HELIVA RUKUS 2009

SASS New York State Championship

Ballston Spa, NY – How can a shoot just keep getting better year after year? I don't rightly know, but in this case, it's a fact! The Circle K Regulators (CKR) were worried about being able to best themselves once again, but they needn't have been concerned. They did it in grand style with Heluva Rukus 2009, their 9th SASS New York State Championship. As always, the shoot sold out within a week of the club's mid-April mailing—and for good reason. It was a dozy of an event—a rootin'-tootin', fun shootin' extravaganza, the likes of which you won't find anywhere else in Cowboy Action Shooting™ land!

The event took place September 18-20, 2009, at the Kayaderosseras Fish and Game Club in the quaint village of Ballston Spa in lovely upstate New York. With a record attendance of 240 shooters from 15 different states, 19 vendors from around the country, and spectators galore, it certainly lived up to its name. There was a flurry of activi-

ty at every turn!

Although there were many cool finishing touches added during Thursday's setup day ... in reality it was the months of work BEFORE then that set the stage for this premiere event. From May to early September, the Circle K spent an exorbitant sum of money and an incredible number of man- (and woman-) hours completely renovat-

ing Stage 8, "the town stage" (aka Rukus Flats). Thanks to a terrific construction crew, ably led by Always Willin', SASS #73501, when walking onto that stage, you were immediately transported back in time to the days of the Old West. At the very least, you felt as though you had walked onto a Western movie set. There is a bank, saloon, barbershop, alleyway, sheriff's office, general

store, and boarding house—all connected with a boardwalk. Some of the buildings are two-stories high, and all have a roof and actual interior rooms decorated with scads of appropriate props, including a safe, bar, poker table, Wanted posters, pots and pans, ironing board, and sewing machine. The exteriors of the buildings are painted or faced with real brick or wooden siding and have custom designed signage and window "characters." There is even a train depot, with a working clock tower, which serves as a shelter on that stage. In the "street" are a watering trough with hand pump, hitching post, street lamp, and authentic 1890s buggy. It is simply awesome! The props and setup on the other stages are nothing to sneeze at either. They include a small permanent cabin, an elaborate train setup, a permanent freight office building with wrap-around boardwalk, a livery stable with blacksmith shop, a fort complete with functional flagpole and Gatling gun, a jail with working jail cell, several authentic wagons, buckboards, and buggies, a ¾-size stagecoach, and some very creative props used for staging guns. There are even two scenes erected "just to look cool" and to provide some great photo ops—

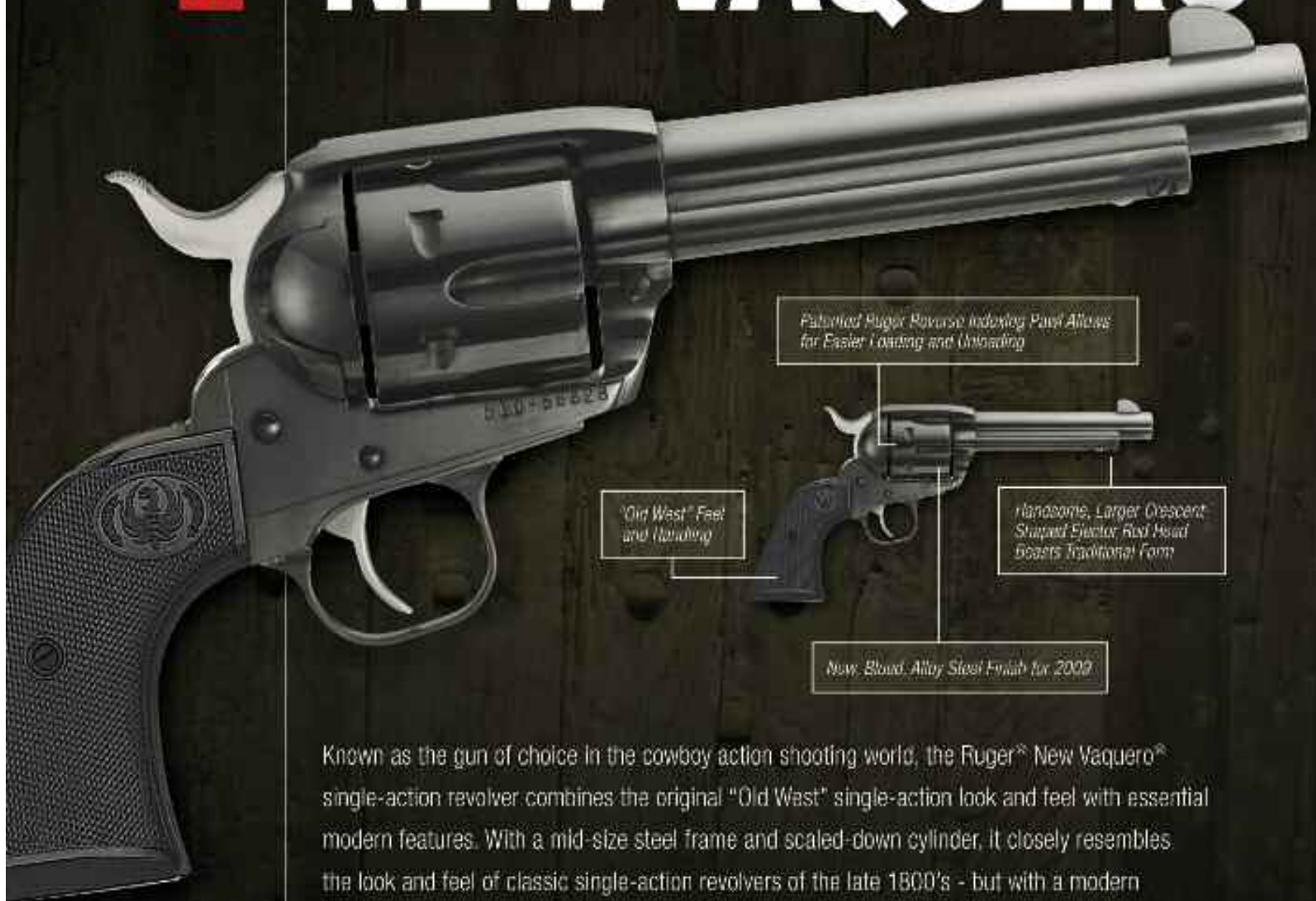

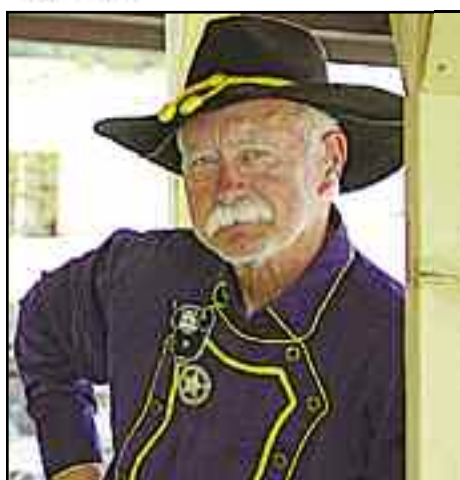

SASS A LITTLE SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE!

SASS is an amateur sport. SASS is a family activity. SASS is meant to be fun.

SASS happens to be great for the shooting industry; it presents firearms and the shooting sports in a great light that is acceptable to a very large number of people, world wide. SASS happens to encourage the preservation of the Old West by promoting a love of history, by showcasing costumes and firearms of the 19th Century, and in the restoration and display of Old West facilities, buildings, and artifacts.

SASS is not a pure "historical" organization. For example, just because double action Colt revolvers existed in the 1880s doesn't make

them legal in SASS.

The Single Action Shooting Society is first and foremost an Action Shooting fraternity. Although our members occasionally DO shoot the ground, we're NOT "ground shooters!" We're Action Shooters. Our policies and our actions have all been shaped by these precepts, and they are applicable to a wide variety of disciplines.

The Wild Bunch

Apart from being the name of the SASS Board of Directors, this movie ultimately became the inspiration for SASS as we all know it. The rules for Cowboy Action were set firmly in the second half of the 19th Century, but vestiges of this classic movie were always with us from the very beginning. END of TRAIL, Winter Range and others

have held various forms of Wild Bunch Side Matches for years. It's only been in the past couple of years this "side match" has grown up into a full-fledged shooting discipline! Today we have a "big bore," "high power" cowboy discipline that accommodates the 1911! While still "cowboy," the applicable "end date" has been pushed back into the 20th Century, and once again is a "fantasy" game rather than historical. Just because Lugers were available doesn't make them Wild Bunch legal!

So, why bastardize our game with a semi-automatic pistol? First, because it's FUN! And second, because there are many handgun shooters who haven't tumbled to the

notion Single Action revolvers are both a challenge AND fun to shoot who might be willing to give our little game a chance. Of course, they'll have to get over their reticence about wearing "one of those silly costumes!"

Mounted Shooting

Why does SASS have Mounted Shooting? The simple answer is because it's "cowboy," and it, too, satisfies all the same objectives as Action Shooting. In many ways, Mounted Shooting is the "ultimate" in recreating our Old West fantasy. Horses were "the" means of transportation in the 1880s. Cowboys aren't complete without horses! Marrying our Old West costumes, Old West firearms, Old West attitudes, with Old West tack and horses has to be the "best of the best!"

Mounted Shooting is much more of a spectator's sport than is Action Shooting. Just as rodeos and barrel racing offer countless hours of spectator appeal, so does Mounted Shooting. And, Mounted Shooting can be held in virtually any arena, once again allowing wonderful exposure to the public, and perhaps, enticing more new folks (and old cowboys) into the SASS fraternity.

Dutch showed us years ago, the END of TRAIL Wild West Show, which featured cowboys doing exciting things on horseback, was much more of a public draw to END of TRAIL than was Action Shooting.

Conclusion

While Mounted Shooting and the Wild Bunch are only a small part of SASS' business base, they are none-the-less important marketing programs for SASS and Old West firearms related sports. SASS is very appreciative of those

State, Regional, and National match directors who, sometimes with great difficulty and very little obvious benefit, have provided Mounted Shooting Championships at their matches. With END of TRAIL taking the lead, hopefully, we'll see clubs and events across the country embrace The Wild Bunch discipline as well.

All of these SASS activities are well defined with Handbooks on the SASS web site. Clubs interested in pursuing these disciplines are encouraged to do so. Prairie Mary in the SASS Office is dedicated to handling all club activities. She'll make sure your paperwork is in order so your activities can be scheduled and available to all SASS members. She's also the one who book-keeps the Mounted Shooting Points (if they are submitted in a timely manner)!

Big Horn, our Founders Ranch Manager, has also assumed the role of Mounted Shooting Coordinator at the Ranch. Tex continues to be the Wild Bunch member responsible for Mounted Shooting. Coyote Calhoun is the man for Action and Wild Bunch competitions. All may be contacted through the New Mexico SASS Office. Any official statements regarding the SASS National Shooting Programs or activities at Founders Ranch can only come from our New Mexico SASS staff or the Wild Bunch.

Whenever I worry if SASS is becoming fragmented and losing its focus, I come across photos while processing Cowboy Chronicle articles of folks around the world standing proud in their cowboy costumes and with big grins on their faces—and I realize SASS is doing "just fine" and still going strong after nearly 30 years! 🤠

With this in mind we created the new 2009 Long Hunter shooting system.

We introduced the Long Hunter gun rig in 2004. Comfortable, functional and very competitive, it has served many shooters well for the last 5 years. Since then we have made a few changes to improve the original design. The new 2009 version has a metal insert in the skirt to keep the pistol comfortably away from the body. This feature provides a draw unobstructed by the shotgun belt and presents the gun for a full shooting grip. Another feature is the retention screw and holster body lining. The tension screw allows modification of drag the holster has on the revolver and the lining insures the holster shape for years of use.

MORE IDEAS FOR STARTING ON A SHOESTRING

I have been Cowboy Action Shooting™ for four years now after shooting other competition games for nearly fifteen years. I enjoy talking to people at the matches who are there to see and learn what it takes to start. Cowboy Action Shooting™ has a very high start-up cost when compared to other games, and I'm happy to see Tuolumne Lawman addressing this issue in a reasonable manner.

I started with a used Rossi '92, used Vaqueros, and a Stevens 311. These guns were all modified to work well. Initial cost was \$1400 plus \$300 of gunwork.

Now for real shoestring for someone just wanting to play: a used Marlin or Rossi '92 should be available for \$300, cap-n-ball revolvers for \$200 each, single-barrel shotgun for \$100. \$600 and no reloading of handgun cartridges is very cheap. A short-gun alternative would be a single Ruger .45LC/.45ACP and swap-

ping the cylinders Pale Rider style during the stage or using a single six-gun and reloading on the line. None of these should win a match, but they will allow someone to play the game and get started without waiting to save a sizable stash of the green stuff to buy competition-level bangers.

A shoestring guncart is a used golf bag cart that should run in the \$30 range. Long guns can be put in the bag and ammo and such stored in the outside pockets or an additional possible bag. It won't be pretty or historically correct, but it will work better than some fancier carts that have design flaws.

(Another thing clubs can do at the monthly matches is include a "Sod-Buster" Category. One revolver, one rifle, and even a single barreled shotgun could be appropriate. Just shoot the first five revolver rounds defined in the stage scenario ... don't bother with reloading. Once a Sod-Buster starts to become competitive ... it's time he purchased the rest of his equipment! ... Editor in Chief) ♡

AMERICA: THEN AND NOW

Miss Mary and I took our daughter, Southpaw Sweetheart, her husband, Santa Fe River Stan, our grandson, Dominator, and granddaughter, Little Livvy, to Kennedy Space Center (KSC) recently. It was their first time, but since Miss Mary and I live only 45 minutes away and have annual passes, we've spent many an enjoyable day at KSC.

Every time we visit I'm recharged by a look back into an era of unparalleled scientific achieve-

ment spanning the 60's and early 70's—the years of my teens and early 20's. I remember well when America proudly undertook JFK's challenge to go to the moon after it became clear the USSR had gotten an early jump on us in the "space race" by being the first to put a satellite and a man into orbit. After an initial struggle, America bounced back with a vengeance. Our country took up this challenge like something rarely seen since WW II.

As our American successes mounted, with Alan Sheppard's first manned space flight and then John Glenn's first manned orbital

flight followed eventually by Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin, and Michael Collins' moon landing, we became an increasingly bold, enthusiastic, inventive, and confident country. There was nothing America couldn't do when she put her mind to it ... of that we were all convinced. Success was to be expected, and 'failure was not an option' as became the catch phrase surrounding Apollo 13 when suddenly a life-threatening tragedy became NASA's finest hour. Apollo 13 developed into a most wonderful success when we taxed our collective brains to the limit bringing those astronauts home safely after their command module experienced a serious explosion enroute to the moon. Failure was not in our vocabulary back then. We just wouldn't accept delivery of anything marked "failed." That wasn't the American way, and we all knew it. Do you remember that feeling of invincibility—of our destiny for greatness? I remember that, and every time I go back to KSC and look at those rockets, artifacts, and astronauts of our past, that feeling returns to the sunrise of my memory. WHAT WOMEN WORE: Chapter 6 – The Nineties: 1890 – 99 THE HOUR GLASS FIGURE

The silhouette of the 1890's was slim and perpendicular with the disappearance of the bustle. The look of the *Hour Glass Figure* was created with large puffed sleeves, a narrow waist, and a flaring gored skirt. Long, elegant lines and tall collars were popular.

