

The Cowboy Chronicle will also soon undergo its own exciting changes. We've finally reached a point where we are able to provide an electronic version of The Combay Chronicle for our international members.

Our struggle with overseas shipping has been an ongoing challenge. The issue is this: it costs over ten times more to ship Chronicles overseas than it does to our domestic members. Years ago this general situation was recognized, and the annual international SASS rates were adjusted accordingly. However, international shipping rates have continued to increase, and we are at a point where it actually costs more to ship The Combon Chronicle internationally than we receive in membership dues!

Thankfully the \$35 domestic annual renewal fee covers the cost to mail a year's worth of Combou Chronicles within the US. These annual fees are the life-blood of SASS and are critical to supporting the Headquarters staff, building, inventories, and all the other aspects of running a business.


The "easy" way (but not the "Cowboy Way!") would be to simply increase the international fees. However, that would create hardships all around, and there would be an inevitable black-lash against

An alternate approach to distributing The Cowboy Chronicle will shortly be available on-line: an online subscription service! SASS will post The Cowboy Chronicle on a secure web site that can be accessed by our international members. The issue will be in full color throughout, rather than just the few color pages available now. And,

it will be available instantly! SASS members can access each issue on the web page and can print them out to maintain one's individual library of back issues. And, the annual international renewal fee can be reduced instead of increased!

Think this is just to make life better for our international members? Think again! How many of our domestic members have complained for years they receive their Cowboy Chronicles weeks after everyone else (if at all, sometimes!)? Well, an opportunity will soon be provided to let these folks also subscribe to the on-line service!

There will always be a physical paper produced ... we see this same phenomena with the major newspapers around the country ... they print newsprint, but they also have on-line subscription services that quickly and efficiently service clients around the world. The Combon Chronicle will be no different! 4.


Tickets for the evening concerts will be \$15 for adults, \$10 for students ages 6 to 12, and children under 6 are free. All other events are no charge.




and try and write an article yourself, send it in, and see what happens. It is a learning curve that can enhance your overall life's skills, just like writing yer first stage,







SOME THOUGHTS ON LIGHTNING RIFLES AND CATEGORY

REALIGNMENTS

I see, or in fact don't see, any Lightning rifles being used in Cowboy Action matches. This is very unfortunate, as some people have gone to great expense to recreate a beautiful rifle. I suppose SASS thinks this would create an advantage. SASS allows 1897 shotguns, and these are very popular, but they are no more period correct than a Lightning rifle. I would like to propose a rethink of the categories along the following lines.

Starting with Modern Category: ANY ONE of the following: adjustable sighted handguns, 1897 shotgun/Hammerless shotgun or Lightning rifle. Since both shotguns are started empty, there is no advantage in speed.

Traditional category: All of the following: fixed sighted handguns, outside hammer shotgun, any lever action rifle. Hammerless and outside hammer shotguns can't realistically compete together.

Chronicl

Frontier Cartridge: Traditional style percussion or cartridge single action revolvers, an outside hammer shotgun, a lever action rifle. ALL loads to be blackpowder.

I have two reasons for wanting these category realignments. I don't believe the hammerless shotgun is period correct, anymore than adjustable sights. And, I would like the Lightning rifle to be a part of Cowboy Action ShootingTM.

Since I currently live in South Africa, where the likelihood of seeing


FORT LEAVENWORTH IS THE OLDEST FORT

a Lightning rifle is quite remote, I am most unlikely to be able to buy one, quite apart from our licensing system. I am presently trying to get Cowboy Action Shooting $^{\text{TM}}$ on the map. Since percussion revolvers are no longer licensed, this will probably form the bulk of our membership. There is or was a sizable group of people interested in "fast draw" that was popular about 20 years ago, so there should be some incentive to reuse these single actions again.

(Lightning rifles are perfectly acceptable in Cowboy Action Shooting $^{\text{TM}}$. SASS has "no problem" with them. The reason one doesn't see too

many of them is because they haven't worked all that well in the past (when you could actually get them). That seems to be changing. I suspect more Lightning rifles will find their way to the range in the future. And, hammerless shotguns are, indeed, "period correct." I use a "mule eared" shotgun simply because I like it. Either kind of shotgun is welcomed in most SASS categories. There really isn't any reason to refine the categories ... unless one wishes to introduce the Senior-Classic-Frontier-Gunfighter Category so the old guys can dress up and shoot Gunfighter on the dark side! ... editor.) 🎩





Fortunately, I've only seen a couple of these folks in my five years of SASS.



INACCURACY IN ARTICLES

Re: In "Reloading Brass Shotgun Shotshells," By John J Valentine, SASS #37690, the article says, "use large RIFLE primers" several times.

However, the Graf catalog says use large PISTOL primers and the MagTech box of brass shotshells says in two places - LARGE PISTOL PRIMERS

I have loaded and shot over 500 reloads in brass shotshells in the past three years using Rocky Mountain Cartridge cases and Magtech cases. I use 11 ga. over powder and 1/2" cushion wads and 10 ga over shot card on Magtech brass, in RMC brass - 12 ga wads and 12 ga over shot card. Seal over shot card with Elmer's white glue or DUCO cement - either works very well. Rocky Mountain Cartridge makes a very nice hand loader for its brass shotshells.

In the second article, "Substitutes and Blackpowder," By Spur Roberts, SASS #14625, regarding American Pioneer powder, the author refers to "hydroscopic." I

believe the correct term is hygroscopic (basically - absorbs water). American Pioneer absorbs water in its unfired state, but does not after firing, therefore making it much less corrosive than blackpowder or Pyrodex. I have never seen any tendency to "harden overnight." An article published in The Cottoboy Chronicle a couple of years ago did a much better job of explaining the Black Powder Substitutes

American Pioneer blackpowder substitute is my powder of choice - tried Pyrodex and black. Hodgdon 777 was developed as a higher velocity powder for hunting purposes and has its place.

Shooting blackpowder or any of the substitutes seems to be shied away from for a lot of shooters, mainly because of a misunderstood lack of loading data, miss-information, and incorrect or incomplete information. SASS members should be able to trust this publication to print correct and complete information. Both of these articles contained incorrect





"Waiting periods are only a step. Registration is only a step. The prohibition of firearms is the goal."



and to be gored hurts—it hurts deep, and when this finally happens to you, then you will understand what it's like. Being DQ'd for a stage or a match is the worse thing that can happen to any Cowboy Action Shooter—man or woman. But, as I mentioned above, to really feel the agony, you must first experience it.

DQ's vary in severity. All DQ's are of concern, but some are less offensive-others more severe, suggesting that perhaps another look should be given to the penalties currently prescribed. One suggestion has already been offered, and that is a "free chip" for one stage per match. Another way of expressing free chip is to say, "kick-out" one stage per match for certain degree(s) of DQ's. This suggestion could apply across the board for all shooters, meaning that one stage can be "kicked-out" for everyone—not just a DQ. Out goes your worse stage. Thoughts and arguments on this issue will vary. Those who are serious competitors will look at this issue differently than those who compete only with themselves. Some will look at the issue with a "cold heart." Others will be more compassionate. Do we, who profess to live in the spirit of the "Cowboy Way," feel the current system is just? I feel the system as currently practiced is too heavy. Heavy should have no place in the Cowboy world—once again, in my opinion.

Shaping, refining, and nurturing a sport such as Cowboy Action ShootingTM is not an easy task, as

the Wild Bunch can testify. But then again, what enjoyable and challenging venue is not in a constant state of flux? Even our National Constitution has amendments, and others are being sought as we speak. Changes are a natural part of our landscape. Venues change—rules change—change is part of our life nothing will change that. Don't get me wrong. I think Cowboy Action Shooting $\overline{^{TM}}$ is the greatest sport I have ever been involved in, but I believe this particular facet of the game needs to be re-tooled. One approach is to approve the "free chip" idea and leave it to the discretion of the club sponsoring the shoot. In any event, I hope I have given all of us something to think about.

(Nothing is ever cast in concrete and cannot be changed ... if there are reservations about the current rules, talk to your Governor and get him/her to get it on the agenda for the Governor's meeting at the Convention. Having said that, the Governors have made the judgment call that some acts are very dangerous and can imperil our game of Cowboy Action Shooting™. These acts are to be vigorously discouraged. The only way we have of ensuring these acts are not often repeated is to punish the offender ... get their attention so they become motivated to never let that act occur again because of their actions. I personally suffered a match DQ at the very first "away" $match\ I\ attended\ ...\ I\ got\ excited\ and$ made a bad mistake. You're right ... I was devastated and my shooting pards refused to look at me, talk to me, or stand with me ... I was alone at the match with no way to leave ... and I have never made that mistake again! I think DQ's are a lot like public hangings in the Old West ... yes they are harsh ... but the observant realize they don't want that to happen to them! ... editor.) ...



While it almost becomes impossible to relate my trip to Israel to Cowboy Action ShootingTM, it seems to me I ought to at least make note of it for readers of The Cowboy Chronicle. Suffice it to say I saw no cowboy guns, no cowboy clothes (not counting my own vest), but I did see some donkey carts and a couple of camels, so it wasn't all 21st century. Then again, some of it was MUCH older than the Old West, donchano!

Since Cowboy Action Shooting TM shooters come from all kinds of diverse backgrounds I won't dwell on the intensity of the religious experience; each of us takes that in their own way and my way might, and probably is, far different from yours. Interestingly, in my group we had another Cowboy Action ShootingTM shooter, Bull Run Warrior, so I sure had company! On the other hand, if you have any interest in guns at all, and I know you do, there was plenty of that on this trip.


I told my friends I expected the

trip to be safe and free from gunfire. It was safe but, fortunately, not free from gunfire. Part of the tour took us onto an Israeli Defense Forces base on the Golan where they allowed us to examine and photograph their weaponry, including a Remington sniper rifle in .308 caliber, a Barrett .50 caliber long range sniper rifle, an FN machine gun, various personal body armor and night vision equipment, and the ubiquitous M-16s - none of the soldiers carried Uzis; they were all armed with American M-16s. We were taken by Humvee out to a field for a live fire exercise involving an armored personnel carrier and a team of soldiers whose training goal was to attack and seize a hill held by enemy fighters. The demonstration of firepower was, to this cowboy's way of thinking, delightful to behold!

The countryside was magnificent, the ancient sites both amazing and emotionally gripping beyond description, and the drive from the northern

part of Israel through the entire West Bank down to Jerusalem was, in a word, riveting! Visiting Masada, the ancient fortress and last stronghold against the Roman Legions was very special to this old military hand, and swimming, or should I say floating, in the Dead Sea later that day was beyond words for fun! The whole trip was, however, quite peaceful, and words cannot describe the feeling of entering Jerusalem for the first time, approaching the Western Wall for the first time, and several times thereafter. We were escorted on a spectacular guided tour beneath the ancient walls, on a 2000 year old Roman street deeply buried underground at the bottom of the ancient Western Wall, a road that took us to a site closer to the ancient Holy of Holies as anyone can possibly get from that direction. It was an experience I will never forget.

Aside from the intensity of the spiritual experience, it was something else to see so many people on the

street, often not in uniform, with M-16 rifles slung over their shoulders, and an occasional M-1 carbine as well! It was also quite thrilling to see a man deeply in prayer at the Kotel (the Hebrew name for the Western Wall) with a large pistol sticking out from under his sweater. If it weren't that I thought it would have been terribly rude, I would have photographed him.

For years I used to say, "If I ever get to Israel ..." then I'd do this or that. Now this cowboy says, "When I get back to Israel ..." because it is, truly, a wondrous place!

