A SHOOTING IN SIN CITY 6th Annual SASS Convention & Wild West Convention

Having attended various Ends of Trail and other SASS functions for more than 20 years now, I thought I had enjoyed the entire SASS experience. I had only seen the half of it!

The SASS Convention has an entirely different personality than END of TRAIL. I've known since starting the club in Houston 23 years ago and then doing the same when we moved to Colorado that all kinds of folks join SASS, and not all of them join just to generate great clouds of smoke and make bang-ding sounds on the range. dress in funny old clothes, and some join to do some serious costuming.

From Wednesday evening when Sugar Britches and I checked into the Riviera Hotel and Casino we never set foot outside the hotel until Sunday morning when we checked out and departed for home. Between arrival and departure, we had one of the greatest SASS experiences we have ever had!

Departing from the chronology of the event, I shall continue this report with my observations of one of the most impressive cowpoke events I have ever witnessed.

The Cattle Baron's Ball

The Cattle Baron's Ball in the grand ballroom of the Riviera took me back 120 years to a time that may have existed only in the imaginations of people like you and me, as we try to recreate the West that never was, but should have been. Costumes were not threatened by wind or dust or mud, so everyone wore their very best.





The colors presented by the SASS Grand Army of the Frontier was particularly moving. Not a word was spoken, but when the colors started to move all conversations ceased, everyone rose, and hats came off. This obvious respect for the flag and what it stands for makes one proud to be a cowboy.

The theme of Cattle Baron's Ball was taken seriously by cowboy and cowgirl alike. I'm just a poor old cowpoke, so I don't know much of silks, taffetas, brocades, and the like. I recognize Stetson Tontos, Garcia spurs, gold watch chains, lovely ladies, and well dressed cowboys. The entire ballroom was bustin' over with cowboys and cowgirls, couples

and singles wearing their very best. Ladies adorned in close-fitting white or pearl satin and silk, or dazzling the eye in unexpected contrasts of purple and green, or hand rolled yellow roses on gun metal blue. Men strutted as peacocks in charcoal gray Prince Albert frocks over blood red vests. Long, trimmed moustaches were shadowed by wide brimmed Stetsons or tall silk stovepipe hats. The smell of exotic perfumes and after-shaves wafted by with each passing reveler. Layers of starched silk petticoats rustled with every step, while bustles added shape and texture to mystery. Brass jinglebobs ka-chinged against stainless steel rowels. Cowboys pulled tight collars from constricted necks, and cowgirls struggled for breath against the constraint of corset and gown. Five hundred and twenty merry souls spoke in every tone and volume from hushed whispers to belly laughs as friends met, seating assignments were located, and the entire world seemed to laugh and shine. Then the rear doors opened and all went hush.

SASS Grand Army of the Frontier





Traveling beyond the bounds of one's home club is very rewarding




Another significant activity involving travel is the General's ini-

tiative to develop SASS' European base. SASS endeavors to become more involved in European Cowboy Action competition in a manner complimentary to the existing program in Europe. Respecting the German Cowboy Action Championship in early August and the European Championship in late August, SASS USA and SASS Italy will host European END of TRAIL, essentially a SASS European Regional match, in mid-August. Hopefully, Europeans will see this as a complementary match and part of a European August "shooting circuit."

True Grit ... Believing in and living by the code of the West ... its values and traditions ... Exhibiting strength, nobility, and courage; honesty, integrity, and decency.

I may have borrowed these words that define the qualities of a cowboy ... yet, Ken McKenzie, known as Ten-X within SASS and to his SASS friends, was all of this and more.

Born on March 2, 1944, Ken was the oldest of five siblings, who survive him: Lynda Carol, Louise Elizabeth, Arthur Edward, Richard Carl, plus four nieces and four nephews.

As a small boy growing up in Hudson, Massachusetts, Ken loved sports and the outdoors. He participated in football, hockey, water-skiing, and snow skiing. Ken especially enjoyed hunting and fishing.

Soon after high school graduation, Ken joined the Navy. That was back in 1960. He became a hydraulic tech, 2nd class seaman and was honorably discharged in 1964. He also married and was divorced ... a union that produced a beautiful baby girl named Tina Marie that he has always adored.

Moving to Whittier, California in 1969, he enrolled in Rio Hondo Junior College, studied Architectural Engineering, and more importantly, met the love of his life, his wonderful wife, Sue.

Ken and Sue spent 31 fantastic years together. Though they had no children of their own, they shared the love of travel and enjoyed many vacations over the years.

Ken worked as a drafting detailer for a cabinet shop and soon started designing and building cabinets, eventually installing finish cabinetry and architec-



tural woodworking for 27 years.

During this time one of his hobbies was reloading for his numerous shooting activities. In 1991 he discovered Cowboy Action Shooting[™] and was asked to reload for some of his Cowboy Action friends. This hobby eventually turned into Ten-X Ammunition, a company he owned and operated for 14 years ... Ken was living most every man's dream.

Ten-X Ammunition became one of the first and most successful bullet manufacturers within the sport of Cowboy Action Shooting[™]. Ken's expertise in reloading had him traveling to different cowboy shoots. With his sense of humor, and of course, his proclivity to talk a knot off a tree, he made many friends ... friends that enjoyed shooting and discussing old pistols, rifles, and hunting.

Ken sponsored various major Cowboy Action Shooting[™] matches across the country with his "All-Around Cowboy" side-match, complete with recognition awards. Generous with his time, he never hesitated to lend a supporting hand, give advice when asked, or make a donation for the benefit of a club.

Ken always said Cowboy Shooting and Ten-X Ammunition were the highlight of his working career.

Just days before Ken's passing, Sue and Ken shared a few special moments many couples oftentimes neglect during such stressful times. They talked about some of Ken's proudest moments:

His first thought, the first thing that came to mind, was of his grandson, Ryan, now 12 years old, the son of his daughter Tina. Ryan is currently a great hockey player and goalie. Ken was more proud of Ryan than anything in the world.

He shyly chuckled when mentioning Sue second, but she understood his love for Ryan, for she feels the same.

Ken spoke of his love for Tina and how proud he was of her when she entered the Army.

Tina's husband, Mike, is someone Ken was also proud of and bragged a lot to his friends about. Mike joined the Army at age 18 and made it his career. Mike is presently a Chief Warrant Officer 4 and has served his country with distinction for 24 years.

He and Sue reminisced about their love of travel. He recalled enjoying his travels through Canada the most, but he also had a fondness for Montana and Alaska. When talk turned to South Africa, a smile crossed his face. Hunting in South Africa had been a dream of his and he was thrilled accomplishing this goal. And Ken didn't go big game hunting with modern equipment. Nope, he chose to shoot the wild beasts of Africa with his cowboy big bore rifles.

Sue recalls Ken saying SASS gave him a lot of happy recollections. His receiving the END of TRAIL "True Grit Award" in 2005 holds special memories for him. He mentioned he hadn't realized how many friends he truly had until then. Yet, if Ken could have read the positive comments so *(Continued on next page)*

His SASS friends were particularly special to him. Although he was under medication during his conversations with Sue, he named a few memorable friends, hoping he wouldn't offend anyone he didn't think of mentioning: Durango Kid, Tupelo Flash, Contrail, Buffalo Chip, Meadow Muffin, and Nasty Nick.

In March 2005 Ken was diagnosed with renal cell carcinoma - kidney cancer that had metastasized into his lymph nodes. The doctors gave him just 6 months to live ... and as Sue has so happily said, "guess he showed them!"

Ken showed them all right ... | we'll miss ya, pardner ... A

with the same True Grit everyone knowing Ken knew he possessed. Many of us seeing how great Ken looked, how great and positive his attitude was during his battle with cancer, something Sue was so proud of him for, hoped and believed he had beat the devil himself. In fact, less than three months prior to God choosing him to ride with His Heavenly Posse, Ken bagged an elk in South Dakota.

This may sound crazy, but when I close my eyes, I can actually hear him laughing that deep "belly laugh" of his, joking with all the great cowboys that went before him ... I can see him slapping John Wayne on the back and telling him and Gene and Roy about that elk he bagged in South Dakota. Can't you just see them all laughing?





bilities on the Timer Operators (TO) and/or Match Directors (MD). What do I mean with that statement?

ALL SHOOTERS Would at least READ THE RO MATERIALS (annually),

It would be a more accurate shot In the right direction. Pun intended.

I am not taking the timer operators/posse leaders/match directors out of this equation 'cuz, they are SHOOTERS TOO. Yes, RO II pin holders need to have a re-fresher course, but what about us, the everyday shooter? We shooters can learn A LOT, just by reading the material, with no test and no pressure put upon us. The material is available at <u>www.sassnet.com</u>, and everyone knows someone with a computer these days.

Let us all take some personal responsibility for helping out on the range, with increased knowledge or understanding. I will be honest, as the very first time I took the RO II class, I walked away with a much better understanding of what we do and what we are supposed to do at the shoot, and I had been shooting for a few years at that point. Am I sayin that ya need ta memorize the whole dang printing? Naw, geeze, I can't even do that.

I hear it all the time, "Ya but Madd Mike, I don't ever want to run the timer. Why should I take the time to learn all that?" Well, 'cuz it will only make you a better shooter. But, "I am just here to have fun, not win." Fine, but having the increased personal knowledge of what the timer operator is expected to remember, and sometimes remember and apply said knowledge, has ta be done in split seconds, as someone is shooting. Well having that knowledge just can't hurt ya none.

Look folks, we are all in SASS/Cowboy Action ShootingTM as a hobby, and we are all volunteers in making the shoots happen. There is usually a small number of folks that do most of the work at these shoots, whether they are small, medium, or large in stature, and this is a very simple way for EVERYone to help (indirectly), because the better educated we are about our sport/hobby, the better things will move along.

A lot of time and energy has been put into developing these programs, and these things have come about due to the growth of SASS. Let us all utilize this informative information as we shoot, travel, and make new friends. Just look in the back of The Comboy Chronicle at the clubs and shoot dates. Where else can you find such an opportunity to have fun with friends, and perhaps travel and make new ones? SASS/Cowboy Action ShootingTM ROCKS, man!!!

Over the last year I've read several articles expressing the opinion Cowboy Action ShootingTM has become a "rich man's game." I beg to differ.

I have been active in the sport for approximately 10 years now, and the most money I have invested has been in ammunition! There is a huge difference in what is necessary to shoot, and what is wanted to shoot.

Let me start with the major investment—firearms. I have been using one, that's right—ONE handgun all this time, and I still get to take the usual 10 shots. How? One word—reload. I've read some articles with folks talking about the historically true Old West, and how folks were lucky to have one handgun, much less two. I've also read letters from people asking for a new category to be invented for one revolver. It's already out there. It's usually on the forms as "other" or just a blank line. If you can get a buddy to leave a holster empty and shoot with you that way, more power to you. It definitely adds a twist and some fun to the standing and shooting drill we are all used to.

There's also a satisfaction factor when your times beat the folks using two guns! If you refuse to shoot because a category doesn't officially exist, and there is no award for winning the category, I think you've lost sight of what is important—SPIRIT OF THE GAME.

There is plenty of used shooting equipment available. Check out gun shows for firearm deals, as well as asking other shooters. And, last but not least, leave 'em alone! You can have just as much fun with a "stock" shootin' iron as the shooter that spent a bunch of hard-earned dollars on action jobs for their guns.

A wardrobe can be inexpensive if one checks out fabric stores for patterns and sale-priced fabric, and employees usually know people willing to make clothing. You can also check western/tack shops for clearance items. Thrift stores can be great assets as well.

Gun carts can also be inexpensive if someone upgrades and sells theirs. Or, do like I did – go to the used sports equipment shop and buy a cheap golf bag cart and modify it to hold guns. Making a wooden box attachment to a hand dolly is also popular, and you don't need to be a fabricator or woodworker to do it.

Hope this helps a few folks starting out or on a budget. *A*




for me this year was the lack of participation in the Gentlemen's category. Come (Continued on next page)



Some Texas Events: Showdown at Ormsby Ranch

Here we proved you could have four Frontiersmen on one posse without getting delayed. Normally match directors spread out Frontiersmen. They might allow, say, a Gunfighter posse, or a Duelist posse, but they assume Frontiersmen will be spending all of their time charging their pistols. These match organizers allowed Frontiersman Bad Gene Poole to marshal the posse, and for three more of us onto the posse. It worked. I don't know if I'd suggest an all Frontiersman posse. First, we'd have to have 20 or more Frontiersmen in one match.

Comin' Atcha

First I have to mention that when we arrived at the Bar-3 Ranch, home of Comin' Atcha, after several days rain, we followed T-Bone Dooley's instructions on parking Camp Baylor. Ten feet later we were stuck. Credit must go to T-Bone Dooley and Bad Gene Poole primarily for getting it unstuck. Several others helped. I'm afraid that if the current rate continues, we'll have to stop crediting the people who pull us out in this column simply because of lack of room. The editor would like me to occasionally write about SASS instead of just about getting stuck at SASS matches.

I must say I was impressed with the method of getting the bus unstuck. First, the trailer was pulled away from the coach. Then T-Bone brought up a Jeep with a military spec. 30,000 lb. capacity winch, and attached the winch cable to the bus's trailer hitch. I was thinking, "Swell, that'll pull the Jeep to the bus." But T-Bone anchored the Jeep *(Continued on next page)*

to his tractor with a chain. Boards were put under the wheels, and the bus was moved about two feet at a time until we reached hard ground. Impressive.

