alright once you get to the unloading table to still have a shell in your shotgun?

The answer is yes and no. We don't assess the penalty unless the next firearm or action is engaged, and since there are none in this case, the answer is no. But, the Handbook requires clearing after the string so we may have a conflict that needs resolving by the RO Committee.

12. If a shooter shoots their '97 shotgun and the shell does not come out, is it a malfunction?

If a malfunction is declared before the shotgun is put down, there is no call. If a malfunction is not declared and another firearm is discharged before the '97 is cleared, it is a minor safety. If the '97 is the last firearm used, and no malfunction has been declared, it will be the same case as the double barreled shotgun above. Need clarification in SASS Shooters Handbook. Coyote Calhoun will work on the clarification.

12. Should we have Senior categories for all categories? (e.g., senior gunfighter)

Coyote Calhoun stated we need numbers to justify.

SASS invited all SASS Mounted Club Presidents, Club Representatives, Territorial Governors, and Regulators to the Round Table Meeting at END of TRAIL. Others were invited to listen in on the discussion. The purpose of this meeting was to discuss the future of SASS Mounted Shooting.

Here's what was discussed:

The SASS National Mounted Shooting Program

SASS has over 500 affiliated clubs. 30 of these are Mounted Shooting clubs. The SASS Mounted Shooting program is not nearly as active as SASS' Action Shooting program even though SASS has made many efforts to enhance its Mounted Shooting program. In the past two years, SASS has bolstered its national Mounted Shooting program by requiring SASS Regional Action Championships to pursue Mounted Shooting. Many of the matches did so with varying results. For the past three years SASS has produced its National Mounted Championships during Winter Range, with this past year having more than 30 shooters. SASS continues to present the World Championship of SASS Mounted Shooting at END of TRAIL, this year hosting more than 60 shooters. SASS also encourages its State Championships to embrace Mounted Shooting and provides incentives for affiliated clubs that do.



New SASS Mounted Full-Time Staffer

SASS added a new staff member to work primarily with the mounted clubs and help build the program. *Aim Me Home* has already begun to help redesign the mounted club affiliation materials and put together our new SASS Mounted Shooting DVDs that will be available in the next few weeks. *Aim Me Home* can be reached Monday through Friday at the SASS office and can be e-mailed direct at aimme@sassnet.com.

Equestrian Event Insurance with Gillingham & Associates

SASS' policy covers any and all Mounted Shooting organization's events, including parades, exhibitions, practices, monthly matches, MSA, and CMSA events.

In light of recent developments in which some club insurance policies cover only the matches sponsored by an individual organization, SASS has developed a reasonable cost program that not only provides the basic liability coverage required for SASS Club Affiliation, but covers all equestrian shooting events. SASS has endorsed Gillingham & Associates Great Outdoor Insurance Program as a preferred insurance carrier for its Affiliated Clubs Program. The policies, which are written directly with each individual SASS Affiliated Club, will automatically make SASS additionally insured and cover both Action and Mounted Shooting activities regardless of which organization hosts its events. The new SASS Mounted Shooters Registry has 500 members and is growing daily. It is designed to inform Mounted Shooters from all organizations of news about Cowboy Mounted Shooting as it relates to SASS.

Territorial Governors

At last year's SASS Convention more than 250 Territorial Governors representing 450 clubs participated in the Territorial Governors Summit. Of those less than 10 were representing Mounted Shooting clubs. The participation among SASS Mounted Affiliated clubs' TGs is non-existent. SASS is exploring other avenues to stimulate communication between the clubs, and several ideas have been discussed. SASS will have meetings for Mounted Club affiliates at the 2006 SASS Convention, and these meetings will be open to all SASS Mounted Shooters. Governors will be recognized, but all can vote and the vote will count. Members are encouraged to attend and help by adding their opinions to the future of SASS Mounted Shooting. The 5th SASS Convention and Wild West Christmas takes place at the Riviera Hotel in Las Vegas, December 7-10, 2006.

SASS Mounted Shooting Advisory Board

SASS is in the process of creating a National Advisory Board for its Mounted Shooting program. This board will be given the task of presenting issues from their respective regions to

Coyote Calhoun opened the meeting with introductions and welcome to all.