More fashion magazines and fashion plates were being published helping women *keep in touch* with

the latest styles. *Ready-to-wear* clothing became widely available, making it possible for more women to have fashionable clothes. *Lingerie dresses*, made of white lace, were worn by all but the poorest women since machine-made lace was now so affordable.

The *Princess-Style* dress became popular late in the decade. An *Empire* style was also seen, but this *New Empire Dress* fit snugly over the corseted figure rather than hanging loosely like earlier *Empire* styles.

Skirts

Skirts were cut in three to five gored panels and were narrow at the top and wider at the bottom, creating an *A-line* silhouette. The fullness was drawn to the back of the waist and hidden in an inverted pleat at the center. An alternative to the gored skirt was the one-piece circular skirt called a *bell, fan, or umbrella skirt*.

By 1896, skirts were their widest - - up 70" around the hem. This was even wider than the hoopskirts of the 1860s. As sleeves widened at the shoulder, the skirts widened at the hem to balance the look. The gores became more triangular and more gores were added. Hems were padded and held out by petticoats. Many skirts were lined with stiff silk taffeta and worn with a taffeta petticoat to create a rustling sound when a lady moved called *frou-frou*.

By 1898, the shape of the skirt had changed again, fitting more closely over the hips, and then flaring slightly from the knee to the hem, creating a *trumpet-like* shape.

Trains were often found on

skirts in the early '90s, but disappeared by 1892, except for evening wear.

Bodices

Bodices were heavily boned with a *hand-span* waistline. Wide belts, cummerbunds, or girdles were decorated with pleats, tucks, lace, or beading to emphasize the tiny *waspy waist*.

Detachable collars and cuffs allowed a lady to add variety to her wardrobe. High collars were popular and usually contained small steel spirals to keep them up straight and tall. By 1898, collars were worn up to the chin and nearly touched the ear lobes with their pointed sides.

In contrast, the bodices designed for evening wear had wide shoulders and often displayed much *décolletage* with their low, square necklines.

Sleeves

Sleeves were the fashion focus of the era, often the most important feature of the costume. They grew from an ordinary tight sleeve with a few gathers at the

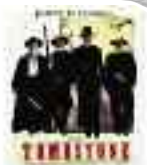

shoulder to a very full top forming the *leg-of-mutton* sleeve. Sleeves were stuffed, boned, or had stiff interlinings to maintain their shape, projecting upward and outward.

Closure

Bodices closed in the back or on the side with hooks and eyes. Evening gowns were sometimes laced up the back. Skirts were fastened with buttons or hooks and eyes at the waist with the opening disguised by pleats or folds.

Although *snaps* had been invented in the 1850s, the first reliable, rustproof snaps did not come onto the market until the early 1890s. These quickly became very popular.

A *clasp and lock* shoe fastener had been invented, but a modern-style zipper for use in clothing was not patented until 1913. It was not until the 1930s that zipper began to be used in women's clothing and then only by high-fashion designers. So, no zippers allowed, even for your '90s gowns!

Undergarments

Undergarments began to be called lingerie and featured frills and trim, especially on petticoats. Active women began to wear bloomers in public for sports.

Combinations, drawers and corset cover all-in-one piece, became very popular since they

were less bulky.

Corsets were tighter than ever in the 1890s to help define the *hourglass figure*. As they cinched in the waist, these new corsets rounded out the bust and hips. By 1899, women began to rebel against the tightly cinched and heavily boned corset and many women began wearing a shorter, more flexible, light-weight corset.

The Bustle was *out-of-style* in the '90s, but because fashions featured a *plump derriere*, many thinner women still wore a small pad tied around the waist to *fill out* their skirts.

Hats

Hats became higher and larger with wide brims and were usually centered on top of the head, worn horizontally. They were usually straw, but might be made of felt or fabrics such as velvet. Hats became very elaborate and were embellished with feathers, flowers, fruit, lace, or birds (sometimes *live!*)

Hairstyles

Hair was worn up, gently waved, then pulled into a bun high on the head or pulled softly to the back of the head. The volume of the hairstyle increased throughout the decade, from fairly close to the head up to the *Gibson Girl* puff, which was reminiscent of the *Pompadour* styles of the 1700s. ♀

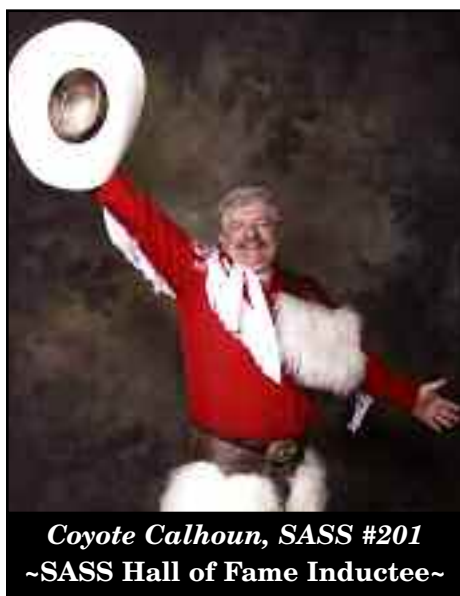
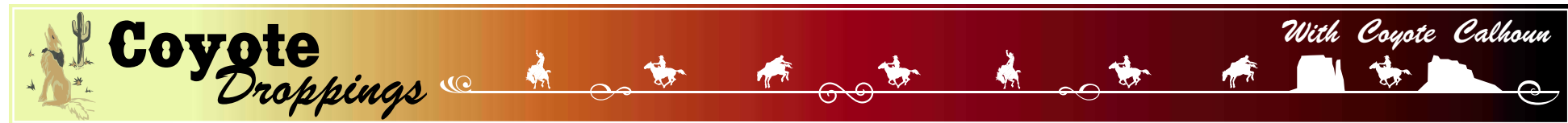

ONE POT CHUCK

Cooking Up Some Tasty Grub Like Cookie Did Out On The Trail

We reassured them Dutch Oven Cooking, as it's called, is only a bit more involved than kitchen cooking, but the style points make up for the extra effort.

The key to successful DO Cooking is having a decent bed of coals to cook over ... NOT flaming logs. Some cooks like to start with real wood like mesquite or other hardwoods and wait 'til it burns down to embers, but most of us today use name brand charcoal briquettes.

One of the Big Kahunas of DO Cooking, C.W. Welch (known by viewers of his TV show on campfire cheffing as "Cee Dub") recommends Kingsford brand charcoal ... and so do we!

Our buddies asked about what kinds of cast iron they should pick up to start their campfire cookin'. Even though you can get by with just one Dutch Oven in the very beginning, we suggest the following lineup for anyone who wants to do the job right later on:

- 12" Camp Style DO w/Lid
- 10" Traditional DO w/Wire Bail
- 10" Camp Style Replacement Lid
- 10" Deep Skillet
- Camp DO Lid Lifter
- 2 DO Trivets or Racks
- Charcoal Chimney Starter
- 2 Lid Stands
- Long-handled Tongs
- Heavy-duty leather mitts

As you can see in the picture, the Camp Style DO on the left has short legs to keep the bottom of the oven just above the coals. This helps keep your chuck from burning, and also protects the oven from warping from too much direct heat.

The Traditional DO (center) doesn't come with legs, but the Lid Stands can be used to keep it off the coals if so desired ... and are handy for resting your lid when you check your food as you're cooking it. The 10" Camp Style Lid (with the lip around the edge) allows you to put coals on top of the 10" Traditional DO if you choose to bake or roast with it.

The Trivets or Racks keep your

grub off the actual bottom of the DO (like the sage hen/chicken in the recipe below) for even cooking.

The Skillet is great for all kinds of campfire meals and, using the 10" Camp Style Replacement Lid, can also be used as an alternate DO. If you're cooking for a big outfit, you might want a 12" skillet here. We'll do some skillet meals in a couple months.

The Lid Lifter will keep your hands away from the heat, and the Charcoal Chimney Starter is the absolute *best* way to get your charcoal going. DO NOT use any kind of starter fluid! It just plain stinks up the place and ruins the taste of your food. Nuf Said!

The paperwork that comes with your cast iron will tell you how to properly "Season" it (This is Important!) and how to balance your coals (on top and underneath) to get the most from this fun way of cooking.

We'll go into more depth on the best ways to stew, bake, broil, braise, and roast great meals in your cast iron in the months ahead. You'll be a recognized "Coosie" (another name for the cattle drive cooks) in no time!

In the meantime, try this stick-to-your-ribs casserole, named for Woodrow and Gus's trail cook for the Hat Creek outfit who (as you'll recall) always walked rather than

rode so he could nab some sage hens or other tasty wildlife for supper.

Po Campo's Sage Hen Casserole

Ingredients

- Whole sage hen (or young chicken)
- 12 Sage leaves (fresh, if you can find it)
- 1 Bunch of green onions (about 10)
- 1 Large green bell pepper
- 1 Large red bell pepper
- 5 Carrots, cut into 3" lengths, then halved
- 1 Qt. of warm water
- 1 Cup of cheap white wine or sherry
- 1/4 Cup of soy sauce
- 1/4 Tsp. of ground cumin
- 1 Large bag of wide egg noodles
- 1 Large can of condensed cream of chicken soup
- 1 Large can of mushrooms

Directions

Preheat Dutch Oven over medium coals.
Truss up legs of chicken. Wipe oil (we like Olive oil) all over the chicken. Lay 6 sage leaves on breast, put 6 more, along with 4 of the green onions in the cavity. Put chicken on trivet or rack in the Dutch Oven.
Keep 8 of your hot coals under the

oven and put 12 evenly on top of lid.

Roast for 1/2 hour.

Put carrots and both whole peppers in with the chicken and continue roasting for another 1/2 hour.

Remove everything from the Oven and set them aside.

Replenish coals if necessary.

Add the warm water, wine, soy sauce, and cumin to the Dutch Oven to boil.

Bone the chicken and cut the meat and the peppers into big chunks.

Put the egg noodles into the boiling water and cook for 15 minutes.

While the noodles are cooking, put the chicken and pepper chunks, the soup concentrate, the mushrooms (drained) and the rest of the green onions (cut up into 1" lengths) in a big bowl. Stir it all up.

Ladle off the water from the cooked noodles.

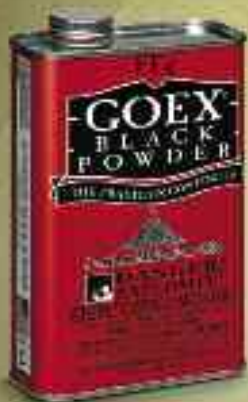
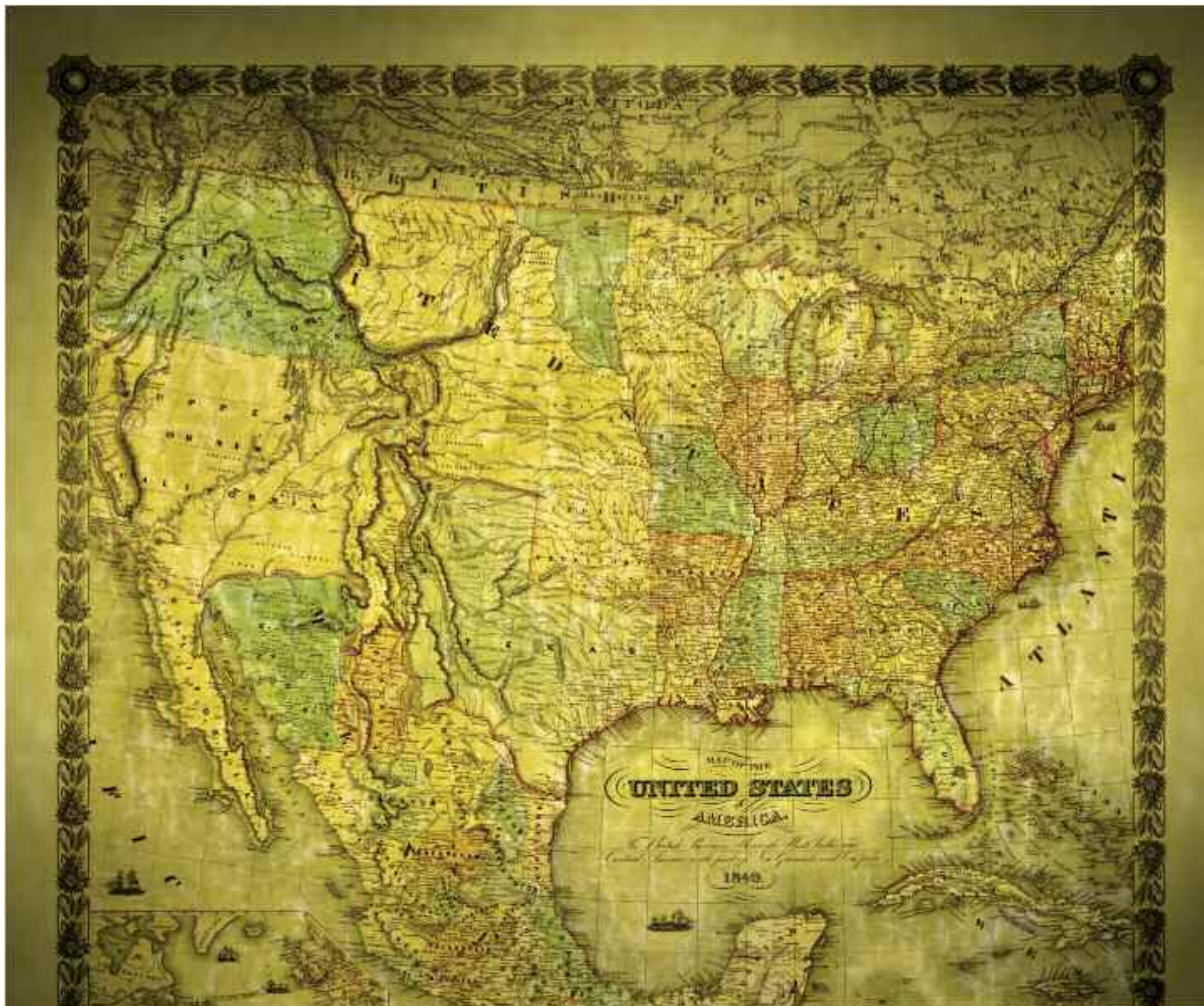
Add all the stuff in the big bowl to the noodles in the Dutch Oven and fold everything together.

Cook this hearty casserole for another 1/2 hour.

Remove Dutch Oven from coals. Dish up the casserole, with the carrots as a side.

If you use table spices and hot sauce, have at it.