COLT SINGLE ACTION "ARTILLERY MODEL"

The year was 1916. The spirit of this story was told by my dad, a US Cavalry Trooper. He served from 1912-1943, experiencing the Mexican Punitive Exposition, WWI, and WWII. On guard duty that day, Corporal William Crismon checked his Colt Single Action Cavalry Revolver, making sure he had five caliber .45 rounds loaded and the hammer was resting on an empty, unprimed cartridge. Normally, Army soldiers on duty guarding the US/Mexico border would have had the hammer down on an empty chamber if they carried a Colt Single Action, not resting on an empty cartridge. But this Trooper's Colt had a bad cylinder notch. The gun could not be trusted to fire safely if the bad cylinder was indexed to fire a live round. The risk existed if the gun was fired with the bullet not perfectly aligned with the barrel-forcing cone. The neck of an empty

brass cartridge was slightly bent before it was jammed into the cylinder chamber. This assured the empty shell would not accidentally be ejected when reloading. Most of the officers and non-commissioned officers on the border carried model 1911 Colt automatic pistols. Most of the enlisted men carried a .38 caliber Colt Double Action Army revolver. However, a few troopers, including Crismon, elected to still carry the Colt Single Action Cavalry "Artillery Model" .45 caliber revolver. Crismon could have turned in his faulty sidearm for repair, but knew it would have been exchanged for a newer gun. He experienced great pleasure shooting the Colt Single Action Revolver, as do all SASS shooters today.

Colt Single Action Cavalry Revolvers purchased by the U.S. government were manufactured only in .45 caliber and only came with a 7-1/2" barrel. Between the periods of 1873-1891, some 37,060 of these guns were sold to the government at the cost of \$12 to \$13 each. Each gun included a screwdriver used for removal of the base pin screw. The revolvers were shipped in wooden boxes of 50 guns. In 1894, the Army determined that being primarily a defensive firearm, the 7-1/2" barrel hindered the ability to quickly remove the single action from the holster (today, we sometimes call that fast draw). This inability to bring the long barreled firearm quickly into play was even more of a problem if the trooper was astride a horse.

During the period 1895-1903, as these guns became in need of repair beyond the capability of the company armory, all 7-1/2" barrel guns were shipped back to the Colt factory. There the guns were completely disassembled. If a part was salvageable, it was placed into a bin along with the other like salvaged parts. All of the single action barrels were cut down to 5-1/2" length and a blade sight was attached. Interestingly, at one time a request was sent through channels to have the barrel shortened even more to 4-3/4" length, but was denied. The remodeled guns were assembled with no regard toward matching the individual part serial numbers. Over the contract period, 16,097 US Army owned Colt Single Action Cavalry Revolvers were altered to the "Artillery Model" specifications. It is highly unlikely any SASS shooter today uses an Artillery Model, as these mismatched number guns are now quite valuable as collector items.

Corporal Crismon holstered his loaded Single Action, and with field glasses scanned trenches on the Mexico side of the Rio Grande. In some of the trenches were militia led by revolutionist Pancho Villa. In opposing trenches, also on the Mexico side, were soldiers of the Mexican Army who were trying to capture the revolutionists. Since the trenches were perpendicular to the International border,

one could see the Mexicans in both trenches. Crismon said from time to time a soldier in one trench would climb to the top and fire off a round towards the opposing trench and then scurry back down into the trench. Then, an answering shot would be fired from the other trench. He said it was doubtful any of the shots ever hit anyone. The US Army was there to make sure neither of the Mexican fighters crossed the border into the United States.

Later that day the order was given. Tomorrow the troop would embark on a routine patrol between El Paso and Brownsfield. On the trail, Corporal Crismon dropped out of the ranks to take a toilet in the brush. That evening in bivouac during meal time his commanding officer loudly barked, "Corporal, where is your side arm?" Holy smokes! Crismon had left his single action, holster, and belt hanging on a mesquite limb while toileting back on the trail. The fuming officer ordered him to immediately go back on the trail by himself and find the missing gun. Crismon said he searched most of the dark, moonless night and never did find the gun.

Many years later the same officer was the Commanding Officer at Fort Riley, Kansas, home of the US Cavalry School. In his office on November 1, 1933, Colonel Selwyn D. Smith signed the warrant naming Master Sergeant William Crismon the First Sergeant of Troop A 2nd Cavalry. At the ceremony, Colonel Smith told others in attendance the story about Crismon's lost gun incident that took place during the Mexico Expedition. The Colonel jokingly told the ceremony gathering, "It's a good thing Pancho Villa wasn't assassinated with Sergeant Crismon's Colt Single Action. We would surely have had another International incident Mexico." Francisco "Pancho" Villa had been assassinated in 1923. The last time Sergeant Crismon fired a Colt Single Action was in 1980 at the age of 86. .





THE BUFF'LER HUNT

One Cowpoke's Experience in the Wild West Part 1

(Lawyer-type weasel-words): The following observations and suggestions are based solely on my personal experience and on discussions with this particular outfitter. They are presented free-of-charge (and remember, you get what you pay for), and are presented in no particular order. They apply only to the Hawes Ranch, which runs 1870-1880's style hunts from horseback. Since other outfitters can and do run their hunts differently, your mileage may vary.

Last November I took advantage of the opportunity to participate in a cowboy-style buffalo hunt at the Hawes Ranch in western Kansas. Our hunting party consisted of myself, my colleague and sidekick Jim (a.k.a. "the Faithful Indian Companion Bodie" just getting into Cowboy Action Shooting TM — no alias or number yet), and two gents named Bob and Gary, active in the North-South Skirmish Association (N-SSA) but not Cowboy Action

Shooting TM . Our hosts included ranch owner Lee Hawes, and his mom Eleanor, who served quite capably as the camp cook. The food's great and there's plenty of it. Eleanor does an

incredible job in the cook's dugout.

This outing had been planned (and postponed) for a couple of years, but it was well worth the wait. A number of outfitters and ranchers are now offering these hunts, with conditions varying greatly. Hunting the American Bison (commonly referred to as buffalo) is not extremely difficult (let's face it - there was a reason they were nearly exterminated), but you still have to remember the basics of stalking and shooting. These hunts can be as strenuous or comfortable as you want, but will yield great memories (not to mention steaks. roasts, and hides), so decide what it is you're after and make sure what the outfitter offers accommodates your desired experience.

Our hunt with Lee Hawes took place on his ranch near Ford Kansas (not far from Dodge City). Although the ranch is "enclosed" by a fence, the herd (which consisted of about 250 animals) roams freely on several thousand acres of prairie. The land we hunted has been in his family for several generations. His great-grandfather was one of the original buffalo hunters who later settled in the area to ranch cattle. After Lee re-introduced bison to the ranch, they resumed the use of wallows, unused for well over a century. Lee runs his hunt (which he bills as "The Great Western Buffalo Hunt") in 1880's style. Hunters are requested to use period-type firearms, dress in a relatively authentic manner, ride out to scout the herd on horseback, and stay in either a teepee or a dugout, dependent on weather.

This brings us to a discussion of the choice of firearm and caliber. Use enough gun! Bob and Gary brought an expensive, custom-made Rolling-Block reproduction and a couple of Shiloh Sharps rifles. These were works of art,

but didn't kill 'em any deader than my Taylor's Sharps reproduction. Bob commented the bull octagon barrels were more tiring after a stalk than the tapered octagon barrel on mine. That was of minimal importance on our hunt, since we did our scouting from horseback. But if your outfitter requires walking several miles from the ranch gate, those rifles may get heavier!

Four bison (two yearlings and two bulls) were harvested during my stay: one with a .50-70 Sharps, one with a .50-90 Sharps (I think he used a 650 gr bullet), and two with the .45-70 Gov't (500gr and 405 grn RNFP, respectively). All were one or two shot kills. By comparison, Lee told us the average was around five shots. I used a 500-gr RNFP bullet over a slightly compressed load of 69gr FFg expertly loaded by The Platte County Kid, SASS #31618, for my Taylor's Sharps. My first shot penetrated the animal completely, and the other was found on the offside, just under the hide.

Big, heavy, all-lead bullets with a large meplat and plenty of power behind them are just the ticket here. Smaller diameter bullets, rounded or spitzer bullets, and jacketed bullets do not perform as well on these large animals. Lee Hawes told us he's seen buffalo absorb 4-5 solid hits with modern rifles in the .338 Win Mag class and just keep on going.

You should be prepared for both longand short-range shots. Thoughts of hunting the big shaggies may conjure up images of 300-yard shots, but it doesn't always work out that way. It took two shots to put my buff down for good. The first shot was at 224 yds; the second one was at 198 yds (as measured by Faithful Indian Scout on our period-incorrect Leica laser range finder). Fellow hunter Gary took one at around 100 yds. Fellow hunter Bob was climbing out of a wadi while stalking one yearling and surprised a different buff at less than 40 yds, hidden on the reverse slope of a hill. It did not take kindly to his presence and proximity. Fortunately, Bob was prepared to take what amounted to a snapshot.


You may or may not be presented with an opportunity to use cross-sticks, but what the heck-bring them if you've got them. My plan was to shoot from an unsupported

sitting position, but the opportunity to use cross-sticks presented itself, and I'm glad I had them. Big Ed at San Pedro Saddlery sells a nice set, or you can make your own. Oh, and practice shooting in the wind–because it will be windy.

It's great to play cowboy and pack your six-shooter along while you're riding, but it only gets in the way when you're crawling up to a shooting position. Buck Stinson of Old West Reproductions solved this problem by sending a beautiful set of pommel-bag holsters that

arrived just prior to our hunt. The Colt stayed on the horse while we were on the stalk. But the plain truth is the six-shooter just ain't needed. Looks good in photos, and it's lots of fun to ride around with one, but not fun when we're crawling around on our bellies.

Speaking of tack, the outfitter should supply what you need. I happened to have a scabbard from the Circle-Bar-T that was made for my Sharps. But Lee does have a couple of generic scabbards that can be adjusted to fit your particular rifle. This is worth checking into with your own outfitter before showing up for a hunt.

Although this is billed as "The Great Western Buffalo Hunt," and is supposed to be conducted in period style, some flexibility exists as regards period clothing. All of us wore either cowboy or slouch hats, and some version of western wear (either the 1880's or 1980's variety). The two Skirmishers made a concession to the weather by wearing goosedown vests and heavy jackets, which are fine – it sure beats freezing to death. But you can, in fact, dress in a relatively period-correct manner if that's what floats


your boat. In our case, the Faithful Indian Companion and I took advantage of modern polypro and thermal layered clothing hidden underneath our Cowboy Action Shooting™ duds. It worked well and we still managed to look like something out of the Old

West. It just depends on what <u>you</u> want to get out of <u>your</u> hunt.

Sleeping arrangements are on the ground, either in a teepee or a dugout. The dugout was equipped with a camp stove and adequate supply of firewood, and was quite cozy (or at least until the Faithful Indian Companion let the fire die out one night). You may wish to consider bringing a cot for yourself, or just do what we did and bring a self-inflating therma-rest type foam pad.

Hunting takes place over a period of three full days, with the day's hunting party departing camp just after breakfast. No rush in the pre-dawn here as this is clearly a gentleman's hunt where you have time to relax and enjoy your surroundings. Bob and Gary drew the first day's hunt while Bodie and I hunted the next day. We scouted for the herd on horseback, learning they had wandered back in the direction of camp over the previous night. Ground-tethering our mounts on the back side of a hill, we walked a hundred yards, and then crawled another 150 yards or so up and over its crest to take up our shooting position.







The "OH S#!* SYNDROME! Advice from an expert

Okay, now all of the giggles and laughing has stopped, I may not be an expert, but I have been there and done that, as have many of you. You know the scenario ...

You're on the line with rifle in hand when the BUZZER goes off, and you start to engage the targets as fast and as accurately as possible. After the third or fifth shot the hammer falls and it goes "CLICK"... the loudest sound in the world, except maybe the "OH S#@!" expletive heard clear over in the next shooting bay by the posse shooting in front of yours ... Or, so it seems.

I remember one match several years ago when a competitor was having trouble getting his revolvers to ignite all of his cartridges in a row. At one point he exclaimed, "I would just like to it go BANG and CLANG ten times in a row!" As helpful as all cowboys can be, several of us (his pards) lined up behind him and every time he pulled the trigger and it failed to go BANG, we yelled, "BANG-CLANG!" He busted out laughing at our good-natured fun at his expense.

Many times we have seen problems

with high primers, cases that were not sized correctly causing feeding problems, or lack of powder in the case, just to name a few. As competitors, we reload

to save money, and to be able to say we crafted our own ammo and produce a load accurate to shoot with our firearms. The last month found us shooting at a match where one competitor was having continual problems with his reloads. Normally he shoots really well, but his turmoil caused him to drop by 40 percent from where he normally places.

