has been training me, and I have watched numerous episodes of Cowboy Action ShootingTM on television. Let me tell you, they make it look so easy! 

There's an old story about a cowboy who drifted about in the deserts of the Southwest for probably way longeder than he should have. He had pretty quickly come to the conclusion the desperately dry, desperately hot places he wandered were filled with treacherous vegetation and wildlife, every one of which was prepared to sting you, stab you, or

sink a set of fangs in you. One day, he ran upon a native, and he was able to pull out a map and point to the words written on it and ask how those Spanish names were pronounced. The native gent told him, and the weary cowboy looked at him, shook his head and said: "It figures. They even spell "Hell" with a 'J' here!" (Think La Junta, La Jolla ...)

Having once taken Spanish (and French, German, and a smattering of Latin), I have come to appreciate the predicament of our cowboy traveler. In fact, it seemed a common "ailment" amongst the cowpuncher set that some of those proper Spanish terms got a might twisted and turned. Some came to be this way just simply to save time. That's where we get things like chaps (pronounced shaps) from chaparejos and taps from tapaderos. In other instances

when a waddie just simply couldn't get his eye teeth to see a word proper-like as far as pronunciation went, he'd just say it the way his Anglo ear figured sounded right. Some of those words don't on the surface sound much like their original Spanish, but if you listen real close, it still echoes in that lingo. And, oh, how it has enriched our English vocabulary!

Here's a sampling of some of the words that form our cowboy lingo:

Buckaroo: This comes from *vaquero*, a word simply meaning cow herder.

Calaboose: A great word for jail or prison that is a corruption of the Spanish *calabozo*.

Caviarde (as well as Cavvy and several other variants): This comes from the words caballada and refers to a band of saddle horses rather than to just a herd of horses in general. In some parts of the Northwest, the word remuda is used with the same meaning. The origins of this are distantly Spanish/ Mexican (remonta) for "remount" or replacement.

Chaps: This comes from the Spanish "chaparejos" which means leather breeches or overalls.

Chinks: Not a politically-incorrect phrase when used as a gringo-fied compressing of the word "chigadero." Chinks are a shortened version of the standard length chaps (Bermuda short chaps or high-water chaps, if you want to be funny), while chaps is pronounced with the softer "sh," chinks is pronounced with the harder "ch" as in "cherry" rather than "sherry." Don't ask me why; that's just how it is!

Cinch: Meaning the girth that (Continued on next page)

keeps a saddle on a horse's back. This comes to us as a shortening of the word "cincha."

Hackamore: This word comes from the word "jaquima." The hackamore is a piece of headgear used to train young horses in the California tradition of reining. This is a long-term process of four steps (jaquima to freno or hackamore to bit). The working part of the hackamore is the bosal or nosepiece that is used to apply pressure to the nasal bones of the animal. No bit is used.

Theodore: This is a corruption of the word fiador. The fiador a part of the hackamore made from soft cotton rope or hair. It forms the crown piece and throat latch, and suspends the knotted end of the bosal where the reins are attached.

McCarty or McCarthy: Yet another corruption, this time of the word mecate. (This is pronounced with the 1st "e" soft and the second "e" as a hard "a"). The mecate is a rope made of hair (generally mane hair, but sometimes hemp, mohair, or even angora) that forms the reins for a horse being trained in a hackamore. Equipped with slobber straps, the mecate is also used in the second stage of training with a snaffle bit.

Dally: Dallies are taken

around a saddle horn during roping. The word is taken from "dar la vuelta" meaning to take a turn or a twist with a rope.

Hoosegow: A great word that stems from the Spanish "juzgado" which means a tribunal or court.

Jerky: Yup, also Spanish, coming from the word "charqui", dried beef.

Lasso: While introduced by the Mexicans into the cowboy vocabulary, the origins of the word are actually Portuguese from the word "laco" which means "snare."

Lariat: This, of course comes from la reata. The reata is a rawhide rope used in dally roping.

Mustang: from the word "mesteno." The mesta were early horse raisers. Horses that strayed from their mesta owners were called "mestenos."

Palomino: from the word "polomilla" describing a pale or golden-colored horse with a flaxen mane.

Quirt: This is the flexible short, often shot-loaded whip carried by the cowboy. It comes from the word "cuarta."

Savvy: From the Spanish "sabe" which means to know or understand. For those of you who enjoyed "Pirates of the Carribean," if you were paying attention, you'll know it was also a word used earlier in history by other equally colorful characters!

Ten Gallon Hat: The term doe not mean the hat actually holds ten gallons. That gallon bit refers to "galon" which means braid. A ten-gallon hat would have had ten rows of braid on it and would have been a rather fancy affair in anyone's book!

Rodeo: This comes from the word "rodear," which means to gather or encircle. In the old days, this was what a roundup was called. As time progressed, it has changed meaning and now refers to an event or contest in which cowboys compete for prize money.

Compadres, there's a lot more words lurking out there that have come to us from across our southernmost border. There's also a heap that have come to us from


the French-Canadians from across the 49th Parallel and from the Indians as well. The cowboy has also added words and phrases in plain 'ol English that are both colorful and humorous. If you want to look up some of these words and phrases, I'd recommend the books of Ramon F. Adams (in particular, his "Western Words" and "The Cowman Says it Salty"), as well as "A Dictionary of the Old West" by Peter Watts. I'll head on down the trail for a spell meantime. 
These are the very same Pards you

read raising the red flag of doom on the Wire. The Wire is the Split Personality of SASS. Just remember it doesn't matter if you are one of the fast gun group that are at the top of their game and see this as a Competition with old time guns, or just the weekend Cowboy that likes to get as dressed up as you can and shoot old time guns. Both groups are having a good time, and fun is most of what SASS is all about. There are just as many members of SASS that spend their extra (?), if there is such a thing - ha ha ha, money on what they wear as those who spend it on more guns.

On the Wire you will hear terms like Power Factors, Level Playing Field, Mouse Farts, or Warthog Loads—none of which make one dang blasted difference to most of the Pards and Pard'ettes that come out on a Saturday or Sunday to play. Many have not the slightest idea what a Power Factor is, or realize that there is no such thing as a Level Playing Field, and to most, Mouse Farts or Warthog Loads are funny sounding names for the choice of caliber you shoot. If you are here in Cowboy Action Shooting $^{\text{TM}}$ as another form of competition (Level Playing Field), you already know the only way for you to excel is to PRACTICE, just like those in the top shooter category do. Come and sit by our fire, enjoy a good cup of coffee with some of the best people you ever wanted to meet, and enjoy the Game. After you have been in Cowboy Action ShootingTM for a period of time, you will have decided if you are in it for the competition or the fun of playing cowboy, or both, and then it is safe to venture into the dark world of the Wire. By that time you will already know the majority of the shooters in this game/sport don't even venture onto the Wire unless they are looking for something specific, and the opinions expressed so vehemently on the Wire are not necessarily the opinion of the total membership.

The Cowboy Way, as I see it, is all about attitude and a way of life. The Wire is nothing but attitude; therein, lays the difference. So, if you venture to the cyber world of SASS forums, always remember the Wire is not the whole of SASS. It's just one tiny part of SASS, and to be tread upon with care and trepidation. A.





I THINK WE'RE FINALLY GETTING IT **RIGHT!**

Every time I open a thread on the SASS Wire or read an article in The Cowboy Chronicle pertaining to new rules, new categories, power factors, race guns, more difficult stage set-ups, gamers and such ... I cringe. I took on the job of match director for the love of the sport. I did not take it on to be a baby sitter, a modification inspector, an arbitrator, or a judge and jury. It doesn't pay enough! Every time a new category is created I have to try and figure out some way to still give out a decent trophy for each category at our annual match without raising match fees. Soon, if this trend for more and more categories continues, I'll have to order buckles for every entry! When new rules are passed such as the mods covenants I wake up from nightmares of a long line of cowpokes waiting for me to inspect their firearms, tape measure in hand. Gotta get em thru, too, as my Pard is waiting for them to get over there where he has the chronograph set up so's he can test their Oh, and we gotta let a couple pards shoot thru early so they can baby sit the pistol knockdowns and keep 'em calibrated for the whole day ...

Yes, of course, I'm exaggerating, but really, do any of the people advocating all these changes ever take into consideration the burden they place on the people that actually put on the matches? The volunteers that make it happen ... for no pay?

After nine years of shooting I have yet to see anyone shooting these loads that has raised such a ruckus. Yes, some show up with ultra light loads occasionally, but usually after a day of constant ribbing from everyone, they come to the next match with something more substantial! If there is in fact a problem with this, it has proven to be self-correcting in this part of the country. For the record, I shoot .45-200 in my pistols and .45-250 in my rifles and could care less what anyone else shoots. Really!

As far as the "race gun issue," I don't see the point of further debate, as it's a done deal. The rules have been established. The point many do not get is the fact many people (myself included) have their guns fine-tuned simply for the joy of operating smooth handling firearms. I knew upfront sending my Colts to Bob James or my Rugers to Wes Flowers and my rifle to Cody Conager or Spur would not put me in the winner's circle, and it was not my intent. I put on a little school for ladies in our area, and I know from working with them that they would have

no interest in fighting the heavy springs or clunky, rough actions inherit in out of the box firearms. They would also soon lose interest in shooting "service loads."
As to the so-called "gamer" issue: (I

HATE that term) I think the most misunderstood aspect of the whole thing is this. It seems to me everyone that really thinks winning is so important are the people that are not winning! They also seem to take offense because they apparently think the people that do win get some perverse pleasure from beating everyone else. We have several National and State Champions that shoot at our club, and I see none of that in any of them. The people that dominate this sport are driven. They are driven by the motivation of trying to best their own performance at each attempt. They don't do this to belittle anyone; they do it to push their own limits in a game they love, to test themselves. If you play a game that uses a timer, it is only natural to try to learn a way to do things faster. The champions that shoot at our club are the first to work a posse. They are the first to take anyone that is interested aside and show 'em every trick they know. They are dedicated to being the best they can be and willing to show you how to do it ... if you are willing to put in the time. If you are not motivated, do not have the practice time or the physical ability to be top gun, then you can most certainly enjoy all the rest of the fun aspects of the game and have a good time.

While some lament the "good old days," I think the good old days are right now. I think most everything has changed for the good. Almost all clubs use knockdowns and actually score shotgun targets. Most of the lines and/or roping, throwing, stomping is off the clock now, which allows the shooters to really ham it up before getting down to bidness. Almost no clubs make you shoot from awkward, uncomfortable shooting positions anymore. Most everywhere has carpet on the tables and shade and water. The safety rules seem to be much LESS "relaxed" now than when I started. Most all the targets are hittable (unless ya go too fast). And, none of these positive changes were the result of any new rules. They were the result of shooters (customers) feedback.

THE LEVEL PLAYING FIELD AND DRAWING FOUR SHOTGUN SHELLS

There has been considerable discussion about the "level playing field" in SASS. A level playing field is an ideal that most sports and games strive to achieve, and that is a good thing and should be encouraged. A level playing field means the conditions under which all contestants compete or play are as uniform as possible.

We have a rule about the number of shotgun shells that can be loaded into a gun. This rule is applied to all without regard to their physical skills. No attempt is made to control for what may be superior reflexes, eyesight, or dexterity on the part of another competitor in order to make things fair for the competitors who don't possess these same

abilities. This is an important distinction to make because while leveling the playing field is laudable, it is important not to impede an individual to create the *illusion* of a level playing field.

Recently during a discussion about leveling the playing field, one of the topics was the perceived disadvantage of the double shotgun when compared to the 1897 Winchester. Indeed, all agreed a double is at a disadvantage in several situations. These include when an uneven number of shells are required in the stage, and especially when the shotguns are staged vertically. Where the parties in this discussion didn't agree was about the number of shotgun shells the shooter should be able to draw from the belt at any one time. Some in the discussion made the point most double shooters can't really take advantage of more than two shells drawn at any one time while a '97 shooter who single loads over the top can do so with four and sometimes more shells drawn at the same time. Some suggested a rule that would forbid a shooter from having more

than two shells in their grasp at any one time would be a good thing to level the playing field.

