2nd SASS NEW ZEALAND REGIONAL

s it was the first time our Region had run the Pistol New Zealand Cowboy Action ShootingTM Nationals and SASS New Zealand Regional Championships, the Trail Blazers Gun Club members were proud to play host for this event. Our club and Cowboy Paradise were determined to make the event as enjoyable and entertaining for the shooters as possible.

Many long hours were worked in the preceding months, building new props and covering existing props. Now, there is a new livery in range one. This building is large enough to enable a full posse to shelter under and shoot the stage. A new kitchen is now attached to the saloon, making mealtime more convenient for all, and next door there is now an office for registration and scoring. This meant the old clubroom could be converted into two bunkrooms, which we called "The Den" and "The Men's Club."

Shooters came from all over, including three of our cowboy compadres from Australia, seventy-five shooters in all. It was good to see such a big turn out from the far north, and it was great to be able to offer them accommodation on range. This event saw the biggest turnout yet of young'uns, eight in total.

This was the first time the Trail Blazers Gun Club hosted the New Zealand Cowboy Action Shooting™ Nationals. The range and props were completely renovated for the event. Covers were supplied for each of the shooting areas ... and they were needed! The venue was pure "Old West," the shooting was fast and furious, and the competitors were warm and friendly. It was a great outing!

Most shooters wandered into town in time for the Wednesday night BBQ and became reacquainted again with old friends.

As side match day dawned, the rain was threatening, and sure enough by mid-morning it started raining. It pretty much rained off and on for the next three days.

Regardless, the day was a full on affair of side matches. Most of the shooters turned up to shoot the side matches, and it was a great opportunity for folks to check out their shooting irons and work out any travel bugs. Each range had its own particular match, and cowboy clays were held down by the rocks. There

were all the standard speed events, long-range events, Blazing Irons, and two new matches this year. The "Pat Garrett Match," which involved using the normal match guns as well as a rifle-caliber rifle, and the "El Grande Stage," which was a stage designed just for those who like shooting lots of lead down range with maximum movement. To give you an idea how long the stage took, the fastest time was 121 seconds, and that was Payden Kash, SASS Life #28037!

All the side matches were keenly contested. Unfortunately, the weather got the better of the clay bird shooters, with only the most dedicated completing that match. Most shooters found their way into the saloon well before the 4pm finish.

On Friday morning, the rain had eased; however, it hadn't given up. After the customary shooters' briefing was completed, we sorted ourselves into four posses and shot six main match stages. We wrote the stages to be challenging, with lots of movement, yet not difficult for even the newest shooters. The targets were big and close (amazing how you can still miss 'em!).

When the day's shooting was done, it was time for supper and the Cowboy Action Shooting TM general meeting (which lasted only about fifteen minutes). Friday night is traditionally "card night." Packs of cards were on the tables, and James B Wright, SASS Life #12717, had his usual crowd of young'uns eager to (Continued on page 74)





contests and seminars, entertainment and shows, award ceremonies and exhibitions, vendors galore, celebrities from different walks of life, food to tempt every palate, and opportunities to kindle and renew friendships of fellow SASS members from around the world—all designed to keep everyone at the ranch, in costume, and having a grand time from the time they arrive until the eventual moment of departure after the Sunday awards!

Shooting

Blazing six-guns on the range are the heart and soul of any shooting competition, and END of TRAIL is no exception! These world championship stages are designed to test the mettle of all the champions and "champions to be" while still being very "shootable" for less experienced The stage scenarios shooters. require movement and a little play-

acting, but allow latitude in how many of the targets are engaged. Great effort has been made to avoid acquiring procedural penalties (although cowboys are a creative lot, and some will surely find a way to earn a few!). Target sizes and distances are right out of the SASS Handbook, at least for the "dingers." The flying buzzard is back again this year, "Fat Albert" (a very large, steel SASS marshal) partially hides a swinging target, and there are a couple of "launched" aerial targets as well. What about knockdowns? Yes, there are some, and they are just a tad smaller than the dingers ... one needs to aim to ensure a good hit. However, these targets are set to react with virtually any standard load of any legal SASS caliber. If your hand-load is faithful to your reloading manual, it'll likely work just fine. Look for a test target in

Bahia de Coto on side-match day for an opportunity to put a few rounds on it with your own ammo.

All requested posse pairings have been accommodated and distributed to the shooters for comment and corrections. This gives those who see each other only once a year an opportunity to renew friendships and share their past year's activities. Even better, it's an opportunity to meet new friends from across the country and around the world. END of TRAIL has been blessed since the early days with a significant international community of competitors. The "Fritzes" (mostly Lufthansa employees) frequented many of the early END of TRAILs. Virgil and Alvira Earp have ensured the Australians participated in large numbers for the past several years. And now, we are again seeing many






HAPPY TRAILS CHILDREN'S FOUNDATION LEGENDARY 1880'S SADDLE WINNER!

REMINGTON TO BE BOUGHT BY **CERBERUS FOR \$118 MILLION**

pril 5, 2007 — Remington Arms Co., the gun maker that has equipped U.S. soldiers for 150 years, agreed to be acquired by private-equity firm, Cerberus Capital Management LP, for \$118 million.

The company, based in Madison, North Carolina, produced its first profit in three years in 2006 after struggling with rising material costs and increased competition from Smith & Wesson Holding Corp.

Remington was sold by New York-based private-equity firms Bruckmann, Rosser, Sherrill & Co. and Clayton Dubilier & Rice Co., according to a company statement.

Remington was founded in 1816 by Eliphalet Remington II, who built his flintlock rifle in Ilion Gulch, New York, after placing second in a shooting match and attracting the attention of other contestants.

The company was rescued by the

U.S. government after Russian revolutionaries defaulted on a contract in 1918 and benefited from its purchase during the Great Depression by DuPont Co., which made improvements to gunpowder.

Cerberus is "getting a brand that has leadership in the rifle market," said Cai Von Rumohr, a Bostonbased analyst at Cowen & Co. who follows Smith & Wesson.

Winchester Rifles

Von Rumohr said Remington may be able to gain market share after U.S. Repeating Arms Co., which licenses the Winchester brand, discontinued three models and closed a factory in New Haven, Connecticut, where the rifles and shotguns were made for a century and a half.

Remington, led by Chief Executive Officer Thomas Millner, stopped making handguns in the

1990s. Stricter federal and state laws governing the sale of pistols prompted gun manufacturers to narrow their focus on shotguns and rifles used for hunting and target shooting. The company's guns include the \$812 700 BDL Custom Deluxe and \$996 11-87 SPS Super Magnum.

In December, Smith & Wesson agreed to buy Thompson/Center Arms, Inc. for \$102 million to enter the hunting-rifle market. Springfield, Massachusetts-based Smith & Wesson, whose revenue is about half that of Remington, is known for its revolvers and pistols.

\$300,000 Profit

Last year, Remington posted net income of \$300,000 after three years of losses. Sales rose 8.7 percent to \$446 million. Smith & Wesson last month said it anticipates earning \$12 million on \$225 million of sales in fiscal 2007. The company had 2,150 employees at the end of February.

Bruckmann, Rosser, Sherrill owns 61.3 percent of Remington, and Clayton Dubilier & Rice holds 13 percent and controls 26.6 percent of the voting power.

Clayton Dubilier bought Remington's assets from DuPont in 1993 for \$300 million. The Wilmington, Delaware-based chemical company purchased a 60 percent stake in the gun maker in 1933 and acquired the remaining shares in 1980. During its 191-year history, Remington branched out to produce typewriters, sewing machines, and cash registers, businesses it later divested. Remington expects to complete the transaction by June 28. Credit Suisse Group advised New York-based Cerberus, which manages \$23.5 billion.

Wallace in December 1880, as well as letters written by John Tunstall and others. It also captures the lure of Billy as reflected in the posters of more than 60 films and a variety of memorabilia. Mixed throughout the artifacts of the exhibition was a series of paintings and art figures by a variety of artists. True West Magazine's Bob Boze Bell had a significant collection of paintings depicting scenes of Billy throughout his outlaw years. Painter Thom Ross also had a number of his unique Kidthemed paintings. His art adorns the covers of several popular books about Billy the Kid.