How many of us use a progressive press to reload? Have a radio or TV playing in the background or the kids nearby ask-

ing questions or taking our attention away momentarily from the press and our task? Last week found me at Hangin' Dawg's, SASS #36463, New

Castle Gunsmithing, New Castle, Delaware workshop using his Dillion 1050 Press to load a bunch of .38 Special ammo for my wife, Hazel Pepper's SASS #49662, rifle. Her several surgeries have left her unable to withstand the recoil of heavier calibers. I even bought her a pair of Rugers in .32 H&R to replace her Bisley .45's, thus enabling her to continue to enjoy our sport. As I reloaded, Dawg replaced a spring in my wife's side

by-side 12 gauge in which she shoots the Agulia Mini shells. As sometimes happens, I talked to Hangin' Dawg, breaking the concentration that should have been applied to the reloading task.

I screwed up a couple of times as the monotony of sitting and placing 1,000 148-grain semi wadcutters on a case lulled me into a since of false security. Several cases were damaged and a couple of split ones sneaked through as well. After the task was finished and we kicked back, Hangin' Dawg pulled out his Dillon Case Gauge*, a finely machined tool that allows a correctly constructed

Ruger Blackhawk that had to be sent back to the factory for a rebuild. I decided to make it a 'project' gun, wanting to have a BBQ revolver that would be unique. Ruger refitted it with a new .357 Magnum cylinder and new springs, screws, and pins. Hangin' Dawg and I replaced the hammer and trigger, new base pin, new springs, chamfered the chambers and honed them, replaced the grip with a birds-head type brass unit that was custom fit and milled to a glass smooth fit, trigger pull set at 1.5 pounds that is glass breaking clean with no over travel, free spin pawl, and the ability to cock the hammer and index the cylinder when the loading gate is open. This revolver will shoot five shots into a group that can be covered by a quarter at 50 feet. We plan to shorten the barrel, remove the ejector rod and reprofile the frame to create our version of a Sheriff's model. The recoil shield had to be polished to the point it would allow .357 Magnum and .38 Spl. Cartridges to cycle without binding. The rims of the .38 and .357 can easily vary from .058" thick to .060" thick. We set the clearances at .060".

round to be seated in the gage. If the rim is too thick, it will stick above the gauge. If the primer is not seated correctly, it will stick up as well and can be felt with the finger or fingernail. An incorrectly sized case will not fit in the gauge or will be hard to seat. These conditions will cause "OH S#!*'s during a match. A high

Two obvious problems found when gauging reloads. Far right shows an unseated primer while the next has no primer. The next cartridge would not enter the gauge and was discarded, as it was not sized correctly. Finally, the .45 Colt cartridge exhibits a hairline crack that developed after being seated and crimped.

primer will cause a revolver to jam the cylinder and not allow the action to close correctly on a rifle, or allow the cartridge to slip into the chamber to the point the firing pin may not make proper contact with the primer.

Some things I would like to point out about crafting your own ammo clean ammo works better than dirty Consistently manufactured ammo. ammo works better than inconsistently crafted ammo. Checking and rechecking ammo can eliminate the "OH S#!*'s" and improve your match scores.

Okay, you say ... I already know that! Well, have you ever considered why

these statements are

true? When you are shooting a match, posse members help by picking up brass and retrieving it for you. Usually, this brass retrieved from the ground has sand and debris also recovered with it. For example, with the .38 Special almost never, will you get back all the cases you spent. Usually those cases get mixed with other cases. Not all cases are equal in construction. Some cases do not have a groove next to the rim, and when they do, some are deeper than others and sometimes Some cases wider. have no groove at all. Then, there is the military brass. Some have that are primers crimped into place and are hard to decap and reprime. Foreign cases can vary in specifications as well. After our last match, we came home with Winchester, Remington, R-P, CDC, 3D, Starline, S&B, American. Federal.

S&W, Speer, Israel manufactured, and Western brass. We started with all Winchester and Remington brass.

Those relief grooves cut in most .38 Special cases can capture oil, grease, powder, and tumbling media, as well as lead fragments. Corncob media is fairly soft as compared to walnut media. A

piece of media can cause the case to not seat properly or the action to not close. Not all chambers are exactly the same. Chamber reamers wear and become smaller over their lifetime. There is a tolerance established by the manufacturers and the tools are changed when they do not meet the specifications, or are supposed to be. A case not resized completely can be stopped from seating completely by just a particle or two of powder lodged in the wrong place.

A case can split when being resized and bullet crimped. Not crimping correctly also causes the "OH S#!*" syndrome. My wife's rifle feeds better with a tightly crimped case that feels rounded when completed. A friend gave me reloaded ammo with the case not crimped tightly, allowing the edge to hit and grab the inside of the mechanism and leading to misfeeds and jams. He had used a bullet without a crimp groove that would not

allow it to be seated properly and still feed through the lever action because of overall length needed to function.

Hangin' Dawg suggested I do what he does in crafting his match ammo. Use the case gauge and check each piece individually. Using the gauge, I inspected each case, wiped off the cases with an old t-shirt, shook each case to see if I heard powder inside the case, and placed them in plastic boxes. I was amazed how many cases would not fit the first time. Media and debris were the culprits most of the time. A few cases had thicker than normal rims, several cases were split with hairline cracks, and two cases had high primers and two were without primers. Usually, after wiping off the cartridge, it went into the gauge with ease. Tight cases

were segregated and will be used for informal practice sessions. The time needed to do this operation was about an hour. I removed six pieces unfit for use, and 20+ pieces were relegated to practice status, potentially eliminating 26 "OH S#!*'s " My wife commented, "Guess I can't blame the ammo this weekend!" It was Mother's Day, and she could make any excuse she wants. After all, she puts up with me.

Previously we did velocity testing of various .45 Colt and percussion loads using the most popular blackpowder substitutes, Hodgdon 777, American Pioneer Powder, and the new Goex Pinnacle compared to the best of the wholly blacks for what we do, Goex Cowboy.

Now we went back and did accuracy testing using a Ransom Rest. A Ransom Machine Rest is a device for testing the accuracy of handguns. It comes with replaceable inserts for different guns. Take the grips off the gun and put it in the inserts and tighten carefully. It has a remote trigger activator. When the gun is

fired, it will tilt up under recoil. Push it back down to the stop, and it's in exactly the same position it was before, ready to shoot again. If you and the gun and the ammo do everything right, all of the bullets go in the same hole. Thus, it tests accuracy. It doesn't get tired, jerk the trigger, suffer from presbyopia, or cheat. Any extensive accuracy testing done without one is probably not worth very much. This one was provided by Brownells and came with Ruger grip inserts (Part #164-



100-008 with Ruger Vaquero/Blackhawk/ Old Army Grip Inserts).

My home club, Tejas Pistoleros, made this test possible. The ace construction chief of the range, Big Jake Cutter, SASS #41344, made a permanent, immovable mount for the rest. A steel post in several feet of concrete isn't going to move.



After suffering with targets moving in the wind, I built a very solid target stand so the target wouldn't move.

Most SASS pistol targets are at 10 yds, but long-range pistol side matches go further, of course. So a regular match load will be acceptable at, say, 3" groups at 25 yards (1.2" at 10 yards). Then if a bonus target, for example, is at 25 yards,

and the target is appropriately large, 3" is an acceptable group there, too. If all else is equal, of course, the tightest group is still the most desirable.

Initial testing with Winchester factory Cowboy .45 Colt loads and Trail Boss loads showed the machine and the target stand were working. Otherwise we wouldn't have gotten 1.5" groups out of Trail Boss. 1.5" is pretty close to the capabilities of a Ruger Vaquero with no accuracy work done to it.

Most Accurate Loads

The most accurate load tested that day wasn't a blackpowder or blackpowder substitute load; it was Trail Boss, 5.5 gr., 215 gr. Hampton bullet. All loads used new Starline Brass and Winchester Large Primers. The group measured 1.5"x 1.5." Winchester was almost as good at 2."

The best full charge blackpowder cartridge load was 33 gr. (volume) Hodgdon 777 ffg, 200 gr. Hunters Supply bullet at 2-3/4" x 2-1/2." Unfortunately, at 873 ft/sec. average, this load has a lot of recoil.

The others were surprisingly large, with even Cowboy doing 4-7/8" x 2-7/8." I would do further tweaking if I wanted to shoot full-charge 200 gr. loads. I am sure there are warthogs who will blame the "light" 200 gr. bullet, and who will say only a 250 gr. bullet will work. Again, 250 gr. bullets recoil a lot.

But when we went to "reduced recoil" loads of 16 gr. volume and the case filled with Black Dawge filler to 1/8" of top of case, then the Pinnacle 3f load measured 2-1/4" x 1-1/4." Pinnacle 2f was a bit larger at 3" x 1-1/2."

~ Trail Boss ~

Previously we reported on chronograph testing of IMR's new Cowboy Action ShootingTM-oriented smokeless powder, Trail Boss. Designed for medium velocities with lead bullets and designed to fill a significant part of the case with a normal load, thus eliminating position sensitivity and double charges, Trail Boss seems perfect for Cowboy Action Shooting™.

That is, it's perfect if you can hit the target with it.

Our tests show if you don't, you're doing something wrong. We first fired a test group with Winchester factory 250 gr. .45 Cowboy loads (previously tested for velocity at 635 ft./sec. with a standard deviation of 36). The same lot fired a group of 2" x 1.5." Knowing that a Ruger Vaquero with a 4-3/8" barrel usually gives 1-1/2 to 2" groups with good ammunition, we concluded the rest was properly set up and "shot in."

5.5 gr. Trail Boss, 215 gr. Hampton Bullet, new Starline Brass, and Winchester Large Pistol primers had averaged 699 ft./sec. with a SD of 8(!) (Low is good.)

I had, then, expected these to be accurate loads. They were.

1.5" x 1.5" resulted from the first six rounds fired.

This is very close to the capability of a Ruger Vaquero with no accuracy enhancement, and it's more than accurate enough for SASS.

I will give credit to the Hampton 215 gr. (212 actual weight) bullets. They are more rounded than most 200 gr., giving them a longer bearing surface to engage the rifling. But some of the other powders were close with 200s, so I give the bulk of the credit to the Trail Boss. (I will be doing more testing with the 215 gr. bullets.)

At this point Trail Boss has passed all of my tests. It is very bulky. A .45 Colt round holds only 12.7 gr. So, the 5.5 gr. load is quite visible when loading. 11 gr. would be a compressed charge with the bullet inserted. So, you could definitely see it. Thus, double charges will be very difficult (never say impossible. It's difficult to idiot-proof things. Idiots are so creative.). . .

Cowboy got worse. I was surprised. On the basis of its low standard deviation, Cowboy should have been the most accurate. It might well be with another gun/load.

No testing was done of reduced loads of American Pioneer Powder and 777 because both manufacturers forbid

wads or fillers. 777 allows 1 Wonder Wad in a .45 Colt load.

Percussion Loads

Moving to the Ruger Old Army, we tried two sets of loads, 30 gr. volume and 20. We expected the 30 gr. loads to be the most accurate. Yes and no. American Pioneer Powder at 1-3/4" x 1-3/4" with best four at 3/4" x 3/4" proved to be the winner despite the fact previous velocity testing had shown a standard deviation of 82!

Pinnacle was almost as good at 2-1/2." 777 wasn't acceptable at 5-1/4" x

Cowboy, with a Wonder Wad, was very close to APP, and its velocity was much more consistent with a SD of 19.

Some 20 gr. loads opened up (APP, Pinnacle). Cowboy tightened, with a 2" x 1" group using a Wonder Wad. 777 tightened to 3-1//2" x 3-1/4."


Conclusions:

Doing this much testing is hard work. This is supposed to be a fun sport.

Cartridge loads varied considerable in accuracy. All would be acceptable at 10 yards, but if you shoot at a club with long-range pistol targets, choose your ammunition carefully.