I strongly disagree! The ability to hold a certain number of shells in the hand is a personal physical trait. It isn't the same as an equipment issue where an argument can be made that the rules should specify performance. Saying there should be a limit to the number of shotgun shells a person ought to be allowed to hold in their hand would be akin to saying Michael Jordan should only be allowed to start his jump within three feet of the hoop or a major league pitcher should never throw a fastball more than 78 miles per hour because this is what the average person can do.

That said, there are ways to fairly address such issues. Thinking specifically about the '97 shotgun, while it would be an unpopular ruling, it would be fair to all if it was eliminated from the game entirely, its use could also be restricted to certain categories. While neither of these options is likely to happen, either would level the playing field in a way that is done without regard to anyone's individual physical ability. More realistically, it is appropriate and fair to design stages that may reduce the relative advantage of the 1897 over the double. For example, making sure a number of staging options are available to the shooter, including horizontal surfaces would help. Another example would be to have the shotgun shot twice, then requiring movement to another station before shooting again. This negates the advantage of drawing four because there is time on the way to the next stage to return to the belt for more shells. Of course, some people will still exhibit faster reflexes, quicker thinking, better luck, and more speed moving from one spot to another. All of these are more examples of advantages that some people have that we shouldn't try to create a rule to prevent them from exhibiting.

If two people step up to the same stage, shoot with guns that conform to the rules, according to the same scenario, and on the same targets, the playing field is as level as it can be. Still, one person will win and the other will lose. Most likely the person who will win is going to be the person with the greatest skill, which is natural ability plus practice. It would be unwise and unfair to create rules specifically designed to try to impede the performance of the shooter with greater skills by limiting the use of those skills to the same levels of performance demonstrated by any other shooter. (You finally hit on the answer the Wild Bunch has been advocating for sometime ... stage design, stage design, stage design ... editor-in-chief.) 🎩

PLEASE DON'T MAKE ME CHANGE **MY LOADS!**

At a couple of local shoots, two TGs mentioned upcoming expected solutions to the light load problem by the Wild Bunch. Let me strongly suggest you (plural you) adopt first the medical oath: "First, do no harm."

Both TGs seemed to think all calibers would have minimum bullet weights decreed. If this happens, you will worsen the competitiveness situation, and will probably require bullet weights that will be a detriment for many competitors. Let me give some examples.

Front sights on Open Tops are so low that, to shoot to point of aim, I use 180 gr. bullets in my .44 Colts, and a friend uses 170 gr. bullets in his Schofields. If forced to shoot heavier bullets, we will be shooting high, and there will be no solution to the problem, except custom-made front sights silver-soldered in, plus then re-bluing of the barrels. These are not wimp loads; knockdowns go down every time.

My .38-40 Colt Lightning rifle, which I love to shoot, feeds reliably only a certain bullet shape. I can only get that in a 145-grain bullet. If I am forced into 180 grains, the reliability is gone. Also, my old Lyman manual shows a 170 gr. cast bullet as their "standard" bullet for the .38-40. Again, these are no wimp loads, whether I load smokeless or blackpowder.

I have recently experimented with a round ball in my Uberti '66 rifle, with a good charge of APP, in hopes of being a bit more competitive without having to sell my rifle and buy a new one in a different caliber. If you look at historically available ammunition, most cartridges were available with a round ball or with a "bullet." The .45 round ball is the same one I use in my 1860s, which again, takes down the knockdowns with authority.

I think that if something must be done, then Long Hunter's letter to The Comboy Chronicle, in which he proposed a reasonable power factor, is probably the best.

Please consider ALL the ramifications of whatever course is being discussed, and do not do as Congress does - a quick "solution" to give the appearance of effort. Do not set the rules so that, while you are precluding the "wimp" loads from the little calibers, you inadvertently make things worse for those of us who don't want to shoot .38s or .32s, but would like to do well in the standings.

(The really difficult part of all this is devising a solution that is good for the game. What's good for the game should not disenfranchise any of our members, but it could well mean some individuals may have to make changes. The sad part

is there are only a few folks who are building loads that bend everyone's sensi $bilities\ and\ who\ practice\ enough\ to\ make$ these very light loads work well enough to win. If only they would stop these activities, there would be no need for any additional "rules" addressing minimum loads. Vigilante peer pressure is another solution that comes to mind (SASS members telling other SASS members their loads are way too light). END of TRAIL and Founders Ranch has solved the light loads issue for our local matches. It remains to be seen what the Territorial Governors will decide in December needs to be done for Cowboy Action ShootingTM as a whole. And, by the way ... nothing on the table is draconian, by any means ... editor-in-chief.) 🎩

OUR RIGHT AND OUR DUTY TO BE ARMED— **EVERYWHERE**

I've written on the subject of gun rights many times, but a stronger approach is in order given recent events. In his book, Guns, Freedom, and Terrorism, the NRA's Wayne LaPierre advocates a good way for Americans to protect themselves against terrorism is to be well armed.

"With the threat of more terror attacks ... Americans are looking toward the protection of the Second Amendment. The most basic element of that right goes to the individual citizens' ability to protect themselves, their families, their homes, their communities, and, if need be, their nation."

I agree—Americans should arm themselves against terrorists. To me, that includes foreign terrorists that fly airplanes into buildings and domestic terrorists that take advantage of these idiotic "gun-free zones" as Cho did at Virginia Tech!

Self defense is a God given right; an instinct instilled in every living thing to survive and protect their own. It's an indisputable law of nature that cannot be repealed—even by the most left-leaning Washington politician or those ridiculous gun-free zones. We have an inalienable right to defend ourselves, as well as our families, and our Constitution guarantees every American the right to keep and bear the instruments necessary to do that. On this, there is no argument or room for discussion in my view. Gun-Free zones, or killing zones as I call them, only provide shooting galleries for those like Cho. Did you notice he wasn't deterred at all by the school's gunfree zone rules; yet, who paid the price for that rule's violation?

The Police or the armed forces can't protect every American 24/7 ... but we can. What do you mean, Colonel? Simply this, although government agencies can't be everywhere, guns in the holsters of Americans could be everywhere and provide effective protection against all types of aggression—including terrorists, thugs, and the dangerously insane.

We can't and shouldn't depend on government as the only means of protection against crime and terror. I get back to the law of self-defense here. We have the God given right and the God given duty to protect our own regardless of what those on the antigun left try to force on us.

Fact: More guns = less crime. John Lott conclusively illustrated this in his book, and I've written about it so many times, gotten into so many arguments with so many anti-gunners and antigun politicians more times than I can count. What if those on the planes of 9/11 or at Virginia Tech had been armed, could the terrorists have taken over or could Cho have killed 32? I doubt it. Look how effective the Americans were that took offensive action, rushed the terrorists, and crashed the plane into a field saving thousands of lives that day. What if those passengers had been armed? Need anyone on the plane have diedother than a few worthless terrorists? What if those students had been armed? How far would Cho have gotten in his rampage? We can only speculate. The point here is our enemy's success on 9/11 and in gun-free killing zones depends on encountering unarmed, vulnerable targets. Terrorists, foreign and domestic, are like street thugs in their approach. They seek out the softest/ weakest targets with the highest payoff. Thugs would much rather attack a mark they know is unarmed than they would someone that might be packing. This is indisputable given the fact that in areas where concealed carry is permitted, there is much less crime than in areas where guns are prohibited.

The bottom line is simple. Terrorists and thugs prefer less carry by those they attack. Doesn't it stand to reason, therefore, the less well-defended Americans are, the greater the terrorists' odds of waging a successful war against us? If you answered yes, doesn't it also stand to reason in these times

of terrorism those who talk against expanded carry, advocate gun-free killing zones, or expansion of gun control should be looked upon with incredible disbelief and very real anger? I think so because when it comes down to it, whether gun controllers realize this or not, their approach promotes that which America's enemies, terrorists, thugs, and whackos would like to seemore vulnerable Americans.

So in light of our war for survival, what does this continued push for enhanced gun control say about diehard anti-gunners? It says it's time America stood up in unison under the combined leadership and coordinated efforts of GOA, NRA, SAF, etc., go on total offense, putting the anti-gunners on defense for a change, and push back hard against these gun control nuts whose behavior is seriously endangering America's future. Americans should be mad as hell over gun control measures that leave us vulnerable, and we should refuse to negotiate or even listen to any more of that rot! We've seen the deadly results of being unarmed, and I for one don't like what I've seen. Do you?

In our collective memory as Americans, it is hard to imagine a time in our history without our national pastime, but our memories of the game's great players and teams seems to dim as we reach back before the beginning of the twentieth century, back when base ball was written as two words, pitchers threw the ball fifty feet to reach the plate, and players caught the ball with their bare hands.

THE FIRST WORLD SERIES IN 1884

If you were living out west in 1884 and were a base ball crank (slang for fans), you would have been eagerly awaiting the arrival of the mail bag with the most recent issue of The Sporting Life at the railroad depot, or hanging around the local telegraph office to find out more about the first ever post season championship series between pennant winners. This Championship of the Americas is considered by many to be the first World Series of the Major Leagues, and it would put a team from the smallest state in the union into the record books.

Because an Indonesian volcano had erupted on the island of Krakatoa in the fall of 1883, 1884 was the year without a summer. Northern teams headed south to Virginia for spring training, only to

return north to snow storms at the start of the season. A severe frost in June destroyed crops in upstate New York and New England. At the end of 1884, there would be a novel innovation for the boys of summer, a championship series between the winners of the pennants in the American and National Leagues, and a team from the smallest state in the union would become the first World Series champions.

Providence, Rhode Island would field its only major league team, the Grays of the National League, from 1878 to 1885. The 1878 Grays would see future Hall-of-Fame pitcher John Montgomery Ward make his debut with the team. In 1879, the son of a former slave named William E. White played a single game for the Providence Grays of the National League. His stint at first base for the Providence club made the Brown University student the very first African American to don a major league uniform. Grays' center fielder, Paul Hines, would lead the league in batting average, home runs, runs batted in, as well as make the first unassisted triple play in baseball history, the only one made by an outfielder. Hines was also partially deaf and persuaded umpires to start using hand signals instead of just making verbal calls. He also was the first player to wear sunglasses on the field. Grays' catcher Sandy Nava was the first Hispanic to play in the major leagues, and the Grays' star pitcher at the start of the '84 season was Charlie Sweeny, the first Californian to play in the majors.

Sweeny would quit the team midseason after taking the field drunk and then storming off after being told to play right field. From 1878 to 1885, the Grays posted a record of 438 wins and 278 losses.

The game of base ball was played barehanded with the exception of the catcher who wore only a small unpadded fingerless glove. The players worked for little money and had no job security; the reserve player rule made them almost slaves to the team owners. During the team's brief tenure, the Grays had seven winning seasons and won two pennants. Stepping into the star pitching role after the departure of Charlie Sweeny, pitcher Charles "Old Hoss" Radbourn won an astounding 59 games in 1884 and willed the Grays into baseball history. The team's list of records set and baseball firsts is enough to fill a record book.

Egged on by the press, the players of the New York Metropolitans were the top team of the American Association and during the summer, they challenged the top team of the National League, the Providence Grays, to a postseason championship game. The Grays players countered with a three game series and a money bet between the players, winner take all.

The postseason series with the Metropolitans was to be played at the Polo Grounds, located north of Central Park in Manhattan. The rules of the American Association would be observed, but pitchers would be allowed to pitch without restrictions on their arm movements in the pitching box.

The Sporting Life reported, "These will probably be the greatest games ever played, and will be the first time in the history of the game that the championship teams of two associations have met in a formal series to decide superiority. If the weather is fine, their meeting will be witnessed by larger crowds than have ever been seen on the Polo Grounds." The Metropolitans were the first New York team to win a major professional championship and they were planning a torchlight parade to be held the night before the series began. Their grand parade, however, was rained out after an unseasonably warm day brought dark clouds that night.

The soggy weather that had snuffed out the Met's grand parade forced down attendance for the next day's opening game. Some Rhode Islanders hopped trains to travel 150 miles to bear witness to the greatness of the Grays. The series was advertised, though not heavily, and the turnout was estimated to be below 3,000. The thermometer for the afternoon game hovered at 51 degrees.