I had a chance to visit with Bob Boze Bell. Bob will be attending END of TRAIL this year. In addition to his writing and recording the leadins to all the shooting stages, Bob will have an exhibition his works in a special gallery sponsored by SASS and True West Magazine. 16 of Bell's paintings depicting scenes of Tombstone and other famous gunfights will be on display and available for sale.



AIR SOFT COWBOY

The "Air Soft Cowboy" letter really got me down for a couple of reasons. First, was the recommendation to have airsoft cowboy matches. I know in some places shooting firearms is not an option, and if it came to air soft or nothing, then maybe airsoft ain't too bad. I visited a shooting range once where a large corporation next door had a court injunction banning shooting. They held a couple of airsoft matches just to allow members to keep in practice while trying to resolve the conflict. However, they maintained all the standard shooting safety regulations about carrying loaded firearms only on the firing line and not pointing a gun at a human.

That brings me to my other problem. The writer of the above article said something to the affect of having real showdown fast draw competition against each other. The writer said then you would know who the real fast draw was. This brings up a couple concerns. First, I know a few guys who have competed in fast draw and say that many times the match is won by mere hundredths of a second. No human, no matter how good, can judge that kind of difference by observation.

Second, I am a certified muzzleloader coach for 4-H. The 4-H programs in North Dakota and Minnesota where I am certified refuse to promote even paintball, because it promotes pointing a gun at a human. I thought that was something SASS discouraged (pointing guns at humans). I was expecting at least an editor's note to the effect at the bottom of this letter.

MY FAMILY'S NORTHFIELD RAID CONNECTION

There has been a story told for years in my family, on my mother's side, about the September 7, 1876 Northfield Raid in Minnesota where Jesse and Frank James. Bob, Cole, and James Younger, Bill Chadwell, Clell Miller, and Charlie Pitts attempted to rob the First National Bank. My family, the Knapps, arrived in the Midwest around 1811. Being a law abiding clan and proficient with firearms, they created a perfect role - being a Sheriff. One in particular, my great-great grandfather, Joseph Knapp, was a Deputy Sheriff in Le Sueur County, Minnesota.

After the raid in Northfield, posses were formed to chase the desperadoes, Jesse and Frank James, who were wounded, but had managed to escape. Joseph Knapp was one of the posse leaders. As the story goes, while Sheriff Knapp was out with the posse, his wife, Margaret, remained home on the farm with the children. While hanging clothes out on a line to dry, she was approached by two men on horseback who very politely asked to water their horses. "Certainly," was her answer. She later would say they looked "shot up and tired."

After watering their horses, they thanked her, at which time she asked, "Who are you two nice men?" The man doing all the talking said, "I'm Jesse James." Margaret answered, "My goodness. You'd better get going. There is a


posse out looking for you, and my husband is one of the deputies." Again, he very politely thanked her for her advice, and they rode off into history.

EVOLUTION

I have been following the debates over firearms, ammunition, and competitive advantage for about a year now, with great interest. What has now emerged as controversy never crossed my mind when I joined SASS in the Spring of 2006. I naturally assumed the game was played pretty much "old-school."

What we are dealing with is evolution. The business decisions made to provide appeal toward a wide audience have produced some unintended consequences. These results are not "good" or "bad," but they are appearing to be quite different from perceived goals. With a member base that is now pushing six figures, there is bound to be a number of competing interests.

As with any competitive sport, there will emerge fierce competitors. With fierce competitors, there will be the innate desire for competitive advantage. Look no further than the 2007 Daytona 500, where several teams were disqualified and/or fined. This type of attitude will always be present where competition is involved.

The only recourse available is regulation. Any new decisions and regulations will now be difficult, because of the evolution that has already taken place. This is not to say the organizational goals are way off track, but it does hint at the need for this sport to examine its "Constitution," and judge whether or not the organization is evolving as originally framed.

The Wild Bunch and the Territorial Governors are headed for some tough decision-making. The time has come to stick to your guns. The alternative is to stand by while some of the membership lobby for a "reestyle" category, where the equipment is left up to the imagination of the competitor. Nearly all other shooting disciplines have naturally evolved toward this end.

I plan on aiding any effort that will prevent Cowboy Action Shooting $^{\text{TM}}$ from straying too far from the games the Wild Bunch originally had in mind. It is my belief the perception of "winning" and "champion" at SASS matches will erode, if the basis of our sport is not rooted in the values of the Old West.

Below are some thoughts that never independently made it to column status ... yet ... they're just some isolated views from my saddle.







I suggest you mark your calendars for next year, folks! ...






THE SACRAMENTO HUSSARS

****alifornia's "Wild West" predated the Jother one by almost two decades. The bucolic life of the Californios, from about 1825 to 1850, was rudely interrupted by the Gold Rush and the influx of thousands of ill-mannered, ill-tempered, and intolerant Yanquis and other foreigners from around the world and, as they say, "there went the neighborhood."

Most of the ranchos were located in Southern California and along the coast as far north as Sonoma, where huge land grants supported enormous herds of cattle and horses in a highly developed horse culture, sort of a mix of the Old West that was to be and the contemporary Old South, a class-conscious society with the native Indians providing the labor and the land held by wealthy Spanish Dons. Here was where the vaquero and his skills were developed, skills adopted by the American cowboy thirty years later.

At first, the enormous influx of gold seekers provided a new source of income

for the rancheros in the south and many became immensely wealthy. Enormous cattle drives, far longer than the Texas-Kansas drives of the later "Old West," were made along the coast to San Francisco. Unlike the hardy Texans, however, the Californios did not have to contend with Indian attacks and prairie weather. This was California, after all.

As it turned out, California was quickly admitted into the United States on September 9, 1850, barely 18 months after the gold discovery in January of 1848. The American court system was quickly implemented, an institution thoroughly foreign to the Californios, who never needed such a government intrusion in their lives.


It didn't take long for greedy Americans to discover many of the original land grants, on which families had lived for generations, were made on a gentleman's agreement with little recoverable documentation and frequently (Continued on next page)



vague boundaries. It became a simple matter to lay legal claim to a piece of land and challenge the Californios to prove legal ownership. When documentation could not be produced, the American courts inevitably ruled in favor of the interloper. One can only imagine the bitterness and anger among the displaced Californios.

Since they were already in California, many Californios headed for the gold fields and there are firsthand reports of fabulously wealthy gold strikes by many of them, a situation not looked on favorably by the Yangui gold seekers. Add to that the unspeakable cruelty of the Americanos who thought nothing of destroying a Californio's home, raping his wife, and killing the entire family to take over the man's claim.

Joaquin Murietta was only one of many such victims. There were many others, one of which, Solomon Pico, was to become the model for the Zorro character. Juan Flores of San Juan Capistrano was another. Up and down the state of California, bandits and banditos began to make life very dangerous, and the California "Wild West" of the 1850's was on.

To curb the rising violence, the State Legislature authorized the forming of local militias throughout the state, and many were formed in remote camps and bustling cities up and down the state. The famous California Rangers was only one of them, and it was formed for the express purpose of capturing Joaquin Murietta. They only lasted the few months it took to capture and behead the supposed bandito.

The most colorful and long-lasting of the militias was formed in Sacramento in 1859 - the Sacramento Hussars. Formed partly to protect the flow of gold shipments from the gold fields from falling into the hands of Confederate sympathizers, there is little evidence that the Hussars actually engaged in any Rather, they military action. marched in parades, escorted dignitaries (including the first Pony Express rider to enter Sacramento from the east), participated in civil and public celebrations, and strutted in their magnificent uniforms astride splendid horses.

The Hussars, all German immigrants, dressed in a uniform copied from the Hussar regiments of the German army of the time. Hussars were light cavalry units, originally created for Napoleon's army by a Hungarian count using Hungarian horsemen, considered at that time to be some of the best horsemen in the world. Huszars (Hungarian spelling) were outfitted in brilliant uniforms, each regiment identified by different combinations of colors with braids and furs and buttons and feathers

and cording. The concept of the Hussars spread throughout Europe, and soon every army on the Continent boasted several of them.