- **Should we split the Senior Category?**
All were in favor of splitting the Category. Coyote introduce the idea of splitting both the Senior and the Elder Statesman Categories in thirds. (i.e., 60 to 66, 67 to 73, and 73 and above.) Most were in favor of this split.
- **Should we reinstate the minimum velocity rule? If so, should it be by caliber?**
NO. Most TG's have not seen a problem, and it would be too hard to enforce.
- **Should all of the Traditional style shooting categories be allowed to use the Gunfighter shooting style when appropriate?**
The answer was a resounding "NO."
- **Should we limit the number of shotgun shells a shooter can pull at one time?**
NO, HELL NO. Stage design can handle this.
- **Should we eliminate the Modern Category?**
The answer is NO. Captain Morgan Rum offered the idea to strengthen both the Modern and Traditional Categories by making changes in both. He suggested to change the Modern Category to allow all legal firearms, adjustable and non-adjustable sights, and all calibers. Then change the Traditional Category to a "Traditional Category" where the use of only traditional calibers is allowed (e.g., .32-20, .38-40, .44-40, .45 Colt). There was support for this change and some discussion of perhaps different shotguns being allowed in the new categories. This may be a good discussion topic for the Convention.
- **Should we adopt Stage Conventions?** (Printed elsewhere in this Bulletin.)
Most agree, there needs to be a standard if not spelled out in the stage description.
- **Should we allow Seniors and/or Elder Statesmen to use .410 caliber or 28-gauge shotguns?**
NO, HELL NO. Most feel 12-gauge shotguns can be loaded lighter.

August 10, 2006

Coyote Calhoun Presiding

Coyote Calhoun opened the meeting with introductions and welcome to all.

- **Should we split the Senior Category?**
All were in favor of splitting the Senior Category by age. Coyote introduced the idea of splitting both the Senior and the Elder Statesman Categories in thirds. (i.e., 60 to 66, 67 to 73, and 73 and above.) Most in attendance thought this would be a better alternative than just splitting the Senior Category in half.
- **Should we eliminate the Modern Category?**
The answer is NO, but there is some support for changing the Modern and the Traditional Categories. The suggestion was to change the Modern Category to allow all legal firearms, adjustable and non-adjustable sights, and all calibers. Then change the Traditional Category to a "Traditional Category" where the use of only traditional calibers is allowed (e.g., .32-20, .38-40, .44-40, .45 Colt). There was support for this change and some discussion of perhaps some different shotguns being allowed in the new categories.
- **Should we reinstate the minimum velocity rule? If so, should it be by caliber?**
NO, HELL NO. Most TG's have not seen a problem.
- **Should we limit the number of shotgun shells a shooter can pull at one time?**
NO, HELL NO. Stage design can handle this.
- **Should we adopt Stage Conventions?** (Printed elsewhere in this Bulletin.)
Most agree there needs to be a standard if not spelled out in the stage description. Some were concerned about the long gun staging.
- **Do we need to look at our scoring practices? If a person receives a Stage DQ should they be able to win their category?**
Most agree a Stage DQ should not be equated to a Match DQ, thus allowing a shooter to receive a Stage DQ and still be able to win their category. Should this also be the case with a DNF? Most felt that if you did not finish the match you should not be allowed to win.
- **Should we strengthen the penalty for shooting out of category?**
Now, the penalty for shooting out of category is a procedure. This includes not wearing the correct number of items in Classic cowboy, not making enough smoke in the black-powder categories, and shooting two handed in a Duelist category. After some discussion, most felt this should be changed to a procedure for the first offense, a Stage DQ for the second, and another Stage DQ, which would result in a Match DQ for the third offense. The shooter should be given the chance to change categories after the first



offense if they cannot comply with the requirements of the category they are in.

Other Discussion Items:

All of the Kentucky Territorial Governors have petitioned SASS to move to the Mid-West Regional—Guns of August. Both of the Regional Directors have agreed and SASS sees no reason not to accommodate the move. All were in favor.

Indy Kid asked if shooting blackpowder could be added as an option to the Classic Cowboy list of required items. Most did not see a problem.

There was a suggestion to open END of TRAIL's Bell Union earlier.

Several Canadian shooters asked if SASS could look into The Cowboy Chronicle postage rates, to see if some saving could be found in mailing The Cowboy Chronicle to Canada.