The New York Metropolitans were ready to show the world they

I "nuked" some coffee I had built on Monday the week before and commenced dressing. Now I gotta tell ya, to properly hunt elks, the weather must be cold, and it was. Better yet, there should be a nice layer of snow on the deck. We could see snow on the mountain from the house(s). Frenchy,

A WYOMING ELK HUNT

John the mountain man, and I are neighbors living a mere nine miles or so from the elk hunting grounds ... if one draws a tag for this area!

I put on everything I own: long johns, short johns, flannel lined Wranglers, two pair of socks: one cotton and the other thick wool jobs, and covered them with a pair of Thinsulated boots, flannel lined LL Bean canvas shirt, a woolen vest, and a funny looking reversible cap with ear flaps. It's reversible by the fact it can be turned "inside out" to reveal the day glow color required by some Game and Fish law. My granddaughter, Malori, gave it to me some years ago. After dressing, I felt like Ralphy, the little kid in the movie, "A Christmas Story," who couldn't move after his mother dressed him for school in the wintertime.

Then I went out into the gum shop (I misspelled the sign over the door) to outfit myself for elk hunting. My friend, Sage, and I usually hunt with shooters like the ol' timey guys did, and since none of my scoped rifles have ever been "papered" (that means sighted in for you non-gunners), I had to make a decision on which shooter to take. My .45-70 Buffalo gun is too heavy, and my other .45-70 shooters have never been properly "papered." My Marlin .38-55 only shoots lead bullets that don't "blossom" worth a hoot, and my new Remington Model 700 in .30-06 is promised to my grandson, Russell, if he continues to get good grades and doesn't go to juvvie too often, was out. After reviewing the inventory of big guns, smaller guns, and little guns, I set on my trusty Marlin 1894 in .30-30 cal. with hand built 170 grain soft-point cartridges. I built them. Since elk hunting requires being a fairly good rifleman, I loaded only two rounds in the rifle. The box of twenty more rounds went into my pack.

Since anything could and has happened, one must carry a pack, back or otherwise, with survival equipment. I filled mine with water bottles, field dressing kit: skinning knife with gut hook, caping knife and bone saw, rubber gloves, plastic garbage bags, extra socks, light weight thermal blanket, energy bars, three tamales, a side order of refried beans, self charging flash light, and a TV Guide. I grabbed my day glow vest, another Game and Fish piece of attire, my Thinsulated LL Bean coat con Thinsulated gloves and loaded the whole shebang into the Gray Goat.

When I got into the truck, I inadvertently set off the alarm. So at 0531, the horn was blasting its fool head off!!! Shortly Frenchy drove up and commented, "If that damn thing goes off while up on the mountain, I'll shoot it." I agreed. Just to be safe, we both turned off our cell phones.

I picked up John, the mountain man, at 0546 who loaded his scoped Weatherby Vangard in .30-06, a rope come-along, and a rolled up plastic sled into the Gray Goat. I asked why was he bringing his rifle. "Self protection," was his reply.

A few minutes later we were bouncing along the dirt road by Heart Mountain to the rendezvous area. (For those of you what don't speak no French, that means "meetin' place.) There we met up with Les, Frenchy's friend, and now mine, I suppose. After a few minutes of commiserating, the plan was set. John, the mountain man, and I were to "go up and follow that ridge," while Frenchy and you know who would go up another ridge.

Now, I gotta tell ya, I have seen this ridge from my house for the past five or six years and never thought I'd be required to climb the damn thing! Frenchy and Les would then "herd" the large bunch of elk Frenchy has been looking in on for the past week in our direction. I would harvest my cow, which in the doing would turn the herd back and Frenchy would bag his. Les gave, actually loaned, us one of his fancy walkie talkie things, and we were off.

Within two to three hundred yards of the trucks John, the mountain man, and I spotted several very large shadows in a nearby meadowish clearing. Remember, it's still 0'dark thirty. I whispered, "John, (I omit 'the mountain man' when directly addressing John, the mountain man.) what's in the meadow?" John, the mountain man, glassed (that means looked through his binoculars with built in range finder) the creatures and declared, "Muleys." Soon the herd of deer became aware of our presence and gracefully bounded off.

An hour or so later we were on top of the ridge. Now I gotta tell ya, the most climbing I do is the seven steps to my bedroom, bath, dressing room, or the seven steps up from my TV room to the liquor cabinet for more medicinal Irish and water. I also keep

walking to a minimum. I drive my Gray Goat to the mailbox, which is across the road at the end of my drive way! But, climbing up a ridge a couple of miles or so from the truck that at times seemed it was going straight up was a real labor of love/insanity. I persevered with the thought that going back would be down hill. Now I know why John, the mountain man, is called John, the mountain man! He's an absolute goat!!

After reaching the top of the ridge, the scenery of the Big Horn Basin was spectacular! We then moved further up the ridge and took up positions amongst some scrub pine. We then looked west and could see Frenchy and Les climbing the other ridge some mile or two away. They could only be seen with our binoculars with built in range finders. I turned on the little, hand held radio thing and it soon crackled, "Breaker!" I answered, "Hello. Who is it?" It was Les. Seems they had spotted the herd of some one hundred plus elk bedded down in a valley and were about to start "herding" them. In the meantime John, the mountain man, and I surveyed the top of our ridge. Elk had been in the area some time in the recent past along with deer and range cattle. I shan't go into detail as how we were able to detect this considering the sensitive nature of some of the recipients of this write up. Suffice to say, "Doo-doo of varying color, size, and configuration."

While John, the mountain man, and I were awaiting the arrival of the herd of elk, we glassed the mountain, surrounding valleys, and drainages for any sign of elk. We did spot three and a half other hunters; the half was a small boy type. They were on a ridge about a mile and some away. They soon left ... goodie! From time to time we would glass Frenchy and Les walking along the other ridge, and from time to time they would walk below the top of the ridgeline to hide from the now moving elk. By now, they had walked close to six miles! John, the mountain man, and I had put our packs down and rested our shooters against them, but in a "ready for use" position. I found a rock with a flat slanted surface and sat on it whilst glassing the areas. Soon, I found myself leaning against the rock and soon lying on the smooth, flat angled surface of same. I stared up into the heavens, and the next sound I heard was me snoring! Fortunately John, the mountain man, didn't hear me since he was "irrigating" a rock. I quickly sat up somewhat embarrassed.

The radio crackled, and it was Les again, "Stand by," he said. In about three minutes we could see the long, dark line of something coming up a valley in our direction. The range finder binoculars showed a herd of many elk moving toward us at a fairly rapid pace; not running, but moving quickly. The binoculars with built in range finders also showed us Frenchy and

Les still walking the ridge! The long brown line seemed to wind through the trees and rocks oh so slowly like a very long snake, but soon we could make out the figures of the lead cows followed by other large cows, calves, and many bulls. They were coming right to our ridge!! John, the mountain man, and I stayed in our positions and didn't move anything, not even our eyes! As the hunting gods would have it, the wind was in our face and the herd was up wind from us.

Now, normally one wants to harvest one of the animals at the end of a moving herd, since if one shoots a lead animal and it doesn't fall immediately but goes off with the herd, one loses the blood trail. One NEVER allows a wounded animal to leave. But, since the plan was the herd would retreat from whence it came, shooting a lead cow was the strategy.


Soon the herd of alces-alces was directly in front of us!! I picked out a huge, barren cow in the lead. She must have been less than sixty yards away! If I hadn't been busy getting set to harvest, I would have measured the distance with my binoculars with the built in range finder. I aimed my trusty Marlin about four inches below the top of her neck line and about five inches behind her head, took a deep breath, held it, and tightened my hand. Nothing happened! I had forgotten to "cock" the trusty rifle. (I have come to find that trusty rifles are only as trusty as the rifleperson.) I slowly cocked the rifle with my right thumb without ever moving a muscle, except for the aforementioned thumb muscles and repeated the above sighting scenario. I never heard the rifle bark, but did hear the "whap" of the bullet hitting the designated target. The bullet had broken the cow's neck and spinal cord. She fell like a bad habit ... the others turned and ran in the direction from which they had come, a true thundering herd ... the plan was working!!!

By the time I was able to find my field dressing kit: rubber gloves, bone saw, skinning knife with gut hook and caping knife, we heard what must have been Frenchy's rifle. John, the mountain man, being the verbose individual he is said in my direction, "Not a bad shot." We set about the task of field dressing the cow and the task of moving her down the ridge to the Gray Goat and to Roger's Meat Processing place in Powell, Wyoming.

Now, I gotta tell ya, except for getting prepared for the hunt, ridge climbing, seeing the muleys, falling asleep, seeing the elk/deer/cow sign, and John, the mountain man, irrigating a rock, we didn't see or shoot poop!!! 

The biggest movement occurred in Germany in 1999 when the first group of cowboys went to an ex-US military shooting facility known as "Rose Range" to many of us ex-soldiers in Berlin, Wannsee, and kicked off the first match organized by the German Organization, BDS, using slightly modified SASS rules, as not all of these rules were legal in Germany at that time.

Thirty-four participants competed at that first Cowboy Action Shooting[™] event that has since grown by leaps and bounds all over Germany and the adjoining European countries. There are now more than 2000 organized Cowboy Action Shooting[™] members registered with BDS in Germany, plus an almost equal number of active fans organized in other clubs—and most of them are SASS members as well!

Even in countries that used to be behind the "Iron Curtain," such as Hungary, Poland, Slovakia, Slovenia, Croatia, the Czech Republic, and as of late at the IWA and IWB in Germany, Lithuania, and Latvia have come aboard and want to join us in this great sport, all the while portraying the "Old West" in the years prior to 1900. That was also a time in which many immigrants from "Old Europe" were also crossing the Atlantic aboard sailing ships and traveling to the "New World" to make their fortunes there.

Can you imagine what if feels like for me, an ex-GI stationed in Germany in the years of the "Cold War," to travel to these "enemies of the past" and see them dressing up like cowboys of our "Old West" and using our guns and equipment to portray something that their governments despised and fought against not so long ago?

Today, thanks to Cowboy Action ShootingTM, we shoot WITH each other for fun—not AT each other in animosity! I am very happy this has come to pass \dots

Cowboy Action ShootingTM-Europe, as an international Federation, is now firmly established in Europe with its own Headquarters in Vienna, Austria, to assist interested shooters in joining with us and enjoying Cowboy Action ShootingTM and the "Spirit of the Game." The founding of Cowboy Action ShootingTM-Europe was discussed and planned with the assistance and promotion of The Wild Bunch while we attended the December 2006 SASS Convention in Las Vegas.

US Grant, Tex, Chiz, and others at SASS Headquarters gave us the best of advice and a hearty "go ahead" for this project aimed at enticing yet more avid fans of the "Cowboy Way" to join the ranks and blaze a trail all across this great old continent!

The SASS Handbook is the foundation upon which Cowboy Action ShootingTM-Europe is built—these

rules having been translated into German and into a number of other prominent European languages (we do have a language barrier here!) as well—to form the solid foundation upon which each country can build their own Cowboy Action Shooting TM organization, always oriented to conform with the internationally known and acclaimed SASS Handbook.

This international organization, based in Europe, is necessary to maneuver around some of the very restrictive gun laws that are in effect in "good ol' Europe," as we do not as yet have a completely united Europe, but must adhere to the individual laws in more than 14 separate countries, with hopefully more to follow soon.

The Federation, "Cowboy Action ShootingTM-Europe" is headed by Busted Arrow, SASS #58972, aka Susanne Putsche, a lawyer by profession who lives in Germany with another residence in Croatia. So far, she has been able to welcome and recognize 11 countries (Denmark, Luxembourg, Switzerland, France, Germany, Austria, Hungary, Slo-

venia, Italy, Croatia, and Slovakia—with Netherlands in the offing) that have joined this Federation and have accepted SASS rules and regulations.

All this was the basis for our many conversations with people from all walks of life as we strolled from appointment to appointment at these international gun fairs and promoted our favorite sport, as well as advertising the upcoming international event, Cowboy Action ShootingTM European Championship, "Days of Truth 2007," in Brescia, Italy to be held August 21st-26th 2007. And, we have had many responses from US cowboys, as well prominent members of SASS Headquarters and the Wild Bunch who will be traveling across the Atlantic to join us and "play the game."