The Sacramento Hussars' uniform copied that of Hussar units in the German army and consisted of a scarlet hip-length tunic trimmed with gold braid and cording, gold shoulder epaulets, tight dark gray riding breeches, Hungarian-styled black riding boots with a gold braid around the top and gold spurs, a black saber belt with saber, and a black fur bag cap with red bag on the left side and a red and white plume. A pistol was worn on the right side, butt-forward, presumably an 1851 Navy Colt. A field uniform with a gray tunic was also worn for duties not requiring the full-dress scarlet tunic.

Each man had to provide his own uniform, horse, and equipment, an expenditure of well over \$500, a significant amount at the time, which limited the Hussars to a wellto-do membership. The Hussars were ultimately a social organization for its members, and there are numerous contemporary accounts of the unit's splendid appearance, equipment, and even their spotless tack room, arranged in German military precision.


The Sacramento Hussars lasted well into the 1880s, when they were absorbed into the California National Guard. Today their original log-books with the unit's constitution, meeting minutes, and activity records can be accessed in the California Military Museum in Old Sacramento.

The Sacramento Hussars are now largely forgotten, but in their time they represented an important phase in California's history, as it became a part of America. 🖈



The Battle of Turkey Creek Canyon

JULY 16, 1899

Three suspected train robbers are in camp at their remote hideout in Turkey Creek Canyon, New Mexico.

Tipped off by a sighting (and a snitch), a seven-man posse out of Cimarron rides to the stronghold and dismounts when campfire smoke is spotted curling up through the trees.

The posse members get into position: three lawmen climb a ridge left of the camp and the other four deploy up the north side of the creek bottom. A half-dressed outlaw, Elzy Lay, comes into their view. With a canteen in his hand, Lay approaches a pool of water in the nearly dry creek bottom.

A few posse members take aim and fire (most likely Sheriff Edward Farr and Wilson "Memphis" Elliott).

Shot twice, in the shoulder and chest, the outlaw drops as though he was hit with a club. "We've got one of the sons of bitches, anyway," a posse member yells.

Officer Elliott spots the outlaws' horses tethered at the far end of the camp. He aims and fires, dropping one and perhaps another.

As others in the posse begin shooting, outlaw Sam Ketchum runs forward and returns fire as he hides behind a tree, but he is soon knocked out of the fight with a mortal wound in the arm.

Will Carver takes up a position high atop a rocky knoll that is screened with brush. He begins pouring lead across the canyon at Farr, William Reno and Frank Smith. Although Carver is nearly 200 yards away, he hits Smith in the calf of his left leg, causing the lawman to go down.

The rest of the posse members can't locate Carver in the dense brush because he's using a relatively new invention: smokeless powder.

Carver widens his arc of fire, sending rounds down both sides of the creek. All the posse members hug the trees and rocks. As Farr peers around his tree, trying to find Carver's position, a bullet creases his right arm near the wrist. Farr wraps the wound with his bandanna and yells across

"one of the outlaws ... appeared to be a dead shot. Every time he fired, the bullet either found its mark or came uncomfortably close to one of the attacking posseman." —Associated Press, July 18, 1899

to Reno, asking whether he saw the trajectory of the last shot Before Reno answers, another bullet strikes Farr's tree, goes through it and pierces his chest, near the heart. Farr collapses and dies on top of the wounded Smith.

In the gathering darkness, the posse members still can't locate Carver, who continues firing at will.


Around 6 p.m., Carver fires two final shots. A full hour later, the posse is still hunkered down, paralyzed with fear. A heavy rain begins to fall, yet the posse waits for darkness before moving. The entire time, Smith moans and yells, as the

dead body of Farr is still on top of him.

All three outlaws disappear into the wet darkness. Ketchum is not long for this earth. He will be captured and taken to Santa Fe, where he dies of blood poisoning on July 24. 3.

RECOIL REDUCER INSTALLATION

heart what it says in Philippians 4:13, "I can do all things through Christ which strengthened me." So when the new shotgun I purchased did not have a recoil pad, I decided to remedy the problem. I thought about using a lace on type, but didn't want the extra length.

After checking out a few sporting goods stores in the area without finding the type of recoil pad desired, I ordered one from Cabelas. I chose the HI VIZ X COIL recoil pad that fits all. The instructions recommended gunsmith installation, but I decided to give it a go. I ordered

the appropriate size pad. received the recoil pad and looked over the instructions, which were not in depth. After thinking it through, it went quite well. Here's how I did it.

When the length of pull and



angle were decided, I applied 2" wide masking tape to the stock over center line of the proposed saw cut. The tape helps prevent the wood from chipping when cut. Then the saw cut line was drawn on the tape. Remove stock from gun and butt plate from stock. Next, I measured (Continued on next page)

the width thickness at the stock butt and at the grip. Dial calipers work quite well for this. Subtract the smaller measurement from the larger and divide by 2. Then use this number to select a shim to place under the stock at the grip to keep the stock level while cutting.

Next I lined my hand miter saw with paper towels to protect the stock. The stock was placed in the miter lined up with the saw cut line on the masking tape. The stock was then clamped onto the miter and the miter was clamped onto the table with quick clamps. Carefully cut stock as desired. File any rough edges being careful not to cause any tearing of wood. I left the masking tape on. Then clamp recoil pad onto butt of stock as desired with a quick clamp. I then used the appropriate size transfer punch to locate top screw hole. The pad was then removed and the punch mark enhanced for clarity. It helps to use a small centering drill, but it is not a must.

Next the correct drill size was calculated. Dial calipers work good to check the minimum diameter of the screw thread. I used a drill press to drill a hole through a scrap piece of? inch wood to hold as a guide on the butt to make sure the holes were drilled perpendicular. After drilling the top hole to appropriate depth with drill motor, I used a three cornered file to cut two small slots on to the tip of the screw thread. This turns the screw into a tap and makes the job easier. Attach pad to stock with tap screw and repeat process for bottom screw. Then affix pad to stock with both screws and mark the perimeter of the stock on the pad with a small awl. The pad will be a little wider than the stock and long enough to accommodate the angle on the bottom. I used a disc sander with a right angle table to bring the pad top and sides to a rough fit. Be careful when shaping the bottom to proper angle.

Then I placed the pad on the stock and finished fit it with file and sand paper. I replaced the 2" masking tape on the butt of the stock to protect the wood while finish fitting ... I was quite proud and pleased with the outcome. When I compared it with another firearm I have with a gunsmith installed recoil pad, the one I had done actually looked nicer. With a little amount of skill, effort, and the appropriate tools, a cowboy can often amaze himself. Make sure to always use safety devices when manufacturing sawdust and wood chips. §.

In the beginning there was the horse pistol, and everyone except the horse thought this was a great idea. After all, the guns were big and clunky and generally held only a single shot. In polite society, it was the sword that was considered the main weapon. In America (which was not always considered civilized or polite) the long knife or the tomahawk often did the work of the sword or saber, and it was the long gun that was the prime weapon for many.

Westward expansion changed much of this. The repeating pistol was born, still heavy and clunky and still requiring pommel holsters to pack them. Then about 1849 came one of the true wonders of the world ... the Colt '49. Here was a pistol you could tote on your body! Just what the West needed! As people made their way to the gold fields of California and settled up and down the Oregon Trail, the holster and belt quickly became both functional and fashionable. For the 1st time (at least in civilian circles), the horse was getting a break. Not so in the

military, for the pommel holsters were still considered appropriate for an officer or cavalryman's two pistols. That, of course, all changed as the Civil War raged and officer and enlisted man alike discovered having your gun(s) with you was better than letting your horse have them.

With war come ever more powerful and efficient guns, and so came the advent of metallic cartridge firearms. Civilians immediately figured out if you took an existing belt and stitched loops (or "thimbles" as they were called in that day) to it, then you'd have a way to carry a bunch of ammo without any trouble whatsoever. The military ... well, once again, they lagged behind.

True, the head honchos in the War Department had it pretty much figured out the pommel holster really wasn't all that great an option. Cavalry was called upon to do dismounted work, so the belt and holster were readily accepted. The problem was the military just didn't

quite twig to the notion the cartridge belt was the most efficient way to cart loose cartridges. Cartridge boxes and pouches worked great during the Civil War, so they figured they'd be just as great during the Indian Wars. The trouble was, of course, fighting on the Frontier was

an entirely different world than anything experienced back east or even in the shelter of a Frontier garrison.