Serves 4-6 hungry cowboys. It's a nice departure from chili once in a while. 🍴

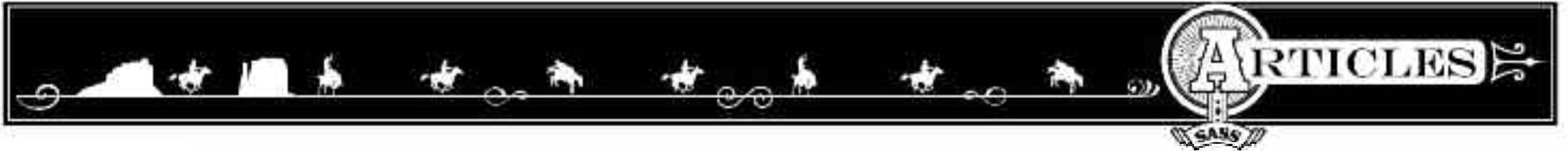

guys when studios looked for tough guys in Westerns, cop shows, and gangster flicks. Three of Bond's biggest boosters were Howard Hawks, John Ford, and Frank Capra, who cast him (but never *starred* him) in some of their better efforts.

He supported Jimmy Stewart, Gary Cooper, Henry Fonda, Clark Gable, Cary Grant, Spencer Tracy, James Cagney, and a host of other Hollywood biggies in over 200 films during his over 30 year acting career.

He was one of the most prolific players in Tinseltown. He regularly played in 10 to 20 films a year. In 1935 alone he made 30 flicks!

His staunchest supporter and best-known Leading Man through the years was, of course, John Wayne. You probably remember Bond supporting Duke in his first starring role as frontiersman Breck Coleman in Raoul Walsh's *The Big Trail*.

Bond went on to support Duke (sometimes as a Sidekick, sometimes as a Heavy) in dozens of fine movies, many of them notable horse operas. I guess we all remember seeing his rugged puss in such flicks as *Fort Apache*, *3 Godfathers*, *Operation Pacific*, *The Quiet Man*, *Hondo*, *Rio Bravo* and Duke's best movie by far, *The Searchers*, in which Bond played Texas Ranger Captain Rev. Samuel Johnson Clayton, who leads the posse seeking revenge for the massacre of Ethan Edward's (Duke)

brother's family.

Following his exemplary movie career, Bond went on to star (yes, *STAR*) as Wagon Master Major Seth Adams in his own big TV Series, *Wagon Train*, where he thrived as one of the most popular actors on the "small screen" for three years until his untimely death at 57 in 1960.

Did he have friends in high places? You betcha! He was Best

Man at his pal John Wayne's wedding (on crutches from a car crash just before the ceremony). He was extremely close to John Ford, who teased him unmercifully on the set. He campaigned strenuously for his politician friend Richard Nixon. And, he was laid to rest after a stirring eulogy by best friend Duke.

Sometimes friends can be *too* close: Bond was accidentally shot by Duke on a hunting trip. To rub it in, Bond left the errant shotgun to Duke in his will!

Bond rightfully has a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame and was inducted into the Hall of Great Western Performers of the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum.

One of the most recognizable support players in Hollywood, Bond appears on our TV often (we watch a lot of oldies on TCM). Did you know he appeared in more films (seven) of the American Film Institutes

top 100 Movies than any other actor? Not bad for a guy who didn't get a starring role for 28 years!

When I hear the term cowboy I think of men who will Ride for the Brand and someone with a good heart. Both of those terms fit the artist Art Faschan who lives his life the cowboy way. If you need him, he's there. Whether it's helping the divorced mother with two small kids build a barn so she could help support her family, or walking a sick horse 'till the vet arrives. He even helped a friend who built an 1862 Concord Stagecoach by painting the door panels and all the gold leaf around the doors.

Some of the best times of his life were the four-day long trips he's taken in recent years riding out west. He took two trips on horseback along the Colorado Trail with Red Steagall, a week riding the Rockies with friends living in Colorado, riding the trails of Bryce Canyon and the best of all—riding in Monument Valley, sleeping in a tent, and



eating out of the back of a chuck wagon. As he rode Monument Valley with his Indian guide, his heart filled with memories of watching John Wayne and Henry Fonda riding those same trails and felt like the "real" cowboy he always felt he was meant to be. And when he watches all those great westerns, he

can say, "I was there!"

And while he sits in his Florida studio creating his Portraits of Memories, he listens to cowboy music, the only music that plays in the home he shares with his wife Gail, dog Dally, and two quarter horses. And while creating his latest portrait, the DVD playing was Last Stand at Saber River with Tom Selleck.

If you've never heard the term "graphite painting" then you're not alone; however, you can expect quite a stir from premier artist Art Faschan. He has taken this medium to a new level with his **Portraits of Memories** collection. In 1999 Mr. Faschan acquired national recognition with a work he created, a portrait of Gene Autry for the Golden Boot Awards to benefit the Motion Picture and Television Fund in Beverly Hills, CA. Over the course of four years he created portraits of Clayton Moore, Chuck Norris, Eli Wallach, Peter Fonda, Andrew Prine, and Stuart Whitman, among others. Faschan has also created a Portrait of Memories of Neil Armstrong, which was commissioned by creators of a memorial to Neil Armstrong and the Lunar Lem in Armstrong's Ohip hometown. Art's next project has been commissioned by Justin McKee, announcer for the PBR. The piece is of Clem McFadden, rodeo announcer for over 60 years, great-nephew of Will Rogers, and Congressman from Oklahoma. Mr.

McFadden passed away July 2009.

Faschan has had numerous appearances on Florida area television stations, as well as exposure through newspaper and magazine articles throughout the country. The article that excited Mr. Faschan most was in "Cowboys and Indians" magazine featuring his portrait of Hank Williams Sr., commissioned by Jett Williams, Hank's daughter. His artwork has adorned walls in art galleries all over Florida and also hangs in fine homes and corporate offices throughout the United States, Canada, and Australia.

Some of the portraits he has created have been of Red Steagall, which was presented to Red several years ago at his Cowboy Gathering in Fort Worth, Texas. It brought his family to tears, and Art received a standing ovation at the presentation. It is Red from age three up until the present time. Clayton Moore's isn't a Portrait of Memories, just a portrait of one of Art's heros that he created for the Golden Boot Awards in Hollywood, CA. It was an auction item and was bought by Rand Brooks, who was Hopalong Cassidy's sidekick, Lucky. Don Edwards' portrait was presented to Don in 2007 at Red Steagall's Cowboy Gathering. Art worked with Don's wife, Kathy, as a surprise for Don. The house in the portrait is the house Don grew up in. Hank Williams, Sr's portrait, commissioned by Jett Williams, was created from



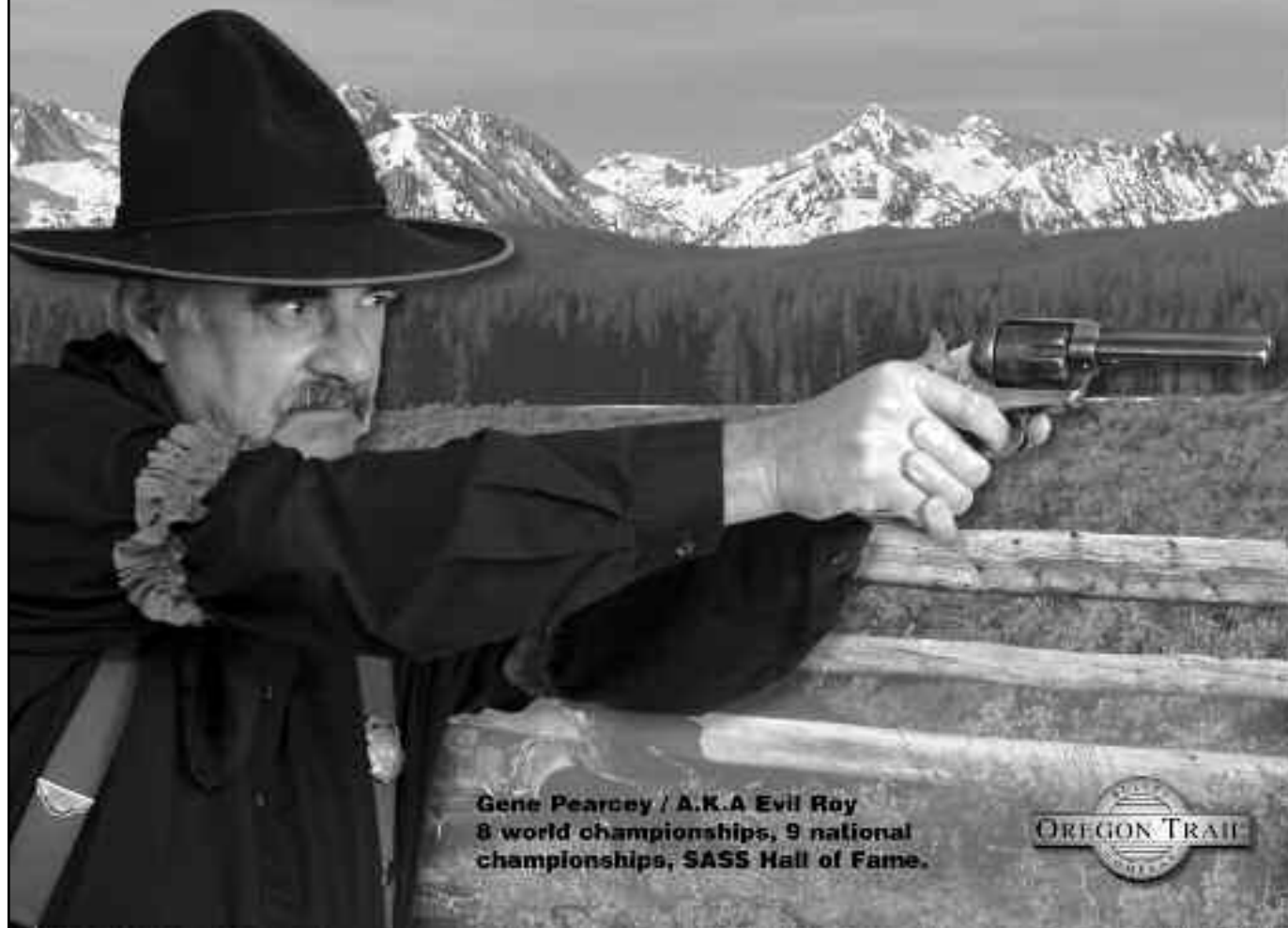
photos of Hank from age three up until his passing. Jim Currier's portrait was commissioned by his parents. It is Jim from age five up to the present time. This portrait now hangs in the Tennis Hall Fame in Newport, Rhode Island. Al Oerter was a four-time Olympic gold medal winner. The portrait was commissioned by the City of Tampa when they were trying to bring the Olympics to the Tampa Bay Area in 2012. Al passed away last year. The picture hangs in his wife's home in Ft. Myers, Florida.

photos of the person at different ages. This portrait can encompass a personal life or career. 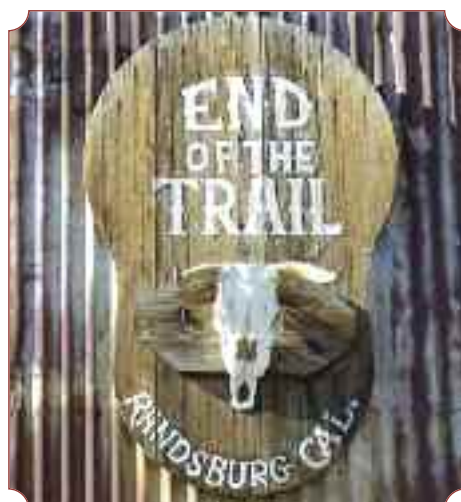

The Other END of TRAIL is a living ghost town named Randsburg, lying off Highway 395, between Barstow and Ridgecrest, California. Total number of inhabitants varies. Sometimes it's 30, and other times it's less than 20. Depends on the number of pending arrest warrants and/or domestic disputes in progress (just kidding). When my wife and I drove through town recently, I spied four people, none of whom bothered to look at me or my slow moving vehicle—no one

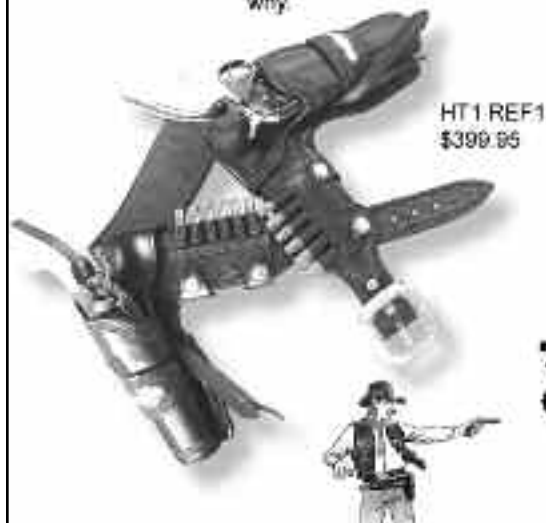

doors and windows.

After the initial shock was over, my first thought was "I wonder if any other SASS people have seen this?" My second thought was "what a place for a Cowboy Action Shoot!" We could rent the entire town and set up steel right off the main drag, up against the mine-pocked hillside. Once the shooting started, the 20 or so people living there would be right at home. I needed proof of the END of TRAIL Plaque, so I whipped out my camera and took the pictures

accompanying this article.

Randsburg is a place Western Authors write about, and the Sergio Leone's of the world use as authentic backdrops for their movies. I swear I saw Lee Van Cleef peeking out one of the upstairs windows, and Clint Eastwood was across the street eyeballing him through a long scope. I felt I should be dressed in my SASS attire, with six guns strapped on, and my '66 at the ready.

According to Len Wilcox of the Desert, USA Association, a visit to Randsburg, is a visit to the past when the mining camps of the Mojave were boomtowns, and gold was being dug out of the hills. The community has survived the many perils the desert mining camps faced, and some of its residents still work the land for its hidden riches. It is a living ghost town, a working mining town that likes having some—but not too much—company. There are no stop lights, gas stations, or malls here; just an unpretentious, quiet little town that enjoys its place in desert history.¹

Randsburg is located on the western Mojave Desert, near the El Paso Mountains and not far from Red Rock Canyon State

Park. It's high desert country with an altitude of about 3,500 feet. Randsburg is a must-see for anyone interested in prospecting or the Mojave's fascinating history. The area is not only famous for mining gold but also for mining silver and tungsten. In the late 1800's, the Rand Mountains hadn't been named yet. They'd been prospected a little, but passed over by most Rainbow Chasers. In the early '90's, three gold hunters discovered one of the peaks in this small mountain range was a mountain of gold. These three prospectors—John Singleton, F. M. Mooers, and Charlie Burcham—were down on their luck. They barely had enough food and supplies to keep them alive while they established their claim, and each day they used the gold they found to finance another day's digging. They were almost to the point of selling their claim to a developer when Rose Burcham, Charlie's wife, arrived and saved the day—and their fortune. She wouldn't allow the sale, and found a way to finance the mine's development. To her husband and his partners, this was a woman who was worth far more than her weight in gold. The Yellow Aster became one of the biggest gold mines on the Mojave.²

The prospectors called their discovery the Rand. The town that sprung up became Rand Camp, then Randsburg. The mountains they

were in became the Rand Mountains, and the owners changed the name of the mine to the Yellow Aster. The town and the area boomed. Soon over 2,500 people inhabited Randsburg, making it a beehive of activity. Gold mines blossomed on the hillsides, and the boom was on.