Comin' Atcha is unique among SASS events, primarily because of the energy of the organizers, primarily of T-Bone. He has two speeds, on and off, and I've never seen off. It's contagious.

Of course having the costume contest limited to Elvis and Marilyn impersonators and having Saturday night entertainment by Elvis, topped off with an hour of professional fireworks didn't hurt. Giving out 15 guns by my count didn't hurt. Lots of people put on good events, but Elvis? Fireworks?

Among the things you might want to copy for your event: everything was included, side matches, two lunches, the Saturday night dinner, and tickets for the appropriate gun drawings.

Next year Comin' Atcha will be the Southwestern Regional. It should be a hoot!

Defend Old Parker

This event takes place at the reconstructed Fort Parker, where in 1836 Cynthia Ann Parker was abducted in a Comanche raid. Her son by Chief Nocona would be the last great Comanche War Chief, Quanah Parker. The stages take place in the shadow of the fort. The thing most remembered about this match, in Texas, where some clubs have "Cowboy Bull's-eye" matches instead of Cowboy Action ShootingTM, is the action part came back. They used BIG targets and put them up close. 40 people shot the match clean out of 125 or so contestants. That's ACTION!

For those who say if you have steel targets close you'll get lead splash back, it should be noted the only Texas event I attended this fall that had significant splash back didn't have close targets, but adhered to the 10 yard rule. Yet, a 200-grain bullet came back hitting a lady at the loading table in the forehead, leaving a 1" gash that required first aid. These targets were angled down and created no safety problems.

It should be noted that this match, with 125 contestants including world champions, was won overall by a Buckaroo, Justin Parker.

Movin' West

After over two months of shooting Texas events, it was time to head Camp Baylor west, with the ultimate goal of reaching the SASS Convention in Las Vegas in early December. In my misspent youth and middle age, this would have been a marathon 1100-mile drive in one day. But with the bus/trailer combination, it's an expedition. 200-300 miles in a day is a good day. When I started the drive, I realized there was an annual event in Tombstone on Thanksgiving weekend, the Ace La Rue Memorial Shootout, by the Tombstone Buscaderos. Who could resist a Cowboy Action Shooting[™] Match overlooking Tombstone? The following weekend Shootout in the Saguaros, organized by the Cowtown Shooters Association, took place in Cowtown, north of Phoenix.

We got the rig in and out of the range at Tombstone without getting stuck. For the Shootout, we left the bus at an RV park. I'm a slow learner, but not that slow.

Who is this woman, and what has she done with my wife?

In Phoenix we had to drop by two SASS icons, Dillon Precision, and Wild West Mercantile. I found it difficult to spend much at Dillon because I already bought most of their stuff. But at Wild West Mercantile I was stunned to see The Redhead trying on dresses, shoes, corsets - all the accoutrements of SASS women. Since I started this sport I've wanted her to get more involved. This is tough since she only shoots to repel boarders, and she hates to shop for clothes. But as the pile at checkout grew to look like the Matterhorn, and more outfits went in and out of the fitting room, I realized she had changed in retirement. She explained, "As we attend more and more events I'm making friends. I'm enjoying the parties. Now, I want to dress the part. Anyway, I don't have to dress as a secretary between SASS events."

Those of you with significant others who spend the equivalent of the annual gross national product of a third world country on SASS clothing will no doubt be warning me that I've created a monster, but I'm happy—until she starts throwing out my clothes to make room in the tiny closet of the bus! **1**.

HBO's "Deadwood" series is, in my opinion, truly fascinating, complete with superb acting and incredible screen writing. As most of us know, however, it is definitely what you'd call X-rated due to the extreme violence and severe profanity, not to mention full frontal nudity. Now that the series has been cancelled after three seasons (although there is rumor of a movie version or two) I would offer the following suggestions to broaden its appeal to a wider audience of Cowboy Action Shooters. First of all, move the whole production up here to Canada. Alberta's own Stampede City of Calgary has a classic re-creation of the early history of our west at historic "Heritage Park," which would serve as the ideal new location. Secondly, we'll clean up the language, cover up the nudity, and tone down the violence. For this we'll need a Boy Scout for a screenwriter. Okay, you talked me into it. So let's give it a whirl.

As part of this sanitizing process I'm afraid we would have to rename quite a few of the principal characters. Ellsworth would be Heavensworth, while George Hearst would be George Hearse, for if ever there was a vehicle for conveying the dead to the grave, it would be our boy George. Mr. Wu could still be Mr. Wu, but as he only seems to know one English word, that word would have to be "Thumb-sucker." Because of this, Doc Cochran would have no choice other than to be renamed Doc Thumbran.

The bad guys would only be allowed to use the interrupted curse we all know from the B-westerns. Terms like, "Why you no good ..." or "I'll be a ..." would predominate. Al Cursengen might be allowed to say, "You thumb-sucking donkey orifice," but only when he's really mad. Instead of a saloon and brothel, Cursengen would be the proprietor of a barbershop where Treatsie and other ladies like her would be employed as manicurists. Indeed, Cursengen could deliver one of his famous soliloquies while Treatsie blows gently on his manicured fingers.

Violence would have to be subdued. No more of this throat slashing business. With Bill seated facing away from the entrance a disgruntled local walking behind him will trip and fall, allowing his gun to slip out of his holster and discharge when the hammer hits the floor. Disgruntled types never seem to know it's not wise to have the hammer resting on a live round. Nowadays they just sue the manufacturer. At any rate when the gun goes off poor old Mild Bill has a heart attack from being so badly startled, his head previously having been weakened from a bout of rheumatic fever, rumored to have been obtained from his association with (Continued on next page)

one of the town's manicurists. Mild Bill's so-called dead man's hand will consist of the following cards: 3-5-6-9-10 with the 3 and the 10 being the only ones of the same suit. He'd have been dead financially if any one had called his bluff on a hand like that; hence the name.

That famous scene in Season 3 whereby Trixie knocks on George Hearst's door, distracting him with one of those full frontal nudity episodes, and then shooting him with her hide-out gun will require some modification. My version will have Treatsie knocking on George Hearse's door, batting her eyelashes at him and dropping her handkerchief. Even a villain feels obligated to pick up a lady's dropped handkerchief, where-upon Treatsie can deliver a slap to George's face as soon as he stands back up. In retaliation, our villain will insist Cursengen arrange to have Treatsie slapped back with George and his henchmen as witnesses. Cursengen will then consider a Treatsie lookalike among his other manicurists to suffer the punishment.

The Season 3 assassination of Ellsworth by a Hearst thug's gunshot to the head will be modified. Heavensworth's hat will merely be shot off his head. His immediate response will be: "Why you no good ..." followed by "I'll be a ...!"

Okay, so now we've gone from one extreme to the other, from super grim to super sanitized. In other words, we've gone from harsh reality to muddled fantasy. Muddled fantasy creates its own set of problems though, such as during a trial when the jury actually expects a policeman to shoot a gun out of a criminal's hands.

We deserve to have a clear understanding of our history, warts and all, so we can collectively make rational decisions in the present. No one should believe the television westerns of the 1950's ever represented reality. It was fun to watch as a kid but hardly historically accurate.

"Deadwood" probably comes closer to accurately portraying history than anything else previously attempted. I think it deserves to stand on its own merits, warts and all. That's undoubtedly what life was like back then despite what legions of Roy Rogers' fans may prefer to believe. It's much like the dif-



ference between "Saving Private Ryan" and earlier Hollywood war movies. Once you've seen "Private Ryan," it's difficult to take previous war movies seriously. We also get an accurate impression of what our war veterans actually experienced along with a greater appreciation of the sacrifices they made.

It's much the same with "Deadwood." Those early pioneers had a difficult life, and we should appreciate their sacrifices as well. Besides, in today's world we have to realize sometimes the bad guys win and the good guys are not without their flaws, which is the underlying theme of this series.

David Milch's screen writing for "Deadwood" is exceptionally well done using language that is almost Shakespearean, except for the profanity. The series may be over, but I predict it will be analyzed and appreciated for years to come. It may be fun to play cowboy, but I wouldn't have wanted to exist in the days of the real historical cowboys. Modern day comforts have much more appeal, and accurate portrayals like "Deadwood" makes me appreciate what I have in this day and age. I think very few of us would have been comfortable in "Deadwood's" environment, but we still have the right, and indeed the obligation, to know that such an environment once existed.


ast year El Rod, SASS Life **⊿**#8849, and I decided to travel to the European Cowboy Action Shooting $^{\rm TM}$ Championship, Days of Truth (DOT) 2007, in Mazzano, Italy with our firearms and most of our ammo. To tell of our adventures on that trip would fill a book with 1200 pictures and text, but what I need to impart to you in this article is what we did to travel with our competition firearms and 22+ pounds of ammunition. Remember—this is what we did in 2007 with no experience flying to Europe with our firearms; NOT exactly what we'd do for European END of TRAIL (EEOT) 2008 ...

After paying our entry fee (100 Euros each via PayPal) and getting a

confirmation letter from DOT 2007, we felt it would be a good idea to visit the Italian Consulate in Los Angeles to get a notarized letter of clearance to take our guns and ammo to a "sanctioned" match. This letter included our passport numbers, gun types, and serial numbers, ammunition quantity, and a "Good Guy" letter from our local police. Match Director, Arizona Tom, told us we didn't need that letter, but upon arriving at the Rome airport, it helped with the police there.

Since we live in Northern Nevada and Reno is our nearest airport, we were limited to airlines (Delta) and their regulations (which we found are somewhat different from Alitalia). Reno also has a U.S. Customs office where we declared our guns and camera (Form 4457), so upon returning to the U.S., we weren't charged any duty, and not returning with firearms that weren't declared. Delta's regulations were two cases per person, no more than 50 pounds each, and the firearms had to be packed in hard cases with locks according to their regulations (see your airlines website for restricted items, "sporting guns"). For extra cases and weight, the costs rise. Since we took four pistols, two rifles, and three shotguns (plus some spare parts), the two gun cases reached their maximum weight rapidly. The other cowboy accoutrements (holsters, belts, boots, etc.) were in a third soft-sided case, and the fourth case was clothing for the remainder of our three-week trip. Delta's regulations stated we could put the 11 pounds (each) of ammunition in the regular cases (soft sided) – ammo to be in original cardboard boxes or metal containers, not cowboy reloads in plastic cases.

Our whole trip was based on our friends picking us up in Verona, not Milan, and renting a car later. Unfortunately for us, there is no direct link from Reno to Verona, so we planned on transferring to Verona on Alitalia. Upon arriving in Rome, we had to get police clearance, *(Continued on next page)*

which is where the Consulate letter helped. Getting the police clearance was a several-hour problem, which made us miss three connecting flights (Alitalia) to Verona. The guns were a concern because they knew nothing about the match in Mazzano (Northern Italy about 400 miles away), but the ammunition was the real problem. Italian law and Alitalia Airlines state that ammunition has to be packed separately from "anything" in a locked, hardsided case, which we didn't have. We unloaded all the ammo from the two clothing cases and had to obtain another case. Guns and ammo are "hand-transported" from airline-topolice-to-airline by security police (and it requires an 80 Euro payment). Once cleared and arriving in Verona, we picked up our gun cases at the airport police office after presenting the Rome airport police paperwork. Oh, yes, the extra ammo case costs more Euros because we then had five cases total.

Point of Interest here – the Italian police are more important than Italian Customs when transporting guns and ammo (even in a vehicle). We found each Province (Mazzano is in Brescia Province) may be different. Also, the airport police we spoke with did not speak English, and we ended up with a Delta and Alitalia airport "troubleshooter" to translate what was happening.

After shooting at DOT 2007, our gun cases were stored in the hotel vault (with no ammo – we left any remaining with the match official for them to practice with) until leaving three weeks later. Back to the Verona airport (Air France) where we filled out the police paperwork again, paid our 80 Euro transport fee, a transfer in Paris (where I thought I could catch a glimpse of the Eiffel Tower - not), then to Atlanta where our gun cases were not on our plane (horrors and stress). Somehow the two cases of guns were delayed in Paris and showed up five

days later in Los Angeles where we had to present ourselves with passports, U.S. Customs forms, and money to get them out of a bonded Customs warehouse.

Once we arrived home from Atlanta before locating the missing gun cases five days later in Los Angeles, a lot of phone calls occurred, finally ending up with the LAX Cargo Manager personally. If you become separated from your gun cases, they immediately become "bonded cargo" and not "personal baggage." The airlines "lost baggage" people may not know this little idiosyncrasy and may not be very helpful in locating them.

Things we learned and what we'll do if we go to EEOT 2008:

- \bullet pay the EEOT 2008 fee
- have the U.S. Customs declaration forms filled out (Form 4457 they want to see the actual guns).
- we'd still get a letter of clearance from the Italian Consulate (Match Director said it wasn't necessary)
- only take ammunition for our rifles (everything else you can buy there – just let them know in advance)
- fly from Reno to Atlanta and then Milan (not transfer in Rome to Verona) – if you can fly directly to Verona from a U.S. airport, that is best because Verona is only 40 miles from Mazzano and is a small airport, whereas Milan is about 130 miles and a huge airport. It is important to not land (transfer) in any other country without the appropriate paperwork and lots of time between flights. Do not land in England at all for ANY reason...
- rent a car at the Milan airport (taxis are expensive, and it's a three-hour drive to Mazzano)
- stay at the same family-run hotel in Desenzano (about 10 miles from Mazzano on Lake Garda – very picturesque with lots to do at the lake after shooting each day). Somewhat more pricey than the hotels in Mazzano.
- return flight out of Milan (no stops in Paris) back to Atlanta (or any other U.S. airport)

• allow at least five hours between flights


The above is probably a LOT more than you really wanted to know, but it was a fun trip even with the few glitches. The people were wonderful—helpful and fun. The stages were well laid out and all descriptions were clear. Everything was translated into 3-4 languages. The opening and closing ceremonies were awesome. We met so many people from the 16 European nations.