The larger cartridge boxes pressed into service for rifle rounds were often tin-lined. Metallic cartridges rattled in them, giving away positions to the enemy. They also

put pressures on only one part of the belt, causing soreness and fatigue. They were bulky and reduced maneuverability, and they didn't protect the cartridges, which often got dented while banging around loose.

Frontier officers and men very quickly learned, for campaigns, the civilians had got it right yet again, and adopted the thimbleequipped "scouting belts" for use outside the garrison. Officers petitioned Washington ceaselessly to adopt a cartridge belt, but Washington knew better. Every equipment review board between 1866 and 1879 rejected the thought of a dedicated cartridge belt. Part of this stemmed from frugal-mindedness. After all, there were a bazillion cartridge and cap boxes left over from the Civil War that could be modified.

What eventually made Washington move was the problem of damaged ammunition, as well as the ever-present problem of verdigris, the green, greasy build-up that weakened the soft copper cartridges of the day. In 1874, they came up

with the idea of a belt slide that could be threaded onto an existing saber belt. Yup, the darn things really did exist! (For those who don't believe it, check out page 174 of Arming and Equipping The U.S. Cavalry by Dusan B. Farrington.) Each slide held 10 rounds and two slides were issued per man. As you might guess, this really made the men feel safe while out on patrol, and so they continued to use what civilian-style belts could be made by the company saddler or bought.

Petitioning continued. While the problem of hurt and bruised cartridges had been "solved," the problem



of equipping more rounds per man had not, nor had the verdigris problem been addressed. By 1876, leather, especially greasy leather, was recognized as being a major culprit in causing verdigris. The Prairie belt was created to solve the problem. This belt was constructed by taking a belt and wrapping the middle section with canvas ducking. Varnished duck was used to create loops for cartridges. The men loved it, as it distributed the weight of a *lot* of cartridges nicely around their waists! Yahoo!

There were drawbacks. The belts were only 2-1/8" wide. Lead from the cartridges was smudging uniforms, eventually prompting adaptation of a 2-1/2" belt, and cartridge loops weren't up to the task of heavy use and would rip out or loosen up and cause cartridges to be lost.

The civilian population had, by this time, figured out a wide belt was more comfortable than one that was narrow, as it helped distribute weight better over the hips. While there were some who liked the Prairie belt. most remained loyal to leather for durability. The narrow single layer belt was being surpassed for function and comfort by the money belt, a soft two-layer belt generally 2-1/2"-3" in width that contoured to virtually any type body and was comfortable for extended wear. The money belt remained unrivaled for popularity among the civilian population until well into the 1920's where it became superceded by the Hollywood Buscadero belts and the heavier modern straight belts.

As for the military ... the success of the Prairie belt could not be ignored. Their problems, too, could not be overlooked, and an officer, Anson Mills, finally came up with a solution. It was the famed Mills belt, a belt designed from a tough, loomed fabric into which the cartridge loops were integrally woven. Don't ask me what kind of diabolical contraption wove these things, but there were eventually 10 of 'em churning out belts at the rate of one every half hour! Mills' belt was a hit! The car-

tridge loops, being formed as part of the belt itself didn't tear out and were uniform in size. They were as strong and as firm as leather, yet did not require the maintenance. They prevented verdigris. The military had found their belt and issued it in numerous forms and colors and with a variety of belt plates and buckles well into the 20th century.

It was a civilian success story, too. Winchester had exclusive rights for a "sporting" model designated by a bear head belt plate for five years. There was also a version with a dog head belt plate, and I am certain civilian belts were made locally by enterprising individuals from hy-

draulic hose belting, the original material that inspired Mills. These belts would have had stitched cartridge loops rather than woven ones.

Whatever the material, the cartridge belt, in tapered Prairie belt format or straight Ranger styles, became the standard for most of the gun-toting populace. I know this is a downright abridged version of the story, and as always, I welcome your comments, insights, and crabbings. 

The third reason I think Cowboy Action ShootingTM is great is the way it helps give juniors a sense of pride. I have never met a junior who didn't truly enjoy shooting. There are several ways Cowboy Action ShootingTM gives juniors a sense of pride.

First, many juniors are very good shooters, and not only that—they are not ashamed to be. Cowboy Action ShootingTM has winners, but it also has losers. However, no matter if you win or lose, everyone has a good time. At my very first match I came in last in the junior category, and even though I knew I did not do my best, I felt honored to be on stage standing next to all those great junior shooters and hoping to be one myself someday.

Second, juniors feel pride because they are competing in a rather special sport. Not many young people get to go out and shoot for fun, or even be trusted to do so. Juniors who participate in Cowboy Action Shooting TM know they are special and take pride in that fact.

Third, juniors feel pride because of the relationships they build with their families. Juniors are taken out shooting with either their immediate family or extended family. By participating in something together, juniors build a relationship with their family that is much stronger than that experienced by juniors that don't participate in family activities.

There are many more reasons Cowboy Action ShootingTM can foster pride in young people; these are only a few. No matter the reason, pride can make a young person strong and confident. It never hurts to strengthen the confidence of a young person as they grow into an adult.

Now that we have covered some of the reasons juniors should be involved Cowboy Action Shooting TM , let's talk about some of the ways to get them started.

First, start them young. If you start them young enough, then there are not so many distractions in their lives. With the new rules, you can start a junior as young as 9. I think anywhere from 9-11 is a really good age to start. If you wait 'till 13 or 15, you have to compete with driving and girlfriends and boyfriends—by then, some kids just aren't interested anymore.

Second, make sure they have good equipment. However, don't jump in too fast. You do not want to purchase a whole set up for someone who may not be interested. I suggest buying a .22 pistol, and taking it from there. That way if they do like it, you can build on that, but if they don't, then you are only out a little bit of money. Other good starting equipment is a .22 rifle and a 12gauge shotgun with really light loads. Regarding the long guns, above all, make sure they have the correct stock length, or they will be uncomfortable to shoot.

At first it is okay to shoot in hand-me-down leather, but if they show a real interest in shooting, get them something that fits their bodies. If you are worried about them growing, get a rig where the holsters slide on and off, and then all you will have to change as they grow is the belt. If they have good equipment that fits them, it will be easier for them to shoot, and they will enjoy it more. When they enjoy it, they will be more likely to stick with it.

Third, be careful how much pressure you apply when getting a junior started. Kids are constantly getting pressure from school, their parents, friends, and everyone around them. It is difficult to have it come from shooting, too. On the other hand, Cowboy Action Shooting $^{\text{TM}}$ is rather expensive to be doing "just because."


Every child is different, and so I can only say to follow your gut. Above all else, shooting should be fun, and if they don't want to do it, you can't make them.





Buscadero style slots in the belts, and bad guys wore over the belt, plain rigs which reflected their low morals. For the young among us, who may not have ever seen a B-Western, I put in a couple of pictures of good guy and bad guy rigs I made several years ago. How else could folks tell good and bad apart? All you gotta do is go back to when we were kids and stuff like that mattered.

Moreover, The B-Western has a simple historical rule ... the older the western, the more original stuff there was in it. The movies even had whole posses of extra's who were hired because they could ride. Some of these coyotes even had names, such as the Gower Gulch Boys, who were actually cowboys riding the range before they worked in movies. Their stuff populated the prop shacks that studios used for movies, so why do we need such books as Packing Iron, by Richard Rattenbury or Cowboys and Trappings Of The Old West by William Manns and Elizabeth Clair Flood? All you gotta do is watch the B-Western, and you can see all the stuff in the world.

And one more thing. How come all our so-called "historians" ignore such basic truths as these: Good Guys had really neat outfits with shirts and boots vou could die for. Bad Guvs wore suits and fedoras and owned banks and law offices. Henchmen and other guys whose sole mission in life is to get shot by the bad guys just to piss us off wore everyday working clothes, and everybody had the good graces to face the camera ... obviously it was a function of western etiquette not to crowd good guys by competing with them on the gear front, and everybody was treated fairly so's we could see all their faces.