In light of the recent accident at the Illinois SASS State Championship, Knifemaker asked if we should consider leaving all guns (including revolvers) on the loading table until called to the line or to the Expediter Position? Several clubs are doing this now. This would take the temptation away from "fiddling" with the hammers on your pistols. All agreed this should be discussed.

- **Drop the Modern Category?**

Straw Poll was taken, and 50% of the TG's voted to drop the category.

- **Which should be used at state and Regional matches—rank points or overall time?**

The consensus was to let the clubs choose which scoring method they prefer to use.

- **How many shotgun shells can be held in hand during the course of fire?**

The unanimously consensus was this should not be regulated.

- **Are there were any problems with the 15 grains of blackpowder rule?**

Two TG's believe this is an issue, however the majority of TG's in attendance did not see a problem and will continue to enforce the 15-grain rule on the books.

- **Should the DQ forward rule be dropped in order to get more shooters to compete in the side matches prior to the main shoot events?**

Slowpoke WY mentioned the research he had done regarding the rule and the legality of allowing a shooter to compete in a main match after receiving a serious safety DQ from the side matches (e.g., dropped loaded firearm.) Slowpoke recommended the rule stay in effect throughout the event to protect range insurance.

- **Should the 5-second miss penalty be increased to**

7.5 seconds?

Why? Who knows, but the TG's in attendance shot it down.

- **What can be done to promote more junior and buckaroo shooters?**

All the governors in attendance agreed we need to recruit more young shooters, and some are currently making efforts toward this goal. SASS should be encouraged by all governors in this endeavor.

There was a lengthy discussion regarding the Blackpowder Standard. Bullet weight makes a difference. There were several shooters challenged during the Blackpowder Shootout today, and four of the six failed to make enough smoke. The standard is working.

There also was a lengthy discussion of the new rule that allows Gunfighters to lay their revolvers down in a safe place while continuing with another firearm and then coming back to them. The confusion was whether the Gunfighter could do it when he wanted to or only if the Match Director or stage description specifically allowed it. It was clarified, the Gunfighter makes the decision to place his/her revolvers down safely, and it is not mandated by the Match Director.

TERRITORIAL GOVERNORS MEETING Smoke in the Valley 2006

Presiding: Hipshot

In attendance: T.A. Chance, Dirty Bob, Adobe Walls Shooter, Texas Dude, Wrangel, More or Les, Pecos Clyde, Ole Dead Eye, and Rattler John

• **Should the Seniors Category be broken into smaller divisions?**

There was considerable positive discussion regarding adding Senior Categories, but not splitting the category we now have by age.

• **Should we re-instate the requirement of a “minimum velocity?” If so, should this minimum velocity requirement be by caliber?**

The general feeling was “Absolutely not!”

• **Should all of the Traditional Shooting categories be allowed to use the Gunfighter Style when appropriate? At present the “B-Western” category is the only category in which shooters may use all shooting styles: Traditional, Gunfighter, and Duelist.**

Simple answer, “NO.”

• **Is it time to limit the number of shot shells a shooter can pull at one time regardless of what model shotgun they were using? Double barrel shotgun shooters are limited to pulling two shells, which already gives the double barrel shooter a disadvantage.**

Absolutely Not

• **Is it time to eliminate the Modern category? While at one time there was a need to protect the non-adjustable sight revolvers, it is no longer the case. If we did this we would need to allow adjustable sights on revolvers in most categories.**

The consensus was leave the category alone, it's not broken.

• **We discussed Stage Conventions included in the Smoke in the Valley Shooters Program and considered adopting these conventions as a standard in stage behavior.**

There was good discussion on this, and all were in favor of adding these conventions to the Match Directors guide to Stage Design or Match Administration.

Additional suggestions pointed out that items 12 and 13 in the Smoke in the Valley program were redundant. Another suggestion for a start position was to have the shooter start with hand on six-gun, thus ensuring the shooter has a firm safe grip.

Open Discussion Items

- T.A. Chance initiated a discussion regarding footwear for the Classic Category. He suggested a term such as “*non-grip enhancing*” be used in the Handbook and possibly adding an example, such as Ariat soles. All seemed to agree. (This could probably be a Committee clarification.)
- Rules are for everybody, and should apply uniformly at all times. (This was specifically targeting Chiz, as his dogs were never leashed.)
- The discussion came up again about rank scoring within category, and how a DQ would affect a smaller category.
- A question came up about Modern Sights in the Frontiersman Category. The current Handbook states “any main match percussion revolver.” (This may need clarification, but is actually covered.)
- Use of a single shot shotgun has been omitted from the current Handbook.