CONFESSIONS OF A MIDDLE-AGED DELINQUENT

My SASS badge number is twenty-three digits away from that of my pal Swift Montana Smith, SASS #52720. We started playing Cowboy at almost the same time, perhaps even the same day, with the Dakota Badlanders in Guthsville, Pennsylvania. I have enjoyed his stories, along with his growing popularity in The Cowboy Chronicle. Montana's efforts have emboldened me to relate a story from my misspent youth, which resulted in my family's above ground swimming pool catching on fire. Yes, it is possible, and truth can sometimes be more amusing than fiction. This is not, strictly speaking, a Cowboy story, but it does involve guns and boys.

Back then, when my age was barely into the double-digits, I would disassemble my single-shot JC Higgins .22 rifle, wrap it in a blanket, strap it to my handlebars, and pedal eight miles over hill and dale to my friend Sid's house. Sadly, neither the unsupervised possession of a firearm, nor the solo bicycle trip would be allowed today. Sid's family owned about three hundred acres of fruit orchards, mostly apples and peaches. Later in life, I would learn to drive in those same orchards, but that story is for a totally different series of boyhood adventures. The family's huge barns were home to empty fruit crates, a fascinating assortment of farm equipment, as well as hundreds of pigeons. The pigeons were, of course, undesirable and fair game for my .22, or Sid's Crosman pneumatic .177 pellet rifle.


Our only constraint, other than staying safe with the firearms, was

to avoid ventilating the metal barn roofs any more than they already were. This meant we had to be sure there was solid wood behind every shot. This was not always convenient; so we began looking for a .22 load that would perforate a pigeon sufficiently, yet not damage the roof behind it. Even .22 CB caps were too powerful, so we tried .22 birdshot. This worked well, if we were close, but would not allow us to "reach out and touch" a pigeon the way we wanted to. Experiments were conducted, which involved opening a brass .22 birdshot shell, combining the pellets with wax, and crudely re-crimping the shell. One of these efforts involved a deliberate double charge of powder, and a very interesting result, but that, too, is another story.

A subsequent ammo experiment involved gunpowder and gasoline. (Hey, I was only eleven or twelve years old!) Continued exposure to blackpowder smoke has obscured the reason why I thought this might be a good idea, or what it might accomplish. But, as one might guess, it was an extraordinarily bad plan, especially since it was conducted inside our garage, unlike my usual covert activities out in the piney woods. Perhaps I didn't want to be seen while carrying the gas can away. Whatever the reason, ignition resulted in a spectacular chain of events.

What actually changed a simple experiment into an aquatic conflagration was the unnoticed trail of gasoline leading back to the old red 2-1/2 gallon metal domed gas can.

(Remember those?) I watched in horror as the gas can-which, of course, did not have the cap onburst into flames. Having always been cool in emergencies, I grabbed the garden rake, snagged the can by its handle, and flung it out the side door. Rather than solve the problem, this turned a slight embarrassment into a real difficulty. A stream of flames now extended from the center of the garage, across the floor, out the door, and into the still-burning gas can.

Certain the can would explode any second, I again hooked it with the garden rake, and lifted it into the pool. The problem only got worse, as the side and surface of the pool were now on fire, and the can was still burning! I stuffed the can under water until it went out, grabbed the pool hose, and extinguished all the flames in sight. Thank goodness the pool filter was running at the time. The garage floor was, of course, by now flame-free, having used up all the available fuel.

I rescued the gas can from the pool and got as much water out of it as I could. I scrubbed the soot from the garage floor. 
videos. Take a look at our website – www.edterrymusic.com.

nate pitcher Buck Becannon, and 28 year old 2nd baseman Dasher Troy.

The Grays from Providence were ready to prove the Metropolitans wrong. The Grays' twirling (slang for pitching) was so dominant in the series, only Esterbrook would garner an extra base hit, a double, during the final game. Tim Keefe started for New York in place of Jack Lynch in game one. Lynch sat out with a wrist injury. Keefe pitched wild, and his catcher, Charlie Reipschlager, had trouble keeping the ball in front of him. Keefe's pitches hit the first two Providence batters to stride to the plate, and both were awarded first base as per American Association rules. The Grays scored, but not artfully. Keefe added two wild pitches and Reipschlager contributed two passed balls before the Metropolitan hurler steadied himself to set down the following twelve men. The National League champions were using their stock blend of tight defense and timely hitting to win the day. As he had done for most of the season, Hoss Radbourn would leave little to chance.

Radbourn, unlike his New York counterpart, Keefe, suffocated his opponents' bats, just as he had done to the National League all summer long. After getting nicked for a lead-off single, Old Hoss struck out six straight batters and dispatched 22 of the last 24 would-be batsmen to face him.

Keefe reached base with a single to begin the ninth frame, but Radbourn disposed of the next three hitters on harmless pop flies to record a two hit gem of a shutout. Henry Chadwick, a writer for The Eagle took note of Radbourn's mastery and deception in the pitching box. "The pitching of Radbourn was the feature of the game. His well disguised change of pace, his close watching of the batsmen to catch them out of form and his entire command of the ball were specially noteworthy points."

Continued poor weather held down the turnout for game two. Only about one thousand cranks were on hand to observe the best game of the series. This match-up was an old style pitching battle, as Radbourn and a rejuvenated Keefe recorded zeros on the scoreboard through four innings. Bill Holbert, Keefe's regular catcher, was back behind the plate for New York.

Grays' catcher Barney Gilligan gunned down two Mets base runners while Radbourn and Keefe surrendered only a combined two hits until the fifth inning. In the Providence half of that frame, infielder Jack Farrell singled and stole second on a hotly contested call. Gilligan hit a double and Farrell crossed the plate. Gilligan drove Farrell in with a ringing double and scored himself on a line-drive home run by third baseman, Jerry Denny, to put Providence in the lead, 3-0.

In the seventh, the Mets imploded. Shoddy defense, a wild pitch, and a Grays' hit brought two Grays around to score and put another on third before a single out had been recorded. Before Providence could inflict still more damage to New York, the umpire stopped the game due to encroaching darkness. The Grays took the game by a final score of 3-1.

The Grays had captured the championship of the base ball world. In spite of this, a third game still needed to be played under the original agreement between the two clubs. Because the cold weather refused to release its clammy grip, only a few hundred fans bothered to show up for the final, meaningless game. Crowd estimates ranged between two and five hundred fans. The Providence players were visibly affected by the puny turnout, as the New York Times reported, "When the league champions gazed on the empty seats, they turned up their noses and said they would not play. This displeased the officers of the Metropolitan club. Mr. Arthur Bell, the treasurer, said, 'I would not disappoint my patrons if there were only ten persons within the enclosure.' This brought Bancroft's pets to their senses, and they unwillingly entered the field. They tried to stop the game by refusing to accept any umpire the Mets would name. In order to close any loophole by which to postpone the contest, the Mets said they would agree to any person Joe Start (The Providence captain) would name, even if they selected their manager." Start chose New York ace Tim Keefe to arbitrate.

By the sixth inning, the Grays were on the fortunate end of a 12-2 slaughter. The team's only motivation for staying on the field was the pittance in gate receipts that the clubs would share. The dispirited Mets declined to play any further, and the game was called. This much vaunted championship series turned out to be an anticlimax to the epic record breaking 1884 season for the Providence Grays.

As the series winning Grays headed back north to Providence, the city of New York held their celebration for their beloved Metropolitans, despite the team's three straight losses. New York's huge touch light parade would see the American Association pennant winning Metropolitans joined by other baseball teams and the Seventh Regiment (Continued on next page)





Band that played Handel's "Hail the Conquering Hero" for their conquered heroes.

After the drunken clambake the Grays had for winning the pennant, we can only wonder why they did not celebrate winning their wager with the Metropolitans and the Championship of America. In the modern game, our World Series champions sport elaborate rings, but in 1884, the Grays' players were awarded no souvenirs, as their achievement was probably considered as only a post-season diversion.

The Grays' legacy of a "World

Series" would outlast the team itself, as a postseason inter-league championship series was continued for the next six years. There were no codified set of rules for these postseason championship series; the owners of the two pennant winning teams would get together to decide what the rules would be for that year. The Providence fans deserted the Grays in 1885 as the team lingered in third place for most of the season and finished in fourth place. Providence would follow other small cities of the era as low fan attendance in economic hard times could not justify the rising cost of salaries to compete for

the best players. At the end of the year, the Grays were disbanded.

Base ball was changing. In 1885 Providence Grays' shortstop, Arthur Irwin, created what would become the modern baseball glove when he broke his finger and constructed himself a padded fingered glove to protect it. Barehanded base ball was on the way out. The pitcher's box was replaced by a pitching rubber and moved from fifty feet to sixty-six feet six inches from home plate in 1893. Integration did not take hold in professional base ball, although there would be no formal ban against blacks in the major leagues.

Once upon a time a hardy breed of sportsmen played professional base ball for the love of the game. And there was a year when our smallest state produced our greatest team, the first World Series champions and the last World Series Champions to field with their bare hands. So, at your next match, it is OK to talk about base ball, but don't call yourself a fan, you're a crank. (Duncan B. Putney and vintage base ball player, Tim Norton, have co-written an extensively researched documentary screenplay that has been optioned for production for Public Television by Black Shark Productions.) .



Topic Three: How to add character or antique your leather

Don't be stupid. There is no such thing as ... "distressing" ... your product or project. Distressing means damaging. Simple. The so-called character you are looking for comes from leather flaws, age, the sun, elements, and usage. If you are going to do anything to add character, first isolate the things you don't like in commercial leather products.

Here's what you think you don't want in, say, a holster and gunbelt:

- It's uniform and smooth and even, sort of like it was made from a computerized machine.
- It looks like the color was painted
- It looks like the stamping and border trimming were machine pressed because it is so even.
- It has no blemishes and is so even and smooth.

Here's what you think you want in your project:

- It looks like it has seen some trail dust, some sun exposure, and some staining
- It is appealing to the eye without looking like something your dog had for a chew toy.
- It is distinctive.
- It looks like somebody made it by hand, and that person is not a rank amateur.


Get the idea??? The difference between appeal and ugly is in your craft and creative eye. So, here's a few things to think about when you add character to your project:

- Don't finish your product with bottled finishes ... especially the ones that say ... "Antique" ... That's where the plastic look comes from.
- Use oil, either Neatsfoot nor Olive. Use light coats repeatedly and rub it in. Put more on where you want the sun to darken the leather a little more.
- Use the sun to darken your leather a little more.
- Look at the picture you are using as your model. For example, there are some great pictures of cowboys in their chaps in almost any picture book about the Old West. In the shots where you can see the stains you are lusting to add, you'll learn to pick out certain spots in your chaps where they are discolored or have those features. Most

- chaps discolor along the thigh where folks rub their dirty hands along them. Or, they show some color difference around the edges of the pockets, for example. That's where you want to add some extra oil or cream to stain a little more.
- Use your hands with oils, not daubers or cloth. I actually made a pair of chaps where I put 'em on and rubbed in the oil where I wanted it on the front of my thighs with both my hands. For Christmas sake, don't bring your hands anywhere near your eyes or forget to wash them right away.
- Try your Razzle-Dazzle technique on scrap before you do it on your project.
- Don't put any finish on your project right after you dye it. Wait a couple of days and let your spiffy new holster sit out in the sun for one or two afternoons. Then finish it with the oil you think smells best. Stay away from the crafty products that add gloss.
- Die before you put anything on your leather that has silicon in it.
- Don't kill yourself loading up the edges with finish. Go through the burnishing process above and use the holster several times. Note where the thing wears. Note where your gun touches it. Now, finish the edge.