The boom faded, but the town would not die. Both silver and tungsten were discovered in the nearby hills, just as the area was beginning to die. The town survives off a little mining, and a little tourism, as do the nearby communities of Red Mountain and Johannesburg.³

History is important here. A museum, open only on weekends, houses a surprising amount of mining artifacts and memorabilia. The general store has a long counter and malt machines dating from the 1930's. There's a rack with treasure maps, books on hunting gold, and locally published histories, all great reading.⁴

I sometimes wonder why we Americans fly-off to other countries for sights and sounds, when we have so many incredible attractions such as Randsburg right here at home. Save your air miles and drive to Randsburg. It's a memory you won't soon forget. Bring your guns, just in case. You're a Daisy if Ya do.

MURDER MYSTERY THEATER LIVES AT THE HISTORIC ST. JAMES HOTEL

Cimarron, New Mexico – Hearing that name really conjures up the ghosts of the Old West for me. I can't resist seeing historic locations. But, until recently, if someone suggested I would actually enjoy staying in a haunted hotel over Halloween, I would have balked. However, the experience turned into an unforgettably, fun weekend.

Cimarron was a key stop along the Santa Fe Trail until the railroad came in the 1880's. Cimarron means wild in Spanish, and by the

1870's the town's reputation as a lawless and dangerous place was widely known. Gold had been discovered nearby, and cowboy ranchers clashed with local residents and the Santa Fe Ring in what became the Colfax County War.

Today Cimarron is home to the Philmont Scout Ranch, and nearby Taos draws tourists to its art galleries in the summer and skiing in the winter. The NRA's Whittington center is also nearby in Raton, New Mexico. For me though, the real

attraction is found at the St. James Hotel. The hotel was recently reopened by its new owners, the Express UU Bar Ranch, after remodeling the kitchen, bar, and dining areas. The Express St. James Hotel offers guests the rare opportunity to stay in Jesse James' favorite room or where Zane Grey wrote, "The Fighting Caravans."

In 1987, television writer/director, Chris Schueler, was filming a feature about the St. James' historic, haunted past. When he told his friend, composer/musician, Jeff Jolly, about the hotel, they realized this was the perfect place to produce their unique vision of a Murder Mystery Theater. Since then, they have hosted over one hundred plays. What is different about these weekend-long events is participants are not just spectators, but become characters in the play!

Did I mention this is a costume event? I had a ball playing the notorious, "gentleman gunfighter" Clay Allison, and my wife played Delightful Desiree, a "Lady of the Evening." She sure looked good in her saloon girl outfit and really enjoyed being a perfect flirt with all of the men! For those of us who enjoy the "Spirit of the Game," being in the play was a real hoot!

Of course, the hotel itself has more character than any other set.

In 1872 Henri Lambert opened Lambert's Place Saloon. With his wife, Mary, they expanded the wildly successful saloon into the St. James Hotel in 1880, offering fine dining and rare elegance for the time and place.

In contrast, the original, bawdy saloon was literally in the next room, and you can still see the numerous bullet holes that remain in the tin ceiling. Between 1872 and 1884 gunfights claimed twenty-six lives here. Talk around town after a busy night usually began with, "Wonder who got killed at Lambert's place this weekend?"

Due to its location, the St. James attracted a "Who's Who" of famous Old West characters. The Earp brothers and their wives stopped here on their way to Tombstone. Outlaws such as Jesse James and Black Jack Ketchum rested in the hotel. Buffalo Bill met Annie Oakley while staying at the St. James.

Most of the old rooms are available to guests, but Room 18 upstairs is not, as the last guest has never really checked out. Legend has it T.J. Wright had won the deed to the St. James from Henri Lambert in a high-stakes poker game, and was shot in the back as he walked to his room. He managed to crawl into his room where he died and, legend has it, remains to this day. T.J. is not a happy ghost as the stories go, and because it was Halloween, I did not wish to provoke him.

Back to the play ... Friday

evening we joined fourteen other players in a live Old West version of Clue as everyone tried to figure out what the heck was going on. On arriving, each player was given an envelope with precious few script notes. Each player had their own lines and clues to watch for, but no one had the entire script or plot. Everyone played off each other's lines and the situation of the moment.

I opened my note, labeled, "Open upon arrival," and read, "When the director says the first scene has started, go pick up Delightful

Desiree fairly quickly and go to your room with her (be careful unless she is really your wife or there could be a real murder!)."

A shot rings out! ... A blood curdling scream comes from the hallway!

I left my room, gun in hand, ran to the lobby, and (performing my best Curly Bill Brocius – Powers Booth imitation) loudly asked who killed my friend? I declared, "I will find whoever killed him and make them pay the price. No one is leaving the hotel until I find out. Anyone who wants to leave can

leave—in a pine box!" And so the play began.

Later, Jeff "Justice Jolly" and Chris "Sheriff Schueler" performed as a musical duo, weaving clues in with song lyrics, and taught everyone the chorus to the weekend's theme song,

"Dark deeds afoot and mysterious doings,

the Old West is weaving her spell, Messieurs Smith and Wesson will root out the guilty who enter the

St. James Hotel,

Beware in the St James Hotel."

The play resumed at breakfast Saturday morning, and then everyone was offered a tour of Villa Philmonte, the Phillips family mansion on the Philmont Ranch. The play continued at lunch and, after an afternoon break, resumed at dinner in the bar that evening. However, the real highlight of the weekend was the show in the lobby after dinner.

Offering virtuoso performances as entertaining as "Riders in the Sky," Jeff and Chris added another twist as the audience was drawn into the merriment of song and humor. By then there were no shy actors left, and a good time was had by all as local residents came out to enjoy the show. As expected, the evening ended with Justice Jolly telling the St. James' haunted history and the staff recounting many ghostly encounters. It took awhile to fall asleep that night as I listened to foot-

steps on the old, creaky floors.

The final scene ended at breakfast on Sunday as all was finally revealed. I didn't see any ghosts this time, but Mary Lambert's welcoming spirit was felt in the excellent service from the staff and delicious meals they served. Always present, local photographer, Toby Kessler did an excellent job of taking pictures during the entire play and everyone picked out their favorites to buy before heading home.

Would I spend Halloween, or any other weekend there again? You bet, and "Delightful Desiree" and I can hardly wait to see what roles we will get to play in solving the next "Murder Mystery Weekend."

Oh, I almost forgot ... who did commit the heinous crimes that weekend? After being sworn to secrecy, I cannot tell. To find out, you'll have to join the play at the St. James Hotel!

FREEING THE MIND To Free The Body

Kevin McNiven, Wyoming Drifter, SASS #15351, tightened the cinch on "Ace," the horse I was riding on the weeklong, "Outlaw Trail Ride to the Hole-In-The-Wall." That was twelve years ago. We were just outside of Lander, Wyoming on our third day. This annual trail ride calls for participants to dress in 1880's attire and strap on six-guns, cowboy hats, chaps, and what-

ever else "cowboy" they've got and ride to the famous Hole-in-the-Wall, a valley where the likes of Jesse James, Butch Cassidy, and the Sundance Kid hid from the "lawdogs." Kevin has a ranch and owned the horses we were riding, many who worked full time as "talent" he had trained for the movies. Being our mounts was like a "summer job." They were spirited good-looking steeds as

is called for from those appearing in movies and very well trained. They handled easily and were impervious to things like pistols being shot by the rider on their back.

"That'll hold," Kevin said as he patted the secured cinch. "Now if I can just find my horse, we can go." The fourteen of us had stopped in a grassy glade for lunch and allowed the horses to graze. I said, "Kevin, I just saw your horse go over that rise, there." Kevin said thanks and walked to the top of the small hill. He spun and yelled at me, "Pappy, could you come over here now." There was urgency in his voice so I hurried to him. His horse was at the bottom of a gully, lying on his side in a stream struggling to keep his nose out of the water. Kevin plunged into the stream and tried to pull his horse up to his feet, but the tired horse seemed glued to the ground. Finally, Kevin said to me, "Pappy, I want you to take his reins and just hold them. He is tired, so lift his reins; keep his nose from going under the water. I'm going to take off his saddle. When I do, he

will get to his feet and likely want to get the heck out of here. That's where you come in. Don't let him run off. Lead him, if you can, downstream to that flat place (only fifty feet away) and ask him to step out of the water. He'll want to, but he might be a little excited. Just keep him calm until I can get there. If he insists on leaving, don't get hurt—let him go. OK?" Not knowing much about horses, I gave a small nod of less than confident agreement.

All went as Kevin had outlined. Kevin undid the cinch and sat down in the water so he could get a good hold of the saddle and began to pull. A wet leather saddle under a thousand pounds of horse is hard to move but he did, eventually. As the saddle inched out from under the gelding, his eyes began to calm although there was still a lot of white showing. When the saddle was finally free and Kevin had moved back a foot or two he said, "Give him a little encouragement to get up—pull his reins a little." It didn't take much. In a second, he had scrambled to his feet and was moving toward me and downstream. I stood off to his side and directed him down to the flat place Kevin had suggested and cued him to come to me onto dry ground. In a minute, Kevin was beside me holding the saddle and pad. "Good work," Kevin said. "Now let's see if he injured himself. He carefully ran his hands over the whole of the horse, squeezing a little here and there. Finally, he threw blanket and saddle on him and rode off up a

hill and across a plain. In a few minutes, he was back pronouncing no harm had been done. Later I mentioned I was surprised the thirty-pound saddle could keep such a big horse from getting up, and how easy it was for him once freed of the saddle. Kevin smiled and said, "The saddle wasn't what kept him down. It was his mind. We didn't free him from the saddle. We helped him free his mind. Once he realized he wasn't trapped (in his mind), he was able to stand." How many of us do that with our own lives? We think we are trapped, but it's all in our mind.

I didn't see Kevin for a couple of years until a friend invited me to be in a Wild West Show in Norco, California. There were many horses involved in the show ... and so was Kevin McNiven. Walking up to him, I wasn't sure he would remember me from the many weeklong rides he wrangled. Shaking his hand, I said as much and he grinned. He said, "How could I forget you, Pappy. You saved my horse." Not true, of course, but that gave me as much pride as if Hopalong Cassidy had called me

partner when I was ten years old.

These memories, all fresh, since I just returned from a weeklong trip to Tombstone AZ where a group of twenty five of us rode the trails ridden by Wyatt Earp and Doc Holiday when Wyatt set out to avenge the shootings of two of his brothers. We rode the movie set built for the movie Tombstone and on the final day rode right down the main street (Allen St) of Tombstone with our cowboy outfits, pistols, and chaps. The next day began the biggest Tombstone event of the year—Helldorado Days. The early tourists thought we were part of the entertainment and turned out of the restaurants and shops to grab a "photo-op." Sitting around the campfire that night Kevin serenaded us with two hours of songs and anecdotes. I bought another two of his CD's. They are part of my permanent collection in the barn, played while I do my chores or just visit my horse. When Kevin begins to sing, I always have the same thought "You saved my horse." And I smile. You just don't get gentlemen like that anywhere but in a cowboy. 🤠

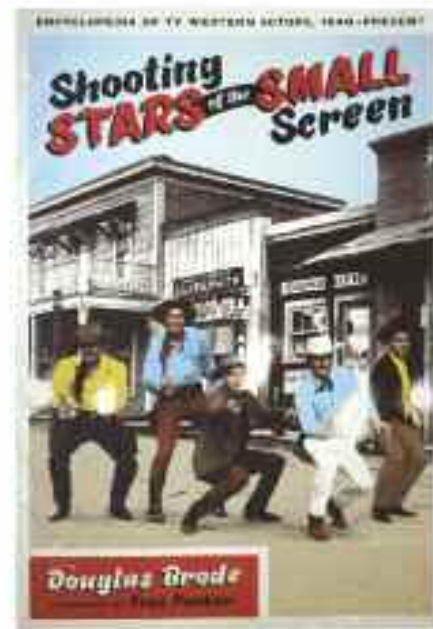

WILD BUNCH FOR DUMMIES

Chapter 2

By Captain George Baylor, SASS #24287

1911 Techniques

This will be mostly a pictorial. Unfortunately you're stuck with seeing me demonstrate the techniques, and to make it worse, I did most of it left-handed. I know most of you would have preferred having a semi-dressed supermodel doing the demonstration, but none of my semi-dressed supermodel friends could demonstrate 1911 techniques. We'll cover basic loading and shooting in this chapter and malfunction clearances in the next.

Drawing

Photo 1—Shooter is standing in the SASS default starting position, arms hanging straight, hands at side.

Photo 2—Strong hand achieves a firm, firing grip on the pistol. Finger is outside the trigger guard. Weak hand comes to center of body.

Photo 3—Gun comes up and forward toward weak hand. Note trigger finger is outside trigger guard.

Photo 4—Weak hand acquires a strong grip on top of slide.

Photo 5—Strong hand punches pistol forward. Note we're not pulling the slide back, we're shoving the gun forward and holding the slide. You have more power in a

punch than a pull. Keep the gun close to your body so you can use more arm and shoulder muscles. Using this technique a 100 lb. woman can shoot a 1911 from Condition 3 (hammer down on an empty chamber, loaded magazine).

Photo 6—And fire. If you are shooting Duelist (Traditional Category), you've punched your shooting hand into a firing position. If you're shooting two handed, the weak hand needs to move to its position over the strong hand.

Changing Magazines

(Demonstrated left-handed, but the basic techniques apply with either hand.)

Photo 7—First, push the magazine release button. If you're left-handed, you can use your trigger finger. If you are right handed and have a long thumb, you can use your right thumb. If your trigger finger is short, we'll come to that later. Since I shoot Duelist, I grab the fresh magazine while shooting and bring it close to the gun.

Photo 8—Insert magazine in one smooth motion.

Photo 9—Index finger is on the front edge of the magazine to help "point the way."

Photo 10—Line up the maga-

zine and keep pushing. I put the rear edge of the magazine against the rear edge of the magazine well.

Photo 11—This is not a separate bump. The hand just keeps pushing up until it seats the magazine firmly. I see people push the magazine in, then tap the magazine with the heel of their hands. As Jeff Cooper says, this is a VBT—A Very Bad Thing! It adds about two seconds to your reload. A good shot to shot reload, using a target the size of an IPSC target at 7 yards, is 1.5 seconds.

Photo 12—Now drop the slide as soon as the magazine is seated. I have been accused of having a defective gun whose slide closes when a magazine is shoved home. This is not true. My trigger finger is on the slide release during reloading, and I release the slide as soon as the magazine is seated.

Photo 13—And fire as soon as the sights are on target.

A Problem for right handers with smaller hands

If you have medium to large hands and/or long thumbs, you keep the gun pointed downrange and push the magazine release button with your right thumb. That's what John Moses Browning intended. But if your thumb isn't long enough ...





Photo 14—You're trying to drop the magazine, but reaching the magazine release button is difficult.

Photo 15—Colonel Cooper taught you to shift the gun in your hand so you could reach the button. It's one thing to shift as shown here ...

Photo 16—But, Col. Cooper wasn't using the 170° rule. People have broken the 170 doing this and

received stage DQs. BE VERY CAREFUL!

Releasing the slide release presents even worse problems

It actually needs a longer thumb.