Go if you can!

P.S. If anyone is interested in traveling through Canada with firearms in a motor home, which we did in 2006 with 21 guns, send me an email (hepenner@aol.com) – there are two critical forms (one from the internet and one faxed from the Firearms Office, and \$25 Canadian (dollars) required several weeks in advance before arriving at one of the Ports of Entry. Season is winding down, and I've got about only 400 rounds left. I'm a bit on the conservative side, so I'm looking for sources of free lead before spring.

At work I've been tripping over an old car battery. Been lying in the

warehouse for about a year \dots hmmmm.

Now some Cowpokes caution against recycling car batteries because of hazardous materials like sulfuric acid. Well, Cowpokes shoot guns, handle lead bullets, smoke, drink alcoholic beverages, and drive Fords, which ain't the safest ether, so why not recycle the lead from car batteries, ask I?

So, I hoisted that car battery up on Gray and took it back to the ranch.

Took the fill caps off the top and drained the sulfuric acid. For proper disposal of sulfuric, you will need to fill out Federal Environmental Protection Agency, State Board of Health, County Health forms, and notify the local Fire and Police departments. DO NOT DISPOSE SULFURIC ACID BY DUMPING ON THE GROUND!

The wife has been treating all the neighborhood stray cats for worms. I've noticed the worm medicine is so strong, the grass dies where the cats recycle their food intake (poop). And if you ignore my "DO NOT DISPOSE SULFURIC ACID BY DUMPING ON THE GROUND!" you will not be able to convince anybody (especially my wife) it was the cat's worm medicine poop that has killed off her flower garden and ate through the steel water line to the house. Trust me on this one.

Then, using cold water (after water line is repaired) flush any remaining sulfuric acid from the battery. Contain all rinse water and dispose of per Federal Environmental Protection Agency, State Board of Health, County Health Fire and Police departments' guidelines. Dumping the rinse water into a ditch will kill most of the neighbor pets, all vegetation down stream for two miles, and will also lead to a very difficult explanation to the arresting Officers.

After bounding out of the calaboose, I used a hacksaw and tried to cut the plastic case off. Using a butane torch to burn the plastic case off works, but make sure you stand up wind. Boiling sulfuric acid residual mixed with plastic case fumes all blowing down wind has the tendency to kill shrubbery and the rest of the neighborhood pets, including gold fish in indoor aquariums. When the Federal Carpet Baggers arrive, suggesting it was a terrorist act will keep your bond from being revoked. Trust me on this one.

Fire up your outdoor melting pot and start throwing sections of the battery in. After burning up a half tank of LP, you will notice in between every six wafers is a substance that will not burn or melt and sucks up the heat. Manually remove this substance. After six hours (not counting jail time) I have 3/4" of lead covered by 1" of dross in the melting pot. My cost breaks down to:

- Butane torch fuel-\$2.
- Refill LP tank-\$22.
- Flower garden replacement-\$247.13
- Repair of water line-\$785.54Bond Agent-\$500.

Total is \$1,556.67 for about a pound of lead. Cost does not include pending lawsuits or gold fish replacement.

My conclusion is using car batteries for a source of lead is viable. I've got most of the remains of one battery left, and if pressed I can leave it go for two or three thousand dollars. I figure at that price I'll have enough to recoup my costs with some left over to skip the territory. (In other words, <u>don't</u> try this at home! ... editor). **1**.

ocrites, ignore or cower from them because it's the easier road, there will be no one left to pick up the pieces of truth and reaffirm it for posterity.


Franklin, and Jefferson.

In this modern age where time travel feels truly convincing, have you ever wanted to transport yourself back to 1875, to a small western town and live "the life" for just a few days? Well, a group of people from a variety of places, with the majority of the members from Oklahoma and Texas, have figured out a way to experience stepping back in time to 1880, more or less, without that time machine. Any time from 1875 – 1890 will do.

Dr. Mike Enger, a landowner in Texas, dreamed of living in such a time. He had the means and the dream and friends who wanted to help him make the town a reality for all of them. Marrow Bone Springs became a reality. Mike wanted to play "cowboy" as authentically as possible, so he started moving in original period-piece buildings and constructing those he couldn't find, to create on his property the town of Marrow Bone Springs; not just a façade, but a town with real buildings that are livable, at least for a short time. Dr Mike is very actively involved in the Marrow Bone Springs group with the four or five characters he plays on any given weekend.


Marrow Bone Springs is just south of Fort Worth with 28 full scale furnished buildings. A contractor was paid to build the large main barn, made with true dimensional lumber – a 4X4 is a 4X4 and 2X4 is really a 2X4. All the sleeping quarters have wood burning stoves. The members who provide the wood get

paid. If you build your own living quarters, house or cabin, you are entitled to stay there. Whit built the Phoenix house that has "rooms for rent." In town the Dixie house is bunkhouse style, and the McGee house is the hotel. The 36 buildings include Gunsmith with his living quarters in the back, just as with the cobbler shop and doctor's office. Most of the businesses have living quarters. The jail has three cells. If one of the "characters" is in jail and does not have a plan for a jailbreak, that member can change characters and get out to play another character. The town is surrounded by woods and pastures. Some members have built their cabins out in the *(Continued on next page)*



woods. Everyone requests a place to stay prior to the event. Think of stepping back to Deadwood, and you could be there in Marrow Bone. It is regularly used as a place for Old West full-emersion experiences; first person events from Friday at 6 pm until Sunday at noon. But you can't go there unless you are invited.

There are 58 active members, with anywhere from 30 to 45 members attending any one event, with up to 16 guests. The officers for the group are elected. Some of the members participate in SASS, but most are re-enactors only. Everyone attending has to be 21 or older, since there are three working saloons in the town. And, you must be invited to attend four events before you are eligible to be voted in as a member. Each member can invite a guest to an upcoming event. They have about six "re-enactment" events per year at Marrow Bone. On the concluding Saturday or Sunday there is a meeting of the members to discuss problems or activities they want to plan. The closed-door meeting is held at the church. Sometimes they vote on membership, plan work weekends for maintenance, or for putting up a

new building. Fortunately they have some real carpenters. If the members decide to perform outside of Marrow Bone Springs, they charge those who "hire" them. They also charge movie studios to utilize their town. Marrow Bone members have dues and event fees (such as theatrical performances, boxing matches, the circus) that are period correct to collect the money to pay for their insurance and event costs.

There are a huge variety of guns at Marrow Bone Springs. Every character might carry a different gun: Colts, Colt replicas, Smith & Wesson, Remington, Merwin & Hulbert, and conversions. You name it and it is there. Very few use cap




Some of the members with horses re-enacting Tombstone.

and ball since most events are in the 1880's. "At Marrow Bone, we use real guns, but the blanks we use are not the same ones we use for public performances. We use an insert made of aluminum with a shotgun primer as our noise maker; we use Remington mostly. In the shotguns we use a safety blank - gold plastic blanks. (Continued on page 37)

Christmas Spoils

DECEMBER 26, 1873

Riding on a rumor of post- Christmas bounty, a Mexican gang headed by the notorious Tiburcio Vasquez reins up on the north bank of the Kings River, in northern California, and ties up their horses in a clump of willows.

In the evening darkness, 10 (some reports state 12) heavily armed raiders walk stealthily across the bridge with the goal of robbing the entire village of Kingston, nestled on the south side of the river. The town is small—two stores, a hotel, a blacksmith shop and several saloons.

The robbers encounter several citizens on the main street. They tie up each one and force them to lie face down in the street. Then the gang robs the citizens of their money and valuables. One of them, Milt Woods, refuses to lie down, protesting that doing so would spoil his good clothes. Incredibly, the outlaws give in and march him to the hotel so he can lie down there.

Having cleared the road, the bandits sweep across the open plaza. Vasquez carries four Colt Navy revolvers on his person as he strides boldly from store to store, commanding his men. As the premises are secured, Vasquez places a guard in front of each business.

Almost a dozen patrons are in the hotel saloon when the outlaws burst into the room with pistols at full cock. They force everyone to lie down on the floor as each victim's hands and feet are tied, and then they frisk for valuables. A puppy bounds in and runs from one victim to another, licking their faces. "The men were to claim later that this was the worst part of the whole affair," the Fresno Weekly Expositor later reports.

Not all the townsmen give in so easily. In the dining room of the hotel, Lance Gilroy is eating dinner when an outlaw enters, brandishing a pistol. Miss Reichert sees it, screams and runs out the back. Looking up, Gilroy assumes the intruder has insulted the lady, so he picks

up a chair and floors the robber. Gilroy is wrestled to the ground and beaten with a revolver, leaving him badly hurt.

John Sutherland, a local, prominent rancher and landowner, is in the hotel when the robberies start. He grabs his Henry rifle and rounds up several other townsfolk. They take cover near the river and across the street from the stores.

In the dim light, Sutherland spots one of the outlaws (later identified as Ramon) standing guard in front of Sweet's Store. Sutherland opens fire. The robber staggers inside and exclaims in Spanish to his compadres, "I'm shot!" He is dangerously wounded.

"Vamos!" (Let's go!), Vasquez shouts to his men as they flee from the buildings, carrying their plunder. Sutherland's little posse opens a blistering barrage at the outlaws. Vasquez and his men, primarily armed with pistols, have a hard time determining the direction of the gunshots and wildly return the fire.

Sutherland and another townie press the attack, following the brigands across the bridge. As the bandits leap into their saddles, a ball strikes Vasquez's lieutenant, Clodoveo Chavez, in the leg above the knee. Francisco Gomez, Vasquez's cousin, is wounded in the neck.

After firing some 40 shots, Sutherland and his men have run out of ammunition. They watch helplessly as the outlaws gallop off into the blackness.

After the raid on Kingston, enraged "impromptu posses" scour the countryside,

roughing up and threatening Mexicans up and down the coastal range. A large reward is offered (\$8,000 for Vasquez alive, \$6,000 for him dead). The outlaw is captured on May 13, 1874. Tried and convicted for murder, Vasquez was hanged in San Jose on March 19, 1875.



new buildings erected until it is clear how the drainage will be handled. The monsoon rains a couple of years ago were a real wakeup call! No one wants to build a town that periodically floods!

Having said that, however, the existing steel building will receive special attention this year. The hope is it can be converted into "the" Belle Union and permanently enclosed. A large, enclosed Belle Union means we can dispense with the "big tent," install lighting, and invest in a real, permanent bar for the Belle Union, along with a stage, and maybe even some flooring! Founders Ranch has fantasies of becoming a movie-making venue, so it's clear the big steel building must have a near-term facelift to provide the appropriate Old West atmosphere!

As time goes on, additional amenities for the shooters will be provided at Founders Ranch. One of the projects initiated last year was an effort to provide electricity to the first few rows of RV parking. The engineering work has been completed, but the cost data is still being developed. With all necessary data in hand and users/investors committed, work can begin and service could be available by END of TRAIL.

The Buffalo Range Riders -Action and Mounted - have been active at the Ranch for the past couple of years. Founders Ranch now welcomes the High Desert Drifters, a brand new Cowboy Action ShootingTM club, to Founders as well. Cowboy Action Shooting[™] is now available at the Ranch on the first and second weekends every (non-winter) month!

SASS has purchased land and now has approved plans for building a new Headquarters Building in Edgewood, NM. The Northern New Mexico-style building is adjacent to the I-40 Interstate Highway where it will be very visible, and represents the largest international headquarters operation in the city. Even though construction is not scheduled for completion for many months, SASS is nonetheless very excited about having a tailor-made headquarters building and a permanent home for the SASS Museum.

Living in a state that has four seasons is a new experience for many of us Southern Californian transplants! All one can do in the wintertime is dream and load ammo! Pulling the trigger on the range and actually working on Ranch building projects must wait for better weather. Everything will change in the Spring! A.

(Continued from page 31) They fit inside an aluminum 5 in 1.

They fit inside an aluminum 5 in 1. It is loud enough, especially across a poker table, and safe at any range.

We have a safety session at the beginning of every event and rules of engagement, so that prevents injury and encourages and inspires 'real life' conditions. Here everyone is on the honor system for dying. If you are shot multiple times up close, you know you are dead. If you are shot in a gun battle at some distance, you might get a wound or be missed all together. It is never determined by 'I got you,' 'No you didn't.' If the person who is shot does not go down, then that's part of the fun and games, and you figure you missed. If a person is killed, they have to go to the church and sit for 30 minutes, and come back as a totally different character than the one who was killed." It's almost like redemption or re-incarnation.

And how would you know if someone was a good enough shot to hit you at 25 yards, and you were supposed to be dead? Well, Marrow Bone Springs members have a live shoot on Saturday morning, and after watching how inaccurate everybody is on a consistent basis, no one complains whether someone should have died or not. Or if they do, it is in the members' meeting at the end of the weekend, not during the weekend's Old West events.