- Note that most holsters stained with gun oil are stained near the top edges or where the gunmetal meets the leather
- Pick the right leather for the right project ... easier said than done ... by LOOKING at it, not mailing for it. The "economy" (That's Latin, Darlin'. It means cheaper) grades of leather are appealing for their price, but they show more of the original animal's scars and sunspots. You can get away with using it and actually add a little character when dyed, but you have to turn the leather over and look carefully at the unfinished side. If you cut out a piece that has soft spots or irregularities, then your project will twist, deform, or ... "grin" ... as the old masters referred to it. If you're willing to lose up to a third of the hide, then economy is for you because what you save and use will have enough surface deformity to add some character. The average saddler or boot maker in the Old West, faced with cost of goods when making a piece of gunleather for some drover, may not have been a perfectionist, and some of the character in that over-priced original is due to that fact. There weren't any flies on the wall to observe when



the old time craftsman made the original piece.

• Put a western movie on while you are working. Haven't a clue why this works.

Topic Four: How to Dye Leather For Effect

Everybody asks about this, and even quality DVD's like Dusty Johnson's and John Bianchi's seem to avoid the topic, probably because it takes a long time to explain, and is so tactile it sometimes defies the English language. Slap my face and call me anti-gun, but I'll try here anyway.

- If you want to bring out the character in your leather, wet it. Don't clean it; just wet it.
- Thin your dye with alcohol or the thinners you can buy with it.
- Don't use the daubers on projects with large surfaces. Use a pad made from wool.
- A good craftsman back in Connecticut who calls himself "The Leatherman" told me he dyes in three (or more) layers ... once with sideways strokes of a wool pad, then again with up-and-down strokes, and third with round strokes of tight little circles. That's


- an especially great idea when you thin the dve.
- Remember the simple rule ... the more applications of dye you use, the darker the coloring, and it always looks darker while still wet.
- If you are using the cheapie grades of leather, then consider using Neatsfoot oil rather than water before you put on the dye. This behaves as a medium to allow the dye to even out before it penetrates. This is especially important when your leather has the surface irregularities that give it some character.
- Dye some scrap the same way you are gonna dye your project first. It'll give you an idea of what is gonna happen.

Hope this stuff helps. Almost any of us who were trained in working with leather will tell you that, beyond what you learned in the first place, the best part of your work happens when you apply the lessons you learned along the way over a broad period of time. You might also consider a prayer, once in a while, for the Aunt Rita's and Grandma Bea's of the world who gave us all those great capgun rigs way back when ...

Don't shoot yore eye out, kid 🌲



Recently, Capt. Morgan Rum sent me a questionnaire about the light loads we are seeing more and more in our game. With his consent, I am submitting his list of questions followed by my comments on this topic.

Questionnaire

- * Do you often see someone shooting very lightly loaded ammo?
- * Do you feel lightly loaded ammo poses a safety concern (squibs, bounce-back)?
- * Do you feel lightly loaded ammo is a concern when spotting (difficult to hear or see hits)?
- * Are you concerned about very lightly loaded ammo affecting the image of Cowboy Action ShootingTM?
- * Do you agree some sort of minimum load should be established?
- * If so, would you rather see a minimum velocity or minimum power factor be established?

Response

I hope you will be receiving some rational replies to your inquiry. Yes, to all questions. My concern here is far more for the safety aspects than anything else. Cowboy loads are

part of our game and are part of the safety factor. However, some folks are really pushing the envelope and creating potential hazards with their loads. Going too light creates another set of safety issues. Squibs are a problem for the sake of a follow-up shot with an obstructed barrel. Detonation potential due to ultra light loads is also of great concern. I have taken a step back from more than one active shooter whose loads are inconsistent and fire with a wide deviation. When we see loads performing in this way, the hand loader is on the threshold of a dangerous gambling game. I have been to matches where some folks were shooting loads that created barely detectable hits. This serves as a great disadvantage to the spotters and ultimately the shooter. Some of these loads are so light if one target is set just two feet further back, the shooter needs to aim high to hit it!

There are guidelines for minimum and maximum loads with all powder manufacturers' loading data, and there is good reason for it. I like to work up loads just like most hand loaders, but I also keep it in perspective and stay within the bounds of safety. Besides if we continue to allow peashooter mouse-fart loads, it encourages people to try some dangerous experimentation in hand loading. A blown up gun does not make for a fun day at the range!

I have no problem with many of the shooter's using the .32's. It is easier on many of the ladies, juniors, and other folks that have arthritis or other physical issues that can cause severe joint pain. Now, let's just consider the reality of a shootout in the period of pre-1899. What would you want in your hands to defend your life from roughnecks, outlaws, renegades, and ruffians? A mouse-fart load that barely makes it to the tar-

get using less energy than a BB gun, or a .38 Long Colt that might at least penetrate a cowhide vest? The fact is Cowboy Action ShootingTM is a fantasy game based on our old western theatre films. In this game, we choose to emulate either the heroes or the villains of this genre. If we allow this game to get too "gamer" oriented, we will lose the core of the game that attracted us to it to begin with. Don't get me wrong here. I believe there is plenty of room in this game for our very competitive pards. I just don't believe the hyper-competitive folks represent the majority of the Cowboy Action ShootingTM par-

There will always be a group of shooters that would just as soon throw out anything lighter than a 250-grain bullet, and there will always be a group of shooters that would like to see short .17 caliber loads. These are the extremes. Neither of which would be truly representative of the array of ammo choices in the pre-1899 period. Cowboy loads are with us and light loads are here, but it is time to draw

a line in the sand as we did with short-stroke kits. For our future, if our game moves too far from its original intent, we stand to lose the intent of the game.

Tex has tried to put a handle on this whole issue of light loads with a suggested power factor which is equivalent to a knock-down target set to be tipped by a factory-loaded 158 grain .38 Special. I strongly believe this is an excellent approach. Let's just remember how much easier life has become since the knockdown shotgun targets have become available. The knockdown goes down or it doesn't. No more arguments about golden BB's. If it's down, it's dead. If it's not down, it's a miss. I load and shoot a wide range of calibers. A knockdown target set to be dropped by a lightly loaded 140 grain .38 Special, can still be taken out with a 96 or 115 grain .32. The .32's do not need to be heavily loaded to drop the target either.

Some folks think the power factor issue is an attempt to level the playing field. I don't give a hoot about trying to level the playing field. That is just ridiculous. What's next? Are we going to setup lightweight targets that need to be hit, but knocking them over is a miss because your load is too heavy? The

playing field will never be truly level. The fast shooters will always be fast no matter what field they play on. If you want to shoot with your peers or near competitive equals, that is why there are several different shooting categories. And, that is another article all together.


A power factor, based on a knockdown target, is easier to regulate. I don't think we want to be administering random chronograph tests to verify ammo at the matches. If you want to see a sport die, just kill the fun at a match for the sake of regulation. If we implement a minimum power factor load sufficient to drop a knockdown, the target is either down or not down. This in turn would eliminate the desire for any competitor to cry foul over another competitor's light loads. The last thing that we need is an administrative headache running contested loads through a chronograph. We have our hands full running the matches as it is.

I would like to think we could specify a standardized .38 Long Colt or .38 Special load for regulation in a similar fashion as the black-powder-smoke-minimum load that was established last year. The .32's are here to stay, as they should be to keep the sport fun for those with smaller hands and for those that have problems handling recoil. The



.32's can be loaded with light to no recoil loads that will still do the job. I would like to suggest we compromise a bit more and specify either a 125 or 140 grain .38 Special load as the standard. Further, the specification could state: "All main match ammo shall have a minimum power factor. The loads used shall be at or above a minimum power factor equivalent to a .38 Special firing a 125-grain projectile at XX feet per second or a .38 Special firing a 140 grain projectile at XX feet per second. Knockdown targets shall be calibrated to tip when struck squarely with this load."


By specifying a minimum power factor load as I have suggested, it eliminates the need for testing anyone's ammo with chronos. match director has a standardized box of ammo to verify the knockdown targets if anyone wishes to contest the calibration of the tip setting. So, that is it. The knockdown target is then, the baseline for the match. Shooters loading ammo for a match will be aware this is the energy standard or power factor to which they need to load. Again, I don't give a hoot about trying to level the playing field, as this is a serious safety issue first and foremost! .




THE AMMO BOX

It is a joy to behold observing parents and grandparents bringing their offspring with them to participate in Cowboy Action ShootingTM. Our sport is one of very few that is truly family oriented. The game we play does more than its share to propagate gun ownership. It says in Psalm 127:4-5 "As arrows are in the hand of a warrior, so are the children of one's youth. Happy, blessed, and fortunate is the man whose quiver is





filled with them! They will not be put to shame when they speak with their adversaries (in gatherings) at the (city's) gate." Amplified Bible. To put this passage in the "Cowboy Action Translation" it could read: "As cartridges are in the hand of a Cowboy Action Shooter, so are the youth that participate in Cowboy Action ShootingTM with their progenitors. Happy, blessed, and fortunate is the cowboy whose ammo box is full of them. They will not be put to

fixture

shame when they compete in a Cowboy Action event in the "Spirit of the Game." It is a blessing to see youngsters being trained in safe gun handling and marksmanship. May every Cowboy Action Club have an "Ammo Box" full of youth.

Speaking of ammo boxes, you could build your own if you have wood working talents and the appropriate tools. I've received quite a few compliments on the one I made. The ammo box was made out of red cedar with box joints. These two main factors make it an eye grabber.

First thing needed are actual measure-

ments. Take a look at some other boxes and decide what size is adequate. I purchased 1" x 8" rough sawn red cedar lumber from a mill. I stuck and staked it in a dry place for a few months, and then planed it 3/4". I could have gotten it from a lumberyard at an extra cost, but at my age money is harder to obtain than time. It wouldn't be accurate to categorize me as a miser or even full-fledged frugality, but prudent comes close.

I cut the ends and sides of the box 1-1/2" longer than finished dimensions to allow for the 3/4" box joints. You can buy a box joint fixture or if you're likeminded, make one. I cut a 2" x 6" x 24" piece of hardwood and attached it in the proper place on the table saw miter gauge. It has to be long enough and strong enough to hold the sides and ends upright while cutting the box joints. I then cut a 3/4" by 3/4" slot in the 2" x 6" hardwood board with a 3/4" dado saw blade set 3/4" high. Then a 3/4" x 3/4" x 3/4" aluminum block was installed 3/4" away from and in line with the slot opening. The block holds the wood in the right spot for successive cuts. Two scrap pieces of lumber were then used to check the joint fit. The wood is held in place with clamps when cutting joint with careful regard and respect for the blade teeth.


After proper joint fit is established, ammo box joints can be cut. The opposite sides of the box are cut the same while the two ends are offset 3/4" to make everything come out equal in height. The bottom inside edge has a rabbit cut in it, and the bottom is made to fit. The top fits even with the outside of the box. I used biscuits in the sides, ends, top, and bottom glue ups. Exterior glue was used on the box. The top has a piano hinge and a friction slide stop

to hold top open when in use. A small hasp was affixed to the top. A couple coats of boiled linseed oil finished it off.

It looks great and is typical of the old time ammo boxes. And yes, by the way, I am happy when it is full because that means I don't have to pull the lever on my reloader for awhile.

Always be safety minded when working on projects, following all safety practices and wearing the proper personal safety gear.



way I carried my guns.


say at this point I was once told by a very experienced cowboy who helps run two large matches that Montana Slim, SASS #20107, and I were the only ones he could recall who did the butt forward thing correctly.) When I got to the firing line, this person I had handed the timer to told me he couldn't let me shoot because it could not be done safely butt forward. He further stated at his club that configuration was not allowed. I asked if they allowed cross draw,s and he said, of course. That having gone over his head, I regrouped. To make a long and irritating story short, I shot the stage, and all those present found no infraction or unsafe practice, but I could tell the person was not con-

vinced and was still troubled by the

The draw when wearing guns butt forward is very simple, and if practiced extensively will become second nature and automatic. When gripping the butt of the gun, the inside of your hand will be pointing away from your body. Next, raise the firearm straight up until the end of the barrel will clear the back of the holster, which is now actually the front because you are wearing them backwards. At this point, you move to straighten your arm without rotating your wrist and forearm (the gun is sideways). After the gun is pointing well down range, you then rotate your wrist and forearm bringing the gun to a vertical position. You then acquire the target and fire.