The winner in each category was a different powder: In 34 gr. cartridges, 777 ffg won. In 16 gr. cartridges, Pinnacle 3f won. In percussion, American Pioneer Powder won, but Pinnacle and Cowboy were close enough for Cowboy Action Shooting™ usage.

There were enough surprises that if extreme accuracy is important to you, you'll probably have to work up loads for your gun. 🌲

ost people consider SASS a man's sport. Most women were not raised around guns, and come into SASS with the help of a man in their lives. Because shooting is not instinctive to most women, we have some unique struggles.

One particularly fascinating aspect to me about Cowboy Action ShootingTM that bridges the gap between men and women is clothing. A majority of women shooting in Cowboy Action started because of the clothing. The role playing aspect

of SASS is one of the reasons SASS has grown so far, so fast, and with such a diverse group of people. It is one of the main reasons SASS has such a high number of female shooters as well

However, the clothing part of SASS may bring men and women together, but at the same time, it continues to separate us. Men have a huge advantage in the clothing department. They can put on a pair of jeans and a work shirt, and they are ready to go. It is a little different for women

Part of the problem with women is we come in all shapes, sizes, and tastes. However, there are some basic styles I have found work very well for the shooting side of SASS, while still filling the other needs women have for their clothing.

There are all kinds of different theories when it comes to SASS

clothing. Some would argue SASS is a historical sport, others that it honors the B-western era, and some that it is just for the shooting. I am not here to argue why the Wild Bunch started SASS, and I am also not trying to teach people how to cheat with their clothes, or how to make the most historically correct costume. I just want to pass on some of my experience. I have been shooting for a long time, and I have shot in many different areas and weather conditions. Take what you find useful from this article and toss the rest. Every person shoots Cowboy Action ShootingTM for a different reason, and I don't want to see cookie cutter images. I just want women to be more comfortable.

My absolute favorite thing to shoot in is pants. I love the diversity, the durability, and the simplicity. I am a bit of a klutz by nature, and, for me, pants are actually safer. From my own fault, I have fallen down many perfectly safe props I am not sure I personally could maneuver in a dress. I take my hat off to you ladies who do wear dresses or period correct attire while shooting.

If you do plan on wearing pants, here are a couple of tips. I like Cowboy Action ShootingTM pants because they are more authentic than blue jeans, but I wore Wal-Mart blue jeans for a while, so just about anything will work. The best advice I can give is make them a comfortable fit. You are out to shoot, and if you can't bend over because of your jeans, it can take some of the fun out of it.

Another piece of clothing I really like to shoot in is the riding skirt. I like these because they give you the diversity of pants while allowing you

to be more feminine. An advantage is that riding skirts can be made from a variety of materials. Because of this, you can get some that are a little cooler or warmer than blue jeans depending on weather needs. Again, make sure they fit well and are comfortable.

As far as dresses go, it has been a long time since I have shot in one, but I try to pay attention and talk to other women who shoot in them regularly. When shooting in a skirt, you want to watch the "cut" of the skirt. A skirt that is too full can end up getting caught on objects and can even cause you to trip. A skirt that is too narrow can cause problems in movement. I can't count the number of times I have had to climb stairs or ride horses while on a stage. A narrow cut in the skirt can cause problems when trying to maneuver on these types of props.

You also want to watch the length of your skirt. A very long skirt can cause you to trip, or someone might step on it. Most timer operators aren't watching a lady's train when he is trying to time her. I have also seen more than one lady set her long gun down on her skirt and have it fall over when she moved to the next shooting station. I recommend keeping skirts to a shorter length and keeping them at a medium fullness. Most of all, I recommend you practice in all skirts before you wear them to a match that is

When choosing a top or blouse, there are several different things to consider. First, the neck is very important. I really like blouses or shirts without collars because they are cooler. The height of the neck is also really important. A neck that is too low will give you too much sun. I have also experienced brass down the back of my shirt, and the front, and I have to say it is an exhilarating experience! A neck should lay flush against your back, and be high enough in the front so this doesn't happen to you. However, a neck that is too high can be too hot for some areas and make you uncomfortable.

I also keep on eye on the shoulder of the shirt or blouse. You need to be able to move well, but you don't want too much fabric. If the shoulder has too much fabric under the arm, it is possible to catch your rifle or shotgun in this extra fabric. To help counter this problem, you can wear a sleeve garter.

Not only can the shoulder be too loose, it can also be too tight. If you can't move your arms forward and back comfortably, then you will want to look for a less confining shirt.

If you wear the Cowboy Action ShootingTM pants with the buttons for suspenders, and you wear suspenders, you may have some unique problems with those. Some women have problems buying suspenders

important to you.



because the piece in the back is very long. I recommend trying them on to check the fit. I don't like the canvas ones because they are slippery and they are usually very wide. The leather ones are also slippery, and they can hurt because of the metal buckles. Also, because of the placement of suspenders, the suspender can chafe some areas. So, if you have that problem, wearing a t-shirt underneath your outside shirt helps.

I would caution also you about hats. The little hats with the feathers. bows, and lace, are really cute, but they are not very useful on the range. When you are out on the range, you

really need more protection than a small hat. Those little hats can't really stand up to all kinds of weather.

When you get right down to it, there's a whole ton-bunch of holster designs out there. Or so it seems. What's actually out there is a whole bunch of variations on just a few major themes. These variations are determined by what era and what region they where built in as well as the personal tastes and whims of their owners. Let's take a look at some of the main groups of holsters and how they might pertain


HOLSTERS, TIME, PLACE & PERSONA

to your persona in both time and space.

California Slim Jim (or just Slim Jim): This is the classic, the oldest of all of the belt holsters. It's a simple pouch with a separate belt loop stitched to it. Traditionally, the pouch was rather high riding and fit very snug to the gun. (Look at old pictures and you can see bumps in the pipe from the sights as well as the gun's profile!) These holsters were also cut very high, often covering the entire cylinder and most of the hammer. (Remember, these hombres weren't playing games. They relied on their guns; losing them was no option!)

A toe plug was always present in the early holsters. Up to the Civil War, these were mostly metal trappings; after that, plain leather. Slim Jims of this style were popular from the late 1840's to well into the '70's when the skirted holsters became more fashionable. (Yes, even that great icon, the Cowboy, was susceptible to the whims and wiles of the

fashion world!) If you are worried about traditional garb and have a bad back or hips, this might be the perfect rig for you because it's correct for the no cartridge loop, blackpowder era. If you shoot cartridges, it is still perfect. Just add a cap pouch to your belt to hold some spare rounds, and you're period correct well into the '80's! (If you doubt my word, look it up in "Packing Iron.") This is also a great way to go if you shoot lots of different caliber cowboy guns.

Slim Jims were around longer than the '70's, of course, so virtually any persona is safe with this style. In the years past the '70's the holster lost some of the curves along the side seam and became more streamlined. Toward the turn of the century, Slim Jims also seemed to sport fewer toe plugs and appeared more and more with stitched-closed toes or opentoed. About the only rig a Slim Jim might look a little goofy on is the Bwestern Buscadero. I won't say it hasn't been done or that it won't be done in future! It just ain't real common nor common sense!

So what's the benefit to the Slim Jim - other than it being the right holster for about any persona? The (Continued on next page)



real beauty of the Slim Jim is that it can be tailored very easily for any rake, from a straight hang to the maximum 25 degrees SASS allows. It can be made to fit snug to any width belt to prevent holster ride-up as the gun is drawn.

Flapped Holsters: Essentially, these were Slim Jims with a flap. Mostly military, they follow the same era peculiarities as regular Slim Jims and were issued with full and half flaps depending on era and regiment. Civilian variations were around, but didn't seem as popular as the standard Slim Jims of the time. If you are a military type, check your regimental codes for the

civilian, take your pick! These holsters can also be made to fit a belt very snug.

Halfbreed holsters: Basically, these are a Slim Jim pouch built with a hidden skirt and a loop or narrow billet to secure the holster to the belt. Mostly, they're post '70's with the military; later, with civilians. They were sometimes built with flaps. This is a popular type of holster with many of my customers because it has a bit more flash than the Slim Jim. (You can get pretty decorative with conchos, initials, borders, and so forth on a loop or with a fancy tip set on a billet). John Wayne carried a halfbreed type holster with an FBI rake through a good number of his pictures. It was cut well down

on the cylinder and isn't period correct for anything but the movie and TV crowd - even if it is a sharp-looking rig! But I digress ...

To work correctly, the halfbreed holster requires a fairly wide belt or some interesting finagling with the loop to get it to fit snug. This is true of all skirted holsters whether with hidden or visible skirts. Why?

There is a relationship between the ride of the holster and where a loop can be placed on the holster. This has mostly to do with the bulge and position of the cylinder. Generally speaking, for the straightup ride of a period-correct holster, this is about 3"-4". The lower the holster rides (the easier the draw), the looser that holster is on a standard 3" belt. This is particularly annoying on the crossdraw, and must be addressed so the holster doesn't gimbal about on the belt.

For those of you who are proudly traditional, low riding holsters were not the norm for the Old West. They interfered too much with riding and with the work of the cowboy. However, they actually did exist because somewhere, somehow, there was always some old lawdog with a gimpy arm or bad shoulder who required a low rig to facilitate their draw in the performance of their duties. This might make an interesting sidebar to persona development!

Skirted Holsters: This was the most popular holster from the mid to late '70's well into the 20th century. The skirts were cut to varying lengths and widths depending on maker and the personal taste (or lack thereof!) of the customer. Texans seemed to favor half-skirted versions. Northern Plains styles seem to make the same skirt length for both 5 1/2's and 7 1/2's, leaving the 7 1/2's with what appeared to be 3/4" length or shorter skirts. Up to the turn of the century, virtually all of these appeared with toe plugs. Afterwards – and especially into the B-western era, the toes were simply stitched shut. Into the 50's when quick-draw was coming into its own, the favored holster was the opentoed type with a narrow skirt and a billet and buckle loop. Most holsters were cut high over the cylinder and hammer up to the turn of the centu-Once the stitched-shut toes caught on, they tended to be cut lower on the cylinder. Because of this, most of the early, high-cut holsters were never made with hammer loops or safety tabs. Once those cylinders got lower, however, loops became standard.

Compadres, that's as good a place to leave off as I can think 'cause I can hear you snorin'! There's still plenty to talk about when it comes to holsters and belts, and we'll get some of that done in future issues. any people have asked my opinion about this subject, and I have done my best to just let it die with most things that get a run on the SASS wire. There are no guidelines for our category. Apparently "The Cowboy Way" is not as strong as it ought to be in the game we play. Back in the Old West, people that cut corners or did something to give themselves an unfair advantage got shot, or hung. In today's civilized times, we have developed rules with penalties that aren't as harsh as they were 100 years ago.

TO SMOKE OR NOT TO SMOKE?


It is now time to declare there is a problem with the Frontier Cartridge category. The trouble is if your ammo is loaded to the point you have very little to no smoke, then you have violated a basic Cowboy Action ShootingTM philosophy in your Handbook that starts on page three and goes through page four. The Sprit of the Game was a concept put into place to stop people from taking unfair advantage of the other shooters in their category. If we do not enforce this guideline, all is lost. The only one time I have seen the Sprit of the Game rule enforced was on Cowtown and myself. We were at a monthly match trying to get ready for a larger match and the scenario called for all guns to be shot from the hip. We just shot it "regular" and received the 30-second penalty along with a procedural we gave to ourselves. We didn't mind, and we actually had a big laugh when all was said and done. If the tables were turned and someone would have accidentally done this and didn't know, the penalty would have been a simple procedural. Intentionally stepping over the line always warrants 30 seconds - Sprit of the Game added to the shooter's time

Many people want to introduce a power factor in our sport. This simply is a waste of time. The fast shooters will still shoot fast and the slower shooters will still shoot a little slower. So, we aren't gaining any ground here. SASS has a standing rule that any knockdown is to be set for a .38 Special with a 158gr. bullet as our Power Factor. It is very simple. If you can't knock it down, then you aren't shooting a hot enough load. I have seen people knock over plates with .32's with no trouble, and we don't hear them complaining. So that should take care of all the Power Factor talk ... but recognize, Match Directors are being far more lenient than the SASS intended.