Different members sponsor a weekend's event, determining the stage or theme of that event, and buying all the food and beer. There are no scripts, just a theme for the weekend and the goal of authenticity and great fun. The weekend at Marrow Bone Springs is filled with court trials, theatrical shows, medicine "flim flamers," and all sorts of activities. There are often traveling theater groups "visitin" the town and putting on performances for everyone. "We have had really bad Shakespeare, really funny plays, and even a period boxing match." The group does everything with greatest regard to the historical perspective.

If you built something, you have your own place to stay. Otherwise, it is first requested, first served for a place to stay. The event begins with a trip to the bank where everyone draws a card. The card determines how much money you get at the start of the event. If you owned a business at the previous event, you can pay the taxes and keep the business. If you can't pay the taxes, the business is auctioned. Taxes are double what you paid for the business in the previous event, or double the amount you paid in taxes the previous event. Taxes will eventually get so high it has to be re-auctioned. Individual characters in the town earn money on the weekends they attend, especially the bartenders, saloon dealers, and cooks, and can put money in the bank at the end of the event. At the next event they can take up to 1/3 of their money out. You can even be a robber and put the money "earned" in the bank.

One of the greatest undertakings was the driving of a herd of cattle through the town by the members! Many of the participants remember that with some fondness. Some members bring horses, and some bring wagons and buggies, but most do not. Attendees eat at McGee's Boarding House for every meal. It is equipped with a full working kitchen. It is the only eating house at the moment. McGee's also has two pull chain toilets and indoor showers, and is the only building with electricity. The lights are made to look like gaslights. There are also two outhouses and, of course, there are trees. All the other lights come from oil lamps, and the heat comes from wood stoves. There is no air conditioning, even in the heat of the summer. In the evening, all the activities tend to be around the saloons with three different saloons selling beer, ale, or Pimberton sodas. Occasionally a Mixologist works one of the bars.

The ladies in the group find it tougher to create a variety of women's roles. Some of the women have three or four characters, usually including an actress' role or seamstress. They can run an ice cream parlor, bakery, or eatery. Some women love playing the part of a suffragette. Of course, there are also the soiled doves. One member consistently plays Calamity Jane. Some women just sit on their front porches visitin', rather than go to the saloons in the evening.

Whit Edwards, who was interviewed for this article, usually uses four of his developed characters at any given event although some Marrow Bone members only have one or two and that works out just fine for them. Whit can go up to seven characters, but that means packing extra outfits for the weekend. Obviously, if you run out of characters, you can't play any more. You can take the opportunity to create a new one from the other outfits you have brought with you. The more adventurous and troublesome characters get into a little additional mischief and need more than one or two characters to make it through the whole weekend.

Hat Maker Reopens Business After Fighting Off Debilitating Disease

When you see David Johnson smile as he sets a \$500 Western hat on fire, you can be sure he's feeling better.

And when you hear Cactus, his

longtime sidekick, brag that Johnson's D Bar J Hat Company hats are so waterproof that when you're caught in the rain you'll never have to cover it "with one of those

> Texas size condoms," you suspect the D Bar J brand will once again be a force in the custom hat industry.

Three years ago, however, when Johnson developed aplastic anemia, he became, in the cowboy parlance that he loves, "as careful as a naked man climbin' a barbed wire fence."

He shut down his

world-renowned Las Vegas hat-making operation in an effort to conserve energy to fight the rare and often fatal blood disorder.

Several times he suspected the next time friends would be wearing D Bar J hats in his presence, they also would be taking them off – at his funeral.

"It didn't look good for me," he said as he sprayed alcohol on a black beaver fur hat before lighting it with a match. "I don't know if I look as good as this hat will, but I'm back." The flames, which Johnson quickly douses with a fine water mist spray, singe off any excess fur and fuzz left from shaping the hat. (Continued on next page)

"See how nice and smooth the hat's finish is now," he said.

With medications, transfusions, and hospitalizations helping the 49year-old Johnson spawn blood cells – aplastic anemia causes the body to stop producing enough new blood cells — he has enough energy to once again use 19th century wood blocks to shape hats and early 20th century machinery to finish them.

He also needs enough energy to complete setting up his new work and sales operation behind Santa Fe Station at 7230 Verde Road.

Blocking machines, steam pots for hats, ironing and sewing machines, and a display area all have to be in just the right place if he's going to once again turn out products for a clientele that has included President Clinton, actor Antonio Banderas, singers Charlie Daniels and Bono, the Roy Rogers Museum, Mike Tyson's entourage, and entertainers at the 2002 Winter Olympic Games.

"I'm only able to really go for about four hours a day right now, but I'm getting stronger all the time," Johnson said.

On Monday, Las Vegas rhythmand-blues bassist Ronee Mac, who had often frequented Johnson's old shop on Spring Mountain Road in the 1990's, found D Bar J's new home.

He handed over an old hat for Johnson to refurbish.

"Man, he's like God in the hat world," Mac told a visitor.

In 2002 and 2003, the outdoors magazine "True West" honored Johnson as the best historical hat maker. One of Clinton's hats, presented to him by delegates from the Nevada Democratic Convention, is in the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C.

Other apparel stores refer customers to Johnson.

"It's amazing how he can make a hat look like new again," said Michael Hull, who sells and shapes Stetsons and other Western headgear at the Boot Barn western apparel store a short drive south of Mandalay Bay. "There's nobody else who can do what he does."

The fact that Johnson is again doing what he does best can be partially credited to Steve White, a fly fisherman who had purchased widebrimmed stylish D Bar J hats.

After Johnson's old store closed,

White wanted to find the man he had heard "was on death's doorstep."

"I enjoyed our conversations about history," said White, who installs phones in commercial properties for Embarq. "I missed them."

When he finally found Johnson through friends, the hat maker was feeling better, but living off disability. All of his hat-making equipment, largely purchased at estate sales from hat makers throughout the country, was in storage.

"Nobody would loan him money to get started again," White said. "I didn't really have money, but I had a place for him to set up shop."

White's wife had long thought that if they could find the right business for a huge outbuilding behind their home on Verde Road, they might turn it into an enterprise that could help fund their retirement. So why not restart a custom hat-making business that at one time had made Johnson well over \$250,000 a year?

"I can't believe how wonderful this has turned out," Johnson said, as steam enveloped his head while he shaped a hat. "I thought this part of my life was about over."

Johnson enjoys making all kinds of hats, including derbies, fedoras, and top hats. They don't come cheap, ranging from more than \$200 to around \$700.

Cactus, a 74-year-old former maintenance man, favors a chestlong beard, a gigantic cowboy hat, and going by one name. He started working for Johnson several years ago after buying hats from him. He enjoys adding Western flavor to the hat enterprise and peppers conversation with quirky anecdotes.

"You can always tell whether a man who wears a derby has been told, 'No,' by his wife the night before," he told a customer. "He tilts his hat to the left."

Johnson's career in hats hardly followed a straight line. While working in the pharmaceutical industry, he also was in a country western dance troupe at the Gold Coast Casino. When he wanted a hat repaired, there was no one to do it.

Before long, he was using the steam from a teakettle to soften a hat so he could reshape it.

In the late 1980s, Johnson decided there could be a good market for a hat maker in Las Vegas. He read about the craft, learning that hatmaking equipment had largely

stopped being made early in the 20th century. Through trade magazines, he found where he could purchase the equipment.

"I've found I'm pretty good at fixing things, and I can always get a machinist to make me new parts," Johnson said as he stood near a broken boiler that will one day provide him with more steam for hat shaping.

Today, Johnson is philosophical about hats. A person should never try to wear a hat that has more character than they do, he notes.

Johnson's weight has shot up as a result of his medication, but he hopes his blood disorder is a thing of the past and he can once again share stories with customers that produce grins rather than grimaces.

Don't be surprised if you hear this cowboy tale when you wait for a hat at the D Bar J: Two cowboys are riding along a trail in the mountains when they suddenly hear tom-toms beating very close to them. "Oh! That doesn't sound good," one says to the other. As soon as the words are spoken, an Indian jumps out from behind a tree and says, "Yeah, our regular drummer is out sick."

"Hats," Johnson said, "help you have good times." J.



One of the things I truly enjoy is helping a new shooter. I love seeing the excitement, the nervousness, and most of all, the accomplishment that follows their first stage. I know many of you share my same feelings.

Cowboy Action has a good reputation because our members are so willing, and passionate, about helping those new to the game. However, sometimes what we mean as help really turns out to be a hindrance. Here are some tips for help-

When helping a new shooter it is always a good idea make sure they actually want your help. Some people really don't want any help. They are enjoying what they are doing, and they don't really want to change anything. Now, if it is a safety issue, let them know right away, and contact a range officer if there continues to be a problem. However, some people take pride in the fact they come in dead last and are not interested in changing that!

When it comes to helping a junior or some women shooters, you want to be careful. Usually women and junior shooters come shooting with a friend or family member who is already giving them shooting advice. Not every friend or family

member knows what they are talking about, and you might know a better way to help this woman or junior. However, if you try to approach that new shooter while he or she is alone, a couple of things may happen. First, they might be intimidated because they don't know you and might not realize you are trying to help them. Or, they may not know enough about shooting to understand what you are trying to explain to them. You also might be giving them information that contradicts what their companion is telling them, so it could end up confusing them even more!

If you are trying to help a junior or woman shooter that has a companion, I suggest approaching them while they are both together. This will help alleviate any intimidation, and it will give you someone to help explain the ideas clearly. Hopefully, they will take your advice, but they will be able to make that decision together.

Once you have made sure your subject wants your help and you aren't interfering, there are both good and bad ways to approach a shooter. I suggest you approach a new shooter only when they are not otherwise occupied.

For instance, the loading and unloading tables are bad places to approach a new shooter. Usually in these areas the shooter is high on adrenaline, and they are thinking about too many things for your advice to do any good. Consider approaching them after the stage (Continued on next page)

(*Continued from previous page*) briefing, so they will be more inclined to listen, and you will have the opportunity to answer any questions they might have.

It is also not a good idea to approach a shooter while they are already talking to someone else. If too many people try to speak to a new shooter at the same time, they will overload, and no one will be able to get any information through.

Some things are more important than others when giving advice. The absolute most important advice you can give concerns safety. Nothing is more important than shooting in a safe, responsible manner. When it comes to new shooters, sometimes they need to be reminded of certain safety rules. Unless it is a real emergency, I suggest kindness first, but if it is a dangerous situation, it is more important to correct the situation before anyone gets hurt!

After safety, comfort advice is the next most important. If a person is leaning back and the long guns are beating them up, suggest leaning forward. This allows their body to absorb the recoil. Or, if a person is missing shotgun targets high because they are lifting their face off of the stock, encourage them to keep their head down.

When it comes to information about shooting faster, handing guns better, or improving the mental game, this advice should be given with caution. There are times when it can be helpful, but this information given to the wrong level of shooter can really hurt more then help. A first time shooter doesn't need to know you should draw one gun while holstering the other. Likewise, they may not be interested in the latest, greatest shotgun loading technique. New shooters are trying to concentrate on the basics of hitting the target and remembering the shooting sequence. Too much information too fast can be an overload.

For information beyond the basics, wait until they ask you, or possibly offer your services at a practice session away from the pressures of a match.

Helping new shooters can be a wonderful, rewarding experience. Put yourself in their shoes, and remember what it was like to be a new shooter!

For over half a decade now I've enjoyed Cowboy Action Shooting[™]. 'Till now Hodgdon Tite Group has been my pistol powder of choice. When I started shooting, one of the top shooters advised me to use it, and

I also read various articles that proclaimed its dependability, accuracy, and cleanness. However, loading .38 Special to the minimum measurement for Cowboy Action (3.2 gr for 125 gr and 158 gr bullets) creates well over 800fps, which in turn produces quite a fair sized recoil. An expert told me recoil has to do with velocity and bullet weight. "Basic Definition of an Expert is a person who carries a brief case and comes from over 200 miles away." Recoil has much to do with the old "for every action there is an equal and opposite reaction," a phenomenon we were supposed to learn in science class.


Now I am quite sympathetic to all those who would like a minimum

velocity. It would probably be a good idea. But the last time I checked, I'm closing in on seventy, and my old arms and wrists are not exactly what they used to be. I don't like loading under the recommended powder load because of safety problems that could arise. So I called Hodgdon and talked to Chris in Tech Support. He asked me if I had tried Trail Boss. I said I had thought about it, but didn't want to spend the extra money for the powder. Now I'm not so tight that I squeak when I walk, but I do try to manage my affairs frugally. Well, Chris went on to explain the benefits of Trail Boss.

speak, and slow to become angry." So I listened to Chris and tried Trail Boss. I couldn't believe it. At the recommended low load for a .38 Special pistol (3.0 grs of Trail Boss using a 125 gr bullet or 2.7 grs of Trail Boss for a 158 gr bullet (check loading chart), there was a noticeable recoil reduction. I was shooting Ruger Vaqueros with 4-5/8" barrels. I checked the speed on my chronograph and found the average of a string of seven 125 gr bullets was 629 fps, and the average for the 158 gr was 649fps. That's around 200 fps less stress on my old wrists, but still a respectable speed for Cowboy Action.

The benefits of using Trail Boss are many. It has more volume per weight so double powder charging is obvious. The powder is easy to see in the case. That is a big plus if you're like me and peek to check the powder level before you seat the bullet. The manufacturer's recommended minimum loads produce less recoil in most cases. The powder is clean, and I was pleasantly surprised when I checked the price. I had always heard Trail Boss powder cost quite a bit more. When I checked the price, I found the price per pound has come to be equal to most other powders, and even less than the Tite Group I had recently purchased.