Photo 17—People have shifted the guns in their right hand in order to reach the slide release with their right hand and received match DQs. You may think this was exaggerated for effect, but I've seen worse!

Solution

Photo 18—Use the thumb of your left hand to push the magazine release button. You can do this while a magazine is in your left hand if you're shooting Traditional. Then insert the magazine.

Photo 19—If you're shooting with two hands, you probably won't have to switch your grip.

Photo 20—After you have inserted the magazine (see above), release the slide with your left thumb.

Photo 21—You're ready to fire.

"The Undisclosed Location"

The neatest Cowboy Action Shooting™ range I've shot at is one that isn't on maps. It's a place that has to be kept unpublicized because it's used by Special Operations units to hone their skills. It's on a mountain, and some of the targets are on nearby mountains as far away as 2500 meters. To say it looks like Afghanistan is an understatement.

The "road" to it is a trail about 10 ft. wide, rough, twisty, and with a sheer drop on one side. It climbs from the desert floor to 5,000 ft. We arrived in a 40 ft. bus towing a 25 ft. trailer. The place is owned by a couple. We'll call them Mr. and Mrs. Blank. They met us at the entrance. We had emailed them when we left the nearest town 85 miles away. The cell phones don't work there. They are off the grid, making their own electricity with big generators and a football field of solar

panels. Mrs. Blank took The Redhead up in a Polaris six-wheeler. We disconnected the trailer, and Mr. Blank and I towed it up to level 2 with a desert colored HumVee. Level 2 was at 5,000 feet. Eventually it came my lot to drive the bus up the 10 ft. wide, twisty trail with Mr. Blank riding in the right seat and giving me minute corrections. I was 63 when I started the trip and 112 when I finished!

What does this have to do with SASS? Well, Mr. and Mrs. Blank have a Cowboy Action Shooting™ range as well, with targets closer than 2500 meters. If you miss one of the pop-up clay pigeons, the hapless bird falls about 5,000 feet, screaming all the way. Mr. Blank explained Mrs. Blank didn't like broken birds

littering her range. A small club actually shoots there once a month. Now those are hearty shooters! We practiced there for a few days. The hospitality was fantastic. Then, I had to bring the bus down the hill. Then, I was on the outside and reminded most of the way that I'm only afraid of two things, falling from a great height and redheads!

The Mernickle Evil Roy Wild Bunch Rig shotgun/rifle slide

Most Wild Bunch rigs started as SASS rigs with 1911 holsters or military holsters (whether authentic to the period or not). Bob Mernickle designed the Evil Roy Wild Bunch rig from the ground up. It has dominated the category. Pretty soon shooters discovered what it was missing. The shotgun belt we use gets in the way of grabbing our magazines. It needed a shotgun slide. Bob designed a slide to go over the buckle area that holds 4 shotgun shells and five rifle rounds. NORMALLY you don't load the shotgun on the clock unless you've missed a round. Sometimes the stage will call for more rounds than a '97 will hold. NORMALLY four will be enough to handle that. If it's not, well, you have a shotgun belt for your main match guns.

The Bret Maverick Hat

Bret Maverick wore a telescope crown hat with the brim curled up on the front of the sides and the crown pointed at the front. This is an authentic Old West style. I found a picture of a cowboy wearing one in an 1880's photo. The one used in the Maverick TV series was straight out of the Warner Brothers prop house and wasn't always the same hat. In

the early '80's James Garner brought Maverick back in a short-lived series, "Bret Maverick." There he had a new hat, essentially the same style but different enough to be memorable. As a fan of Maverick I decided I had to have that hat. After all, I am married to a lady poker player who might have been right out of that series. I made photographs off the TV screen and gave them to Rick at Brims & Trims. The result, complete with the silver leather hatband from the series, is shown in the pictures. This is a hat that's both TV correct and historically correct. The hatband was more of a problem than the hat, but Rick came through with both.

It's not necessary to note the fact James Garner looked a lot better in the hat than I do!

"I'll make you famous"

You might have noticed I did articles on several major events in 2008 and 2009. These were well received. If you want your event written up for The Cowboy Chronicle, I am available. What does it take? Well, first, you comp my entry fee, camping fees, and banquet tickets for The Redhead and me. Second, you put me on an interesting posse. First choice would be a posse of semi-dressed supermodels. If that isn't

available, the Blackpowder Posse is preferred. If you don't have one, I'll help you come up with one. Third, have someone else photograph the event. I can do enough photos for an article, but, as a contestant, I can't be everywhere at once, and I can't concentrate on photography. Photographs should be digital, in as many megapixels as possible, taken with a quality camera by a good photographer, and captioned with the names of everyone in the picture. 8 to 10 pictures like that is enough. If you turn in more, Tex will make it into a montage. When you see a montage instead of captioned photos, it probably means Tex didn't have captions to work with. It may come as a shock to you, but Tex doesn't know all

85,000 SASS members! If the pictures include semi-dressed supermodels, send them directly to me.

What Did I Learn in 2009?


I attended matches with targets way out at Fort Mudge. Some had unbelievably difficult stages. Usually the ones with difficult stages had distant targets, too.

These matches all attracted fewer shooters than they had the year before. In short, around the country matches that ignore the wishes of the paying customers are withering away and dying.

I also attended matches with close, big targets and simple scenarios. These events are all growing. The last three major events I attended were good examples, Outlaw Trail,

Bordertown, and Comin'At'Cha. Outlaw Trail had 3 days, 18 main match stages, and I wouldn't change any of them. Bordertown had the best stages I encountered all year, and Comin'At'Cha was the best overall event I attended. Both of them had more than 10% clean matches. (Outlaw Trail would have if it had had 10-12 stages, but 18 is a lot.) I've concluded that the percentage of clean matches is a good measure for how good an event is. The more clean matches, the better the match is.

Bordertown had about 300 contestants. Comin'At'Cha had nearly 400. Neither of these events is in an easily accessible location. Bordertown is near Tombstone, Arizona, and Comin'At'Cha isn't near anything in East Texas. Both events learned what the majority of shooters want. Both events geared their stages to average shooters. Match directors who want to "slow down the gamers" or "challenge the hot-shots" are kidding themselves. Yes, the really fast shooters went really fast. They always do. But, a lot of average shooters could say they shot clean. They enjoyed it, they'll tell their friends, just like I'm telling you, and those events will grow or limit out. If your event is not growing, look at the number of clean matches. If it's less than 10%, it's probably not a good match.

In 2010 I'm looking forward to attending matches that cater to the paying customers. Aren't you?

GETTING STARTED IN COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING™ ON A SHOESTRING ... REVISTED 15 YEARS LATER!

Part Three: Handguns

As I stated in prior segments of this series, in 1994, a person could get a start in Cowboy Action Shooting™ for well under \$900 if they shopped carefully. I know this because I had less than \$875 invested in my initial Cowboy Action Shooting™ armory when I began way back then. In today's market, however, you seemingly can't even come close to that now! Through the last fifteen years, much has changed. The dismal exchange rate between the US Dollar and the Euro is certainly not helping. A large majority of our Cowboy Action Shooting™ guns come from Europe—especially Italy. Prices on domestically produced handguns like Ruger have been hurt by other factors here at home. The post election hysteria has driven up demand for ALL firearms to previously unseen levels. Anyone familiar with basic economics knows rising demand means decreased available supplies and rising prices. Credit card rates going up also has an effect, as people are reluctant to put rather expensive (and un-necessary) toys like Cowboy Action Shooting™ guns on high interest plastic.



A wide variety of powders are available for percussion revolvers in Cowboy Action Shooting™. Triple 7 BP and Pyrodex blackpowder substitutes, Pyrodex pellets, and GOEX blackpowder.

The purpose of this series of articles is to tell you how you can still get started on a shoestring. Last month we talked about good buys on Cowboy Action Shooting™ shotguns, and the month before about inexpensive rifles. This month, I will talk about the final item in your Cowboy Action Shooting™ armory: the revolvers. Why did I put rifles and shotguns ahead of the handgun? Both were used more often and by more people than the revolver in the West. Most farmers and settlers in the West did not have a handgun. Let's first look at the real role of the handgun in the West to better understand our choices now. Because their modern replicas are part of an affordable Cowboy Action Shooting™ battery, I will cover percussion revolvers and the 1873 Colts. Replicas of the other 18th century cartridge revolvers are not very affordable.

OLD WEST HANDGUN LORE

The revolver went by many names: Hawleg, Peacemaker, Frontier Six Shooter, and Smoke Wagon, just to name a few. While not generally used by farmers, sod busters, or townies, it was very popular with cowboys, lawmen, and bad-

men. It offered five, six, seven, or even 12 shots (yes, the Moore revolver was seven shots, and the Walch Navy was 12) very quickly. The larger frame percussion models in .44 caliber, and cartridge revolvers in 38 WCF, 44 WCF (in fact most .44 calibers), and in .45 caliber were decisive fight stoppers. Despite what the movies and television would have you believe, though, the West wasn't just won by Colt 1873 Army revolvers. About twenty-five years of percussion revolvers preceded it into the West.

Percussion Revolvers

The "Wild West" as we know it was a short period of time. The earliest time period generally considered as the "beginning," is the California Gold Rush in 1849. More often than not, though, it is thought to be from the end of the War of Secession in 1865, continuing until about 1900 when the last of the gangs like the Wild Bunch disbanded. Vast number of discharged and displaced soldiers from both sides of the Mason Dixon line drifted west, carrying their wartime side arms with them. Huge quantities of weapons, including percussion revolvers, were surplusd

after the cessation of hostilities to help settle the wartime debt. Surplus revolvers were sold for just a few dollars by firms such as Bannerman's in New York.

If you consider the Gold Rush as the beginning of the "Wild West," for the first 20+ years of this westward expansion, the percussion revolver was the only sidearm around. Even after the advent of cartridge revolvers with the S&W No. 3 American Model in 1869, the Colt Cartridge conversions in 1871, and the 1873 Colt Single Action Army, the percussion revolvers were the rule, rather than the exception. The percussion revolvers still dominated until the late 1870's, and were still very common even through the 1880's! That means of the 50 plus years of the "Old West," two-thirds of it was dominated by these percussion revolvers of Remington and Colt.

Colt was the first to introduce percussion revolvers with its 1836 Patterson. The Patterson revolver was exceptionally popular with Captain Jack Hays and the Texas Rangers for Comanche fighting in the 1840's. In 1847 Colt collaborated with Captain Samuel H. Walker, and

created the massive and powerful "Walker model" .44 Colt revolver. It was so large it was generally carried in pommel holsters on horseback. In 1849, Colt introduced a scaled down .44 horse pistol, called the Dagoon model. In 1851, at the height of the Gold Rush in California, Colt introduced the slim, sleek .36 caliber 1851 Navy Model, which was Wild Bill Hickok's favorite.

Both during the Civil War, and the subsequent westward

migration, the Colt 1851 Navy and 1860 Army were the favorites of most revolver carriers. Until 1878 when Colt introduced their 1873 "Peacemaker" in .44 WCF (.44-40), the term "Colt's .44 revolver" meant a .44 1860 Army percussion revolver. During the majority of the pre-Custer Indian/Cavalry conflicts, the .44 Colt 1860 Army model was the revolver used. Outlaws Sam Bass and John Wesley Hardin favored the 1860 Colt Army for shootist work. I have heard that over 500,000 1860 and 1851 Colts were made.

While Colt was the first to introduce percussion revolvers, other manufacturers, like Remington, soon joined in. The first widely successful Remington revolver was the New Model Army in .44 caliber. While we generally (and erroneously) refer to it as a "Model 1858," it was actually introduced in 1861 after the beginning of the Civil War. The "1858" actually refers to the patent date. This New Model Army revolver from Remington was second only to the Colt in its numbers and in its popularity. Both during and after the Civil War, the Remington 1858 was also a favorite of many.

Part of its popularity was due to its reputation for its one-piece frame being sturdier than the inherently weaker two-piece frame of the 1851 and 1860 Colts. In fact, Colt later adopted the Remington style one-piece frame for its 1873 Single Action Army. Another feature of the 1858 was the "safety notches" for the hammer between the chambers on the cylinder. This made the Remington percussions the ONLY major 19th century revolvers safe to carry with all six chambers loaded. Rather than resting precariously on a safety pin between chambers, or on a live percussion cap, the Remington's hammer nestled safely in these notches between percussion caps.

Colt's 1873 Cartridge Revolvers

To most of the world, the Colt 1873 Single Action Army revolver IS the gun that tamed the Old

West. For over a century, the saying "God created man; Samuel Colt made them equal," has been ingrained in us from our earliest youth. Even among today's Cowboy Action Shooters, some still insist "Real Men shoot Colts."

The Colt Single Action Army was a vast improvement over the percussion revolvers of the day. The Indian fighting army of the frontier carried a wide variety of side arms during this time period. These included 1851 and 1860 Colt percussions and later cartridge conversions, 1858 Remington percussions and cartridge conversions, and even Smith and Wesson #3 American revolvers in both .44 Henry Rimfire and .44 S&W American. In an effort to standardize in the early 1870's, the Army was looking for a durable, robust, and powerful sidearm to arm the Cavalry. Colt submitted the 1873 Single Action Army for trials, along with their new, proprietary .45 Colt cartridge.

This cartridge itself was a vast improvement over any of the guns and calibers in use. It used a 250 to 255 grain conical lead bullet over 40 grains of coarse (FFG) blackpowder in a balloon head case. This potent round developed well over 400 lbs. of muzzle energy. The round was so brutal in recoil the army eventually reduced the powder charge to either 30 or 35 grains (depending on what source you read) to reduce the recoil. This was still a potent stopper. (Author's note: current .45 Colt brass has a solid head, and will only take about 35 grains of blackpowder. About 14 years ago, I found some old balloon head .45 Colt cases. I loaded these with 40 grains of FFFG Goex under a 255 grain bullet and fired them from a martial marked Henry Nettleton 1873 Colt SAA. Boy, did it buck and roar!!!!) A man shot with a .45 Colt in the torso generally noticed it immediately, no matter how excited and full of adrenalin he might have been!

The Colt Single Action Army (or 1873 SAA) was a vast improvement over the percussion and cartridge conversion revolvers of the day. The 1873 SAA had a robust solid frame with a top strap (initially developed by Ryder and Remington prior to the

Civil War), rather than the strapless two part frames of the percussion Colts and the cartridge conversions of those revolvers. It has very few moving parts, and these, for the most part are very strong. Awhile back, I had a 1902 made .38WCF (.38-40) first generation Single Action Colt. Though very well worn and somewhat loose from many years of use on horseback, it still fired EVERY time I pulled the trigger!

Also known as the "Peacemaker," the 1873 SAA was an instant success, not just with the Army, but civilians as well. Initially offered only in .45 Colt, in 1878 it was released in .44WCF (.44-40) as the "Frontier Six Shooter" to be a companion piece to the popular 1873 Winchester. In 1886, it was released in .38WCF (.38-40), also a companion for the Winchester. John Wayne "the Duke" carried a .38WCF 1st Generation in his early movies. In all, between 1873 and 1941, the Colt SAA was offered in over 30 different calibers!