- Entry Fee is \$90 and includes all ammunition and firearms.

SHOOTING CATEGORIES

The SASS Indoor Cowboy Action Shooting™ World Championship is open to all smokeless, non-modern categories only—Traditional, Ladies Traditional, Duelist, Ladies Duelist, Senior Duelist, Gunfighter, Ladies Gunfighter, Classic Cowboy, Classic Cowgirl, Junior Boy (12-16), Junior Girl (12-16), 49er, Ladies 49er, Senior (+60), Ladies Senior (+60), Elder Statesman (+70), Grande Dame (+70), “B” Western, and “B” Western Ladies.

MANDATORY SHOOTER SAFETY MEETINGS

Mandatory Shooter Safety Meetings will take place on Thursday, December 7, thirty (30) minutes prior to each posse's first scheduled shoot time. For the Red Cycle the safety meeting will take place at 8:00 a.m., for the White Cycle the safety meeting will take place at 10:00 a.m. and for the Blue Cycle the safety meeting will take place at 1:00. You are required to attend your

designated safety meeting.

SHOOTING SUPPLIES

You must be dressed in regulation attire and must wear your SASS badge at all times during the competition.

- **DO NOT BRING FIREARMS** – All firearms will be supplied.
- **DO NOT BRING GUN LEATHER** – All firearms will be staged.
- **DO NOT BRING AMMUNITION** – All ammunition will be provided and is included in your entry fee.

AMMUNITION

Each stage will consist of 10 rounds of revolver, 9 rounds of rifle, and 2 rounds of shotgun.

All revolvers and rifles will be in .45 caliber. Revolvers will shoot standard .45 caliber wax bullets using a standard large pistol primer as the propellant. All rifles will shoot .32 caliber wax bullets in a custom designed cartridge using a standard pistol primer as the propellant. All shotguns will be 12 gauge using a .45 caliber wax bullet and a standard shotgun primer as the propellant.

All components used in the competition remain the property of SASS. DO NOT pick up brass or attempt to remove spent brass or shells from the

firing line. A match DQ will result for anyone who breaks this rule.

Ammunition failures will be considered a hit target.

FIREARMS

Firearms will be provided and available for inspection on Wednesday, December 6 during registration hours. Shooters will choose which firearms they wish to use at each stage from a selection of sponsored arms. All guns will be tuned to SASS accepted standards by a SASS selected gunsmith. A crew of designated armorers will ensure guns are inspected after each use and cleared of any fouling caused by wax residual. **YOU WILL SHOOT A DIFFERENT GUN FROM THE SAME MANUFACTURER AT EACH STAGE. ALL GUNS ARE SHARED AND MAINTAINED ON THE RANGE AND AFTER EVERY CYCLE.**

Available firearms will include Colt and/or Colt Replica revolvers, Ruger Vaquero and New Vaquero revolvers, 1866, 1873, 1892 Winchester and/or replica rifles, and double barrel and 1897 Winchester and/or replica shotguns.

AWARDS

Awards will be presented for the top three competitors in each shooting category with an Overall Top Gun Champion trophy going to the top man and woman.

including State, Regional, National, and the World Championships. The program begins annually with points for all END of TRAIL Mounted Shooting participants and is free of charge to affiliated clubs. Clubs must submit complete scores from any qualifying match to the SASS Clubs Administrator. Prizes for overall point winners, all division winners, and random drawings will be provided by sponsors and SASS. SASS Mounted Shooting Points are not required for participation in any SASS Mounted match and have no qualifying value.

Awards Uniformity

SASS has received numerous comments regarding the quality of its awards for Mounted Shooting. It was suggested a uniform design for belt buckles and other awards be developed. It will be the task of the SASS Mounted Advisory Board to develop suggestions for a consistent line of awards.

Promotions, Marketing, Advertising, Public Relations

SASS will publish Mounted Shooting information for any SASS affiliated club in *The Cowboy Chronicle*. SASS encourages clubs to submit photos and articles on their matches and other related events. The new club affiliation materials will include ideas for club promotions, including sample ads, articles, and press releases.