The end result was also quite nice. The first match shot after loading with Trail Boss I received a Clean Match certificate. I'm no expert, but it doesn't take a genius to spot a good product. Thanks again to Chris at Hodgdon Tech Support for teaching me a thing or two!

Always follow manufacturers' reload recommendations, all safety precautions, and be quick to listen to good instructions.

ortally wounded in a gunfight in Mortally wounded in a game 1, Phenix, New Mexico, June 1, 1894, Con Gibson had his pistol hang up in his suspenders as he tried to draw from his waistband. It was a fairly typical gunfight - with a predictable result. Study historical records, and you will discover few of the gunfights of the Old West involved holsters. Take John Wesley Hardin, for example. There is not one documented source this great gunfighter ever used a holster. Instead, he used cords around his neck, the waist of his pants, and leather-lined pockets. Another gunfighter, Wild Bill Hickok, most often carried pistols in a sash. Many gunfights of the Old West were delayed while participants ran to get a pistol from their room or "kit." The parties involved weren't going around "heeled."

Another example of the casual gun-handling skills of the Old West is the well-known Miller-Frazer Feud of Pecos, Texas. Sheriff Bud Frazer shot ex-deputy Jim Miller on two occasions. In neither of these shootings did Frazer kill Miller. Why? Miller was wearing a breastplate of boiler iron under his long frock coat

Sheriff Frazer had hired Miller as a deputy, but Miller had proven to be very cunning. At the same time, Miller had a knack for using other people for support. First of these, undoubtedly, was his wife, Sally, whose kinsman was the notorious ex-gunfighter John Wesley Hardin. Her brother was Mannie Clements. Both Hardin and Clements became involved in Miller's intrigues. Another Hardin, Martin Q. Hardin, also became involved.

In May 1893, while Frazer was escorting convicts to Huntsville Prison, Miller organized a plot to kill him. Frazer anticipated this and organized supporters, including Texas Rangers. Miller and Mart Hardin were charged with conspiring to kill Frazer, but were acquitted. That left only one way to end the suspense. On April 12, 1894, Frazer shot Miller. Hit at least once <u>dead center</u> in the chest, Miller was still firing as Frazer gave up and ran away.

In December 1894, Frazer had a second shootout with Miller, with a similar result. This time, Miller had Frazer charged with assault. He collected his supporters and moved operations to El Paso. It was at this point two of the most important shootings of the Miller-Frazer Feud took place.

The first of these involved Mannie Clements. In June 1895, Clements accidentally shot himself. He had loaded all SIX chambers of his pistol, and then casually tossed the gun on a mattress. He was hit somewhere in the hip. Though the wound was described as painful, it was not serious. Three days later, Mart Hardin accidentally shot himself, too! Alighting from a buggy, he let his pistol fall from his pocket. The bullet entered under the right shoulder blade and lodged in the (Continued on page 49)

DRESS SHIRT MADE EASY

The shirt is an important part of our dress. In fact SASS rules specifically address what is acceptable and appropriate for Cowboy Action ShootingTM attire. God made the first set of clothes out of skins for Adam and Eve (Genesis 3:21). Since that time the style has changed through the centuries. In my opinion, the late 1800's achieved the apex of formal dress. Consequently half of the enjoyment for me in participating in our great sport is suiting up for the game.

My uniform is that of a circuit preacher, in part because I am a preacher. In the past couple years I have crossed over to dressing exclusively in the 1800's style. As a result, the Vicar's Wife and I keep a close look out for frugally priced items. But, we have been disappointed at times with shirts purchased on line. So, we have come up with a great looking dress shirt at a minimal price.


The Vicar's Wife is a shopper. She finds unbelievable deals quicker than a good bird dog can get on point. She finds long sleeved white dress shirts on sale for around \$5 each, some even less. The only problem is they have modern pointed and button down collars. But, the matter was resolved as fol-



lows. If it is a button down collar, remove buttons and make a template out of thin cardboard the size of the collar with the radius desired. Next, with a pencil, mark the radius on each side of the collar. Then, leaving around 1/4" seam allowance, cut the collar. Next, cut back a little on the original stitching. Then form, adjust, and pin new round style collar. Finally, hand or machine sew. It's just like that 19th century style shirt at a fraction of the cost.

In my judgment the shirt looks better than the ones we purchased on line, and the fit is much better by far. If you wear your best duds every day, on the field or just for the Awards Banquet, this is an inexpensive way to acquire dress shirts.





any of today's Cowboy Action Many 01 100ay 5 Communication Percussion revolver shooters would like to have the ability to convert their revolver to a metallic cartridge firing revolver, just as shooters did 140 years ago. With this in mind, Walt developed a drop-in 1858 Remington Kirst Konverter cylinder about ten years ago. By simply dropping in one of these Kirst cylinders, you can convert your Uberti or Pietta 1858 Remington percussion revolver into a very period correct conversion revolver to use in Cowboy Action ShootingTM, utilizing .45 Colt, .45 Schofield, or .45 Cowboy Special cartridges. No gunsmithing is required, and it can be returned to percussion at any time. I personally use one in the same Uberti forged framed New Model Army .44 I use for Civil War re-enacting to also shoot Cowboy Action ShootingTM matches. Before getting into a review of his products, let's first cover the historical precedent for Walt Kirst's Konverters.

WALT KIRST AND HIS WONDERFUL KONVERTERS Part I

Remington New Model Army Conversion History

The American Civil War created an enormous demand for firearms of every kind. Designers and manufacturers pushed the limits with new designs and production methods. Existing firearm manufacturers such as Colt and Remington moved over and made room for the likes of Christian Spencer and Oliver Winchester. The first widely successful Remington revolver was the New Model Army in .44 caliber. While we generally (and erroneously) refer to it as a "Model 1858," it was actually introduced in 1861 after the beginning of the Civil War. The "1858" refers to the patent date. This New Model Army revolver from Remington was second only to the Colt in its numbers and popularity. Part of its popularity was because its one-piece frame was sturdier than the inherently weaker two-piece frame of the 1851 and 1860 Colts.

Self-contained metallic cartridges in Smith & Wesson, Henry, and Spencer firearms became immensely popular during the Civil War. There was no doubt they represented the future of firearms. Until 1871, however, Smith and Wesson held the exclusive rights to Rollin White's patent on "bored through revolver cylinders." This meant Colt,

Remington, and others could only produce percussion style revolvers. Bored-through-cylinders were an absolute necessity for cartridge revolvers. This gave Smith and Wesson a virtual monopoly on metallic cartridge revolvers. Just after the Civil War, however, Remington decided to pay the licensing fee to Smith and Wesson in order to convert the huge stocks of percussion (Continued on next page)

.44 caliber New Model Army revolvers (1858's) for re-issue to the US Army. They converted the New Model Army .44s to five shot cartridge revolvers using the .46 caliber rim-fire. According to McDowell in his book "A Study of Colt Conversions and Other Percussion Revolvers," 4,574 of the Remington New Model .44 Army Revolvers were converted to this .46 caliber rim-fire round between 1868 and 1869. Smith and Wesson received \$1 per gun royalty. These new cartridge conversion Remingtons were very popular with US frontier troops.

Eventually with the Rollin White Patent expiring, Remington began making numerous cartridge conversion revolvers. Remington reworked their percussion revolvers, using a newly manufactured cylinder and altered the revolver recoil plate. Within several years, many Remington New Model Army revolvers were also being converted to six-shot .44 Remington center-fire. This .44 caliber cartridge was simply Remington's version of the already successful .44 Martin (Colt) center-fire cartridge. The Remington .36 caliber percussion Navy sized revolvers were likewise converted to both .38 Long rim-fire and .38 central-fire. Many of the .38 and smaller rim-fire caliber revolvers were modified using a twopiece cylinder and no modification to the revolver's recoil plate.

Both the .44s and .38s usually had a modified recoil plate with a loading notch milled into the right side of the percussion revolver's frame. An additional assembly with a loading gate and frame mounted firing pin was also added. Then, either a shortened percussion cylinder that had been bored through, or a newly manufactured bored through cylinder were fitted. Some Remington cartridge conversions had a simple ejector rod mechanism attached to the right side of the barrel/loading lever. The ejector rod had a small "flag type" protrusion at the muzzle end that was locked in place by the loading lever in the closed position. In order to use the ejector, the revolver was placed in half cock, and the loading lever unlocked and dropped slightly, freeing the end of the ejector rod.

The Remington cartridge conversions in .38 center-fire and rim-fire, .44 center-fire, and .46 rim-fire were produced in huge numbers. Some were actually converted to .45 Colt by various gunsmiths. Remington kept producing cartridge conversion revolvers until the No. 3 Army Model of 1875 was released, also in .44 Remington, then in .44 WCF, and finally some in .45 Colt for the Indian Police.

Original Remington conversions are about as plentiful as Colts and

are slightly less expensive. Around half, however, were manufactured in rim-fire calibers such as .38 Short and Long rim-fire and .46 rim-fire. Original .46 rim-fires are some of the scarcest of the early metallic cartridges, and even if they were still able to discharge, they would cost a

small fortune just for one cylinder full. So what's an early Remington loving, Spencer toting cowpoke to do? Do like I do and shoot an Italian New Model Army copy with a .45 Colt Kirst Konverter!

is to increase the number of certified MRO-I and MRO-II instructors nationwide in order to have all SASS Mounted Shooters certified in these vital safety courses. These MRO courses are available online at the SASS website for your review.

Consistency is important—undefined rules and gray areas cause hard feelings, misunderstandings, and arguments. The Mounted Range Officer program is designed to provide a better understanding of the rules and how to apply them. SAFE-TY RULES—FIRST, LAST, AND ALWAYS. The purpose of these courses is to ensure safety and consistency at every SASS club match, no matter what size the match is.

Each SASS competitor who sets foot on a range is a Safety Officer,

responsible for his own safety, and the safety of those nearby. However, it is the ultimate responsibility of the Mounted Range Officers to ensure safety rules are consistently followed. It is our intent every SASS competitor has the knowledge to function as a Mounted Range Officer, given appropriate coaching on the range by experienced personnel. When designing and running a match, every Match Director and Mounted Range Officer must keep in mind the event is solely for the safe enjoyment of the shooters. Mounted Range Officers must be professional, polite, and friendly. The SASS Mounted Shooters Handbook is to be followed in designing a match, and SASS rules enforced equally and consistently.

The purpose of trained club

Mounted Range Officers is to provide the sport of SASS Mounted Shooting competent, firm, and fair officials in all levels of competition, and allow Mounted Range Officers to perform any duty on the range. The course offers guidelines for the fair and consistent application of the rules and procedures for the match. The Mounted Range Officer's role is to keep the match running efficiently, safely, and consistently. It is the responsibility of club officials to determine the qualifications, experience, maturity, and judgment of its match officials, and appoint appropriately trained individuals as Mounted Range Officers for their matches.

Any time you go to a match, SASS' goal is for you to feel comfort-(Continued on next page)

muscles of his neck. Mart Hardin had also loaded all six chambers of his pistol.


Two experienced gunmen accidentally shoot themselves within days of each other? The coincidence is startling, but the significance reaches beyond that. With both Mart Hardin and Mannie Clements shot, they weren't any support for Jim Miller during the summer of 1895, and, on August 19, 1895, things got much worse when John Wesley Hardin was shot to death by John Selman in El Paso. The loss of three of his strongest supporters brought Jim Miller's plans to a temporary halt.


With opinions in Pecos now running against him, Miller brought his two least desirable cohorts into play, John Denson and William Earhart. These two men "witnessed" Jim Miller's shotgun murder of Bud Frazer in Toyah, Texas, on September 14, 1896. The resulting trial was moved to Eastland County on a change of venue, and, in January 1899, Miller was found not guilty.

So, the accidental shootings of Mart Hardin and Mannie Clements, followed by the loss of John Wesley Hardin a short time later, forced Miller to end his intrigues and get down to business, assassinating Frazer himself. Miller, of course, gained nothing from the murder, and he left Pecos and West Texas. In 1908, he was involved to a greater or lesser degree in the assassination of Pat Garrett near Las Cruces, New Mexico. A little over a year after that, Miller and three conspirators in another case were lynched by an angry mob in Ada, Oklahoma. A



one season. Frederico makes things for a lifetime and former customers often return for a visit and more merchandise.

He was quoted in several American tourist guides and thanks to these, foreign customers came, and are still coming to meet him. Customers who only want "custom made" leather goods seek him out.

Leather is in his blood. His grandfather and his father were saddle makers in a countryside village near Rome. They worked for a local cowboy. Federico, listening to their stories of a past time became enthralled. This passion became his style, his way of life—the cowboy way!!

The love for the Old West was so strong his father made him a belt and holsters to play with when he was just a kid. For Federico, these holsters were really strange because they were a Hollywood style, but he was so happy he used the rig for many years.

When the first western movies, the ones in black and white of the 40's, and the first western books arrived in Italy, they satisfied his curiosity, and he discovered a fantastic world called America and its Golden Era.

Even though creating leather bags was his predominant business, he had the opportunity to satisfy several lovers of Single Action revolvers, and he believes historically there's no other pistol linked to its holster and belt that better represents an era.