Item Three. The Real Culture.

Let's put on our intuitive hats for a moment and get to some of the real meat of western history.

Where's Mom? We see her husband and her daughter, but where is Mom? Not to pick on Bob Boze Bell again, but he seems occupied with mundane details of gunfights in his books to the point where he ignores a basic need in evaluating western culture ... how come all the heroines don't have mothers? What happened to them? There's plenty of Dads around, but where's Mom?

It appears a significant segment of western women were, in fact, snotnosed belles who come directly to the ranch from ... "Back East" ... and begin falsely accusing heroes such as Ken Maynard, Gene Autry, and Roy Rogers of wrong doing before some sense is knocked into their heads. They all get suckered by the bad guys (not the henchman in the rough clothes, but the smooth guys in the suits) before they have to come to their senses. Happens over and over in at least half the B-Westerns out there, yet is completely



ignored by most historians.

Here's the more relevant theory, and I am surprised I am the first to publish as such: The lack of Mom's in western movies is a reflection of a notwell-known facet of western culture. If Mom delivered a son (even a brother of the heroine who was lured by the bad guy until rescued by the hero), she was allowed to live on. If she delivered only a daughter, she was quietly done away with, albeit sorely missed. Do you feel the temptation to wonder whether there may have been a ritualistic practice of cannibalizing unfortunate moms to cover up evidence that maybe we don't know about? It'd certainly be a big help if the so-called historians spent some time studying this intriguing theory.

And what about Dad? He always seems to get shot, wounded, or tied up in some cave somewhere. Is this to imply that Western Men who owned ranches weren't very bright?

Item Four. The Western Economy.

Forget cattle. I don't want to hear anymore about cattle. Even a hasty glance at B-Westerns shows the key features of the economy were Water, Oil, Gold, and Mismanagement. The former three were why Dad was shot, or the bad guy schemed to gain the sale of Dad's ranch.

The latter, mismanagement, is a reflection of the fact bad guys (not the henchmen and extras in drab, work-aday clothing, but the cigar smokers who wore suits and wanted to kill Dad and take his daughter) were willing to spend inordinate amounts of manpower and funding for the sole purpose of getting Dad's dinky little ranch with all the undiscovered oil, gold, and water sources. The real reason cattle even existed is because rustling them gave the bad guys (not the bad guys in suits, but the henchmen in drab clothing with mundane stuff) something to do with their idle time.

What happened to rustled cattle? Ever see them in a scene at market? Anybody make a profit off them? Ever see a Henchman collecting a receipt for them? Where'd the bad guy put them on his Schedule A and 1040? Maybe their bones are bleach-

ing in some remote corner of the prairie, next to Mom's.

The simple truth of the matter is that most historians are willing to go off on wild goose chases to write about gunfights, make movies like Tombstone and Deadwood and Open Range more authentic when they are overlooking the basic facts of western history that are so blatant in The B-Western.

What's next? Are we going to leave war to our generals and laws to our elected officials rather than trust Hanoi Jane, Baghdad Sean, and Rosie the Mouth?

Conclusions

All kidding aside, how blessed are we with our western heritage, and how lucky are we to be gifted with both the charm of things like the B-Western and the dedicated research of the people I mentioned in this article.

If you don't look past the actors and at the background the second time around in watching B-Westerns, you'll miss the wind blowing in the background scenery of the low-budget movie, or the cow-pony standing at the hitching rail with the slick-forked, Stagg Rigged saddle, or the gunbelt that came from who-knows-where ...

If you don't have Bob Boze Bell's books on Wyatt, Billy The Kid, and Doc Holiday, then you are truly missing some excellent analytical writing that captures the excitement and detail of the events he worked on. If it were not for people like Peter Sherayko, adding a level of detail to presentations like Tombstone then they would not be as attractive as they are. Check out his book, *Tombstone–The Guns and Gear*.

Rattenbury and Manns/Flood have put together two of the many excellent books and sources out there whose photographic quality makes the subject matter vivid. Sometimes I wonder how many of us who craft leather have made the holster shown on the cover of Packing Iron. The saddles I have made have been more enjoyable because of the ability to see so much detail in the pages of Cowboys And Trappings ...

> Good work, folks, and thanks for all you have given us. Don't shoot yore eye out, kid. ...

and is a direct spin-off of Cowboy Action ShootingTM.

Mounted Shooting is a sport that combines elements of old-time Wild West Show exhibition along with the elements of barrel racing, pole bending, reining, and many other equestrian skills—all done while using two .45 caliber single action revolvers loaded with five rounds each of blackpowder blanks to shoot ten balloon targets set in a special random pattern or Old West type scenario called a "stage." Typically, a competitor crosses a timing beam at full gallop and engages the first pattern of five targets. After the shooter

fires the fifth shot, he or she returns the empty revolver to a holster and proceeds to the next set of five targets. Mounted Shooters are timed through the stage, determining raw time plus any penalties incurred. For instance, five seconds is added to the raw time for a knocked over barrel, dropped gun, or missed target. The contestant with the lowest accumulated time wins.





ness to your horse is key in Mounted Shooting horse training. We acclimate horses to gunfire using a herd method and repetition of exposure to the various elements of Mounted Shooting-with an emphasis on safety and exposure to the sound of blanks and balloons. It is assumed students have intermediate riding skills and safe gun handling skills.

The second portion of the clinic is designed for those folks that are relatively new to the sport of Mounted Shooting. It is assumed you have horseback riding experience and basic gun safety skills. All






he Dragoon Mountain Spanish Barbs project was created by leasing a breeding group of Wilbur-Cruce Colonial Spanish Horses (also known as Spanish Barbs). The owners joined a select group of conservation breeders dedicated to bringing back to popularity the horse that conquered the New World and settled the West. The Barbs, known for their intelligence, diverse athleticism, hardiness, and gentle temperament, inspired the

quest to save and popularize them. This particular strain of Spanish Barb developed over hundreds of years in the dry and rocky terrain of Sonora, Mexico and Southern Arizona near the Dragoon Mountains. For those who are interested in preserving ranching horses of the Old West, this is a significant group of horses. Nino Cochise, the grandson of the great Chiricahua Chief, Cochise, writes about the Barb in his biography, "These thirty horses were good ones: half-feral, half-domestic snipnosed Barbarie referred to as Barbs and prized by all good cowboys." (Circa 1896) ("The First Hundred


Years of Nino Cochise" by Ciye "Nino" Cochise as told to A. Kinney Griffith, p.168) Today this appreciation of the Spanish Barb is being spread by Rick Levin, who participates in Mounted Shooting, hunter/jumper, trail rides, and cattle work on Dragoon Mountain Spanish Barb horses.

The History

Iberian from the Spanish peninsula and Barb horses from the coast of Morocco, both breeds closely related, were the horses the Conquistadors brought to the New World. Settlers of the vast new territory of Hispania also imported Barbs directly from Africa when Spain became drained of her original breeding stock from excess exports to European

nations and the New World. In 1667, Sir Walter Raleigh found the West Indies had the finest-shaped Barb horses he had ever seen (www.-ColonialSpanishHorses.org). These horses were bred in the West Indies and shipped to Mexico to begin the conquest of both the North and South American continents.

In the late 1600's Jesuit missionary and explorer Father Eusebio Kino established a herd of Spanish Barb horses along with cattle and other livestock at Rancho Dolores, Mexico to supply the expanding settlements of the Pimeria Alta region. Father Kino developed a mission system reaching from Mexico to San Xavier del Bac outside Tucson, AZ three centuries ago. He was known as the "Padre on Horseback" for his extensive riding. Father Kino and his Spanish Barb horses were said to make many trips from Mexico City to the Pimeria Alta settlements in a span of seventy days. Known for the attributes of endurance, easy keepers, and hardiness, these Barbs were instrumental in establishing the missions.