BLACKPOWDER CARTRIDGES AND SHOTGUN SHELLS

Celdom do I bother to shoot the Odirty stuff; in reality about once a year, just enough to remind myself why I do not make it a common practice. With the Michigan State Blackpowder Championship being held about seven miles from my home, it's that time of year again. I know about the Winchester AA hull, the red wad, plastic powder hoppers, and cutting the bottom out of metal powder cans with the same screw thread as MEC powder hopper bottles, the ease of then crimping shot shells as in a normal smokeless cartridge.

I also know a shotgun barrel, without the chamber clearly designated as 2-3/4 inch or longer has a 99.9 % chance of being shorter chambered, as in all older double barrel guns and all original '87 and most '97 Winchester firearms. This condition creates higher pressure,

more recoil, and excessive wear on both the gun and shooter. Yes, a modern loaded 2-3/4 inch shell may easily fit into the shorter chamber. It is the fired, open crimp length that counts, not the loaded length.

Precision Reloading Mitchell South Dakota, among many other things, sells a 12 gauge D-loader and hull trim attachment that really works, far better than either of the other two I own. They also have the necessary wads and a drill press roll crimp tool in all gauges. The old Lee Loader is usually cheap at a gun show. You should also get the Lee adjustable powder and shot scoop, and the MEC black wad guide. I made a 12 gauge-loading block with a 15/16 inch spade bit into a 2 x 4 on 1-1/8 inch centers. With a little figuring, you get three rows of holes. A drill press really does a good job here. Those are the tools you need to make proper length shot shells for shorter chambered shotguns. Actually other than depriming and repriming, a 4-inch piece of 5/8 dowel and the MEC wad guide and, most importantly, the roll crimp tool is what are needed. I hold the cartridge with a curved jaw vice grip adjusted to hold, but not mar the shell, when roll crimping

I use an equal measure of black-powder or substitutes and shot. A hard over powder wad, a thin over shot wad, and cut your hulls to fit your filler wad, which come 1/4, 3/8 or 1/2 inch thick. It goes on top of the hard over powder wad and under the shot, acting as a cushion. Your great-grandfather would rec-

ognize these shells. I know it's fun to use the old hand crank type roll crimp tool, but the people who want to sell you one put a higher value on them than they are worth, and the drill press type will do a better job, cheaper!

The Hornady blackpowder powder measure will fit both the RCBS and Hornady case activated linkage mechanism. Screw that combination into a progressive press, make the proper powder adjustment, and a lot of blackpowder cartridges appear in a short time with little effort on your part.

Remember, the proper bullet lube is very important when using blackpowder or its substitutes.

Watch your front sight! 🌲



With practice, this will become one fluid motion. Reholstering can be done by reversing the procedure, or by grasping the firearm around the frame in the barrel down position. You then return it to the holster, keeping it vertical at all times. The point of all this is that it can be done easily, and it is quite period correct. In the photos labeled "the draw," it

shows the proper way to safely draw from the butt forward position.

I am of the opinion that almost anything can be done unsafely, and we should not condemn all for the actions of a few. Further, we need more training in some areas for Range Officers, and just a little contemplation before making extreme rulings. As always, I can be reached at juaquin@thecowboyway.us .







Holy Terror, SASS #15362

One of the great things about Cowboy Action Shooting™ is it is a family-friendly sport. It is easy to come out with your spouse and kids and make great memories together as a family. However, anyone who shoots as a family knows while it is fun to shoot together, it can also be a lot of work. As an experienced family member, I have some tricks that can make the experience easier and less expensive.

When shooting as a family, money is always an important issue. Shoo-

ting is expensive, and shooting as a family is even more so. However, there are things one can do to keep the costs down.

First, it is always a good idea to shoot the same caliber. If you shoot the same caliber, it makes life simpler in three ways. First, it is cheaper to only have to buy one type of loading machine, bullets, brass, and primers. Second, while trying to load and pack for a match, it is easier to remember to only have to bring one type of ammunition. Third, if you are shooting the same type of rounds, you are less likely to have a big foul up, like loading 20 gauge in a 12 gauge. Shooting the same caliber is a good idea.

Now, I know shooting the same caliber is not always possible in the beginning. Most men buy .45's when they start shooting, and I know very few women, and even fewer children that want to shoot .45's. So, if you have to have a couple of calibers, then that is just the way it is, but when you are buying for the wife and kids pick one caliber and stick with it.

If you are considering buying a new caliber, I suggest a .38. I know many people like the .32's and they work well for them. In my personal experience, I just prefer the .38's. I think they are easier to create a good load, and the guns are easier to handle. If you have the opportunity, talk to people in your club and you can get a better idea about what works for you.

The second piece of keeping things simple advice is to buy the same type of firearms. Buying the same type of firearms makes life cheaper because you can use each other's firearms for backups. When it comes time to clean guns, you only have to know how to take apart one type. Also, when it comes to spare parts, you only have to keep track on one kind.

If you have multiple children that are close in age and size, I suggest at least for a little while, to have them share guns. This ensures you don't break the bank and gives them a chance to make sure they like it. Sharing firearms only really works if the kids are close to the same size. If you are trying to share guns between a 12-year-old girl and a 17-year-old boy, you are going to run into trouble. However, if they are close, then you can get away with it.

Sharing guns is fine, but I do not suggest sharing leather. This can be a major problem and a bit of a safety hazard trying to change the belt back and forth. You can usually find some inexpensive leather to use once or twice, but don't wait too long to buy a good belt. Good leather is really a must for safety and enjoyment.

Sharing between kids can work well, but sharing between kids and adults doesn't generally work so well—there's too much size difference. When sharing a long gun you should not compromise on stock size, and the size for an adult is usually way too large for a child and vise versa. Revolvers are easier to share, but kids should have their own long guns if it is going to be a long time interest.

The third piece of advice for simplifying shooting is to help share the

As an example, in my house my grandfather is the main man when it comes to all things shooting related. My grandmother is the lady of the household and runs all the domestic activities. They were pleased with that. When I came into the picture things were changed around a little. I have half and half duty. I have chores around the house to help grandma out with cooking and cleaning and such. However, I also have shooting chores, such as loading ammo and cleaning guns. That way I can help with everything.


Don't be afraid to pass the work around. Just like kids help with housework, they should help with shooting responsibilities as well. Not only that, it is useful knowledge they will be able to use for many years to come.

The fourth thing I suggest to help keep things organized is: don't be afraid to label things. You need to find your own way to tell things apart. If keeping things straight means different colored gun socks, or carving the individual's name into the stock, then that is what you should do. Whatever you decide needs to be simple so everyone can understand it. You should label guns, leather, ammo, eyes, ears ... everything.

Once this is done, and everyone knows whose stuff is whose, then it makes packing easier. You should make everyone a list with everything they need on it, and they are in charge of their own stuff. If you get to wherever you are going and something is missing, it's their fault!

Cowboy Action ShootingTM can be one of the best family activities. I have many wonderful memories from shooting with my grandparents that are really one of a kind. I know many families in the sport can say the same thing. Hopefully, when it comes time to shoot as a family, you can stay organized and have an enjoyable time!

Doc Gets Hammered

OCTOBER 11, 1880

Doc Holliday is having a bad day. He's been in Tombstone for only a few weeks and is still getting the lay of the land. As usual, Doc makes his living the old-fashioned way—at the gambling tables.

On this day, he's in the Oriental Saloon, working the faro table. He gets into an argument with fellow sport John Tyler. Holliday tries to retrieve his pistol, which is being held for safekeeping behind the bar. The barkeep won't give it to him. Several men step between the two combatants and separate them. Tyler leaves.

Oriental co-owner Milt Joyce proceeds to chew out the deadly dentist. Doc, who is drunk, gives it right back. Joyce grabs him by the nape of the neck and throws him into the street.

Holliday comes right back in and demands his pistol, but Joyce knows this can lead to nothing good and refuses to hand it over. Bellowing a drunken oath, Holliday lurches out into the night.

Just as the gambling tables get back up to speed, Holliday returns—only this time he's heeled. As he comes through the swinging doors, he swears at Joyce and raises his pistol, firing from less than 10 feet away. Joyce is hit in the hand while bartender Gus Williams returns fire at Holliday. Joyce's 19-year-old partner, William Parker, Jr., is hit in the big toe of his left foot. Joyce grabs a pistol and leaps at the dentist, clubbing him to the floor.

A bloodied Doc is helped into a chair. One of the Earp brothers (it's not clear which one) arrests him.

Doc eventually pleads guilty to assault and battery. The fine and court costs total \$31.30. 🌲



THIS MONTH IN HISTORY



1850's August

Aug 1850 Captain Ulysses S. Grant arrives in San Francisco on the S.S. Golden Gate with the 4th U.S. Infantry.

8 Aug 1850 Lieutenant Colonel Edwin Sumner establishes Fort Atkinson (west of Dodge City, Kansas) to control Indians along this stretch of the Santa Fe Trail. The fort is made entirely of sod.

9 Aug 1850 The boundaries of New Mexico and Texas are adjusted; \$10 million goes to Texas for assumption of debts.

13 Aug 1850 The Senate approves admission of California, as the thirty-first state, a non-slave state

15 Aug 1850 The Senate approves the Territory of New Mexico, with boundaries that include the present state of Arizona, the southern tip of Nevada, and part of southern Colorado.

14 Aug 1851 John Henry Holliday is born at Griffin, Spalding County, Georgia.

22 Aug 1851 The U. S. schooner *America* wins the race against the British schooner *Aurora* to win a silver cup trophy in British waters and international honors. From this day forward this yacht race will be known as the America's Cup.

4 Aug 1853 Rogue River Indians are upset by gold miners on their lands. They kill Edward Edwards on Stewart's Creek, near Jacksonville, leading to widespread hostilities.

The *Yreka* (California) *Herald* runs the following editorial: "Now that general hostilities against the Indians have commenced, we hope the Government will render such aid as will enable the citizens of the north to carry on a war of extermination until the last Redskin of these tribes has been killed." Extermination of the Indians was no longer a question of time, for "the time has arrived, the work has commenced, and let the first man that says treaty or peace be regarded as a traitor."

15 Aug 1853 Fort Kearny records 105,792 cattle passing through, most en route to California/Oregon.

3 Aug 1854 The Graduation Act passes Congress with strong support from the West. It provides for disposal of public lands that remain unsold for a period of 10 to 30 years at sale prices ranging from \$1 per acre for 10-year-old land to 12 cents per acre for 30-year-old land.

Miniconjou Sioux warrior High Forehead kills a stray, sickly cow from a Mormon wagon train that wandered into their camp. Brule Sioux chief Conquering Bear apologizes, and offers to pay. At Fort Laramie Lt. Hugh Fleming decides to arrest High Forehead. Brevet Second Lt. John Grattan and 29 infantrymen from Company G, 6th Infantry ride into the Brule camp. Conquering Bear offers many horses for the dead cow. A drunken military interpreter misinterprets the chief, and Grattan opens fire with howitzers, killing Conquering Bear. Little Thunder and outraged Oglalas and Brules attack, killing Grattan and twenty-eight infantrymen. This, the 1st armed confrontation between the Sioux and U.S. Army, is witnessed by 13-year-old Crazy Horse.

20 Aug 1854 Snake Indians attack a wagon train near Fort Boise, Idaho, killing nine men, two women, and eight children.

4 Aug 1856 Fort Randall replaces Fort Pierre in keeping the peace between the Sioux and the Ponea. (Fort Pierre was abandoned due to insufficient grass, timber, and hay). Fort Randall is located on the Missouri River in Nebraska Territory (southern South Dakota).

8 Aug 1856 Fort Simcoe, in the Simcoe Valley of the Washington Territory, is established as a base of operations for the war against the Yakima.

12 Aug 1856 The Tom Bell gang is credited with the 1st stagecoach robbery in California, near Maryville. Over 40 shots are fired, a woman passenger is killed, plus two other passengers and the reinsman are wounded. Yet, the gold shipment makes its destination.

LITTLE KNOWN FAMOUS PEOPLE WAY OUT WEST -

JOSEPH GEITING MCCOY dreamed up the concept of the western cattle town and promoted the idea into reality on the Kansas plains in 1867. The vision first came to Joe when he learned that millions of stray longhorn cattle were grazing on the Texas plains, free for the taking.