TODAY'S AFFORDABLE COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING™ REVOLVERS

You may ask why I spent so much time on percussion revolvers. Well, the answer is simple. Replica percussion revolvers are your least expensive way to get into Cowboy Action Shooting™. Not only are they the cheapest, but actually the most correct choice for a pre-1875 Cowboy Action Shooting™ persona, and still equally appropriate for an Old West persona up to about the early 1880s, when the percussion revolvers were still common and just losing their predominant status.

One of the leading manufacturers of the replica percussion revolvers like the 1851 and 1860 Colts and 1858 Remington Army revolvers is Pietta in Italy. For those of you who think Pietta revolvers are still the poor quality, lower end, percussion replicas of 15 years ago, think again. In recent years Pietta has greatly improved their quality control and product, moving into the top of the pack of the Italian revolver manufacturers. I would compare them with Uberti any day.

EMF and Taylor's are the primary importers of the Pietta revolvers, though they can also be had from Dixie Gunworks and

Cabelas. They all retail them well under \$300. Considering they are not required to be purchased through an FFL, they are a doubly good buy! You can even generally find them used for only \$150 to \$175 each.

The samples of the three percussion revolvers used for this article are courtesy of General US Grant at EMF. EMF has been importing and selling Cowboy Action Shooting™ firearms as long as, or even longer than others in the market. All three had really nice polished blue finishes on the barrels, cylinders, and back straps. The frames, loading levers, and hammers of the 1851 and 1860 have really pretty color case hardening. The 1858's is blued. The trigger guards are polished brass like the originals. The 1851 and 1860 frames have the extended screws, notched recoil plates, and notched bottom of the grip strap to accept the optional shoulder stocks. The 1851's and 1860's have one piece walnut grips with an excellent fit. The 1858 has two piece walnut stocks due to the very strong one-piece frame. The EMF percussion replicas all have reproductions of the original military inspector's cartouches on the lower side of each side of the walnut grips. The Pietta replicas from the other importers do not have this nice touch.

The hammer and trigger pull were uniform from all three examples. Timing on all three seemed to be right on. There were no failures of the cylinders to lock up, even when resistance was applied grabbing the cylinder with the non-cocking hand. The cylinder pin wedges on the Colt clones were very tight. The trigger pull was clean and crisp on all three.

The 1858 and 1860 are pleasant to shoot using a 148 grain .454" diameter lead ball and 30 grains (volume) of FFFG blackpowder, Pyrodex, Triple 7, or Clear and Clean Shot. I personally use RWS percussion caps, 30 grain Pyrodex Pellets, and Ox-Bow "wonder wads" between pellet and ball when I shoot them in either a main or a Plainsman match.

Both the EMF 1858 and 1860's shot about an inch or two above point of aim at ten yards, using a traditional two-hand hold. This is very common with all of the percussion revolvers, including originals. I aimed at a Six-O-Clock position on the four-inch bulls-eye, and hit about one to two inches above in the black, depending on revolver and load used. At a match, I use a "low, dead center hold" and generally hit. Though the Pyrodex Pellets and wonder wads are handier for a match, all the percussions seemed to shoot best with FFFG Goex, and SPG or Buffalo Butter over the ball. I actually had one shoot 1" at the ten yard distance with this load. Those of you who enjoy the dark side of Cowboy Action Shooting™ will not be surprised by

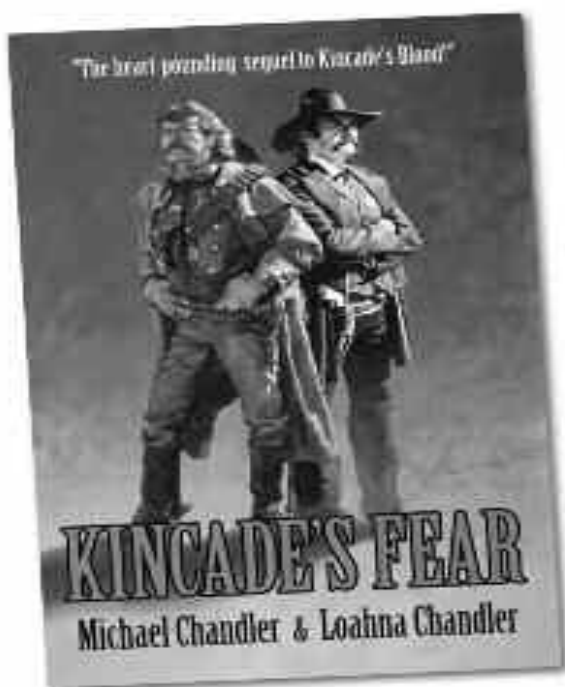

the blackpowder's accuracy.

All and all, I would say the quality of the Pietta percussion revolvers from EMF was excellent. The cartouche on the EMF percussion revolvers stocks is a nice touch, however, especially if you are a Civil War re-enactor or have built a persona for Cowboy Action Shooting™ of an ex-Civil War soldier, you can't go wrong with any of these Pietta replicas.

A nice feature of these blackpowder replicas, however, is the availability of later upgrading to a cartridge revolver with either a Kirst or R&D conversion cylinder. These convert these revolvers to shoot .45 Colt smokeless cowboy loads in the percussion guns. They run about \$200 each cylinder, and are available from Taylor's, Cimarron, EMF, and other suppliers. There are five or six shot (depending on model), SASS legal .45 Colt cylinders for both Uberti and Pietta 1858 and 1860 Army revolvers. To load the Colt clones, necessitates removing the barrel and cylinder. The five-shot Kirst or six-shot R&D .45 Colt cylinders for the 1858 Remingtons are much easier to use. Simply drop the loading lever, pull out the cylinder pin, and remove the cylinder. These handy, instant, do-it-yourself conversions are generally "drop in," and require no FFL for either the blackpowder pistol or the cylinder! You can get a pair of pistols for under \$500 and a pair of cylinders for \$400.

EMF Great Western II Revolver

If percussion is not your cup of tea, your next best bet is a Great Western cartridge revolver from EMF. General Grant at EMF actually foresaw the issues with Uberti, and their change of ownership, and cultivated a relationship with Pietta well in advance of the "Uberti crunch." He has managed to keep Cowboy Action Shooting™ firearms flowing into the hands of Cowboy Action Shooters without interruption. One of the best and most affordable is the EMF Californian Great Western II clone of the 1873 Colt SAA.

EMF's Californian Great Western II is a beautiful firearm. The sample I got was a .44-40 model, with a 4 3/4 inch barrel. The finely polished deep blue finish and bright color case hardening on the frame are on a par, or better than Uberti's. The fit and finish of the Californian Great Western II is awesome, and the action is slick and crisp. The hammer and trigger pull on it were uniform, with a trigger pull of about 2 1/2 pounds and virtually no creep. The one-piece walnut stock has a nice oil finish. It appeared to be American walnut, rather than the redder European variety. If it is European walnut, it is as close to American walnut as you can get.

General Grant at EMF has even introduced affordable starter packages with discounted "blem" firearms, including the Californian Great Western II revolvers. Before we go any farther, let me clarify what a "blem" really is. A Blem (short for blemished) is a firearm that is discounted because of one of the following: it may be an author sample (like the ones I use) that is returned after firing just enough rounds to evaluate. It may be a perfect, new firearm that has a damaged box. It may also be a firearm that has a minor scuff on the wood or a slight blemish on the metal finish. It could even be a firearm returned from a dealer after a cancelled order that has been handled some. I think you get the point. Even at slightly around \$500 at full retail (less if it is a blem), the Californian Great Western II is about the best cartridge revolver buy for Cowboy Action Shooting™.

USED RUGER VAQUEROS AND OTHER REVOLVERS

Let's not forget the used Cowboy Action Shooting™ revolver market. Used Ruger Vaqueros, EMF Hartfords, Dakotas, 1875 Remington Outlaws, and even Great Western II's can be found if you look around. As a rule of thumb, they will run 20% to 30% less than the same firearm new. Prices for these guns tend to be much too high on the online auction sights like Gun broker.Com and Guns America. They are way too proud of their stuff. The best place to find them is at a match where someone has a "For Sale" sign on their gun cart listing some firearms. Another good place is the Classifieds on SASS Wire or CAS City. With unemployment being what it is, and times being as hard as they are, lots of people are liquidating their "toys." While one hates to profit on someone else's misfortune, you are actually helping them out if they badly need the money.

CONCLUSION

I hope this series of articles on getting started in Cowboy Action Shooting™ on a shoestring has been helpful to those who want to join the sport, but don't feel they can afford it. Remember, family still comes first! If I hear of any pard out there leaving their young'uns and spouse to go hungry, or the mortgage unpaid, just to buy Cowboy Action Shooting™ firearms, I'll lead the posse and necktie party to string him up! Seriously, though, you can still get started for less than you think, if you shop carefully. I was once again surprised how affordable it is. With \$400-\$450 for a pair of percussion revolvers, a used double barreled shotgun for \$200, and an EMF 1892 for \$500, the total isn't bad. At \$1,200.00 (or maybe less if the percussion revolvers and 1892 are used) it is not as daunting a number as it could be. *J.*

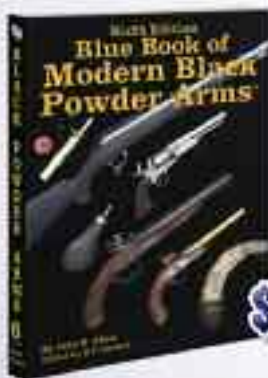

that's an excellent start! Fingerprint them while at it.

- Take away public ranges! Accomplish this by claiming safety hazards; i.e., bullets going overhead or hitting nearby children, and if that doesn't work, get a developer to build homes within hearing distance of the range, then file a public nuisance law suit—works every time.
- Accuse them of contaminating ranges with life threatening lead. Perhaps other hazardous substances can be included in the accusation. Request an environmental survey and soil assessment study of the range by your state or federal Environmental Protection Agency (EPA).
- If none of the above work, keep 'em in court fighting baseless lawsuits.
- Most importantly, keep our constituents in office. Vote for the incumbent—immobility and indecision are our strengths, and our current elected officials are masters of these qualities. Keeping our currently elected representatives in office is most important to our overall agenda. If these few strategies fail, let's rack our brains and think of something new. All in favor, follow Governor Terminator's lead. Thank you!"

End of fictitious Anti-gun meeting.

Start of Good Guy discussion. How

do we Shooters cope with these threats to our Second Amendment rights?

BE PROACTIVE

Develop plans for: safety, medical evacuation, and environmental compliance. How do you do this? Safety and medical evacuation plans are a given—we shooters are familiar with the necessary verbiage. The Environmental Plan, however, needs some discussion. Example: we shoot lightly loaded lead bullets that hit reactive steel plate targets and fall to the ground. Develop a plan to harvest the now "mushroomed" lead and sell it to bullet makers in your club or in your local area. Save the receipts to prove you have harvested and sold the lead. Designate a Plan Custodian. Keep files of harvested lead and sales receipts. Figure-out the average amount of lead expended for each shoot and match those figures with the amount harvested. A small discrepancy for lost lead is acceptable and certainly reveals the honesty in your reporting. A small amount of lead left in the ground should cause little or no concern since it amounts to natural background readings of the mineral and metal content of your local area. Be honest in your reporting, but most importantly, be proactive!

Go one step beyond compliance and invite your local/state Environmental Inspector to come visit your range and review your plan(s)—get

to the authorities before the opposition poisons their minds! A well-informed inspector can rebuff a potential complaint in the bud. "The best defense is a proactive offense!"

Lead is a valuable resource, so sell it. Don't keep trampling it into the ground; put it to recyclable use and get financial as well as environmental credit for it. Resale value of spent lead lying on the ground is about \$1/pound as this article is written. It's no problem at all to harvest 30 pounds in one bay after several shoots—believe me, I've done it. It may be a bit labor intensive, but worth the good feelings that follow: by accomplishing these deeds, you have recycled a scarce metal, helped someone make more lead bullets, and you have helped protect the environment.

Visual check: Go to any of your frequently used bays, set up your pistol targets where you normally set them up, then look down at the ground. I bet what you see are several "mushroomed" pieces of lead that fell to the ground during your last several shoots. As you look down, you can identify the calibers of the flatten-out lead: "that's a .45 LC, and that little guy is a .38. The teeny-weenie ones—oh well." Think to yourself: this is what an Environmental Inspector will see,

and more than likely take photographs of. The consequences of the photos are all too predictable—unless that is, you take proactive action and harvest it.

Rainfall will eventually cause metals left on the ground to leach into our water systems. Having a "harvest plan" in hand helps prove your range is aware of this fact and continuous harvesting will prevent this phenomenon (called leachate) from occurring. Once again, these factors should be proactively pointed out to environmental authorities under the heading of being "proactive."

Your Club more than likely has members who cast bullets for their own use, and therefore are on the lookout for recyclable lead. If so, have these members keep a record of what they harvest and combine those records with your club records so total amounts harvested can be revealed. Another approach is to pay "the kids" to do the work. Young Shooters who are learning about Cowboy Action Shooting™ from loved ones are a good source for the harvest labor. This gives the kids a chance to help the club, the environment, and the opportunity to earn some pocket money. Be very, very vigilant—Governor Terminator will be back! You're a Daisy if Ya do. 🐶

Since mostly what I do is travel, shoot, and film shooting, it only makes sense when I have a couple of days off, I ... go shooting. Specifically, with a tiny break between THE BEST DEFENSE and SHOOTING GALLERY schedules, I snuck in a two-day Cowboy Action Shooting™ class with Evil Roy and Wicked Felina.

I've known Evil and Wicked roughly forever ... they and granddaughter, Holy Terror, were instructors in the National Shooting Sports Foundation media education project, which I headed up, and you've seen them on numerous episodes of COWBOYS. In fact, next season Evil Roy will be a regular, handling our

instructional segment. But, as many times as I've worked with them, I'd never actually taken a class.

So why do I need a class in something I do every available weekend (and most of the week days)? Same reason you should consider a class. A good instructor—and Evil Roy is far more than a good instructor—can see small details about your shooting that can make a huge difference in your results. The problem is our shooting "style," for lack of a better word, is always evolving, and not always in a good way. As I've said repeatedly on my shows, shooting is a perishable skill, one that requires repeated practice. And, regardless of what the old saw says, only perfect practice makes perfect!

So how easy is it to pick up bad habits? Pretty much on par with picking up cat hair on a black sweater when you go visit the nice neighbor lady with 42 housecats and a broken vacuum cleaner! Back in the old days of IPSC, we used to say the sport was a way to learn how sloppy we could be and still hit the target ... judging by some of the Cowboy Action Shooting™ shooters I've seen—including myself on occasions—there's still a lot of that thinking around.

If you've been shooting for awhile, the function of an instructor is to "recalibrate" you to the straight and narrow. Here's an example ... one of the goals I wanted out of the

Evil Roy class was speeding up my draw. I can reliably deliver an aimed shot in less than two seconds, which is nowhere near as fast as when I shot practical pistol. And drawing the gun means more in Cowboy Action Shooting™ than in some of the other sports—in USPSA or IDPA, I would normally have just one draw for a stage that might take as many as 20 or more rounds (hence the emphasis on speedy reloading in those sports).