The next one going around is the 15gr. minimum in your cartridges ... this opens a whole other can of worms, as some shooters can't run a 15gr load and keep their accuracy. My new buddy, Old #4, is a .32 caliber shooter, and he was nice enough to describe his load. He uses 15 grains of Goex under a 115 gr. Desperado Bullet. His comment was even though it is not a light load, it works well in his rifle and pistols. Old #4's opinion is it isn't the amount of powder, but what works well with your guns. The no smoke item on the table is simple to solve ... if it don't smoke, it isn't right. I agree with what Old #4 is saying.

I called Jerry Dean at Powder Inc. and asked just how do you make a blackpowder round that doesn't smoke? To my surprise he said it is very simple and de-

scribed the procedure. Afterward, he asked me an important question. He asked, "Doesn't the SASS rulebook state you can't duplex your loads with a nitrocelious or a smokeless powder? After reading the rulebook, I couldn't find that rule. (It's on pages 26 and 27 of the 2005 Handbook ... editor.) The only thing I could find was the Sprit of the Game. I keep going back to this, don't I?


Several blackpowder shooters in my area are a little confused as to why make a rule to punish the entire category when it is a select few causing the problem? Good

We don't need any new rules. We just need to enforce the ones that are in place. From this point forward if I see this happening I will simply go find the range officer and have him watch the shooter and let him take care of it. I have talked to many shooters that feel the same as I do. So, if you think your ammo might be taken as a Sprit of the Game penalty, you might ask some other blackpowder shooters their opinion before you end up shooting in another category or taking a 30 second penalty on every stage you have shot so far. Remember, this has nothing to do with your load or

what bullets you use or how fast they are moving. It's all about the smoke. So until next time, keep them smoking!

(In fact, we do have enough rules right now ... and if shooters and match directors were willing to challenge blackpowder loads that seem very out of the norm, there wouldn't be any "problem." No one likes a confrontation and no one likes "blackpowder Nazi's" who are over zealous in their personal interpretation as to what is right and what is "substandard." Cowboy Action ShootingTM is a family sport and a game, and Frontier Cartridge is a very small subset of this game ... since most of the competitors know each other, it really shouldn't be a "big deal" to question someone else's loads. Perhaps "standard" smoke loads can be developed that will provide a basis for making a call. However, under any and all conditions, there will always be an element of judgment in the call. Be prepared to be both firm but fair when challenging anyone's load ... and always attempt to show good judgment ... editor.) 🌲

The Single Action Army Model ▲ 'Peacemaker,' 'Model P,' or 'Model 1873' revolver was simple, strong, and virtually impossible to wreck. In 1873 the US Army adopted the Colt as its side arm. The Army issued firearm had a 71/2-inch barrel marked "Colt's Pat. F.A. MFG. CO. HARTFORD CT. U.S.A.," all chambered in .45 Long Colt cartridges.

There were four US Patents for the Colt Peacemaker;

The first US Patent was issued to Charles Richards on September 19,

The second US Patent was issued to William Mason on July 2,

The third US Patent was issued to William Mason on September 15,

The fourth US Patent was issued to William Mason on January 19, 1875.

The Colt's SAA Peacemaker was the work of William Mason, who combined traditional Colt features such as single action lock with the solid top frame for the increasing power of handgun ammunition. The US Army acquired 37,063 guns from 1873 to 1891. These guns all sported screw cylinder pin retainer and onepiece wood grips.

In 1876 at the Philadelphia Centennial Exposition, Colt introduced the Single Action Army revolver with two-piece plain ivory grips and a screw cylinder pin retainer that had been made in 1874 (s/n 11088).

The Colt SAA has had very minor variations during time. They were found in the ejector assembly, the ejector rod, and the ejector head. But the most obvious external change was the cylinder pin retainer, which was a screw running diagonally up under the pin. The US Patent of September 15, 1874 to William Mason was for an improved pin retainer embodying a transverse bolt locked by a spring. This was added to the Colt SAA at the end of 1893 in

the region of s/n 153,000. By this time, the one-piece wood grips had been discontinued by Colt after the Exposition of 1876.

No reproduction of Colt's SAA or clones could be historically correct by having a transverse bolt locked by a spring and a one piece wood grips combination before early 1894.

In conclusion, the gun with the spring action cylinder retainer and the one-piece wood grips never

A COWBOY IN TINNY LAMAS?

What does it profit us to shoot in the world of Cowboy Action ShootingTM, and lose our feet?

I'm asking you, partners, if any of you have pondered the value of shooting in cowboy boots, which were never designed for walking or running?

I was impressed when, as a young lad in the 1950's, I was in the presence of a discussion between my older father and a young aspiring bull rider and cowboy-type friend. The bull rider had been buying cheaply made boots from Mexico. They didn't have a steel arch, which made them okay for dancing and other things that cowboys do with their boots on. He said he saw no reason for the steel arch anyway. My father mentioned that bull riders weren't in the habit of punching cows all day, except as an occasional gathering, or moving roping steers from one end of the arena to the other. "Yes, that is true," the bull rider agreed. It was then the wisdom of my father's words came loud and clear as he described the steel arch. Father explained the steel arch was there to relieve stirrup pressure in long days of riding. Oxbow stirrups, combined with a good steel arch support were also a help. Father did do the real cowboy thing for fifteen years or so from 1912-27, throughout Texas and Montana.

Cowboy boots were never designed for walking, running, standing, hunting, or catching fish. Looking cool would be acceptable. Looking rich also has an appeal, and, of course, looking the part (of what ... is debatable) are the main reasons for wearing such boots. Dancing? Yes, okay, I'll give in there. An inch or two of heel could also make the difference in height for someone who may feel the need to be more impressive.

Looking the part is a big bunch of what we are doing in our sport. It is an essential component of our shooting sport, and no one will deny that. Getting to the reason of my essay what price do we pay as we get older, in



order to do this shooting game well?

Our feet are not designed for the running, stopping, standing, running, standing for 5 to 10 stages a day in ill fitting, ill designed shoes or boots. We have all heard, and expressed the statement, "My feet are tired, and need a rest." So, we pull off the cowboy boots, sigh \dots and believe it is a part of the 'rough old life of the cowboy'. Pulling my boots off at the end of the day is a very welcome time. A foot massage from momma would also help, and if I have to go out again, slippers would do.

So, what's the point?

The point is I am ruining my feet trying to shoot as fast and hard as I can in those beloved cowboy boots. I am apparently scrunching my toes trying to get more traction, and perhaps to take the pressure off my knees.

Yep, that is the consensuses of my 'new' podiatrist, who is beautiful enough to be a movie star. New I might add, because I have just begun going to the foot doctor, thinking I had a neuroma (nerve impingement) that

According to Dave Gullo in his "Black Powder Primer," the .50-70 was the most popular Buffalo hunting cartridge between 1866 and 1874. This was probably due to the proliferation of .50-70 Springfield Allin conversions and Sharps carbines converted to .50-70 after the Civil War. When you consider the US Army gave free .50-70 ammunition to the hunters so they could kill off the food supply for the Plains Indians, this makes sense. Cimarron has recently introduced several of their Sharps variations from both Armi Sport and Pedersolli in .50-70

CIMARRON'S 1874 SHARPS .50-70 NO. 1 SPORTING RIFLE

Government. The nicest of these, I think is the "1874 No. 1 Sharps Sporting Rifle" from Pedersoli.

A Brief Sharps Buffalo Rifle History

When we say "Sharps Rifle," in our minds it conjures up images of scruffy, buckskin clad, bearded men carrying their heavy barreled 1874 Sharps "Old Reliable" business rifles across the trackless plains in search of the vanishing North American Bison. This is actually a fairly realistic image, as Sharps rifles, according to many experts, outnumbered all other types put together. The closet second was the .50-70 1866 Allin conversion .50-70 Springfields.

Christian Sharps produced his first single shot, percussion, breech-loading rifle using paper cartridges in the late 1840's. The popularity of his rifles increased over the next ten years. Prior to the Civil War, the Rev. Beecher, an Abolitionist, shipped Sharps rifles to fellow Abolitionists in Kansas in crates marked "Bibles." This gave the Sharps rifle the nickname "Beecher's Bibles."



During the Civil War, the Sharps rifles, with their fast breech reloading and their deserved reputation for accuracy, were in high demand. Col. Hiram Berdan issued .52 caliber, model 1859 Sharps rifles to his notorious "Sharpshooters."

In the late 1860s and early 1870s, over 30,000 Sharps linen cartridge percussion carbines were converted to fire the new .50-70 Government round then used by the Allin Conversion Springfield trapdoors. In 1866, Sharps also began producing newly made metallic cartridge firing breech-loaders. As the post war

westward migration swelled, so did the flow of Sharps rifles to the west. Plainsmen and Buffalo hunters alike favored the Sharps for its power. The Sharps rifles were made in at least 59 separate calibers and loads ranging from .36 "mule ear" teat fire to .50-140-473 with its 473 grain .50 caliber bullet.

The Cimarron No. 1 **Sharps Sporting Rifle**

The Cimarron Sharps have become extremely popular with Blackpowder Cartridge competitors, and Cowboy Action Shooters who shoot the Plainsman and Long Range side matches. The Cimarron Pedersoli made Sharps are made to Mike Harvey's exacting specifications. They are very well made guns, patterned after the model 1874 Sharps. They are a great buy for the money, when you consider the price (and long wait) of the various domestically produced custom Sharps replicas. They are authentic and great shooters.

The sample I got from Cimarron was really, really nice! I obtained a .50-70 (Continued on page 62)

I have been shooting Uberti replica Remington 1875's for the last four years. In that time I have owned five such pistols in .45 Colt. I have come to understand both the fine points and bad points of these replica pistols. The only thing I have not tried is shooting blackpowder through them, as I shoot Traditional. The two things about the 1875 that first grabbed my attention are the larger grips compared to the Colts, and the familiar web or sail under the barrel that harkens back to the blackpowder revolvers. Later, I discovered many other endearing points of the 1875.

The grip is a wonder in itself. It contains fewer screws than a Colt, as the

frame and grip are one piece, resulting in a stronger hammering tool. The main spring tension can be adjusted from outside the grip using a single screw in the center of the grip's forward strap. Often, the main spring will still need some fine-tuning to achieve smooth, light tension when cocking the hammer. The most important things for me are the longer distance from the grip to the trigger and the grip's larger size, which makes a Colt feel like a toy after handling a Remington. It also has a shorter hammer spur when compared to the Colts. For a smaller hand, this can mean a larger problem for single-handed shooting; however, with a two handed grip, it is of little consequence.

The hammer is a nightmare on the 1875 replicas. The metal used in the hammer assembly is softer than it should be and results in easier parts breakage. The firing pin and the retaining pin can start to move after repeated firings, resulting in weak primer strikes and damage to the recoil shield's shim. Also, the Uberti hammer safety is of little real use. It just gets in the way or can break during shooting, resulting in a jam. The hammer screw is also terrible.

It becomes loose when the hammer is cocked over and over \dots a small amount of lock-tight fixes it.

The weight of the pistol adds to the sense of balance, making it better compared to Colts. I have shot nothing but the 7-1/2" barrel length, which gives the Remington the best looks, balance, and accuracy in my opinion. There are those who like the 5-1/2" barrels, but the handling is different for me.

The cylinder on the Remington is shorter than the Colt's, resulting in the bullet traveling a shorter distance before engaging the rifling ... a plus for accuracy, but a concern for some new to reloading. To anyone with a micrometer this is of little concern ... the rounds must be loaded a little "short." This is not to say all replica Remington's are inherently accurate. I had one that was very loose around the cylinder pin, resulting in poor accuracy. I have found how the cylinder pin and all the parts around it fit together can make a big difference in accuracy. The cylinder chambers on the Remington replicas I've owned have needed no polishing. The spent casings always fell out with very little use of the ejector rod until the powder build up got bad.

The ejector rod on the Remington is not housed in an assembly like the Colt, and some complain it is exposed to the elements. I find it works well for normal shooting. One of my Remington's had a poorly fitted ejector rod that would come unscrewed and start to rotate, causing it to iam.