In the 1870's, according to family history, Dr. Wilbur, an early homesteader near the town of Arivaca, Arizona, purchased a group of these Mission horses. These became the foundation stock of the Wilbur-Cruce rancher strain of Colonial Spanish (Continued on next page)

Horses. Dr. Wilbur's granddaughter, Eva Antonia Wilbur-Cruce, preserved this isolated herd through much adversity until she sold her family ranch in 1989 to The Nature Conservancy to be included in the Buenos Aires National Wildlife Refuge. Fortunately, the American Livestock Breeds Conservancy became involved. Blood typing and visual inspection supported the oral history and resulted in the rescue and conservatory distribution of the herd. Today Eva's "rock horses" as she fondly called them, noting their ability to negotiate very difficult, rocky, mountainous country with skill and ease, are preserved by breeders in several western states. ("A Beautiful, Cruel Country" by Eva Wilbur-Cruce, 1987)

Dragoon Mountain Spanish Barbs

The Horse Ranch is located at the western foot of the Dragoon Mountains in Cochise County, Arizona, bordering the Coronado National Forest. This area represents a rugged but habitable land, which was historically known as The Horse Ranch because early settlers would find their lost horses in this large box canyon. After buying the ranch from an oil company that held the land for nearly 40 years, it seemed logical to the owners this land be returned to its former beauty. Cattle were removed to allow revegetation of the

land, and after five years the Dragoon Mountain Spanish Barbs project was created to breed and preserve the Spanish Barb horse on the vast range.

Knowing the Wilbur-Cruce horses were self-managed for over one hundred years on a ranch in Southern Arizona, the owners of the horse ranch decided to enable this rare strain to develop and breed in a natural setting. Owners, conservationists, and breeders believe the Spanish Barb horses' traits must be preserved, and being raised in a natural setting appears to enhance their wellknown mild temperament, intelligence, and resourcefulness. Allowing the horses to be disciplined by mares and stallions seems to produce a wellmanaged, mentally healthy, and easily trainable horse.

New horses enter the project in April. Foaling, breeding, and settling takes place during the following two months at the headquarters. Foals are socialized and taught to lead during the six weeks after birth. The mares are bred to appropriate stallions. At the end of the mares breeding and foals socializing, a stallion is chosen to stay with the herd for the next 10 months, and the herd is taken to the thousand-acre pasture. The pasture has native grasses, Mesquite trees, and natural terrain where the horses can roam as they have for centuries. The herd is a family, and you

see the stallion taking an active role in natural rearing.

Training

When the herd is brought in from pasture, they have experienced the natural world of horses and terrain with every imaginable obstacle. They are ready for training in any discipline. The preservation of their keen sense of surrounding as well as acceptance of the natural pecking order is vital in horse behavior.

All of the horses are started under saddle around three years old. During round pen work, they learn voice commands, such as walk, trot, canter, and whoa. This helps the horse learn to associate rein and leg cues much quicker and with a more relaxed attitude. The horses are started in a snaffle bit and stay in a snaffle bit until they have a firm grasp of the training fundamentals. Suppleness and softness are stressed at all levels of training.

Trainers note the Spanish Barb

learns very quickly and requires less repetition than most horses. During the first four to six months of training the horse is introduced to several equine activities, such as cattle work, dressage, jumping, Mounted Shooting, and trail riding in the Dragoon Mountains. An equine discipline is then selected that suits the horse's ability and specific training begins in that field. These horses have competed in hunter/jumper events, Mounted Shooting, and trail competitions.

Although the Spanish Barbs have done well in many disciplines, they have exceeded all expectations in Mounted Shooting with two of them taking State and World Senior Men's Championships after only one season of training. The history of these horses and their role in settling the Wild West make a focus on Mounted Shooting a logical pursuit. Why not, "The horse with a historic past making records for a sport with a historic flair?".

BIANCHI'S DRY FIRE SIXGUN

Here's a full-sized, fully functional, non-firing peacemaker look-alike that's perfect for SASS-type shooting practice, gun twirling, or other safe gun handling!

Practice, practice, practice, and more practice. Ask any champion shooter or master gunhandler, and that is what they will tell you is the "secret" to becoming the best. Of course, constant practice and dry firing can be hard on your competition pistols, or other working sixguns. However, help is on the way. John Bianchi's Frontier Gunleather and EMF Co., Inc. have joined forces in bringing out an all-new "Dry Fire" single-action revolver. This full-sized, fully functional, replica Colt-type peacemaker-style copy has all of the working parts of the post-1896 sixshooters, and is even serial numbered like the originals. Offered in 4-3/4, 5-1/2, and 7-1/2-inch barrel lengths, the big difference here is a Dry Fire sixgun cannot be fired with any ammunition—live or blank! Possessing a similar weight and balance of an original, it looks, feels, and handles just like the real thing. This revolver has been ruled by the ATF as a non-firing, nongun for legal purposes, however, except upon the closest inspection, it is virtually indistinguishable from a live fire

original. Because these "six-(non) shooters" cannot be loaded or fire any ammo, there is no FFL required, no transfer, delays, registration, or licensing process to go through, and there are no shipping problems. According to EMF, who is the exclusive dealer for the Dry Fire sixgun, each is a cash and carry proposition!

If you have a hankering for a sixgun you can use for practicing your sixgunning techniques for SASS competitions, Bianchi's Dry Fire single action could be just what you need. This authentic looking peacemaker clone is also great for safe gun twirling practice, static display, staged theatrical purposes, or for travel to Western gatherings as part of an Old West outfit, re-enactments, and other historical events, where live-fire handguns are banned.

Bianchi's Dry Fire sixgun is produced on the same precision machined steel parts and forgings used to make the live-firing replicas, and is manufactured to exacting standards in Italy by Pietta, who make fully functional shooting replicas, such as EMF's Great Western II series. The main difference is the Bianchi Dry Fire hoglegs cannot

be altered to handle live ammunition. Several safety features have been incorporated into each piece, preventing alteration. For example, the barrel has not been bored through completely. Further, each chamber in the cylinder has been blocked and is slightly offset, thus preventing the loading of any ammunition. The frame is also manufactured in such a way that a live-fire cylinder cannot be inserted into it.

Another feature is the springloaded firing pin, which is visible when the revolver is cocked, retracts when the hammer is dropped into firing position, so it does not make contact with any cartridge! Another nifty feature is Bianchi's non-gun disassembles

like an original; thus, it can be serviced and repaired by a competent gunsmith, and for practicing SASS-type shooting, fast draw, or fancy gun handling, the revolver can be fine tuned like a live-fire sixgun.

Having seen and handled Bianchi's Dry Fire sixgun, I can report you can't tell the difference until you open it up. A blue and color casehardened model with walnut stocks retails for \$365, while the nickel-plated model with simulated ivory grips, costs \$435. 





Few who have seen Sam Peckinpah's 1969 epic movie documenting the closing days of the Old West, "The Wild Bunch," will ever forget it. Besides being a cult classic having the distinction of holding the record for using more gallons of fake movie blood than any movie prior or since, it has a certain graphic, desperate realism painted by unforgettable images. One of those images is that of Ernest Borgnine, William Holden, and others toting a short barreled 1897 and Model 12 Winchester shotguns, employing them with great effect against the Mexican "Ruales" police force, which vastly outnumbered them. This movie, probably more than any other factor, ensured the inclusion and popularity of the ubiquitous 1897 in Cowboy Action ShootingTM.

Several years ago EMF sent Steve Langford, the driving force behind China Sports, to negotiate with the arms manufacturers in China for a high quality 1897. These 1897 Winchester shotgun clones were to be manufactured to exacting specifications. Steve was

successful, and TTN began importing these new 1897's. EMF is handling the marketing.

HISTORY

The 1897 Winchester was initially made only in 12 gauge, and only with a solid frame, non-removable barrel. I understand some of the very first ones produced still had 2-5/8" chambers for the blackpowder loads still commonly used. The 1897, however, usually had fluid steel barrels as standard, rather than Damascus barrels. Damascus barrels could be had on special order, however. By 1898, they were producing the 1897 with the now more common removable barrel variations. Winchester even started making some 16-gauge guns by 1900, though those are now exceptionally scarce. Other features such as fancy wood, special order barrel lengths, and straight grip English style stocks could be had for a price by special order.