In a 10 stage practical pistol match, there'd be 10 draws or less if the gun was staged on a table. On a high round-count stage, a quarter or even a half second off on a draw isn't going to make that much difference. In a 10 stage Cowboy Action Shooting™ match with rank point scoring, there will likely be 20 draws, and shaving half-a-second off a draw yields a whopping 10 seconds off in that 10 stage match!

Evil Roy spent a disproportionate amount of time staring at my draw, then came up with not one, but two "a-ha!" moments. "You're gripping the gun like a 1911!" he said, which when translated into Normal English means I was establishing a dead-perfect grip on the gun before moving into the draw, a perfectly logical response if I were getting ready to shoot 20 rounds of IPSC Major .45 ACP loads from four different positions at small paper targets where a bad grip would have huge consequences in controlling the gun. Not so logical if I were shooting five shots of Cowboy Action Shooting™ .38s at large steel targets, where a less-than-perfect grip would have far fewer consequences. The second a-ha was for the amount of rearward pressure my weak hand was exerting on the revolver, the correct amount being "none."

There's the half-second ... all I need to do is repeat the draw four or five thousand times, and it's my half-second.

Ah, Little Grasshopper ... I know what you're thinking ... does it really make that much difference? At least twice a week on the Wire

there's a thread about "having fun" versus "being competitive." I never have much understood the controversy. I don't know about you, but I believe in *being better* ... not just in SASS but in all the important things I do in my life. I want next year's episodes of COWBOYS to be better than this year's episodes. I want my relationship to get better and better as each year passes. Heck, there's even improvement possible in my chili recipe, although it's darn near perfect.

The great thing about Cowboy Action Shooting™ is it is a tool to train us how to get better in many things. We learned in the Evil Roy class to move forward in quarter- or half-second intervals, to eliminate the unnecessary motions as we transition from gun to gun, to set small, achievable goals, and work relentlessly toward them. In short, while Gene Pearcey, Evil Roy, is providing the tips and techniques we think we need to succeed as a shooter, he's also giving us a way to *think*, a methodology that will lead us to change. That is maybe the most important part of the class, because unfortunately Evil Roy and Wicked Felina can't camp out in my living room to remind me of what I need to do on a daily basis. It's up to me.

I submit the same methodology will work for repairing your porch, starting a new business, building a relationship or anything else in your life where change seems impossible—small steps, achievable goals, elimination of time wasters, and commitment.

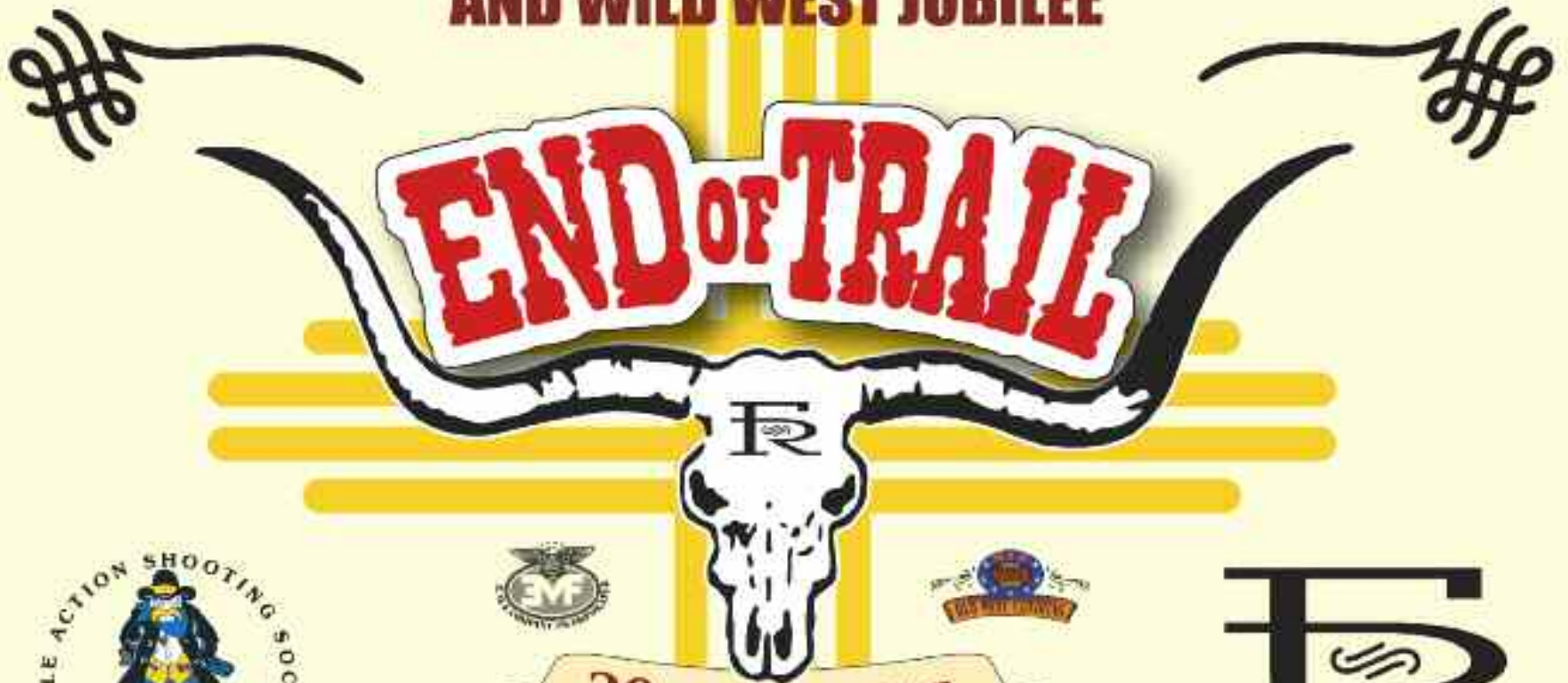

RELOADING, BLACKTHORNE BILLY-STYLE

Even though most of us Cowboys already do our own brass-stuffing, SASS continues adding new members, some of whom are new to the sport. I know in our Michigan club, "Hidden Valley" near Sturgis, we always have a few newcomers each match. Some have just gotten into Cowboy Action Shooting™, but don't realize the costs of expending a hundred or more rounds of ammo each match. Some are just beginning to think about reloading.

As today's inflation rate on factory ammo skyrockets, it becomes an economic necessity to reload at least pistol calibers, which are consumed in large quantities at each match. While shotgun shells have gone up in price, you can still find decent prices for under \$5 a box of 25.

Basic components to be replaced are: 1. Bullets, 2. Primers, and 3. Powder. All have gone up in price, but there are still economies to be gained by reloading. First, there are numerous commercial sources for cast Cowboy-style bullets at reasonable prices. Then, if you go in with a couple buddies on quantity purchases of primers or powder, there's only one so-called "Haz-Mat" charge of \$20 for many thousands of primers. The same goes for powder, which has to be shipped separately from primers. One source will absorb the HazMat with 16 pounds or more powder purchases.

Cast bullets, from commercial sources, have been very reasonable; however, they have gone up some in the last year. Hunters' Supply (<http://sureshotbullets.com/products.htm>) offers a very nice .44-40, 200 grain for \$144 per 1000, UPS shipping included. Mid-States Bullet (http://www.bulletsdirect.com/as2/Midstates_Cast_Bulletslist.asp) has a price of \$86 per 1000, shipping included. Sure-Shot (<http://sureshotbullets.com/products.htm>) has the same for \$90 a thousand, and if you request USPS priority mail, \$14

shipping. ("Snail-Mail" USPS will ship up to 62 pounds, which 2000 200-grain bullets will weigh, for about \$14 if it can fit into one of their boxes. It will!) These prices are subject to change by commodity market fluctuations. A few commercial casters only ship UPS, which can cost at least \$50 or more depending on distance from seller. Be sure to ask.

Casting your own bullets is a whole 'nuther story, and I'll try to cover some of my high points since I started melting lead in the mid-70's in my next article. I'll include some "Do's and Don'ts" I learned along the way, along with some new technology I discovered to eliminate barrel leading.

Primers, in quantity, can still be found for under \$20 a thousand, or two cents a shot from a couple mail-order houses. Increasing to 10,000 at a time can many times give you a little savings over that, even considering the Haz-Mat charge. Frankly, I think some bureaucrat invented the Haz-Mat charge to discourage citizens buying from mail order suppliers. There's never been an explosion of a shipment of primers or powder on a UPS truck that I can remember. Of course, certain Left-Wing anti-gunners hate the idea we can order our reloading supplies by Internet or phone. Watch for efforts to change that ...

Selection of powder will determine your cost per loaded cartridge. For many calibers, Alliant "Red Dot" works very well. Recent price of \$13.99/pound can yield almost 1200 loaded .44-40, 200 grain bullets at the 5.9 grains each suggested. Hodgdon "TiteGroup" at 5.6 grains costs \$13.99 a pound and yields 1250 loads. One of my favorites is IMR (Hodgdon) "Trail Boss." At about \$19.50 per pound (it comes in 9 ounce cans at \$10.99), it yields 1111 rounds for a cost of less than two cents apiece. I like Trail Boss for its doughnut shaped grains pretty much filling the larger cases like

.44's and .45's. No chance of double-charges with it. It also works well for .40 to .45 caliber rifle cases when you want a light, "plinking" load.

Starting from scratch, you have to buy empty brass, which is about \$28 per 100 for .44-40. Larger quantities bring the per-piece cost way down. This cost, however, is pretty much a one-time expense, as the cases can be reloaded several dozen times as long as you stick to low pressure Cowboy loads.

With a little shopping around, you can keep bullet cost down to under a dime each. A completed load would then come to \$0.13 each time you go BANG! This is compared with the cheapest factory ammo, something around \$14.49 (Hornady) for 20, or about \$0.72 a shot. Let's see, 72 cents ... 13 cents ... Hmmm. A hundred shots or more per match. Oh. Reloading IS good! Of course, there's some .44-40 ammo for around \$30 a box of 50 ... only \$0.60 per shot.

One very serious word of caution on reloading: .44-40, .44 Special, .44 Magnum, and .45 Long Colt all take Large Pistol Primers and are shot in the accompanying lever-action rifles, but never substitute Large Rifle Primers for Large Pistol Primers. There is a slight dimensional difference ... the rifle primer being a couple thousandths larger in diameter, and slightly higher, top-to-bottom. They are also made of a thicker metal by a couple thousandths. You can push a rifle primer into a large pistol case, but you run a very serious risk of squib shots due to the lesser kinetic energy of the revolver hammer fall. In some instances, the primer strike will only partially ignite the powder, and the bullet will exit the barrel, maybe even with enough speed to hit the plate. Sometimes, however, and this is the dangerous part, the bullet will be pushed into the barrel and will stop. Firing the next shot would very likely blow the gun up, and cause serious injury or perhaps death to the shooter as well as the RO.

Everyone has had a squib or misfiring shot sometime along the way. Recognize a different kind of "bang" that sounds like a cap pistol, and no recoil. If you experience one of these

squib loads, immediately ground the gun, while keeping the muzzle pointed down-range in case of a "Hang-Fire." At our Sturgis, Michigan club, The Hidden Valley, we have instituted a new rule of one squib, okay to continue after clearing; second squib, match DQ for safety reasons alone. We don't want anyone hurt from defective loads.

If you run out of Pistol Primers, whatever the caliber, stop loading. Don't make the mistake of substituting Rifle primers, even though you make them fit the primer pocket. That advice comes from personal experience, I'm embarrassed to say. Mea Culpa. (From some loading done four or five years ago.) Haven't repeated the error in my old age.

The Outlaws Are Comin' ...

If you are a regular SASS Wire reader, or have been a shooter at any of the Southeastern matches in the last few years, you've probably read snippets, or heard mention of some Cowboy Action Shooters who are gaining notoriety due to the way they shoot. This interest and excitement is about the Outlaw cegory. It continues to be amazing to watch the progress of Outlaw shooting as it advances west across the country and becomes more and more popular. A bit of background and an explanation of exactly what Outlaw shooting is might be beneficial to shooters interested in learning more.

Tennessee Tombstone, SASS #34723, joined SASS toward the end of 2000, and started shooting with the Smoky Mountain Shootist Society, as well as with a club that would become the Ocoee Rangers. Early on it became pretty obvious to Tombstone he was not going to be a top contender anytime soon,

and his complete lack of competitive spirit was a further hindrance. So, focusing on the fun aspect of the sport, he decided to shoot like his heroes did in the movies: From the hip.

Tombstone ran into another cowboy, Lane, SASS #27698, who had the same attitude and thoughts, so they started shooting together at most of the local matches. Loose Cinch, SASS #37255, who shoots in Cleveland, TN, was also playing around with hip-shooting. For the next few years each of them registered as whatever category fit their particular style of shooting (such as Duelist or Gunfighter) but still shot the match from the hip. In 2005, they settled on the name, "Outlaw," to describe their style of shooting. They did not care how a cowboy shot—Traditional, Duelist, or Gunfighter—as long as he held the pistols and shotgun below chest level and did not aim. They still allowed the rifle to be aimed

and shot from the shoulder—if the shooter wanted to.

Cinch, Lane, and Tombstone pestered, badgered, and recruited as many fellow cowboys as they could to join in their fun. Badlands Beck, SASS #27209, Rawhide Rex, SASS #29168, and Curly Bill Kelly, SASS #28451, began to shoot Outlaw at all the matches they attended. Soon Outlaw Cactus Red, SASS #47281, joined them and later Ranger Z, SASS #25940, started as well. The Outlaw Posse was growing!

There are now many Outlaw Ambassadors around the country: Larry Earp, SASS #60034, Whiskey Creek Johnson, SASS #67187, Just Little Joe, SASS #63583, Hico Kid, SASS #35226, and more recently T-Bone Dooley, SASS #36388. Larry Earp from Florida has gotten quite a few clubs down there to recognize Outlaw. Whiskey Creek Johnson, from the Highland Regulators in Kentucky, has been a major force in pushing Outlaw everywhere he

shoots, along with Just Little Joe, from the same club. Hico Kid is one of the best Outlaw shooters around and always has a good showing wherever he shoots.

The Smoky Mountain Shoot-Out, with its trademark mascot, the Smoky Mountain Outlaw, began offering Outlaw as an awarded category in 2007 and had a special Outlaw side match that let shooters try their hand at hip-shooting. That same year, the Kentucky State Shoot became the first SASS sanctioned match to recognize Outlaw as an awarded category. The Alabama State Shoot and the Tennessee State Shoot are also now recognizing Outlaw as an awarded category, and the North Carolina State shoot will recognize the category in 2010 with at least five registered shooters. And, rumor has it Mule Camp 2010 is planning on recognizing Outlaw as an awarded category as well.

In 2008, Loose Cinch and Tennessee Tombstone attended Comin'at'Cha, the Southwest Regional. They both registered as Gunfighter but still shot from the hip, as Outlaw was not an offered category (and it should be noted at this time Outlaw is not a SASS recognized category). After watching Cinch and Tombstone shoot, T-Bone Dooley tried Outlaw shooting and had so much fun he registered for it at both the 2009 US Open and 2009 Comin'at'Cha where it was an awarded category at both events for the first time.