Internally Remington replicas are little different from Colt replicas. The handspring is the weakest link of almost all revolver designs of this era. They are prone to breaking, and a replacement almost always has to be hand-fit.

The two biggest complaints with Uberti's replica Remington when compared to the originals are the overall dimensions of the grip and frame and the Colt-style cylinder pin retaining pushpin. The grips can be easily exchanged for slimmer ones. The Colt style cylinder pin is just wrong to those of us who know the Remington.

Those of us who shoot the Remington 1875 replicas do so for many different reasons. I do so because I thoroughly enjoy shooting the Remington, and I like being different from those who shoot Colts. A.

is easily removed, and I could be back on my feet in a few days. A feeling like a ball of sock began the uncomfortable sensation I was experiencing in the pad of my feet just in front of the toes. This was coupled by a progressive pain radiating into the middle toes of my left foot. Old Hammer Toes became my alias when I had my weekly appointment with the foot doctor. Hammertoe is a nickname for the toes curling down as the tendons contract. This progresses with age, and it also runs in the family, but is emphasized by the scrunching of the toes as one runs in tight shoes or boots in order to constantly gain balance and speed. It is almost unnoticeable until, yep, that ball of stocking feeling on the bottom of the foot begins to appear.

How many of us have similar symptoms? Who knows? How many will get these symptoms? Probably many more than may be aware of it. The fearful thing is the cure is painful and the recuperation period is long and may be unnecessary. A good therapeutically made insole, with pads to relieve toe pressure, and TENNIS type shoes, cross trainers, etc., for comfortable walking, running, stopping, and standing may be all that is needed. Those types of shoes will alleviate most of the problem for many of the affected persons. If you happen to be a shooter, and you want relief, or if you want to prevent foot problems, and that is as important as finding help for a problem, then you must use the appropriate foot wear.

If you have these problems and you don't take some precautions, there is always surgery. That means cutting to relieve the tendons of the toes, breaking the toes to straighten them out, and a recovery of several months. Sounds like another great, old age adventure, doesn't it? Actually an Alaskan cruise with my mother-in-law even sounds better.

I'm sure many 'old' cowboys and cowgirls never experience any symptoms of boot or foot problems, but I'm also sure that many of you will, if you don't take care of those feet.

Shooting in boots may be the "look," but as older sportsman and older shooters, we need to stand up on our feet, and realize we may need to change our attitudes toward the shooting costumes. We need to include shooting shoes of an approved style, other than cowboy boots. The other thing is to encourage adoption of other styles of shoes that would be more comfortable and certainly less stressful on the feet. My feeling when reading the "OUTLAWED "section of the clothing requirements in the SASS Handbook, is even the SASS guidelines recognize the need for better footwear than boots, when it mentions, "Indian Moccasins work well for relaxing after a long day in boots."

Nothing has been said of "gaming" in this discussion of footwear, as it is a medical problem, and perhaps a safety issue. If it helps some of us shoot longer, what could be wrong with that? Gamers have already breached the foot wear problem, but for the rest of us, being known as serious shooters in some kind of therapeutic sport's shoe, hopefully would be acceptable.

I wonder if we realize who makes the rules for the rest of us? What I mean by that is, if younger, healthier shooters make up the rules for those of us who are experiencing problems as we age, perhaps we could put in a small lobbying word for the oldsters needing some help? Being an "old" DGB has nothing to do with my message here. Younger shooters growing older may, however, be part of my message.

If you are experiencing any symptoms of foot problems, do yourself a favor and see a podiatrist. I'm in good hands now with my beautiful doctor of the hoof, Doctor Emily Huang, D.P.M. She has encouraged me to discuss this subject with you potential old sore foots. A little care now could save you a great deal of foot pain later. She has provided a couple of websites for your perusing.



"East of the Border" is available at most bookstores or at amazon.com. The cost of the book is \$25.95. .



But, like every family, there is always that one extraordinary family member you have to really brag about. Our extraordinary family member was Maggie Darlin, SASS #18274. Maggie Darlin' finished fifth in the Ladies Modern and participated in the Sweet Sixteen Shootout. This just added to her already long list of accomplishments. Indulge me as I list them for you:

This is an extraordinary list in itself, but even more extraordinary when you realize Maggie Darlin' is deaf. She had not been exposed to firearms until 1997 when her husband, Ozark Azz, SASS #18273, found an article on Cowboy Action ShootingTM in the local Georgia newspaper, and they decided to check it out. Maggie Darlin' took the third place award at her very first match and has been hooked ever since! After watching her in action at END of TRAIL and getting to know her and her husband, we felt everyone needed to know about this extraordinary lady! We asked them to give us a simple bio on Maggie Darlin', and since Ozark Azz knows her best, and has so eloquently written about her, we have chosen to share his words about Maggie with you ...

Maggie Darlin's late mother, Mrs. Margaret Brooks, was doing research with Dr. Salk on development of the polio vaccine in 1957. Mrs. Brooks was not aware she was in her first trimester with child and exposure to the various researches resulted in Maggie Darlin being born totally deaf. Her father, a physician, promised her mother Maggie Darlin would be educated and trained in such a way that she could communicate normally in the speaking world.

Maggie doesn't use her deafness as an excuse to not do well. She doesn't

expect or want any advantages or sympathy for her deafness. She does expect the necessary time to understand the shooting sequence. During a stage briefing, she makes sure she understands the target sequence and how the stage develops. The timer simply taps her on the shoulder to signal her to start, and then, when the action starts, she can remain focused (usually!). She knows she cannot depend on the timer instructing her on which target to shoot next, or to tell her she should move to the second window instead of the doorway to shoot her last pistol. She's fast enough that she would earn a procedural before she can be corrected. She has the ability to visualize a stage well and then remain focused.

Before a match, Maggie will spend a little extra time at the range practicing more challenging shooting scenarios such as sitting and shooting, using scabbards for the long guns, and practicing with 12" round targets. But at matches, she tries to relax, get involved with the shooting, and help with the posse chores. She looks for difficult targets and studies the angles of the shots through doors or windows. She looks for stage hazards such as door jams to trip over or tricky steps to negotiate.

SASS and Cowboy Action Shooting[™] presents a challenge for Maggie to put forth her best effort in negotiating a match, and provides an atmosphere for enjoying the camaraderie of fellow shooters and renewing old friendships made over the past eight years. Reflecting on her first year of shooting is a little comical to Maggie. She remembers the hot ammo that spit lead and powder in her face, the too heavy shotgun rounds, the 'black and blue' bruised shoulder, the uncomfortable pointed toe cowboy boots, and targets that shot back at you (lead splash back)! "It's good to grow in this sport," she says. And 'grown' she has! She loves to admire other shooter's costumes. She enjoys sharing with new shooters little tricks she has learned to make gun handling quicker, especially with the double barrel. For Maggie, SASS has become a way of life. Her home cowboy club is the Lonesome Valley Regulators in Macon, Georgia. Shooting has kept Maggie from being 'lonesome' though, as it has fulfilled both social and recreational requirements in her life."

It's not everyday you get to experience shooting on a posse with someone as amazing as Maggie Darlin'. Fellow posse members summed up the experience. "It was a pleasure to shoot with such a fun and dedicated shooter," said Shotglass, SASS #17153. "Maggie didn't let her hearing deter her from shooting with speed and accuracy. I have shot

A few years ago I was looking to memorialize my children in angels embossed on my gun rig and found the number of craftsmen, options, and prices to be as many as the buckshot flying from the end of my shotgun. For such a personally significant item, I wanted to make sure my little angels were represented by the best.

Thus was born my idea and challenge to the leather makers for this year's Mason Dixon Stampede. I am challenging our most talented craftsmen and women to a comparison show down. Send me a holster or your most personally prided talent from your stock line of products that shows how your craftsmanship is distinctive. Label stamp or mark it with your information. If you are not going to be at

the Mason-Dixon Stampede, send some business cards, so if someone likes your work, they know where to buy it.

The display will be with me. I will post the times I will be under the big tent to show it off. If someone has space and time to display it at their tent, I will post where and when that is. If you want it back afterwards, send a return label, and I will ship it back to you. Otherwise, I will hold on to it to show to other shooters I see

I will pick three judges to declare the craft person who will forever own the title of the "First Ever Doc Workday Leather Challenge Victor." CIMARRON'S 1874 SHARPS .50-70 . . .

model, though it is also available in the most popular .45-70. The No. 1 Sporting Rifle .50-70 Sharps is fairly heavy, weighing in at about 11 pounds. This weight is essential, and does a good job absorbing the heavier recoil of the .50-70 cartridges. The fit and finish on my sample is flawless. It is one of the nicest Sharps reproductions I have ever seen.

The steel butt-plate has very nice color case hardening. The receiver, lever, and hammer are also color case hardened. The breechblock is blued. The receiver, which is forged rather than cast, is based on the 1874 Sharps pattern. Cimarron's No. 1 Sharps Sporting Rifle has adjustable double-set triggers that are smooth and crisp. The action is very smooth and light, yet very tight. It does not have the obnoxious automatic firing pin safety gizmo some other inexpensive imported Sharps replicas have.

The barrel is very stout, being a full 32" long. This heft, along with the pistol grip style stock, gives this Sharps superb balance for off hand shooting! The muzzle is somewhat counter-bored to protect the crown from deformation. The barrel has lapped and polished cut rifling with deep lands and grooves for improved accuracy with blackpowder. Pedersoli has been a leader in producing blackpowder firearms for many years, and they certainly know how to make a great blackpowder barrel! The twist rate of the rifling is 1 turn in just over 18 inches (1 twist in 460 mm). The barrel sports an exact reproduction of the original Sharps ladder style rear sight marked to 700 yards. This sight is finely machined, and far superior to the ladder sights on any other replica Sharps I have seen. It also has a period correct rounded, nickel-silver front blade. The barrel has a flawless high polished, deep blue finish.

The Cimarron's No. 1 Sharps has a walnut stock, with a beefy pistol grip conon my sample is perfect!

The receiver tang is drilled and tapped for Pedersoli's optional tang sights. Pedersoli has three or four grades of these optional tang sights, running from around \$100 to \$325. The top grade is comparable to ANY domestically made Soule sights

The .50-70 cartridge is a relatively recent offering from Pedersoli. While it will not necessarily "float the boats" of the rank and file BPCR shooters, I think it will be very popular with the Cowboy Action ShootingTM shooters for Plainsman and side matches. When loaded with blackpowder, the recoil from this rifle is surprisingly mild!

Ammunition

The only load I had on hand to test it (which is the only .50-70 load I use) proved to be a real gem, and showed the No. 1 Sporting rifle's wonderful accuracy potential. I use a 450-grain bullet cast from a LEE mold (I've also used Lyman's)

figuration. Both the butt-stock and foreend are devoid of chequering. This rifle's butt-stock is also of a beefier "shotgun style, with a broad butt-plate. This also helps spread the impact over a wider area, further diminishing the felt recoil. The walnut appears to have a hand rubbed oil finish. The wood to metal fit

> that incorporates two very deep grease groves. I use a lot of wheel weight and linotype material, which gives me very hard cast bullets. It is probably about the same as a 1 in 10 tin-lead mix, or maybe even harder! This minimizes deformation from fouling. The bullet is somewhat short with an almost pointed round nose.

I lube them with my 1/3 beeswax, 2/3 Crisco lube mix. I used Dixie Gunworks .50-70 brass, Winchester WMR primers, and 67 grains (volume) Hodgdon TRIPLE 7 blackpowder substitute. The powder

That should be a good combination of speed and bullet weight for those of you who, like me, prefer the heavier "pills" traveling down range.

For .50-70 brass, bullets, moulds, and dies, the best source is Dave Gullo at Buffalo Arms. I got my Lyman dies and Their address is: Buffalo Arms, 660 Vermeer Court, Ponderay, ID 83852. online at www.buffaloarms.com.