In 2000 he became a SASS member, choosing the alias Frederick Holster Maker. With the formation of the Old West Shooting Society in Italy, he lived to spread the Old West in our country.

From 2004, thanks to now-called SASS ITALY, he has even more opportunities to create the leather of the Old West. Some friends, and I'm one of them, assert he is the best artisan available in Italy for this "custom made" leather.

A great help to him was the book, "Packing Iron." He believes this literature should be placed near the beds of our children.

The leather he uses is natural with a minimum of fat. The thickness is 9/10 oz. In his Suede Lined model, he adds some leather from England inside. His holsters are completely hand-made; this is not the fastest system available ... but this is what he prefers and offers to his customers.

His wire is 100% flax from Ireland. The buckles come from the United States with classic styles such as the California Clip, Corner Buckle, and Cart Buckle, always nickel-plated. Also, the copper rivets come from the US.

He loves to decorate his holsters with nickel spots or basket weave or border stamping. These designs are used to personalise all his products. All these finished leather pieces are placed inside his showcase so the sun can give them a better colour.





Writing a "Historical Novel" has got to be one of the more difficult accomplishments for an author. Creating and maintaining the balance between researched historical accuracy and a novel's requirement for "readability" is no easy chore, especially when the subjects of your work are as well known as "Doc" Holliday, Kate Elder, and the Earps. Michael Crane establishes his "bone fides" within the first few pages of "A Fistful of Thorns," and serves up page-turning action salted with the language and facts of the period.

Mr. Crane has obviously studied his subjects and the 1880 period in which this novel is set. You can taste the air and smell the streets in this one. I especially enjoyed the Epilogue, giving you the facts of the "characters" final days, which for some came quickly. Others, mostly the ladies, lived well into the 20th Century. fiction? Who knows? I'll have to ask Doc when I meet him up the trail ... (Continued on next page)












4 Feb 1860 Texas Rangers and Captain John Ford fight Juan Cortina and his Mexican irregulars at the Battle of La Bolsa Bend on the Rio Grande River.

- **8 Feb 1861** Six Southern states establish the Confederate States of America.
- 13 Feb 1861 Assistant surgeon Colonel Bernard John Dowling Irwin takes command of troops, attacking and defeating hostile Chiricahua Indians at Apache Pass, New Mexico Territory, becoming Nation's first Medal of Honor action, which will not be issued until January 24, 1984.
- 18 Feb 1861 Jefferson Davis is sworn in as President of the Confederate States of America; Montgomery, Alabama.
- **16 Feb 1861** Flying the Lone Star flag, Ben McCulloch and his Texas Rangers march to the Alamo, a US garrison post, arsenal, and supply depot and demand their surrender.
- 18 Feb 1861 Cheyenne and Arapaho leaders agree to abandon their lands in Colorado, guaranteed to them in an 1851 treaty, believing they retain their freedom to roam and hunt buffalo.
- **21 Feb 1861** President-elect Lincoln secretly arrives in Washington to take office, foiling an assassination plot in Baltimore.
- 23 Feb 1861 Texas leaves the Union.
- **1 Feb 1862** Atlantic Monthly publishes "*The Battle Hymn of the Republic*," written by Julia Ward Howe.
- **6 Feb 1862** Union gunboats four ironclads and three timberclads commanded by Andrew Hull Foote, under command of General Grant, fire on and take Fort Henry, on the Tennessee River. Union gunboat *Cincinnati* fires first shot.
- 8 Feb 1862 First amphibious landing under enemy fire occurs at Roanoke Island, North Carolina.
- **10 Feb 1862** Wooden steamboat USS Commodore Perry destroys Southern flagship Seabird.
- 17 Feb 1862 CSS Virginia, built from USS Merrimack's hull, is launched; Norfolk, Virginia.
- 13 Feb 1862 Lee defeats Ambrose Burnside; Fredericksburg, Virginia.

- **28 Feb 1862** Confederate Captain Sherod Hunter and 200 mounted riflemen occupy Tucson without firing a shot.
- **Feb 1862** Union war prisoners start arriving at Camp Sumter, near Andersonville, Georgia. The prison has 16.5 acres of open land enclosed by a 15-foot-high stockade, with no housing, clothing, or medical care available. By the end of August, there'll be 32,000 men in an area of 26 acres intended to hold 10,000. Of 45,000 Union soldiers confined, 13,000 will die.
- Feb 1863 Formation of a secret society of law enforcers, the Rocky Mountain Detective Association, is formed.
- **2 Feb 1863** Leland Stanford, California Pacific Railroad's President, strikes the first spike at ceremonies in Sacramento. The race is on to build the transcontinental railroad.

precursor to Sherman's "March to the Sea." This is the first attempt by the Union at total warfare, a strike aimed not just at military objectives, but also at the will of the Southern people.

- **17 Feb 1864** At 9:00 PM in Charleston Harbor the 30 foot long, 5 feet high, and 4 foot wide Confederate submarine *H. L. Hunley* is struck by an explosion that destroys her entire stern and disappears, becoming the first sub to ever sink an enemy warship, when she rammed Union ship *USS Housatonic*. Only 5 of her 160-man crew lose their lives.

Take is between \$57,000 \$62,000 in cash, bonds, gold, and silver. This is America's first daylight bank robbery during peacetime. According to the Wymore family, within weeks of the robbery, they received a letter apologizing for the death of their boy, signed by Jesse James.
 - **Feb 1867** Famed bandito Narciso Bojorques and One-eyed Jack Williams duel over a card game in Copperopolis, California. A slug from Narciso creases Williams' head, while a fatal shot hits the bandito in the arm, ricocheting into his heart and killing him.
- **26 Feb 1867** Kansas Governor Samuel J. Crawford signs into law an act to protect livestock from "Spanish fever." This law prohibits driving of Texas or Indian cattle into Kansas between March and December.
- 24 Feb 1868 House of Representatives impeach President Andrew Johnson after his attempted dismissal of Secretary of War Edwin Stanton; the Senate will later acquit Johnson.
- **1 Feb 1869** Outlaw Cullen Baker, gang leader terrorizing Dallas, Texas area is hunted down and killed by a group of men including his father-in-law.
- 8 Feb 1869 Notorious horse thief "El Pollo" (The Chicken) is shot and captured at Socorro, New Mexico.

SIX GUN TOM, SASS#49289

Milton, DE - I have long admired the title "cowboy." The word for me has always stirred up images of a strong, rugged individual - one who was self-confident and had no fears to stand up for what he knew was right. In 2006, it was my great pleasure to have met a man who embodied my vision of a real cowboy.

Six Gun Tom, aka Tom Turner, was born in Lexington, Kentucky, the youngest of three children. As a boy in Lexington he was District Duncan Yo-Yo champion four years in a row, and also received the Gold Duncan Yo-Yo award for three years, and he was the Kentucky State Duncan Yo-Yo champion in 1956 and 1957. I can only assume these early skills were meant to serve as a foundation for his gun handling skills as a cowboy.

He loved music and played in several bands when he was younger. He also performed with Jimmy Eller and the Little People in several nightclubs in the Washington, DC area in the 60's.

He proudly served his country in the Army. He then served his community as a Deputy Sheriff in Fairfax, VA, for about four years. He was the Sheriff of Old Virginia City in Fairfax, VA - he scripted, staged, and performed in many western reenactments.

He became a Deputy Sheriff in Loudoun County in 1979, and stayed there until he retired in 2000. It was during this time he was awarded the Medal of Valor for his actions during a standoff with armed gunmen shooting at a truckload of explosives. The highlight of his career was when he had the chance to serve as a guard for his childhood idol Roy Rogers for a few days. Roy was coming to town to attend the opening of a new restaurant, and needed security. What stories he could tell about those few days! His wife says you could not get the grin off of his face for almost a year.

When Tom and his wife moved to Delaware, he became a member of the Tombstone Posse of Salisbury, Maryland, which did western reenactments, western skits, and performed in parades. He wrote numerous skits for the posse to perform


ern parts in the skits he

at senior centers, nursing homes, and for the Scouts. He



nursing homes in our area - telling stories and jokes, twirling guns, and giving folks a fanciful taste of the Old West. He was like a little kid, living his dream.

Tom knew guns. He had been an armorer while serving with the police, and had taken countless classes and training seminars. He had personal correspondence with Arvo Ojala. He had an uncanny sense of how a gun should "feel," and seemed to be able to tell by touch when the action wasn't "just right."

Tom loved the Old West and could answer any trivia question you could come up with. We would sit back and watch Tombstone or a John Wayne movie, and he would point out all sorts of unique details - like Audie Murphy wearing the largest gun belt ever filmed, or the editing error in *True Grit* (yes, there is one).

In February of 2007, Tom suffered the first of several subdural hemorrhages, and then Tom suffered a severe stroke a few months later, and passed peacefully in his sleep the next week.

Roy Rogers said cowboys never cry, and I sure tried to keep it in, but Tom was more than a friend. In every measure, Tom was a real cowboy, a white hat wearing lawman he was a man of honor. He served his country and his community. He loved putting on his tux and dancing with his wife. He enjoyed going out and entertaining and making other people happy. He was a good man. In the short time we knew each other, he became one of my closest friends. Tom was a role model, and I hope I can be half the cowboy he was.

I should also note Tom was a gift of life donor. Even in death, he helped over 100 people. So if someone comes up to you one day and says, "Did you hear the one about ..." you know they might have been helped in one way or another by Tom. 🦨


Ft. Worth, TX - Valdez, SASS #2335, aka William Lafayette Wallace, 78, passed away November 25, 2007.

This 'Greatest Generation' knew the job they had done was essential, but unsavory. They had been asked collectively to literally save the world. This they accomplished, and then retired back to civilian life.

You could see the military discipline and training when he shot Cowboy Action, always one handed, slow and steady, never missing. I



can't recall ever seeing him miss a pistol shot in a match. He was fond of those pistols, 7-1/2" .44-40 Single Action Army's. The rifle, a '92 also in .44WCF, had been re-barreled by his son Bo, and was a tack driver, especially with Valdez doing the hammering. Topping off his favorite match guns was a Berretta muleeared side by side. As I said, I can't recall seeing him miss more than half a dozen total targets, TOTAL, in the eight years we shot together.

Several years ago he had some serious health setbacks. While he was able to come out and visit with us one more time about nine months ago, it was just too hard a battle to fight. All who knew him will miss him, especially this wet behind the ears Cowboy Action Shooter wannabe who learned a great deal from him and his cronies.

The little world that was sad yesterday is much sadder today. Vaya con 🛓 Dios, my friend.

Saturday morning after a good breakfast (maybe our last) Cayuse Jack, J R Hammer, and a couple others came up with the idea of splitting up into four groups (about 13 or 14 in each) and to just infiltrate and mingle in with the town folk until about 10 o'clock and then let all hell break loose. This sounded good to everyone, so at right around that time, with some at the Saloon, Goldmine, Can-Cans' Brothel (I just happened to be here), and the Livery, the Good Doers let loose more lead, fire, and smoke into Two Rig a Tony's gang than Michigan had ever seen at one time.

By the time the town clock had




struck two, most of the Bad Guys were in jail or had headed for the foothills. Only some of the meanest were still hiding around town. (Continued on next page)

The range at Oakwood is at an idyllic setting on heavily forested land, with the range in the lowlands. Every time we go there they have improved the stage facilities. This time they had a new saloon, but, sadly, I never found the Margarita machine. Owners Texas Alline, SASS #21632, and Justa Hand, SASS #23892, are constantly working on the place, along with a few really gung-ho members such as Texas Scrounger, SASS #34675, who was named a SASS Regulator at END of TRAIL this year. The range features such luxuries as air-conditioned indoor bathrooms and RV sites with power. There are some big matches that need that. Boy, do they need that! (hint, hint.)

Alas, all was not perfect. We discovered that many Texans were gullible and believed the lies spread by "Soot Lords" who want no more competition in blackpowder. Once more I heard, "Oh, I can't shoot blackpowder. It'll rust my guns on contact. I'll need special cleaning equipment. I can't use my normal bullets, but have to mold them myself using an obsolete Lee mold only available at a thieves' market in Marrakech during the dark of the moon in months without an R. They have to be molded out of a secret formula of Kryptonite and unobtanium. They have to be lubricated with a 50/50 mixture of unicorn fat and beeswax hand collected from


Here, have some cheese with that whine. Read *Blackpowder Substitutes for Dummies* in *Captain Baylor's Ranger Camp* online (see the SASS Links on the SASS home page.) You'll get enough information to get through the match without embarrassing yourself anymore than normal.

The one paragraph answer for people who want to shoot black once a year is: fill the case with American Pioneer Powder, Goex Pinnacle, or Hodgdon 777. Leave room for the bullet. Use the same bullets you always use. Buy some blackpowder shotgun shells from a blackpowder shooting buddy. Clean your guns with water and a little Windex sometime after the event. Run a Bore Snake through the shotgun barrels every 25 rounds. Use the same oil you usually do. Shoot a little slower, so you can see the targets. As Jericho Walls said after I showed him how to clean his guns after a previous Powder Blast, "This is easier than smokeless cleanup!"

And there is the never fail alternative of getting some schnook like Captain George to load some rounds for you. If you're not in my category, I'll probably put powder in all the rounds.




Congratulations to these fine events, organizations, and folks who promote SASS and the cowboy way.

Now, on to the rest of the 6th Annual SASS Convention and Wild West Christmas.