The Winchester Model 1897 pump shotgun was an unqualified success. It was a favorite long beyond its 60-year production history. Winchester manufactured over 1,000,000 of the original Model 1897 pump shotguns between 1893 and 1957. It has always enjoyed a reputation for being strong, simple, and ruggedly built. Sportsmen and lawmen alike favored it. It was a favorite with Railway Express and payroll guards because of its 6+1 firepower of OO Buckshot! During both World War I and World War II the

1897 Winchester was used in its 20" barreled "trench gun" configuration.

I have personally owned five 1897 Winchesters in the past fifteen years. Most have been fair to rough "shooters" of the 1901 to 1915 vintage. While I like 1897's for Cowboy Action ShootingTM, I have always personally favored external-hammer doubles since I joined the "dark side" in the mid '90's and started shooting blackpowder cartridge. As the 1897s aren't allowed in the Frontier Cartridge, category I stick with the "double barreled street howitzer." I thought of keeping an 1897 on as a "house gun" loaded with #4 Buckshot, but have been leery of shooting hot, modern high base loads in an 1890's designed gun, even with modern steels. (That's why Remington makes Model 870's!)

EMF'S 1897 COWBOY SHOTGUN

As soon as I opened the box, I was really impressed with the EMF 1897. It approximates an 1898 vintage fixed barrel model. It is currently available only in 12 gauge, for 2-3/4 inch shells. The metal has a very uniform, nicely polished deep "blue-black" finish. There is no variation of color from part to part. It comes standard with a 20-inch barrel. The barrel is equipped with a removable choke as a standard feature. It comes with a modified choke tube in it, though other choke tubes are available. This is a nice feature for Cowboy Action ShootingTM. Usually, folks want a cylinder choke, though a modified or full might be wanted for clay pigeons or even the infamous "Murrieta Pipes."

Sighting on the EMF model is like the original 1897 Winchester with a bead on the barrel, and "U" notch on the forward, upward swelled portion of the receiver. The

action of the EMF 1897 remained very tight, though I did not find it overly so. I like a tight action. It will generally work in smooth, and can be polished further if desired. If an action starts too loose, it tends to get sloppy over time. The EMF Model 1897 has a hammer half cock, the slide release button on the left side, and also the magazine catch release buttons, just as the originals do.

One of the nicest features of the EMF 1897 is the wood furniture. The wood to metal fit is excellent. It appears to be American Walnut. It has a very clean, straight, bright grain. It has no checkering, and is well finished. The walnut stock and forearm have a satin coating, rather than a varnish finish found on other imported 1897's.

Another nice feature is the practical, but discreet, rubber recoil pad / butt-plate. I say it is discreet because when you look at it, you don't see the typical, very UN-period, perforated, white lined spacer,

screw on recoil pad! I don't care what you say; the average recoil pad doesn't pass my dual prong "John Wayne, Clint Eastwood Test." Would they use one? I think not! The EMF discreet recoil pad is a dark brown, close celled, semi-rigid foam about 3/4 on an inch thick. It really seems to take the bite out of my smokeless 1-1/8 ounce, #6, 12 gauge shells. This pad also has a nice texture that allows the stock to really stick to the shoulder once you place it. It had virtually no slippage. It really grabs and stays in place. It is certainly far superior to a period correct steel or hard rubber butt plate. Those downright hurt the bursitis!

Overall, as far as I can see, it is identical to the solid frame 1897. While I don't know if parts interchange, I suspect they may, as they just reverse engineered an original 1897 Winchester for a prototype. When I loaded the magazine, it took the full six rounds in the tube magazine. Of course unless you are in a team shoot, you will never load the

full six rounds.

How does it shoot, you ask? The answer is an unqualified GREAT! The modified choke patterns a little less than 1 inch per yard from the muzzle, giving it about a 12-inch pattern at 15 yards. The action when new was very tight, but not rough. A speed demon or gamesman might want to have the action slicked up by an 1897 specialist, but for the average Cowboy Action Shooter, or myself, the EMF 1897 is (in my opinion) just fine out of the box.

Hangin' Judge Hemp used the EMF 1897 at a River City Regulator match several months ago. He was

very pleased with its performance and said it shot dead on point of aim. It cycled flawlessly, hit where he pointed it, and never had any issues at all.

CONCLUSION

Well, all in all, I think the EMF Model 1897 12-gauge cowboy pump is a natural for Cowboy Action Shooting™. For less than the current price of the average "rough shooter" original 1897 Winchester, you can have a brand new, modern steel 1897. It is also priced competitively with the Norinco made imported 1897's. I guarantee if you had an original 1897 this nice, you would be hesitant to take it out to get banged around in your gun cart at a Cowboy Action Match!


At this point I would like to give a personal opinion. I know some folks say, "Buy only American." I like this sentiment, but it is not practical in this era of globalization. I have no doubts that half the components of my Ford F250, Crew-Cab, 4x4, 7.3 Liter Diesel are made off shore. The same is probably true of my Jeep YJ Wrangler. Even Remington's Spartan cowboy double shotguns are made in Russia. It is a fact of life.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY



1850's

3 June 1850 A convention of "slave" states advocate extending the Missouri Compromise line to the Pacific. This would include the Southwest and Southern California. The problem? This land is suited for cattle grazing and ranching, activities incompatible with slave labor.

5 June 1850 Pat Garrett is born in Chambers County, Alabama, one of six children of a southern plantation owner.

22 June 1850 San Francisco's 6th great fire destroys 300 buildings and 18 blocks of frame houses in 10 hours, resulting in over \$5million in damages.

3 June 1850 Leaders in the Cayuse War are hanged in Oregon City. Those hanged are Tilokaikt and Tamsaky.

27 June 1850 Army explorers complete the first survey of the Great Salt Lake.

9 June 1851 San Francisco's 200-man strong First Committee of Vigilance is organized, hanging an accused thief from the city hotel the next day.

1 June 1852 Major George T. Howard, superintendent of Texas Indian agents, reports there are 22,780 Indians in Texas. Comanche and Kiowa make up 20,000.

23 June 1853 Captain John W. Gunnison leaves Fort Leavenworth in NE Kansas to start the Pacific Railroad survey along the 38th Parallel as part of the government's Manifest Destiny program


29 June 1856 Tecumton and his band surrender as part of the Rogue River War.

On a visit to Pueblo, Ford agreed to share a room with Ed Kelly, another tenant in a local boarding house. The next morning, Ford's diamond ring was missing. When Kelly learned that Ford was spreading the word around Creede that Kelly was the thief, he went to Ford's saloon and killed him with a blast from a 12guage. It was 11 years after Ford shot Jesse James. 🖈

10 June 1857 The XY Company (Brigham Young Carrying and Express Company) wins a contract from the U.S. to carry mail and freight. The company's second purpose is to facilitate migration to Utah. The first mail delivery, from Independence, Missouri, to Salt Lake City is made in 26 days. The U.S. cancels the contract in less than six months due to tensions between the Mormons and the Federal gov-

12 June 1858 Nineteen Georgians and 46 Cherokee Indians reach Bent's Fort on the Arkansas River, in south-central Kansas Territory. Many quit, but those who stay on find gold many miles north, along the Cherry Creek, near Denver.

16 June 1858 In Springfield, Illinois, Republican Senate candidate Lincoln said the slavery issue had to be resolved, "A house divided against itself cannot stand. I believe this government cannot endure permanently half slave and half free." Lincoln lost this particular election.

24 June 1858 Fort Garland, in the San Luis Valley, Colorado, is established to curb the Utes and Jicarilla Apache.

10 June 1859 Comstock Lode, the richest mining discovery in US history, is discovered in the Washoe Mountains, (Nevada), Utah Territory yielding \$300 million in silver and gold over the next 20 years. The discovery is made by Peter O'Riley and Patrick McLaughlin. Henry Comstock comes along and insists on a share, since it's his water they use to wash the dirt away. All the mine discoverers die poor. Only men like George Hearst, who buy the prospectors out, make and keep their fortune. Virginia City is built to house miners coming to the mountains to get rich.

11 June 1859 Due to lack of protection by government troops, the Comanche Reservation in Texas and reservations along the Brazos River are eliminated. The affected Indians are moved to Indian Territory.