At The Range

My first shooting session with the Cimarron .50-70 Sporting rifle was at the 2005 Annual Plainfield Raid, north of Sacramento, CA. The rifle had arrived by UPS from Jamie Harvey at Cimarron just the day before the match. I showed up at Plainfield in time for the Plainsman side match. Not having fired it, I asked for some sighting shots down range at 50 yards, just before we started. I loaded one of my pet loads, pulled the stock back into my shoulder in an off- hand, standing position, and aimed at a piece of clay pigeon on the berm at about 60 yards. I squeezed off the first shot (using the "battle sight" with the ladder folded down). The half of clay pigeon turned into orange dust! As I am not generally much more than a passable off-hand rifle shot, I said "I'm good" and put it away! That would be hard to duplicate, or so I thought.

Later that day, I decided to try my hand at the "long range" side match. Because of location constraints, this consisted of a 100-yard off-hand shoot. The \$699.00

Deluxe tray, cradle wagon wheels,

was trickled down a 24" brass drop tube. I use Lyman .50-70 "Cowboy" dies, which run only about \$40 a set, to assemble the loads. The bullet was seated so no grease grooves were exposed. This allowed the 67-grain powder charge, without either over compressing the powder charge or deforming the bullet. This load should be in the neighborhood of 1,350 fps, if I am figuring right.

hand (no buffalo sticks or support of any kind) at a 10" or 12" gong, 100 yards distant. There were no sighting shots allowed. Remember, I had fired exactly one 60-yard sighter shot from this rifle, about three hours before! The Plainsman match (which I shot clean with this rifle) farthest shot was about 25 yards. Once again, I pulled it tight against my shoulder with the pistol grip, welded my cheek on the comb, and cradled the schnable forend in my off hand. I left it on battle sight, and commenced to fire as fast as I could. The first two went just under it with a six o'clock hold. I shifted to a low twelve o'clock hold, and put 5 shots on the small gong within about 45 seconds! More recently, at the High Sierra

vou had to shoot seven timed shots off-

Shoot Out annual match at Railroad Flat California, I took third place in the Single Shot rifle (blackpowder) side match with my Cimarron .50-70 Sharps! It was eight shots timed at a 6" disk at 50 yards. Using a six o'clock hold, I nailed 7 out of 8 dead center on the plate in something like 55 seconds, including loading from a Civil War cavalry carbine ammo pouch! I was shooting my pet load: 67.5 grains Triple 7 FFG, 450 Lee cast bullet, and CCI magnum rifle primer.


Conclusion



THIS MONTH IN HISTORY



1890's

August

By Ellsworth T. Kincaid, Life/Regulator #6037

26 Aug 1891 A successful attempt at rain-making is made in Midland, Texas, which had been dry since 1888.

Police officers begin questioning Visalia, California farmers, Chris 3 Aug 1892 Evans, George and John Sontag, suspected of robbing a Southern Pacific train near Collis Station in Fresno County, California in which they made off with five thousand dollars. A gunfight erupts and the suspects flee. Returning for supplies, another shoot-out develops and a deputy sheriff is killed. George Sontag is captured.

Aug 1893 Calamity Jane joins Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show.

5 Aug 1893 The Osage Indians refuse to sell their two million acres in Oklahoma to the US Government. The area, adjacent to the Cherokee Strip, will be opened to settlers on September 16th.

31 Aug 1893 An informer notifies the U.S. Marshal's office in Guthrie, Oklahoma the Doolin gang is holed up in Ingalls.

The Carey Desert Land Act is passed by Congress. The act calls for 18 Aug 1894 the Federal Government to give each state up to one million acres of public land if the state will irrigate them.

Aug 1895 Frederic Remington's 1st bronze cast, *The Bronco Buster*, is finished.

7 Aug 1895 Nineteen Hopi Indians, arrested for interfering with friendly Hopi Indians on their Arizona Reservation on November 25, 1894, are released from Alcatraz prison, California, where they had been held since January 3, 1895.

10 Aug 1895 The Buck Gang, hold-up men, rustlers, murderers, and rapists, lead by Rufus Buck, is captured after a bloodless gun battle and taken to Fort Smith, Arkansas for trial before Judge Parker. All five outlaws will be found guilty and will swing from a rope on July 1, 1896.

John Wesley Hardin, age 42, is shot and killed by John Selman, Sr. 19 Aug 1895 in the Acme Saloon, San Antonio Street, El Paso, Texas.

12 Aug 1896 Gold is discovered near Klondike Creek, northwestern Alaska by George W. Carmack. Although it takes a year for word to spread to the United States, this discovery triggers a 'gold rush'...the Klondike Gold Rush that will bring 100,000 prospectors and 'boomers' into the Klondike area over the next three years. Carmarck becomes a millionaire

13 Aug 1896 Butch Cassidy, Elza Lay, and Bob Meeks rob a bank in Montpelier,

Marshal Heck Thomas tracks Bill Doolin to Doolin's farm at 26 Aug 1896 Lawton, Oklahoma. Doolin is on the receiving end from both barrels of Thomas' 8-gauge shotgun and is killed. Some reports have Thomas finding Doolin's corpse, dead from consumption, and riddling it with the shotgun in order to collect the \$5,000 reward. Heck Thomas presented Mrs. Doolin with the reward money.

23 Aug 1897 The first Cheyenne Frontier Days celebration is held in Wyoming.


An Indian Congress is formally opened in Omaha as part of the 4 Aug 1898 Trans-Mississippi and International Exposition. Almost 500 Indians representing thirty-five different tribes attend.

Spain accepts the peace terms offered by the US and effectively sur-9 Aug 1898 renders this afternoon, ending the 'splendid little war.' As a result, US boundaries now embrace Hawaii, Guam, and the

Formal ceremonies transferring the sovereignty of Hawaii to the US 12 Aug 1898 takes place in Honolulu at noon.

Tom "Black Jack" Ketchum boards the Denver & Fort Worth Railroad (now the Colorado & Southern) in Folsom, New Mexico, in 16 Aug 1899 an attempt to rob it single-handedly. He captures the front-end crew and wounds a guard in the jaw. Ketchum is wounded in the right arm by a shotgun fired by the conductor. Ketchum will be captured and tried for train robbery, and while in captivity, he'll have that right arm amputated. 🎩





The action didn't stop when the shooting did. Catered dinners and dancing both Friday and Saturday nights added to the lively nature of this spectacle. More than one tough cowboy complained of possibly spraining their smile muscles before the event was through.

Shooting culminated on a bright morning with the top 20 men and women lining up for the Ten-X Deadly Duo. Teams were randomly paired with one man and one woman shooting together for top honors. Starting at opposite ends of a long section of town, they shot their way toward each other ending with a shotgun finale that got cheers from the crowd. Bodie Rose, SASS #18621, and Hop Sing, SASS #2021, are the Deadly Duo.

While the critics have the last word, the director is already working on a sequel scheduled for release May 4-7, 2006. You'll want to get in line early, as it is sure to be a blockbuster.

Goobers this time.





SHOOT LIKE A 19TH CENTURY COWBOY, CLEAN BRASS USING 21ST CENTURY METHODS

I have tried some brass polishing media that makes other polishing media obsolete. The polishing media is small cylindrical ceramic media with diagonal cut ends that are small enough to get into the primer pockets and effectively clean the pockets. The cylinders are approximately 1/4" in length and 5/32" in diameter.

Pards, if you would like to take a quantum leap in polishing your brass, this media is for you. I read about this polishing media in the October 2003 edition of The Single Shot Exchange, pages 10-12. I purchased the media, and it works better than everything I have ever tried, and I have tried just about everything.

A common goal of every cowboy is to get that brass looking like it did when it came spitting out of the factory. This includes polishing the

inside of the case and cleaning out the primer pocket. My common method of cleaning brass was to tumble the brass for 4 or 5 hours in a media with a popular liquid cleaner. Then, I would touch up any spots the media did not polish. The media typically did not clean primer pockets. So, I cleaned the primer pockets by hand. Even with all of this work, the inside of the case was not as clean as the outside of the case.

After reading the article in <u>The Single Shot Exchange</u>, I purchased a ceramic media polishing kit. The kit was supplied by:

Dave also supplies a quart bottle of cleaning compound to use with the

media contained in one cleaning kit. One quart of cleaning compound makes 32 gallons of cleaning liquid. Dave developed the media in conjunction with the manufacturer of the ceramic media

The instructions indicate a tumbler or vibrating type device can be used. Author Paul A. Mathews of the article in <u>The Single Shot Exchange</u> used a rotary tumbler. Mr. Mathews experienced foam coming out of the hole in the cover of the tumbler. He resolved this problem by plugging the hole with epoxy. I used a Cabela's Model 400 vibrating tumbler.

I was tumbling .38 Special cases. These cases have small pistol primer pockets. The cases I tumbled were range brass. Many cases were plugged solid with mud. Some cases had spider webs in them. I put the worse cases in the tumbler. I wanted to see if this new fangled media would work. I checked on the brass after about one hour. To my surprise, the brass looked as good as new. The inside of the brass was polished. The primer pockets were polished. The finish on the interior and exterior of the brass was very bright and lustrous. I placed another case in the tumbler. In 15 minutes, it was polished.

The instructions indicated the polishing kit was intended to be used with .38-55 to .50-140 cases. The

instructions clearly stated the media should not be used on bottleneck cases such as 30-06. There is an old cowboy saying, "There are three kinds of people. The ones that learn by reading, the few who learn by observation, and the rest of them that have to touch the fire to see for themselves if it is really hot."

I am the one that has to see if the fire is really hot. I placed a .30-30 case in the tumbler. When I removed it, the media was jammed in case. I had to cut the case apart to retrieve the media. Why did I retrieve the media? The media is much more costly than typical media. However, it will never wear out. After using the media, I rinsed in water. It looks as good as new. In my opinion, the media is well worth the price.

I contacted the distributor, David Mauer, after using his media. David told me he has media available to clean smaller cases and bottleneck cases.


As Paul A. Mathews stated in his article in <u>The Single Shot Exchange</u>,

"In my opinion, this has proved to be the best way possible to get blackpowder cartridge cases thoroughly clean, bright, and shinny inside and out, including the primer pocket. It obsoletes all other method I know of."

I agree. Try this new media out, you will like it. 1.



I LOVE COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING AND THE GUNPOWDER CREEK REGULATORS!

I love Cowboy Action Shooting™. I have to admit it took my husband, Barrel Head, SASS #21205, a long time to convince me to even watch a match. My first thoughts were, "Men dressing up as cowboys?" I think what intimidated me at first about Cowboy Action Shooting TM was the fact there were so many more men in this sport than women. When I first started, I would

often be the only woman on a posse. But right from the beginning, the men were so kind and supportive and genuinely pleased to see the "fairer" sex participating. I was immediately accepted as one of the gang. Men love to see the women get dressed up in the Victorian clothes

and are very generous with the compliments on our fashions. Everyone is very eager to help a new shooter because they want you to enjoy this sport as much as they do.

Barrel Head and I have met so many great people in this sport. We have made friends all over the country after meeting them at events like END of TRAIL, Winter Range, Mule Camp, and the SASS Convention in Vegas. Is it a sin to have too much fun?

Living here in Statesville, NC turned out to be most fortunate for those who really enjoy Cowboy Action Shooting TM . There are five clubs within a one-hour driving distance from my home. We can shoot every weekend and one weekend we can shoot two matches if we want. How great is that?

I just have to mention one extraordinary club in particular I think deserves special recognition. Nestled in the Appalachian Mountains near the town of Lenoir, NC is the Gunpowder Creek Regulators, www.gunpowdercreek.com. Follow a few winding country roads, and you will come to the cowboy town of Mine Branch. Ripshin, SASS Life #20556, owns this property that used to be a cornfield, just part of the farm his family ran for generations.

Every third Saturday of the month the town comes brimming to life with up to 60 enthusiastic shooters. When the club was formed in November 1999, thirteen cowboys showed up. At subsequent matches they would panic if more than 20 shooters would arrive not knowing whether they could handle the crowd. But, word slowly leaked out about this little club up in the mountains, and it is now a favorite destination for many cowboys for miles around. On the second Saturday of each month they host a 100-150-yard Buffalo Shoot that is also well attended.