6th Annual SASS Indoor World Championship of Cowboy Action ShootingTM

Yes Dear, we shot real guns in the safety and comfort of the Riviera! All SASS activities were held in the east wing of the Riviera, including the shooting stages, which were positioned in two adjoining meeting rooms. Three stages were shot each day Thursday, Friday, and Saturday with targets and props changed each evening. All stages required 10 shots from two revolvers and two shots from a double barreled, mule ear 12 gauge splattergun. Rifles shot between 8 and 10 rounds per stage. As usual, each stage had a different scenario with an opening line by the actors.

Stages were humorous and challenging without being complicated. If we did a Nevada sweep with revolvers, we did a Nevada sweep with the rifle, or a revolver double tap was followed by rifle double tap. We recited our lines indicating shooter-ready, the buzzer sounded, then we snatched up revolver or rifle and blazed away at steel targets. Most stages ended with two blasts from the shotgun to be sure the timers recorded all shots. Ten-X Ammunition supplied cases of riflerevolver ammo and more cases of 12 gauge shotgun shells. All were powered by primers only, and sailed wax projectiles downrange. As the wax bullets made no significant ding when hitting the steel targets, counters had to pay close attention to record hits and misses. Counting rules were simple. If you think it's a hit ... it's a hit. If you think it's a miss ... it's a hit.

No other firearms or ammo were allowed on the range, so each shooter had the opportunity to shoot several brands of revolvers, including Ruger Vaqueros, USFAs, and Ubertis. We had a few primers fail to ignite and also the occasional firearm malfunction, which was to be expected with the rapid turnover of equipment. Most of us took it all in stride and had the option to reshoot any stage where equipment malfunctioned. The absence of modified or even finely tuned guns leveled the playing field to some extent. During one of my brainfades, I was given special recognition in the form of a procedural penalty for the ugliest Nevada sweep during the match!

All things considered the indoor

match was enjoyed by all and drew quite a crowd of spectators. Here are the results:

Reel Guns of the Old West

The NRA Firearms Museum also has a traveling exhibit that has been very popular. These display items include some of the most famous firearms used by many of our Old West movie icons.

- Hawken Plains Rifle used by former NRA President Charlton Heston as he portrayed Bill Tyler in "The Mountain Men."
- Sharps #3 Rifle SN8886 in .45-110 was manufactured by Shiloh Sharps as one of three used by Tom Selleck as Matthew Quigley in "Quigley Down Under."
- Colt Walker Revolver SN491. John Wayne remarked as Rooster J. Cogburn to Kim Darby as Mattie Ross in "True Grit," "Why, by God, girl, that's a Colts Dragoon! You're no bigger than a corn nubbin, what're you doing with all that pistol?"
- Winchester Model '92 Carbine SN995913 in .44-40. Chuck Connors as Lucas McCain fired many a Hollywood round through this rifle with the modified lever in the series "The Rifleman" between 1958 and 1963.
- Colt Walker Revolver SN715 like the Walker used in "True Grit" are both Italian reproductions. This one was used by Clint Eastwood as "The Outlaw Josey Wales" in 1975 as he exacted revenge against the hated Red Legs.
- Winchester Model 1892 Rifle SN795913 in .32-20 with its 15-1/2 inch barrel and modified lever ring is perhaps the best known of all guns as the stagecoach gun used by John Wayne as Johnny Ringo in the movie "Stagecoach," which launched the Duke's film career in 1939.

Seeing these six firearms at the SASS Convention sent a chill up my spine as I realized how much these (Continued on next page)

Territorial Governor Summit



The Territorial Governors met and discussed the issues of the day. In the end, they basically declared, "No rule changes for 2008!"

The Territorial governors met, discussed, and cussed ... and in the end essentially said, "No new rules this year!" Well, they did approve a new Long Range Optical Category, but that's it. There were two announcements made at the Territorial Governors Summit. One announcement concerned Power Factors and other concerned Power Factors and other concerned shotgun ammunition. The Power Factor announcement was printed in last month's Comboy Chronicle. The statement regarding shotgun shells follows:

Shotgun Rounds

It has come to our attention that practice of "Coning" or crimping shotgun shells to a smaller gauge (e.g., 12 gauge sized down to 16 or smaller gauge is being practiced, and these shells are being used at SASS matches.) Limited testing of these loads by the technical staff at Hodgdon Powder Company has been completed using traditional load data and SAAMI standard testing equipment. The "Coned" load test results exceeded the recommended maximum SAAMI standards by as much as 7000 PSI. Therefore effec-

tive immediately, this process will not be allowed, and the use of such ammunition will be considered as illegal ammunition.

The process of scoring shotgun shell hulls with a sharp blade is known as "ringing" and essentially makes the round a slug. Also effective immediately, this process will not be allowed and the use of such ammunition will be considered as illegal ammunition. The penalty for the use of illegal ammunition in any SASS match is a Match Disqualification.

Cowboy Karaoke with the Dooley Gang

In addition to the more formal activities at the SASS Convention, we were subjected to events such as Cowboy Karaoke, which thoroughly entertained us on Friday evening. In addition to being a crack shot, T-Bone Dooley can belt out quite a repertoire of cowpoke songs.

Single Action Shopping Society




The after shoot meal was provided by Papa Joe's restaurant, who catered more food than any one cowpoke was able to finish.



The magnitude of this match is just amazing when you think back to a year ago when this shoot started as a dream. We have a great bunch



Najon Pass, CA - Excitement Jfilled the air as shooters converged at the top of the GEM Ranch's dusty trail, jockeying for a place to park. Across the cleared field, shooters pulled their highly individualized carts from cars and pickups. Long guns, ammo, and bottled water were placed on the carts. Then shooters slung belted holsters around their hips and settled cowboy hats firmly on their heads. Grey skies and a cold wind, unusual for September in Southern California, didn't dampen enthusiasm as they called greetings to one another:

"Hi – glad you made it!"

"What posse are you on?" "Brr-rrr! - I should'a brought a

jacket!"

"See if there's room on Posse Three!"

"Whoo – nice shirt!" "You seen Bojack?"

'Legends Of The West 2007' was about to begin. This annual shoot, held near Devore and hosted by the Cajon Cowboys, is named to honor people who became a 'legend' in the west. Actors in Western movies, such as Tom Mix, Hoot Gibson, John Wayne, Roy Rogers, and this year's honoree, Jack Elam, are accorded VIP status. Historical figures like Jim Bowie, Annie Oakley, and Jeremiah Johnson are also revered. The event has grown in eleven years from 37 competitors in the first match, to 119 shooters in the 2007 event. Club membership has also escalated and now numbers over 500 active shooters. Women comprise about 25% of the total membership, which also includes 37 Juniors.

A noteworthy hallmark of Cowboy Action matches is its casual but sincere friendliness. Low-key competition, plus a ready willingness to help anyone who needs extra ammo, a cold drink, or a seat in the shade, puts Cowboy Action Shooting[™] on the highest social/ethical rung on the ladder of competitive sports.

No Cowboy Action ShootingTM match I've ever attended exceeds the Cajon Cowboys in those virtues listed above. Members of this club subscribe wholeheartedly to the Spirit of the Game, which makes participation in their shoots a particular joy.

The 'stat office' and sign-up shack sits at the edge of the main staging ground. A flag pole, picnic tables, a couple of oil drums converted into heaters face the 'veranda' along the front of the office. Two covered areas where food is prepared and served, along with additional shaded picnic tables complete this area. Stretched out in both direc-





tions beyond the picnic benches are the shooting stages.



better shooting events I've had in a long time, well on my way into friendships that made me a very lucky man.

The four clubs in the area, MacDonald Cowboy Action Shooting[™] near the airport at Pittsburgh, Logans Ferry to the east of the city, Indiana somewhere in the mountains, and these people at River Junction Shootist Society (RJSS) near Donegal along the pike, hob-nob extensively with one another, and the clubs support each other in a shooting circuit. Given the familiarity, and the consistency of faces from shoot to shoot, you'd think there would be nothing special about this twoday event. Not quite.

For one thing, The RJSS Folks have a town at the range. No, not a boardwalk of really neat props, but a real little town with real little buildings you can go into, sit down, buy and sell, or mebbe just chew the fat a while. It sits just under the range, which is up on a long shelf in the hill where the club is situated, and when you look down on this little town from said range, you also get to take in some very pretty scenery with rolling hills and a wide sky.

For another thing, the food was good. Chuckwagon Sam makes a point of making sure we're all well fed during their shoots, and The Ambush was no exception. Then there's the fact this club is easy to get to ... it's right off I-76.

Of course, the main issue was the quality of the shooting. Here again, in a well laid out range with a lot of open air, good props, and well thought out scenarios, RJSS scores as an impressive club. The targets were challenging, but there was none of that sadistic nonsense like ... R1,R3,R5,R5, The Square root of R4, R\$,R\$,R\$,R1 except if it's cloudy and it's R2 ... You know what I'm talking about, because we've all been to those shoots that have one lemon of a stage that taxes our Spirit of the Game to get by.

They arranged and planned stages like the 8th stage, which had a rotating star, down through the 4th stage that had some reverse order shooting that made you think without demanding you get your MBA to shoot it. The fun kept my attention every minute because, among other attributes, these clubs out here keep the posse sizes to a manageable size, so you are not standing around getting bored. Everybody works because there's enough to do without being rushed, and not enough slack time to stand around and swelter in the sun. That's an important part of making a quality shoot, but there was something else ... something more with the assembly of clubs here in the hills ... that made it unique.

Not long before this shoot, I witnessed a call by our Territorial Governor and watched a little drama unfold when one of our most experienced shooters had his crossdraw sixgun pulled out of the holster by a moving prop. We all gasped as the loaded gun hit the dust. The shooter didn't make a fuss, mind you, and seemed willing to accept the match DQ like a gentleman. The rest of us, however, had no such notion. We all marched up to Fuzzy Gonzales, The Territorial Governor, and Match Honcho on that day, and put the facts before him. He made his ruling, the DQ stood, and then ... most impressively ... there were no hard feelings, no underlying gossip, and no further discussion. The shooter kept both his poise and his demeanor, and the incident was over.

If you take that kind of behavior, fold it into a ten stage match that has challenging but do-able stages, season it with a theme like Gunsmoke (that was built into each stage in such a way as to make the story lines fun without being too long or ponderous), and support it with the hard work put in by club officers such as Lacey, Sara, Club President Chuckwagon Sam, Match Director Durango Dave, and Club leaders Like Colonel Hayes and his wife Mattie, Tombstone Timi, Deputy Kek, Honey Dipper, Philadelphia Kid, and so on, you have a winning match. Moreover, you feel like you have a shooting home, like you belong to a community. That's why I wouldn't hesitate to take the ride to come to The Ambush At Indian Creek every year. The fact that it is right off the pike helps ... not hard to find in the middle of the wilderness ...

One more thing ... in an age where vendors are getting reluctant to travel to shoots because of high costs and fees, I was more than pleasantly surprised at how many good vendors showed up and how much quality could be seen under their canvas. Bob Enck and his Gunbarn were the main sponsors, but the turn out of support was quite impressive, as well as a reflection on the organizational skills of the RJSS Team who managed this show ...

Lastly, as if this match didn't have enough merit as a stand-alone, members of the same crew of organizers, such as Mattie Hays, strapped on a blackpowder match the day before. It was their first effort, and I toured the stages and was quite impressed with both the number of shooters and the cohesiveness with which the first time match was run. Took me so thoroughly that I started loading the dirty stuff into my open tops, and now have a fresh agenda for next season.

But, I tell you what. Don't take my word for it. Check out the club website at http://www.nauticom.net/www/rjss/. When you get there, there you are. They maintain an extensive gallery of photos and videos that give a far better portrait of the club than my words can. Yup, the community of shooters in these four local clubs has put together quite an array of pictures, videos, and events. The Ambush stands out as a real winner. Two years of shooting with these folks, and leaving my shooting home of ten years don't seem so bad after all.

In the Thesaurus, next to ... "Spirit Of The Game" ... it says ... "See River Junction Shootist Society, ref: Ambush at Indian Creek."

Don't shoot yore eye out, kid. A.

naysayers and stayed away. I was shocked. In the land that gave us Audie Murphy and Anna Nicole Smith, a lot of Texas-based SASS shooters were afraid of blackpowder. Must've been naturalized Texans. True Texans are only afraid of ex-wives' lawyers and the IRS.

But an enthusiastic group did show up to shoot ten interesting stages—in the forest, in the lowlands, facing east, with no wind. You've guessed it. The smoke just hung there, refusing to leave, like your brother-inlaw after a party. Targets disappeared like scantily dressed Magician's assistants, returning only after your stage was ruined. New-to-blackpowder shooters learned to plant one foot and dance around, up, and down to find holes in the smoke. Gunslinger asked me what color would be best for the targets. Dayglo orange with a flashing strobe light below it would be good.

This was a morning phenomenon. On Saturday morning stage times went down as the sun moved across the heavens. That afternoon the Plainsman match started at 4 PM. Smoke wasn't a factor then. The wind was up, and the sun was behind us. My stage times beat some of the morning's times even though I was using a single shot rifle.

Did I mention that shooting any event in Texas can be akin to shooting a major match anywhere else? I've been on posses in Texas with 10-12 shooters shooting in the 20's and three or four in the teens. If, like me, you can't shadow shoot a stage in the low 20's, this is quite depressing, as if you were put on the super posse by mistake.