SUMMER SNOW


One of my complaints about some of the excellent western novels I have reviewed lately is they are too short. "Summer Snow" looked to be too short from the get go, too, until I spotted the trick

time and his use of dialect and cowboy colloquialisms and metaphors was unsurpassed by virtually anything I have ever read before. Let me give you some examples:

"He served a cider pie that was as sweet as a baby's breath."

"The ranch triangle jangled at five."

"...all would fade away like summer snow drifting from the cottonwood trees." [And thus the title of the book.]

"...cold as a miser's heart, with snow hump-deep to a buffalo."


That's just a taste, actually. But you get the drift immediately; you know exactly what the words mean, but they make the time and place vividly real. And as the story unfolds, and the characters talk to each other, you almost feel like you're there in the Old West, speaking like those folks and thinking like them and even living like them - you're just, well, absorbed!

Like other writers, Mr. Lynde is diligent about the use of classic descriptions of horses, too, but with no explanation – very typical of western writers - they assume we all know! Sure, I know we're a "cowboy outfit," but it occurred to me that maybe not everyone knows what a "roan" horse is. A roan is a horse with single white hairs mixed in with a darker base color, giving the effect of a much lighter coat. The mane, tail, and head appear darker, as will the legs. I expect many folks often refer to them as some kind of grey, which they are not. What about a "grulla?"

(Pronounced grew-ya, by the way.) These horses are smoky or mouse colored. And the only reason I mention this kind of stuff is because one of the horses in the book is called a dilsey and if the author had not explained it was a "small bay saddle mare," I'd have been lost. Now, when you read these books, you'll know (and I know some of y'all live in the big city and had no clue about this!).

The point is, if that's all I can find to say negative about this book, that the horses' descriptions need to be explained, you just darned well know it was a great read. The details were terrific but, MUCH MORE IMPORTANT-LY, the book's plot twists were sometimes subtle, sometimes stunningly surprising, and sometimes completely off the wall! Non-predictability is the hallmark of good writing, and "Summer Snow" has that on page after delightful page. The lead character is just that, too - A CHARACTER! Young and brash and tough as nails and up against opponents who have varied, impulsive, and erratic behavior that make his job that much tougher - and you really do feel for this guy, especially in the freezing cold of a high desert winter where most of the story takes place. The final plot twist is a regular bolt from the blue, too, and you'll just about drop the book when it happens. I'm telling you, this is a western story with a capital W!







is up for debate. Whatever his origins, the Jersey Devil was last seen lurking in the Pine Barrens.

Purgatory In The Pines was held October 27-29, 2006. It was the third SASS New Jersey State Championship and was combined this year with the first Delaware State Championship. The match was hosted by The Jackson Hole Gang at Central Jersey Rifle and Pistol Club, Jackson, New Jersey with 10 main

stages scheduled (six on Saturday, four on Sunday) and side matches Friday with a limit of the first 180 SASS competitors.

For the past two years, the match was "bedeviled" with hurricanes and their left over remnants. It was decided to move the event date back a few weeks and hold the match after the official hurricane season was over. However, the east coast has another natural condition we call nor'easters. Similar to a hurricane, a nor'easter is counter-clock wise turning cyclone (a storm system circulating around a center) ... and one showed up Friday evening, lasting most of Saturday!

It was the SASS Kentucky and Tennessee State Blackpowder Shootout—Smokeout in the Hills. This smoky October weekend was one of the largest SASS blackpowder matches to date with 73 total shooters (67 shot blackpowder) from eight states.


The "town" of Possum Trot, Tennessee doubled in size in the two months prior to the match. The Highland Regulators really lent a hand (or hammer) to build six new stages to accommodate the blackpowder shoot. The majority of the new shooting bays are covered to protect from the elements and include a jail, a mercantile, a saloon, a stable, and the necessary cowboy cemetery. Smokin' Joe Anderson had no trouble renting out the two brand new sleeping cabins in the town. Card playing/story telling at the Possum's Breath Sasparilla Saloon and sitting around the campfire at night are always a highlight of any shooting weekend at Possum Trot.

The Friday afternoon side matches began with a bang-thunderstorms put a little damper on the day. But those diehard blackpowder shooters don't scare easily; they came out in droves for one stage in particular. The required firepower was a knife, jail keys, .22 pistol #1, .22 rifle, tomahawk, bow and arrow, shotgun, .22 pistol #2, match rifle, match pistol #1 (shot duelist style), and match pistol #2 (shot two-handed squaw grip); hence the name—

Ringer's Humdinger. Montana Max and Hepsibah Hawke were overjoyed to take home the prize for that humdinger of a side match!

The Saturday morning main match also began with a bang. Possum Trot's resident historian, Ernie, saluted Kentucky Tennessee mountain men from times past with a blast from his handcarved muzzleloader. The eight main match stages were fun to shoot as well as being friendly to gunfighters and right and LEFT-handed shooters. The dark-siders found themselves in jail, sitting down to a meal, riding a horse, shooting a bull's butt, and of course, in a saloon. The shooting died down long enough for the cowfolks to grab some grub at the Southern BBQ dinner. When all had a full belly, Hezekiah Hawke, SASS #36665, ran the side match drawing featuring donations from over 25 great sponsors.

And then ... Hog callin', snake egg stompin', seed spittin', pumpkin carvin' and all other sorts of crazy activities took place. It seems a whole gang of cowboys and cowgirls came to the blackpowder match to do more than just win a shootin' match. They came to earn the title of The Champeen of the Hillbilly Nation, The Sultan of Smoke, The King of Kaboom, or The Best Dang Soot Lord on the Planet! The Soot Lord competition used points for factors such as finish in the main math, score on Ringer's Humdinger side match, and other interesting nonshooting activities. The SASS Kentucky and Tennessee State Blackpowder Shootout was an exciting match for the whole family. Hope to see y'all next year for more spittin', stompin', and – oh yeah – shootin'. ♣

WHERE THE OLD WEST STAYED YOUNG






In order to obtain the flags required for this project, Jake petitioned the fifty state governors explaining the purpose of his project and requesting a flag for his trailer. His response from these politicians—an abysmal response of four flags! These were sent by the states of Rhode Island, Utah, Wyoming, and West Virginia. He did not even receive a response from the Governor of his home state! (Something to think about the next time you're in the voting booth.)

While the Boy Scout Troop and the Boy Scout Venture Crew are separate organizations, both are chartered by the same parent organization of the Boy Scouts of America, through our local Trails West Jake recognized in order to complete his project and to achieve his advancement, he was going to need help. Jake turned to his immediate family and his extended family, the Rangeless Riders, several of which are one in the same. 



CASTLE GATE TOWN, UTAH

ust over the Wasatch Mountains from Salt Lake City, Utah in the heart of coal country, is Price, Utah, home of the Castle Gate Posse.

For nearly six years this SASS affiliated Cowboy Action club has been working on funding and constructing one of the finest SASS ranges in the western US. And now their dream has finally come true. With the help of the City of Price, UT and Carbon County, with funds generated from area oil and gas leases and earmarked for recreational use, the Carbon County Shooting complex is now nearing completion. This three and one-half million dollar project located on 600 plus acres includes a public range for rifle with ranges to 1000 yards, pistol ranges, a law enforcement range with pneumatic targets, and yes, a Cowboy Action Town.

The Castle Gate Posse takes possession of the new shooting com-

plex May 2007. This magnificent facility located in the hills south of Price, Utah includes 14 separate shooting bays and is equipped with 280 Evil Roy targets acquired from Action Target, also located in Utah. The main street of the complex is reminiscent of any 1800's town and includes a bank, livery stable, saloon, jail, church, an outhouse, and other buildings you would expect to see in the Old West. Driving up to the entrance of the town and entering the 150-car parking lot you feel you are truly entering any small western town in the 1800's. The only thing missing is Boot Hill.

Since the Cowboy town is located away from population areas, the facility is completely self-contained with power generators, a cistern for water, and, yes, a heated clubhouse with heated restrooms and kitchen facilities. Just because you are

playing Cowboy doesn't mean you have to eat out of a chuckwagon and freeze in the winter!

Castle Gate Town is about 15 miles out of Price, Utah and access