Match Director Horsetrader, SASS Life #20213, and Range Master Ripshin, keep the club running smoothly. Every weekend you can find them working on the town, either making repairs or erecting a whole new building with the help of the Colonel, SASS #33926. Several of these buildings are lasting memorials to cowboy club members who have passed away. For example, the

Dakota Dry Goods was built in memory of Dakota Ralph, SASS #16381, and The Rail Depot for Old Fuzz, a charter member of Gunpowder Creek. Lastly, the UPS Freight building was erected for (Uncle) Parker Shotgun, SASS #3634, a retired UPS driver.

When I first started shooting there, I noticed the story lines for each stage included a bad guy (Continued on next page)

named Johnson. This poor guy really gets beat up, so I had to ask Horsetrader, who writes most of the stages, what the significance was behind this bad guy. Apparently Horsetrader really got a kick out of the character Turkey Creek Jack Johnson in the movie *Tombstone* and just had to make him and his entire extended family the resident bad guys of the town of Mine Branch.

The club would not be the success it is without a dedicated support group. Horsetrader's wife, Hanna Dubyatu SASS #30261, is the tireless secretary and treasurer of the club. El Hombre, also a family member who actually lives at the range is the private grounds keeper. The club even has its own dedicated Chuck Wagon Gang of 10 or 11 women and men who cheerfully provide a hot lunch for every match. Everyone in the gang is related to at least one of the cowboy shooters. They all pride themselves on the quality and variety of the food served. Meals have even included wild turkey and venison. The desserts are to die for! It is their way to happily make a contri-

bution to the club.

Every year the Gunpowder Creek Regulators have the Mallie Woods Memorial Shoot, a members only event, held the second Saturday in April. The event is named in honor of Ripshin's mother, Mallie, who owned the family farm where the match is now located. Eight great stages are ready and waiting, and there is never a dull moment. From jail, we aim at bulls and coyotes located on the hillside deep in the woods. Those dreaded snake targets torment us inside the Three Diamond Mine. From Madame Orr's

house, we try to nab robbers on a train high on its trestle. This has got to be one of the best yearly matches a person could hope to attend, and of course, the Chuck Wagon Gang really outdoes itself with huge quantities of mouthwatering food.

One of the unique things about this devoted club is it engages in a variety of activities out-

side the range in addition to the shooting matches. You're not limited to the company of these fine cowboys just on the firing range. They have an annual Christmas party in December and a Thanksgiving dinner after the match in November. A train ride from Dillsboro, NC to Bryson City, NC through the Great Smoky Mountains was well attended with everyone dressed in their period clothing. Recently a whole gang of cowboys and cowgirls took a cruise on the Catawba Queen, a replica Mississippi River paddle wheeler on Lake Norman just north of Charlotte.

They have had numerous fund raising events for various local cowboys with medical problems, and during the Christmas season they will take donations for Toys for Tots.

Every match begins with the raising of the colors, the Star Spangled Banner, the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, and a word of prayer. Our local US Congressman, Patrick McHenry drops by from time to time and has provided the club with a flag flown from the US Capitol. Several of the local sheriffs come by to shoot and to visit. No doubt about it, the Gun-


powder Creek Regulators are a very patriotic crowd.

SUBMITTING YOUR ARTICLES TO COWBOY ACTION SHOOTINGTM PUBLICATIONS

In this article I thought we would talk about how to get your articles published in either of the two major Cowboy Action ShootingTM publications, The Cowboy Chronicle or SHOOT! Magazine.

My alias is Rev. Alkali Al, (Alan Lott) SASS #53645. I am part of the Mr. Quigley Photography team. In past years I was editor of a school publication in Arizona. I have also taught journalism and was a beat reporter/photographer for some newspapers in the Midwest. I've seen many stories submitted for publication. Some demanded attention; many did not. The Chronicle and SHOOT! receive many submissions. So, how do you get Tex, Chucky, and others to take a second look at your stuff over someone else's story? Let's look at a few simple guidelines that can help you get there.

When writing your article, be

sure to follow the basics of journalism. Try within the first two paragraphs to answer the five W's and H - who, what, why, when, where and how. Many writing rules are broken under the guise of creativity. Sometimes this works and sometimes it doesn't. The five W's and H is a standard rule that must eventually be addressed, and the sooner the better for the sake of the reader. But, for variety, one can start an article with a narrative that pulls the reader in and then goes on to address the W's and H. Case in point, see Mark Quigley's story on the Minnesota State Championship in the July/August issue of SHOOT! Magazine.

In short, grab the reader's attention with some sort of hook and let the reader know what it is you are writing about. That's where the 5 W's and H come in. Warning – the hook should have something to do

with the article you are writing, not just something that sounds good.

Keep the story, paragraphs, and sentences short, especially the sentences. I have actually seen sentences that run on so long they wind up being the whole paragraph. This is hard reading, even if it does make sense (the reader will actually break a long sentence into parts to more easily digest it anyway, so why not keep it short in the beginning?). Even that sentence was too long. I could have made three shorter ones out of it for easier reading. However, I wanted to make a point.

Paragraphs should be natural breaks or thinking points. The previous paragraph lets you know there will probably be three or more paragraphs coming – one or more on sentences, paragraphs and stories. Paragraphs can be short or long depending on what has to be said. As a guideline, most paragraphs should run between three and five sentences. This helps keep the article moving and makes for easy assimilation of what is being said.


By the same token, the article should be kept short and sweet for a couple of reasons. The main reason is consideration of the publication you are writing for. Writing space is a premium in most publications. Your article will have a better chance of getting published if it is short and to the point without being dry and rigid. A short article is more apt to

be read by the average reader who may not have a lot of time on his or her hands to read a longer article.

If you submit photographs with the article, then the article has to be kept short unless the editor has given you other information. Remember, an editor can fill space by enlarging a photo if necessary, but it is far more difficult to cut a long article to make room for a photo. The size of the text has to be fairly consistent throughout the publication, so a long article with photographs can also present an aesthetic problem for an editor who may be working with limited space and time.

If you are submitting regularly to a particular publication, try varying your style of introduction. Use a narrative style one time (again see the

Stage Design is at the heart of not only keeping Cowboy Action Shooting TM fun, but also keeping it safe. Most of the safety issues I've seen associated within our sport have been related to Stage Design. It relates to many aspects of setting up a stage and can involve target angles, loading/unloading table angles, uneven footing surfaces, poor target design, and confusing

target engagement.

Who is responsible to make sure stages are set-up safely? The Range Master is the person directly in charge to look over all the details of all stages shot at the match. However, the Match Director and the Range Master should form a small committee of themselves and maybe one or two other experienced shooters to look over each and every stage. I've found top shooters really are valuable in this area, as they know how to dissect each aspect of every stage from a competitor's viewpoint. They can spot things even a very competent shooter who's not quite on the top competitive edge would miss.

Target angles can keep lead splatter down, which can really affect loading/unloading tables. You should also be concerned about keeping target angles safely down range so a shooter doesn't have to get too close to the 170 to shoot a target.

Related to target angles is target design, as poorly designed targets cause most lead splatter. They should be clear of excessive bullet divots on the face of the targets, and more importantly, they should be angled down so lead splatters are thrown down towards the ground.

Loading/Unloading table angles have to be adjusted to fit each and every stage. Shooting ranges that have berms for each stage have a big advantage since loading/unloading tables can be placed almost perpendicular to the shooting line. When you have such an arrangement, there is no need to close the loading/unloading tables every time someone has to go downrange to set or fix a target. Technically people are downrange of the loading tables all day while they are just shooting and RO'ing stages. So it just doesn't make any sense to close down loading/unloading tables because they go down range a little further. When loading/unloading tables are on the firing line and parallel to it, then they must be shut down anytime anyone goes down range of the firing line.

The ground should be as level as possible in a stage area, so as to avoid trip hazards. Many of our competitors are seasoned in years and might not get around as good as they used to. But when that buzzer goes off, even our Elder Statesmen feel young again and push their envelopes.

The Safety/Fun Factor relies not only on the above-mentioned items, but also when designing a stage. Try not to make your stages too complicated. When you design a course that becomes a memory test, what's the point? Are you trying to cause shooters to make mistakes? You are not going to mess up Top Guns, as most of them are Top Guns because they are really accomplished at choreographing a stage like a dance and then performing it as it was programmed it into their

subconscious minds. To the contrary, you are affecting new shooters who lack experience, good shooters that might not have evolved to the level of a Top Gun, or our older shooters who have trouble from time to time with their short-term memories. And, a confused shooter can also be a dangerous shooter. Shooters can get confused and holster cocked pistols or put down long guns in unsafe conditions.

Target sizing is also a big factor on the fun side of stage design. Shooters just seem to have more fun when targets are properly sized for "action shooting" not "target shooting." Cleanable stages add to the enjoyment of any match, and you can see the added enthusiasm displayed on all the shooters' faces. I've been to matches that have 10" pistol targets at 15 or 20 yards and also small targets out to 50 yards. I've seen the frustration in the faces of most of the shooters. I've asked some of the people who put on these matches why they do this to their shooters. They usually respond with one of the same dumb answers I always hear, "We're trying to slow down all you fast shooters." I got news for you - the reason some people shoot fast is because they have all the fundamentals down really good. They have them engrained so deep into their subconscious due to many long hours of practice that all they have to do is focus on the front sight and the rest takes care of itself. The smaller the target, the more it plays into the hands of a really good shooter. You are just once again hurting the same people indicated in the prior paragraph.

Set your stages up so everyone can enjoy them. The fast guys will just shoot them a little faster. If you are going to have some tough shots in your match that's fine. Just make them bonus shots, and that way everyone feels like they can clean the stage. Happy shooters will make a point to return to your match next year. It's just good business. 4.



Minnesota State Championship article in the July/August issue of SHOOT!), a journalistic style another time (see Shootout Under the Midnight Sun article in same issue), or maybe even a statistical style for those who really get excited about numbers and such. But remember. whichever style of article intro you use it has to grab the reader's attention. And the editor is your first reader.

Create a catchy title for the article, even if it isn't used for the finished product. The purpose here is to catch the editor's interest. Who cares if the editor changes the title as long as your article is published? Publication, that's the goal! If the catchy title is long on catchy but short on identifying what the article is about, use a subtitle to tie the title and article together.

If you are new to the article writing game and wanting to break into either of the above publications (and there are a lot of other possibilities out there too), begin by contacting the editor with a query letter. A query letter is a one page letter introducing yourself, displaying in a paragraph or two your ability to write the article you have in mind, and then explaining the slant you wish to take for the article that makes it fit into this particular publication's market. Each query letter has to be custom tailored for each publication.

Another grabber way to get your article considered for publication is to pick an interesting subject that has not been touched on yet, or take a new angle for an old or new subject. Since Cowboy Action ShootingTM is a relatively new sport, there are bound to be many subjects that have not been covered yet or haven't been covered from your unique perspective, whatever that may be.

Once you have contacted the publication and been given the go ahead to produce an article or to produce one on speculation (not guaranteed they will use it but they are interested enough to have you send the full article in), then you need to neatly package the finished product. Make sure the article is cleanly typed. This isn't hard with today's computers. Include a cover letter (this is similar to your query letter and is intended to remind the editor what you are sending him/her) with the finished manu-

script and any photos you are including. Some editors want this all in hard copy, some want everything on disk, and some want both. You need to do a little research here to find out how the editor wants your submission. When you are given the go ahead for the article, the editor will usually inform you how the article is to be submitted. Even if they ask for a hard copy of the article, most editors will also want the article on disk with either MS Word or Corel Word Perfect. They will usually tell you which software and version they prefer.

Do not expect your items to be returned! If you want them returned, you must include a self addressed stamped envelope for the publisher to use. Your best bet is to make sure you have a copy of everything at home and not worry about getting anything back from the publisher. And one last thing - don't expect to see anything in print right away. Publishers often work six months or more ahead of the publication date. The Chronicle and SHOOT! usually print articles a lot sooner than that, but they still have their deadlines too.

Well, we've touched on the idea of sending photographs with your article (this always helps to "sell" the article by the way, but they have to be really good photos), but this article would be too long to include everything we need to say about photos and/or artwork. I will use another column to inform you of everything you need to know about submitting photos and/or artwork. (Or at least everything I know about submitting photos and/or artwork.)