McCoy chose the tiny prairie village of

McCoy chose the tiny prairie village of Abilene, Kansas as a perfect market location where southern drovers could meet Northern buyers and conduct their business on an equal basis. He bought 250 acres next to the railroad, built stock pens to hold 3,000 head of cattle, a tenton scale to weigh cattle, a livery stable, offices, and a hotel called the Drovers' Cottage. The rest is history. Abilene set the pattern for every western cattle

town that followed. .

13 Aug 1856 The town of Franklin, a pro-slavery stronghold in the Kansas Territory, is seized by members of the Free State militia.

Gail Borden, recognizing the plight of mothers and their children on long sea journeys, works on a process for the 'concentration of milk.' His patent, received on this day for the process, leads to condensed milk, later used by the Union Army in the Civil War.

18 Aug 1856 Governor Shannon resigns his post in the Kansas Territory. President Pierce replaces him with Daniel Woodson, a pro-slavery man, as Acting Governor.

25 Aug 1856 Captain G. H. Stuart and forty-one soldiers from Fort Kearny in southern Nebraska catch up with the Cheyenne who attacked a mail train the day before. Ten Indians are killed.

25 Aug 1856 Acting Governor Woodson issues a proclamation declaring the Kansas Territory is in a 'state of insurrection,' and calls out the pro-slavery militia.

26 Aug 1856 Two young Cheyenne braves stop a mail wagon and wound the driver. Captain George Stewart and the 41st Cavalry attack a Cheyenne camp, killing and wounding from 16 to 20 Indians. Within the next two months, Cheyenne war parties will attack four wagon trains, kill twelve people, and kidnap two.

30 Aug 1856 Kansas militiamen (300) attack Osawatomie, a town defended by John Brown and 40 other Free State supporters. The militia prevails, driving out the Free Staters and pillages the settlement. Guerrilla warfare rages throughout the territory

26 Aug 1857 Tiburcio Vasquez is imprisoned at San Quentin.

28 Aug 1857 Fort Abercrombie is established on the banks of the Red River of the North, at Graham's Point (North Dakota) to protect settlers from Sioux.

15 Aug 1858 Lieutenant J. K. Allen and fifteen soldiers surround the Yakima camp of Katihotes. They capture seventy-one Indians. A few of the Indians are determined to be the murderers of two local miners and are shot. Allen was killed during the early-morning attack.

16 Aug 1858 Telegraphed message from Britain's Queen Victoria to President Buchanan is transmitted over transatlantic cable.

3 Aug 1859 Comanches are ousted from Texas; sent to Indian Territory.

12 Aug 1859 F. H. Conway's play *Pike's Peak or, The Search for Riches* premieres at the Old Bowery Theater in New York.

17 Aug 1859 Tiburcio Vasquez returns to prison after his June 25th escape.

Colonel Edwin L. Drake strikes oil in Pennsylvania, the world's 1st oil well. Within fifteen years, Drake will go bust although he continued to produce oil. Unfortunately, oil wasn't yet a precious commodity.

In my mind, one of the most ascetically pleasing Cowboy Action ShootingTM rifles is the 1894 Marlin Century Limited .44-40 rifle. With its figured walnut furniture, real bone color case hardening, and hand engraving, the 1894 Century Limited is a work of art. The Marlin Firearms Company has always been one of the leaders of the American firearms industry. Marlin was also one of the first manufacturers to specifically cater to, and be responsive to the rapidly growing Cowboy Action ShootingTM market with their wide variety of "Cowboy" series rifles. The

in 1878 he and Marlin patented further improvements. Their efforts vielded the first Marlin lever action rifle, the Model 1881. The Model 1881 was initially produced in the extremely popular .45-70 Government round, and then in Marlin's proprietary .40-60 Marlin cartridge (a near duplicate of the popular .40-65). In 1885, the Model 1881 was released in two more calibers: .32-40 and .38-55, both of which were Ballard single shot target calibers. The 1881 came standard with both 28-inch and 30-inch barrels.

The Model 1881 Marlin was far more popular and successful than Winchester's Model 1876 in .45-60 and .45-75. The Marlin 1881 had a reputation for having a stronger action than the 1876 Winchester's toggle link system. It was not until the introduction of the Model 1886 Winchester in .45-70 that Marlin had any serious competition in the long-range, big bore, lever rifle race. The 1881 Marlin in .45-70 was the

The earliest example was the 1860 Henry and 1866 Winchesters that shared the .44 Henry Flat rim-fire with the Colt 1872 Open-Top and even a small number of 1873 SAA revolvers.

The Model 1888 Marlins were "top ejectors" like the Winchester lever action rifles. In 1889, however, Marlin changed the 1888's design slightly, switching to a stronger, solid top, side ejection system. This has been their trademark until this day. While actually chambered for the .44 WCF (.44-40) and .38

WCF (.38-40) cartridges, Marlin released their own version of the .44 WCF cartridge. It had a 217-grain lead bullet over the same charge of 40 grains of blackpowder. They called it, unimaginatively enough, the ".44 Marlin Cartridge." The .38 WCF Marlins were marked ".38-40" rather than ".38 WCF" like the Winchesters. Five years later, Marlin released an improved version of the 1889, called the 1894. It has a two-piece firing pin and slightly different locking system; otherwise, it is almost impossible to tell them apart. The 1889 also had a spring loaded lever latch, which is absent on the later 1894.

Unlike the Winchester 1873, where .44-40 was the most popular, with 1889/1894 Marlin shooters, the .38-40 was almost as popular as the .44-40. At the turn of the Century,

the .38-40 enjoyed an increasing wave of popularity as a caliber. It had a well-deserved reputation for exceptional accuracy. Today, you will encounter about as many .38-40 original Marlins as you will .44-40s. The available original 1894 Marlins, and their predecessor, the 1889, represent affordable, and "shootable" pieces of history. In 1996, Marlin introduced their 1894 "Cowboy" .45 Colt rifles. They

were an instantaneous success. Marlin later introduced the Cowboy II, which was identical to the original Cowboy, except it is available in .38 Special/.357 Magnum, .44 Special/.44 Magnum, and for a short time in an original 19th Century chambering, .44-40 (.44 WCF).

However, today's Marlin Cowboy Limited and Cowboy II rifles that (Continued on next page)





1894 Century Limited .44-40 is certainly Marlin's best effort for the Cowboy Action ShootingTM market, and the daddy of the current "Cowboy" series.

MARLIN HISTORY

In the 1870's, a gun maker named John Marlin was manufacturing the very popular and accurate Ballard single shot rifles. Marlin had apprenticed under Winchester at his New Haven plant in the early 1870's. Seeing Oliver Winchester's success with lever action repeaters, Marlin teamed up with firearms designer Andrew Burgess to compete against Winchester in the repeating rifle market. Burgess already held several patents for lever rifle systems, and only big bore lever gun participating in any significant numbers in the slaughter of the northern buffalo herds prior to the buffalo's demise in the mid-1880s.

It wasn't until 1888 that Marlin released his first "pistol caliber" lever rifles, initially in .44 WCF (.44-40) and later in .38 WCF (.38-40). To call these "Pistol-Caliber Rifles" is really a misnomer. Both of these calibers were introduced by Winchester as rifle cartridges, in 1873 and 1878 respectively. The fact is Colt, Smith and Wesson, Remington, and Merlwyn and Hubert released revolvers after the fact in these same calibers to create popular "pistol/rifle combos" that used the same ammu-

are so common at matches are actually an outgrowth of the Marlin "Century Limited .44-40." The 1894 Century Limited had a limited release of 1,000 rifles in 1994, commemorating 100 years of 1894 Marlin rifles. The 1894 Century Limited resembles the current Cowboy models, except they have an engraved, case color receiver, and a figured walnut stock with a crescent butt plate.

I have owned two 1894 Century Limiteds through the years. The first I acquired in 1995, shortly after beginning in Cowboy Action ShootingTM. I later traded that one away, and regretted it ever since. I recently, however, acquired a gently used one from Rancho Cordova Guns. The Century Limiteds are the most reliable and accurate pistol caliber lever rifles I have ever shot. They will shoot 2-3 inch groups at 100 yards from a rest using the factory buckhorn sights and my hand loads!

TODAY'S MARLIN CENTURY LIMITED .44-40

The 1894 Century Limited .44-40 is a beautiful rifle! It is a Marlin in the true tradition of the Marlins of 120 years ago. The serial numbers are "CLxxxx" (CL followed by four digits). I like the fact it was made in one of Marlin's originally issued 19th Century calibers, .44-40. This is important to me, as I try to be as authentic as possible in my persona portrayals. No 19 th Century lever action rifle was produced in .45 Colt. This was mainly due to the diminutive rim of early, balloon head, blackpowder .45 Colt cartridges. The rim was far smaller than the rims on today's .45 Colts. It would not have functioned reliably, causing extraction failures.

You can see the famous Marlin quality. It has an American black walnut stock with a straight grip. The walnut of the stock is figured, with some "fiddleback" pattern, especially on one side. The wrist of the stock and the fore-grip have real cut chequering, rather than the cheaper pressed type. The wood to metal fit is perfect. It has a semi-gloss "Mar-Shield" finish. The butt stock has a very nice brass crescent butt plate.

The receiver and lever are the most distinctive features of the Marlin 1894 Century Limited. They have a real bone process color case hardening done by Doug Turnbull. There is absolutely no comparison between this truly exceptional finish and the cyanide chemical color case hardening currently used by others like Uberti, or for that matter even Marlin on their current case hardened models.

The receiver is also beautifully hand engraved with scrollwork. In addition to the scrollwork, the left side has an engraved stag with a large rack of antlers in an oval, and the right side has the rifle-armed man on horseback from the Marlin logo engraved in another oval behind the loading port. The top is engraved with "Marlin's Safety." The barrel is roll stamped "Marlin 1894 Century Limited." The lever also has engraved scrollwork adjacent the receiver.

The barrel is 24" long, and is of a tapered octagonal configuration. There are no barrel bands, true to the 19th century styling for rifles. It has a blued steel end cap for the forearm. The 1894 Marlin Century Limited has the "Micro-Groove" rifling that was standard on all Marlin rifles in 1994. This is the same rifling as in the barrels of the commercial (non-Cowboy Action ShootingTM) 1894 CS in .357 and .44 magnum and 336 in .30-30 that have twelve microscopic grooves instead of deep cut rifling.

The .44-40 Century Limited has Marble semi-buckhorn rear sights, just as the current .45 Colt "Cowboy" does. It has the white diamond (which I black out anyway) and the choice of either a fine notch or wide notch. I prefer the fine notch for long-range, and the wide notch for Cowboy Action ShootingTM shooting and hunting. The notches are set in an adjustable plate in the center of the rear sight. This allows you to fine-tune your sight, without using the coarser elevator adjustments. The rear sight also has the long shank and elevator, so you can "crank it up" for longer range shooting. The front sight is the standard Marble brass bead. I have long been a fan of the Marble buckhorn sights that Marlin uses on its lever action rifles. The great sight picture from these certainly helps me shoot clean with the Century Limited at a match.


The overall length of the Century limited is 41-1/2 inches, and the weight is approximately 7-1/2 lbs. The rifle balances so well in the hand. Although it is a full-length rifle, it does not feel heavy at all. That may also be at least partially due to the fact that I'm used to shooting a 9 lb. Henry or 8-1/2 lb. Spencer. The 1894 Century Limited has a fulllength magazine tube that holds thirteen .44-40 rounds. The action is silky smooth, and feeds different brands and hand-loaded .44-40s without a hitch. The trigger breaks clean at about 2 1/2 pounds.

The Century Limited does have that obnoxious modern cross bolt safety we are all so fond of. At least Marlin discreetly located it at the rear of the receiver. It fits flush with one side - unlike the unsightly Winchester safety with its hollowed out locations on the sides of the new 1894's receiver! Because of the Century Limited's engraving, the safety blends into the side of the receiver much better than on a stan-

Well, now the trilogy is in one 400 page volume, and if you have not read any of the separate stories, it's time to get them all in one very sharp looking book.