Stages ranged from simple to not quite. Targets ranged from semi-distant, hard to see rifle targets hidden in the shadows of the trees to HUGE saw blades hidden in the shadows of the trees. One stage had eight rifle targets, each at different range and elevation. Those of you who avoided END of TRAIL because of fear of knockdowns would have been shocked to find an entire stage of knockdowns, 4 for shotguns, and 18 you could shoot with either rifle (8 rounds) or pistol in any order. They all fell easily if you hit them. If you didn't, you made them up with the shotgun.

On the other extreme, one stage started with the line, "Be vewy, vewy quiet. We're hunting wabbits." Before you was apparently the result of an experiment by the Texas A & M Bioengineering Department. They're the people who gave the world maroon carrots and purple bluebonnets. Their medical department, of course, is famous for the world's first hernia transplant. Their ROTC department is famous for inventing the short round.

(Note for the humor impaired: The first two accomplishments are real. The third and fourth are jokes!)

Before the shooter, at about 10 yards, stood a rabbit the size of a full-

grown buffalo, complete with hump, etc., but with rabbit ears and cottontail. It was so big the instructions to empty both pistols into it made sense. Then 5 rounds in each of 2 saw blades at 25 yards or so and 4 shotguns.

The match included lunch both days at Justa Kitchen, complete with ice cream you can only get in Texas. One of the reasons we returned to Texas was the discovery that outside of Texas and Oklahoma, you can't get Blue Bell ice cream or Mrs. Baird's bread, two of the reasons for the superiority of life in Texas in general.

Mentioned in dispatches: Marcus Hooker shot a clean match, but more importantly, he smoked a cigar. He took it out to shoot long guns and reinserted it to shoot pistols. It was a sight to see.

A few converts to the holy black were made, and others who feared the total destruction of their guns had their fears allayed. Several people didn't pick up their brass because, horrors, black stuff or black substitutes had been shot in it. Working the unloading table, as Frontiersmen are apt to do, I just said, "thank you very much," and dumped it in Captain Baylor's Magic BP Cleaning Elixir for future use. Yes, the formula is secret, and it's absolutely the only chemical known to man that can clean brass that has been exposed to black stuff or black subs.

You can order it from me for only \$10 a liter, or you can get it from the nearest faucet.

The awards ceremony was proof of the adage, "choose your category wisely." For example, they had several Frontiersman categories, such as Frontiersman Gunfighter. Unfortunately there was no "Slow left-handed old Frontiersman" category. Remember, this is Texas. Texas has a lot of people who can shoot.



ockhart, Texas – The sign on ⊿the gate reads "Agarita Ranch," but it is one of the best-kept Cowboy Action ShootingTM secrets in Texas. You drive down a deadend, white gravel road heavily sided by Mesquite with a few scrub oaks mixed in. You watch the little white sign in the ditch pointing the way and wonder, "Where in the world am I going?" You get the feeling you are getting further and further away from civilization. Then you top a small rise and the road abruptly ends. You are looking at a stone entrance with a wrought iron, electrically operated gate.

You follow the drive through the gate and begin to wonder if you've made a wrong turn. There is absolutely nothing to indicate you are anywhere near a Cowboy Action Shooting[™] location when you top a hill and below you see the roof-tops of an 1880's Old West town. Welcome to the home of the Plum Creek Shooting Society located near Lockhart, Texas.




Agarita is absolutely inviting! It is a great location to shoot cowboy, and it invites you to just wander around. As you turn the corner into the town, the first thing you see is the church with the rest of the town stretching out on your right. The church is an 1880's style church building, complete with antique stained glass and a bell for calling the cowboys and gals to worship on Sunday morn.

A little way down from the church is the General Store, and next to it is the Lucky Lady Saloon. The general store is worth a visit ... the fixtures in the place are antiques, and with all the cowboy stuff, you'd swear you've stepped back in time.

Now the Saloon is a special place. First, it is the only two-story building in the town, if you don't count the blockhouse on the fort, that is. Downstairs and to the right is the saloon, complete with an original player piano and a sign

above the bar that says, "No Dancing on the Bar With Your Spurs On!" This room serves as the administration HQ for all shooting events conducted at (Continued on next page)

Agarita Ranch. If you are prone to engage in a game of poker, you will be tempted to pick up a deck and park it at one of the large round poker tables.

Downstairs and to the left is a foyer, sitting room, and registration counter for the hotel. Yep, you read right, the hotel. The Shamrock Hotel is located above the Lucky Lady Saloon. The foyer is complete with 1880's photos on the wall (original) and a stairway leading up stairs. The hotel contains two of the most beautiful rooms you could ever wish to stay in. All of this is period correct, except for the television complete with satellite dish, and indoor plumbing, and of course, electricity. The wrought iron bed is beckoning for a good night's rest.

Across the way from the hotel and saloon is a large pavilion, a modern metal building complete with kitchen and modern bath facilities. All ceremonies and celebrations are conducted here.

Next door to the hotel is the bathhouse, a modern facility for both the cowboys and for the ladies. Then there is a Marshal's Office, a blacksmith shop and barn, a stable, and two corrals. Across from the barns, stable, and corrals are the RV hookups where it is just a short walk to the firing line.

On the far left side is Fort Agarita with its two-story blockhouse. This is where the cowboy long-range matches are conducted with silhouettes of pigs, buffalos, and rams out to 300 yards, and a large white square swinger at 400 yards.

All cowboy matches are shot from the back of the buildings and in and through the barns and corrals. The town is a functional part of the match and contributes heavily to the shooting experience with the back of the buildings forming the firing line. These folks work hard at keeping the cowboy spirit alive and the shooting interesting with monthly matches conducted on the first weekend of each month.

At the conclusion of each match, lunch is served in the pavilion. Kitchen Kate and her staff go out of their way to put the chow down for a bunch of tired and hungry Cowboy Action Shooters. You might leave here tired, but if you leave hungry, it's your own fault! After the meal there is always a short awards ceremony with hatpins awarded to the winners of each category, and a special pin for the top cowboy and top lady competitors. It is special to be the Top Gun at Agarita Ranch. If you don't have a good time here, it simply 'cause, "you ain't even tryin'..."

Agarita Ranch and the town of Agarita is an enduring compliment to our beloved sport. You find yourself getting caught up in the ambiance of the town, especially when you realize the creek below the town is Plum Creek where part of the battle between the Comanche and the Texas boys was fought on August 12, 1840. This place just whispers the word, "Cowboy!"

As you drive away, what you'll hear is pure south Texas, "Y'all come back now, ya hear?" A.







THE DEDICATION OF FORT KASKASKIA

World Shooting Complex, Sparta, IL – Veterans Day, 2007; it seems more than a coincidence the Kaskaskia Cowboys Shootout for the Fight Against Cancer would fall on the weekend of Veteran's Day. One reason is because this occasion marks the first event in which they would begin using their newest stage, Fort Kaskaskia.

To aid in building the first-class facility used by this club, the Kaskaskia Cowboys began selling sponsorships to raise funds to build structures on each stage. They called themselves, "The Rangeless Riders Red Hat Auxiliary."

Although the Rangeless Riders are a subset of the Highland Pistol and Rifle Club in Highland, IL (about 30 miles from St. Louis, MO), I am told this Auxiliary was born at the October, 2006 Show-Me Shootout in Branson, MO. Details as to the organization's creation are sketchy at best. The only information the ladies will disclose is it has something to do with an extended wine tasting tour of southern Missouri and whatever happened in Branson ... stays in Branson! The only other information I can gather is the ladies are planning a "reunion" at this year's Missouri State Championship.

Regardless of the guarded circumstances of this organization's establishment, their contributions to our local Cowboy Action ShootingTM community speak for themselves.

On own club's home front, our ladies have assumed the responsibility of scorekeeping, bookkeeping, and providing very tasty lunches for a hungry bunch of cowpokes when our club's cook has the day off. 





arble Falls, Texas – It all started with a new Cowboy Action Shooter who wanted to find a Cowboy Action range that would welcome shooters in the central Texas area at a time other than the regular scheduled club matches - a place where the Cowboy Action Shooters could "practice" their sport with authentic realism. Absolutely nothing was available. All existing club ranges were on leased properties, and the clubs were generally only allowed access on certain weekend days, usually only once a month for their regular monthly matches. To use that range any other time would entail paying the landowner an additional fee. This was something the clubs just could not afford.

So, the only "practice" a Cowboy Action Shooter got was at his house, after work with no ammunition, just dry firing his cowboy guns. This might be fun, but it just didn't give the same results that being able to "practice" on a "real" cowboy range, with "real" stage fronts, "real" steel targets, and "live" ammunition would give. One might see improvement in speed in gun transition and loading proficiency by practicing in the living room, but the true experience of competing and "practicing" real Cowboy Action Shooting needed the outdoor availability of a "real" cowboy range to make us all better shooters. These were my thoughts as I searched for a solution to the obvious need for a "practice" range. Being a retired police officer and living on my small ranch in central Texas, I found a solution that has proven to be an asset to the Cowboy Action ShootingTM community in this area, and has brought me more new friends than I could ever have imagined.

I decided I wanted to take a small area of my ranch and build a "practice" range for Cowboy Action Shooters. It was a very large undertaking because there were so many things that had to be done to make a Cowboy Action range that would be like the ranges at the clubs in the area. Everybody I questioned seemed to support the idea and said they would be willing to help make it happen in any way they could. I spoke to every shooter I could in By Singin' Zeke, SASS #69807

order to "pick their brains" on exactly what I needed to do to build a cowboy range. All of the cowboys were very helpful and were ever ready to give me ideas, advice, and most important, support. This was October 2006.

I decided to take on this project, and one cool morning I drove over to a long valley area on the ranch that was completely covered with brush and scrub cedar trees. While standing there, I saw the range in my mind. I would clear some of the valley and build a couple of stage fronts and buy some targets and the "practice" range would become a reality. As I continued to talk to some of the more experienced old time shooters. they continued to encourage me, and soon my little "practice" range idea began to grow. Its locale would offer many cowboys in the North Austin area a closer place to come shoot. They could come after work and still get in some shooting before dark. The next closest range was south of Austin, another 50 miles from our range. Also, there was no place to shoot cowboy style for approximately 100 miles north, east, and west of the new range.

Soon several of the experienced shooters suggested we form a "club." The idea was very frightening at first. This meant more clearing, more stage fronts, more targets, and a lot more work. In order to get an idea of whether a new club would succeed and prosper, we decided to hold a meeting on site at the ranch. Word spread among the Cowboy Action Shooters in the area, and on the day of the meeting, there were a large number who showed up and again expressed their support for the range and the idea of

forming a new Cowboy Action club. All were ready and willing to help in any way to get the range going and get the club on its feet. It felt good to see the genuine support and encouragement of all my fellow shooters.

Okay, if there were that many folks willing to help make a new Cowboy Action range and club, then we were going to do it. The next week I had another bulldozer on the range area, and then a motor grader to smooth things up. Many of the friends at the meeting began to donate lumber and sheet metal, money, and other items that could be used to build stage fronts. They also began coming to the range, and working folks would come on weekends and weekdays after they got home from their jobs. Many would stay after shooting to work on a new stage front. Everybody was putting all their efforts into the new project.

I called clubs and posted mes-



sages on the SASS Wire looking for targets. Soon I received a message from another club who said they had some targets they wanted to sell as they had replaced them with new ones. I bought all they had. The range was coming together. The excitement and enthusiasm continued to grow as things fell into place.

In all this confusion I met a man who has been the real backbone of the club. He came to me with a world of experience and a positive attitude. His is well known in the local cowboy community by his cowboy alias, Nada Chance, SASS Life #29547. He unselfishly worked to build the range and put together the necessary paperwork to form the new SASS affiliated club known as "The Green Mountain Regulators." He guided us in the writing of the bylaws and all the other paperwork necessary to get the club going. He (Continued on next page)

still serves as Vice President of the club and our Territorial Governor and also continues to give a lot of time and money, as well as his computer expertise to make things happen for the club. He even writes stage scenarios that are true to the cowboy tradition. He lives his life by the code of "the cowboy way." We are all very proud of him, and I'm especially proud to call him my friend.

So, with a lot of help and support, The Green Mountain Regulators was formed in November 2006 and held its first match on a very cold morning that same month. Our first match had 11 shooters who became the club's first members. Now the club has grown to over 64 members, and the membership is growing every month. The range has eight completed stage fronts with plans to continue to add stages to a total of 15. We shoot from a jail cell, sheriff's office, gallows, saloon, buckboard on springs, a suspension bridge, and soon a rolling horse. We shoot on the 4th Saturday of each month and have an average of about 35 shooters each match. We are sure that number will continue to grow.

We also created a long-range rifle area on another part of the ranch and have targets set at 25, 50, 100, 150, 200, 250, and 300 yards. This is great for the "big guns." We have plans to expand the rifle range out to (hopefully) 500 yards. But, for now, it's nice to hear the steel ring at 300 yards!

All the members of the Green Mountain Regulators are extremely proud of our club and our accomplishments as we approach the oneyear anniversary of our club and range. We are continuing to grow and expand the range thanks to all the dedication and help of all our members. We have many family memberships and are proud of our lady shooters and our juniors and buckaroos, too. Also, every member is encouraged to submit ideas that we try to incorporate into our range and our matches. This is truly a club that belongs to each and every member, and every body has a voice. We are a "fun" club where everybody comes to have a great time and do