Let me explain "sharp looking." The absolutely great covers of the three original volumes were real photographs of Texas (which are now identified for us in the back of this one volume—the author was in the pictures but you couldn't see his face, and he never actually admits it is him), and the photographs were textured.

described them in one review, "the cover does not have a smooth, shiny finish, but is more like a topographical map, with etches and cuts and rivulets that evidence the rough country the story itself describes." However, now that the trilogy is in one volume, the cover art is quite different. Instead of a photograph, there are five stylized pictures drawn to show various characters, and they are done in a way that epitomizes nineteenth centurystyle art. It's really quite excellent looking, in my opinion anyway.

In summary, because I have reviewed all three books individually, let me suggest now you have the privilege of watching the char-

acters develop with no break as you go from book to book, so it should be easier to understand the characters, their motives, and their aspirations without resorting to memory. They will be fresh from chapter to chapter. These are riveting, connected stories, and I still think they need to be turned into a movie! You'll love this book!


Of course, I am tickled the publisher is listed as being in New Jersey and in London – there's something symmetrical about a


book that is about books of the Old West, and an author from the Midwest, being connected to the Old East.



dard Cowboy Model. With these Marlin safeties, you could get a small "C" clip or small rubber "O" ring at the hardware store, and snap it in the exposed red groove in the firing position. This will disable the safety YOUR OWN RISK, COURSE!) and prevent you from inadvertently engaging the safety while staging the rifle and picking it up only to have it go "click" instead of "boom" when you pull the trigger.

Another extremely desirable feature of the entire Marlin 1894 series is the ease of cleaning from the breech end of the rifle. This protects the barrel's crown, and is much better for those of us who shoot blackpowder. This allows the blackpowder sludge to run out the muzzle, instead of into the action like on 1873s. It really cuts cleaning time when shooting blackpowder/Pyrodex by 75-80%! It is simplicity itself. After insuring the rifle is unloaded, open the action half way. Remove the lever pivot screw, and then the lever itself. Draw the bolt assembly out to the rear, and pop out the ejector from its notch. To reassemble, just reverse the process. The one disadvantage of the microgroove is for Cowboy Action ShootingTM folks who use "real" blackpowder. While the micro groove



rifled barrels will shoot the blackpowder loads well initially, accuracy will decrease from fouling faster than rifles with deep cut rifling.

AMMUNITION

For range testing, Jeff Hoffman at Black Hills Ammo supplied me with some of their excellent .44-40 loads. I even had some 3-D Cowbov ammo kicking around. I also used some Winchester factory 200-grain JSP factory loads. I did not have any of my Hodgdon 777 blackpowder substitute loads on hand for the bullseve shooting, though I am sure they would perform similar to the smokeless loads, as fouling would not be an issue with them. Black Hills .44-40 loads generally chronograph in the neighborhood of 1,100 fps from the Marlins. I am not sure about the 3-D ammo, but I am sure it is about the same. The factory-listed ballistics for the 200-grain JSP loads is around 1,200 fps, if I recall correctly.

AUTHOR'S NOTE: The 1894 has a very strong action, as evidenced by its available .44 Magnum chambering. The strong Marlin action will take .44-40 hand-loads that would turn an Uberti 1866 or 1873 into flying shrapnel! The older Lyman Manual has a load for modern 1892 Winchester and 1894 Marlins, using a 200 grain JSP that gets to 2078 FPS with Alliant 2400 powder, surpassing some .44 Magnum factory loads! This is a great deer load. The danger here lies in inadvertently loading these types of "HOT" loads in your Uberti 1860/1866/1873 rifles, or any revolver (including Rugers), and blowing them to smithereens. I AM NOT RECOMENDING THESE LOADS, BUT if you must load these "Rhino-Rollers," paint the base and primer of the hot loads red with a permanent marker.

AT THE FIRING RANGE

The first load used to test the

Marlin Cowboy II was the Black Hills Cowboy .44-40 ammo. These were very accurate. At 25 yards from a rest, they made one ragged hole. At 50 yards, the group was about 1-1/2". That's pretty decent in my book, considering I just used stacked milk crates for a casual rest. Doing offhand shooting at 35-40 yards, I bounced a pop can 13 out of 13 times.

The second ammo I tried was the 3-D Cowboy .44-40. The 3-D Cowboy ammo did about the same as the Black Hills, but not quite as tight of a group. It did shoot to the same point of aim as the Black Hills ammo.


The third load I used the Winchester factory .44-40 with the 200-grain JSP bullet. They performed almost identical to the Black Hills Ammunition as well.

CONCLUSION

Marlin has continued to supply its high quality rifles to shooters continuously for over 120 years. The fact the 1894 remains basically unchanged for the last 116+ years is a testament to both the strength of their design and to their durability. Another factor in the popularity of the Marlins is their price. Marlin has always given excellent utility for a relatively modest price. The 1894 Century Limited is not cheap, however! New in the box, unfired (if you can find one) will go \$1,200 or more. Used ones run almost as much. I felt lucky to get mine as inexpensively as I did. I was in the right place at the right time, I guess.

All Marlin rifles are entirely American made. The Century Limited is premier example of the Marlin gun maker's art. It is a beautiful rifle, exceptionally accurate, and an absolute joy to shoot. I am sure glad I was able to replace the one I traded off so long ago. You should see if you are lucky enough to find one yourself! A.



Match Director 41 Colt Bob and "old red" Rusty Wood.






NON" stage that was proposed by their Territorial Governor.







The shooting façades required integral

> bullet absorbing baffling to prevent a round from escaping the range. "Where most clubs have a one dimensional facade, we had to construct whole buildings," Rhodes adds.

> The scope of the cowboy range is impressive, even more so when you add the fact the buildings are recreated from historic Kansas sites. Abilene Kansas' famous

Alamo Saloon was constructed from a drawing provided by the Dickinson County Kansas Historical Society. It's huge—forty feet across with it famous three sets of double doors. The two-story C. M. Condon Bank from Coffeyville where the Dalton brothers met their fate in 1892 is striking. The Old Reliable House

Mercantile is modeled after the 1870's original in Ellsworth. The Monticello Jail is modeled after the first jail built in the newly opened Kansas Territory of 1856.

It was little chilly as the shooters broke up into posses, and a nice bonfire provided a period-correct way to keep fingers warmed up.


But, the pervasive aroma had some shooters wondering, "Who put the cedar in their shotgun shells?"

thing from accommodations up to stages but, thank God, I've the BEST team a man can desire. Seriously, Whispering Hole, Kill Bob Sally, Mary Rouge, Lady Blue, Wild Dancer, Speed Ladle, Lone Trapper, and the "Shooting Club Udine" realized something beyond my expectations ... a miracle!

Let me go back a little bit to explain what we're talking about. The name of our annual match is "Hangin' at Crossfire Camp" and was held March 31st to April 1st, 2007 near Udine, Italy. It was the first Italian SASS rules match and the first International match in Italy. 58 shooters came from all over the Europe; not bad for our first attempt!

The first shooting day gave us the first lesson. NEVER choose a crazy month to organize a match or you can have a BAD surprise ... the heaviest rain of the year! Believe me, I was looking around the range to see if someone needed a canoe to move between stages! A nice guy asked me why I forgot to send a fax to God in order to have good weather. Right! We'll do it for sure next year.

It's in situations like this I always realize how much I love this "family" of crazy shooters. Nothing can stop them from having fun. There's never too much mud, rain, sun, or humidity, and, like a real cowboy/girl, they simply don't care about it. Fantastic behaviour!

Except for the weather, the logistics were exceptional. They were able to find accommodations for the latecomers in less than five minutes (real time) and all the paperwork was done in advance. The stages were ready with props and painted targets, and the match started following a perfect schedule.


The shooters' meeting! Oh my God, this means I must talk to a bunch of shooters and ... I never did it before! I was so worried I felt my mouth was full of sand and I probably spoke in an alien language. Thinking back, I'm not sure all the people understood what I was telling them (and in English, too) but at the end they shook their heads in a way that meant: "OK Andy, you are right, and we understand what you said."

I smiled faintly in an "Adam's Family" way until the "bang" sound, followed by a "boooom" of the blackpowder, signalled the beginning of the match. As soon as the sounds occurred, a spectacular smile appeared on my face, a smile of satisfaction. It's real, it's our match, we spent tons of time, and now it's running smoothly, and well ... wow!

On this first day, the competitors passed through four stages with nice situations, lines, and props like an outhouse in which you handled a "toilet paper" roll, played the teacher's

role with a book in your hands, or ran with a bucket full of shot shells trying to not drop them on the ground.

From bay to bay, laughs, jokes, and fun filled the air until the end of the day. Now it was time to take a rest and, thanks to Lone Trapper, enjoy a special dinner on a table embellished with gorgeous decorations, and accompanied by a lot of "good" Italian food and wine! Into the late night (or early morning if you prefer) live music, laughs, and discussions fluttered in the air. (Imagine for a moment a small Italian hotel filled with "cowboys

and cowgirls" and the amazed looks of the customers that seriously didn't understand where those people came from!).

All the shooters survived the wine and arrived in time for the second day. There was just a little bit of rain, but it was warmer than the day before, and the stages added more fun stuff.

The last four stages featured an iron horse built on springs (under the weight of the shooter it started to move) with saddle and scabbards, swingers and bobbers, a "stick horse," dynamite stick with real fuse, and a chain ball fixed on a

shooter's leg. Plenty of fun!

In the middle of the morning the sun appeared (I did a special tribal "sun dance") and immediately the shooters took off their raincoats to receive the sunshine like a lizard in springtime!

The range started to look like a western movie set. Around the range pards and pardettes dressed in an Old West way pushed their guncarts. Flags blew in the breeze, and clouds of blackpowder smoke and the sounds of the shots gave the spectators real excitement.

For the first time the mayor of S. Giovanni al Natisone's town came to the match and said, "I never saw a

sport so enchanting, and I'm proud to have all of you from all over Europe here. We are accustomed to believe guns mean something bad, but now, thanks to you, I've discovered it's not true." A picture of the shooters is in the Town Hall right now; it never happened before.

Sadly the second day came to an end and the award's ceremony took place, mixed again with jokes and laughs, especially when our President, Whispering Hole, appeared dressed in red underwear and bananas in his holsters.

What I want to remember is the camaraderie and the fun all the friends gave us. Wyatt H. Ristl

(T.G.-Austria) said it was a First Class match, but better than that he said, "Andy, you had the pleasure to work with a special Team and the success of this match is a result of a perfect Team working together," and he was right!

The Honky Tonk Rebels and the Shooting Club Udine worked as best as possible, and considering what Shotgun Boogie told me, we are in trouble now because it will be hard to do better next year ... I know it's a guess, but I think we'll want to do it even better!

Folks, I'm looking forward to seeing more of you at Hangin' at Crossfire Camp 2008. Yee Ha! 3.

SASS Louisiana State Blackpowder Shootout



and shoot in your match, but it's even better when they come to help! Founders Ranch is especially grateful for the waddies that support our major matches and make the monthly shooting program here at the Ranch a success.

Cowboy Action ShootingTM is still new to many here in New Mexico. I've met numerous potential cowboys who want to play cowboy and may even have some of the necessary equipment, but are a little intimidated to play for the first time and feel handicapped by not yet having all their gear. Most of us didn't have everything we needed when we started. Folks loaned us what we were missing ... and some were missing everything! When new folks show up at a shooting event, most of us are more than willing to return the favor and "give back" to the sport by loaning equipment to potential new shooters. New shooters shouldn't feel embarrassed about accepting ammo from their lenders, either. The firearms owners want to know what's being used in their guns! If you borrow guns from someone and want to supply your own ammo, just make sure it's factory ammo. As for putting new shooters "on the line," it's a great idea for clubs to offer a new shooter orientation ... some need basic firearms training and others simply need to be introduced to our "range etiquette."

Once things settle down, there are many activities beyond Cowboy Action ShootingTM to whet my appetite. This is, of course, the land of Billy the Kid! But good guys and bad guys have roamed this lawless land in the past, and tracking them down is a pastime all by itself. Not only that, the Llano Estacado, the famous Staked Plains, home of the Comanche, runs all the way from Lubbock in West Texas to Edgewood, NM! From the top of the ridge overlooking the Ranch, one can see the edge of the Llano. What can be more Western than that? 3.