Okay, history lesson is now over; let's get to the main issues. With the astoundingly rapid gain in popularity of this category, everyone who shoots Outlaw needs to be on the same page in regard to the rules. What's that you say? "We're Outlaws! We don't need no stinkin' rules!" Well, relax; there are only five or six of them, and they are pretty darn simple.

First and foremost, **safety and all SASS rules apply.** Second,

revolvers must be shot one handed—you've never seen one of your heroes in the movies hold and cock a gun with two hands—so its Duelist, Double duelist, or Gunfighter style only. Much like the Gunfighter category, Outlaw shooting is NOT for the novice shooter; **proficiency in gun handling is a must** before trying this category! Third, **you must hold the revolvers and shotgun below chest level with elbows bent, without aiming or sighting down the barrel.** Fourth, **the rifle may be aimed and shot from the shoulder if the shooter prefers.** Fifth, any SASS approved caliber is allowed. (The Outlaws started to disallow .32s but realized no *respectable* Outlaw would use something that small—unless it was a pocket pistol!). That's about it for the rules of the Outlaw category, except to HAVE FUN. Once you try it, it's hard to shoot (and miss!) any other way!

As a postscript: There has been much interest in the Outlaw category lately, but we have gotten some negative publicity from a rumor and misconception that there is an "initiation" to Outlaw shooting, involving your hat being shot up. Contrary to what some may say, this is a complete fallacy. While some folks are shooting other's hats and saying it has to do with the Outlaws, and some even want their hat shot as some sort of "badge of honor," Outlaws do not shoot hats as a part of this category, and we welcome anyone who wants to try the Outlaw category without sacrificing their hat. If, for some strange reason, you want your hat shot, please ask one of your friends to shoot it after a match or at some other time.

So my hat is off to El Camino, a True SASS Cowboy I just happened to have the pleasure of meeting at the Alabama State Shoot.

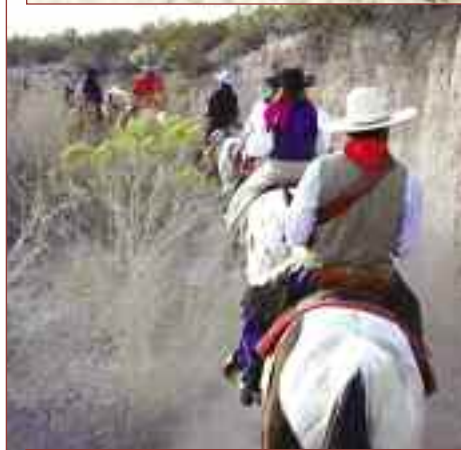

the territory, politics had changed ever since the Civil War. White people were flooding into the territory, taking over politics, the land, the mining rights, the cattle industry, and commerce. Hispanics were being squeezed into the smaller towns and off the land.

The Hispanic deputy was young Elfego Baca, born in 1865 in Socorro, New Mexico, but raised in Kansas and unable to speak Spanish. He arrived in the little town of Frisco, New Mexico, by buckboard. Few believed such a young man could be a deputy sheriff, but Baca took his job seriously. Upon hearing of a disturbance caused by a drunken cowboy, Charlie McCarty, Baca marched across town and arrested him. When a justice of the peace refused

to hear the case, Baca prepared to hold the prisoner overnight, intending to take him to the county seat at Socorro. The cowboy's foreman, Young Perham, arrived and demanded he be released. Unafraid, Baca said he'd count to three and when he did so, commenced firing, wounding one cowboy and killing Perham's horse, which fell on him, injuring him so badly he later died.

The next morning, November 30, 1884, some citizens persuaded Baca to give up his prisoner to the justice of the peace, who fined the cowboy five dollars and released him. Outside after the hearing, Baca faced 80 angry cowboys led by Tom Slaughter, ranch owner. The word had spread among the local ranches that there was a Hispanic uprising, with shooting, and the cowboys took the threat seriously. As Baca faced the hostile crowd, someone fired a gun, and Baca ran down an alley and into a *jacal* (pronounced *hack all*) occupied by the Geronimo Armijo family. A *jacal* was a flimsy house made by driving cedar posts in a large ring, covering it with mud plaster and roofing it either with thatching or with poles and dirt. Luckily, the interior of the house was sunk eighteen inches below ground level.

After rushing in, Baca pushed a woman and two kids out. The woman, Mrs. Armijo, allegedly padlocked the door from the outside

before she ran away. As rancher Jim Herne rushed up and tried to kick the door in, Baca shot him twice, killing him. After that, the cowboys began to fire volleys into the *jacal*. Baca's occasional, but very accurate fire held the cowboys off. Before long, the walls were filled with holes. At dusk, the roof caved in on one side, and Baca was buried, only managing to free himself two hours later. At midnight either a stick of dynamite or a wad of kerosene-soaked rags destroyed half of the now very rickety building, but Baca managed to survive in a corner. At dawn, he cooked breakfast of black coffee and fresh tortillas. Several hours later, another deputy sheriff arrived on the scene and convinced everyone to lay down their arms. The *jacal* was shot to hell, but on December 2, 1884, Baca emerged through a shattered window. He was conveyed to Socorro and charged with murder, but was later acquitted.

The legends claim 4,000 bullets were fired into the *jacal*, but the truth is probably closer to half of that. The door allegedly had 367 holes in it, and a broom handle was hit 8 times, but the young deputy suffered not a scratch. Elfego Baca became a legend in New Mexico after that. He became county clerk, sheriff, mayor, district attorney, a wily and very successful lawyer, and he even ran for governor of New Mexico. He died in 1945 in Albuquerque. *A.*

LITTLE KNOWN FAMOUS PEOPLE WAY OUT WEST -

ROWDY JOE LOWE was born in Illinois in 1845. Rowdy Joe and his wife, Rowdy Kate, left Illinois after the War Between The States and opened a Rowdy Saloon and Rowdy Brothel in a Rowdy section of Wichita, Kansas. When a rival saloon owner named "Red" Beard burst into Joe's joint with guns blazing and shot one of Lowe's soiled doves, Rowdy Joe shot him dead on the spot. Soon, Joe's saloon became so rowdy, he and Kate had to abandon Wichita and move to Texas where they operated a crooked gambling hall and were suspected of participating in several stagecoach holdups. In 1899 they showed up in Colorado, bought a ranch outside Denver, and professed to renounce their rowdy ways. Joe met his match when he was shot and killed by a man called Kimmel at the Walrus Saloon in Denver. When the sheriff turned him over, Joe had five bullet holes in him. Ironically, he was unarmed.

A Review Of BLACKMAG POWDER

I really like shooting blackpowder, the smoke is wonderful and the variety of guns you can use is awesome. The one thing I really, really don't like is the clean-up, which is why I shoot blackpowder substitutes. Pinnacle by Goex seemed the best to me, but then Hodgdon bought Goex, and Pinnacle is no longer in production. I have resurveyed the list of substitutes, and also considered new possibilities. One substitute I had never tried was BlackMag. Too pricey I thought, but now with Pinnacle gone, and not being very satisfied with the other options, I decided to give it a serious look.

This powder seems to have been around for some 10 to 12 years, and has had some slight variations in its name. Early on it was BlackMag 2 and BlackMag 3 to differentiate the granulation size. Then it went to BlackMag 3 with one granulation. Now it is called BlackMag XP because of the latest refinements, and it has a universal granulation.

Craig Sanborn, the President of BlackMag Industries and producer of the new XP series powder, invested in the company previously known as MagKor, restructured the organization, and brought all the manufacturing into a new facility located in Colebrook NH. In a nutshell he stated, "BlackMag is an ascorbic acid based powder, but much more highly refined than the other ascorbic acid based substitutes. Due to this refinement,

BlackMag is a very uniform granulated powder and has a controlled burn rate. The pressure curve for BlackMag has a lower peak pressure, but the burn time is longer, compared to the other substitutes. Even though the peak pressure is lower, the longer burn time results in a more energetic powder that delivers higher velocities. Due to the lower peak pressure, the felt recoil is reduced. The residue from BlackMag is very light and can be cleaned up with a single patch. BlackMag is nearly twice as potent as blackpowder, with loading guidance of 50% to 60% of the equivalent blackpowder load by volume."

The reviews of this powder were reasonably positive to very positive. Randy Wakeman (www.chuckhawks.com/black_mag3.htm) really liked BlackMag over any of the other substitutes (even 777). The lower peak pressure characteristics of BlackMag were documented by Rick Kindig of Black Powder Journal (Vol. 1, No. 4, 2006) where he compared blackpowder, BlackMag, and Pyrodex. He stated, "BlackMag produced a lower and longer curve, which means it produces a lower peak pressure, but extends the pressure over a longer period of time." He also noted a perceptible reduction in recoil.

The energy characteristics of BlackMag are discussed in an article at gunnersden.com (www.gunnersden.com/blackpowder/index.htm.blackpowder-substitutes.html), which cited test data for Pyrodex, 777, and BlackMag. BlackMag was 10% to

15% hotter than 777 and 20% hotter than Pyrodex P. Hodgdon's 777 is hotter than blackpowder, and their web site states that loads by volume must be lowered by 15% to duplicate a blackpowder load velocity (www.hodgdon.com/loading.html). Sam Fadala of Guns Magazine (July 2002) tested 777 against blackpowder, which verified Hodgdon's information. Since I found no head to head test data for BlackMag vs blackpowder, there is no quantitative data comparing the two, but the above data do qualitatively show that BlackMag is definitely hotter than blackpowder.

I also reviewed the forums, and I even posted questions about usage of BlackMag on one of them. Several people had used the powder, and virtually none of them panned it. These individuals used BlackMag years ago, and complained they could not find it anymore. Even the older powder (prior to BlackMag Industries' improvements) was well liked.

The strongest voiced comments on the forums came from the individuals who had never used

BlackMag. Some were against ascorbic acid based powders in general, others did not believe that the powder could shoot clean, and the high price was definitely mentioned. The high price is noteworthy because this is why I had not yet tried the powder.

I really liked what I heard about this powder. The owner of the company made some very strong claims, and virtually none who had used the powder criticized it. In addition, literature information and comparative test data were positive. Given these findings, I decided to try BlackMag.

The powder I received was consistently granulated with no fines and no dusting. Since there is virtually no load data available for cartridges, I used my Pinnacle data and equated it to the equivalent volume load of blackpowder. I then applied BlackMag Industries' statement that their powder should be loaded at 50% to 60% of a blackpowder load by volume. This powder metered well, and I loaded three groups of test car-

tridges, one group at the calculated load, one group 20% above the calculated load, and the last group 20% below. (I used grits to fill the void space above the powder.) My calculations for a powder load were quite good, and I quickly found the equivalent load. Since I do not have a chronograph, I was comparing the loads by "feel." Certainly not a quantitative test, but one that was adequate for my needs.

I used a pair of 1858 Remingtons (Pietta) with R&D conversion cylinders for .45 Colt cartridges to test this powder. Excess powder residue significantly thwarts the unloading and reloading of these conversion cylinders. I had only been able to consistently shoot smokeless powder in these cylinders because I had to swab/scrub the cylinders between reloads if I used substitutes. There was very little residue from BlackMag, and it did not stick or cling to the cylinder. I ran a box of bullets through each pistol, and the last reload was as smooth as the first. When I cleaned up the pistols I found the residue could be wiped off with a dry patch. However, I am a stickler for a clean bore and cylinders so I used a damp patch for cleaning. The first patch through the bore was the only swabbing needed. I cleaned all six chambers in the cylinder with the same patch since the residue was so light. A final patch with Ballistol removed any residual moisture.

The other gun I shot was my 1873 Winchester rifle, which is .45 caliber, and any blowback from the chamber will accumulate as residue on the riser block. I ran two boxes of ammunition through the rifle with no problem. When I pulled the riser block there was very little residue, and it wiped off with a dry patch. The bore was clean with one damp patch, followed by a Ballistol swab. Clean-up was faster and easier than any substitutes I had used, and also notably faster and easier than smokeless powder.

I also tested the powder without filler in the cartridge case to see if the controlled burn rate of this powder maintained a low peak pressure, or if it was on a par with smokeless powder. Using the same load, I found the felt recoil was

noticeably stronger, and the blowback (indicated by blackening of the cartridges) was significantly greater, just like smokeless powder. While this powder does seem to have a controlled burn rate (it did not flash), I will use filler in the cartridges to obtain better overall performance.

The range testing showed this is an excellent powder, but the complaint about cost still remained. BlackMag comes in 10-ounce containers at a list price of \$30 per container, which equates to \$48 per pound. Yes, a significant price compared to approximately \$25 per pound for substitutes. Some may argue substitutes can be had for a lower price and the real black for much less. That may be true, but the substitutes I would consider shooting are in the \$25 price range. The question is, "Does BlackMag provide a significant enough benefit to offset its increased cost?" Since BlackMag is hotter than the other substitutes, it takes less powder per shot. Even with this offset, I calculated that BlackMag costs about \$1 per box more to shoot than the other substitutes. The total additional cost in a given year will depend on how much an individual shoots, and the value of a more convenient powder will have to be assessed by each individual. For me, BlackMag is significantly more convenient than the other substitutes and definitely worth the increased cost. I like my hobbies to be as hassle free as possible, and I am willing to pay a reasonable price to keep them enjoyable. We have to wrestle enough with other things in life, and I believe our hobbies should not be in that category.

I do not, however, totally disregard cost. I still have a supply of other substitutes, and I will shoot these in my cap and ball pistols and shotgun. When those supplies are exhausted, I will again evaluate the cost of BlackMag. I suspect the cost will come down as the powder becomes more widely used, or if it is purchased in quantity. If a price of \$20 per 10 oz container (\$32 per pound) is realized, the cost differential with other black-powder substitutes would be negligible. This is a really, really nice powder and well worth a try.

SASS New York State Championship

Following side matches this year, the CKR opted for something a little different for their Friday evening festivities. Foregoing an expensive formal banquet off site, they instead had a light, casual, and CHEAP "Blazing Saddles Feed" at the range. The simple meal, provided by the Greenfield Lions Club, consisted of chicken and biscuits with gravy and baked beans and was attended by nearly 100 hungry cowpokes. After dinner, Trail Boss, Smokehouse Dan, SASS #12524, made some general announcements and presented ribbons to the male and female winners in each of the day's numerous side events. The gang dispersed shortly thereafter—some choosing to attend a Territorial Governor's meeting in the clubhouse, others heading back to their campers or motel rooms to relax, clean guns, or go through their Shooters Handbook in preparation for the "main event."

Saturday was the first day of the real competition and, as usual, consisted of six stages with a mid-day lunch (and shopping!) break. It was another spectacular day for shooting—cool, crisp, and sunny. The day began at 8:30 AM with opening ceremonies and a brief safety meeting under the big tent. Two new SASS Regulators from the area, Geriatric Kid, SASS #28872, and Rattlesnake, SASS #20387, were congratulated, and the 16 current SASS State and Regional champions in attendance were recognized. Then it was time for the excited cowpokes to head out to their stages and start seriously throwin' lead. The stages at the Rukus seem to always stand out from those at other shoots, and this year was certainly no exception. There were 10 separate berms, allowing for plenty of both lateral and down-range movement on every stage. Range Master, Rowdy Bill, SASS #9628, once again provided well thought-out scenarios that managed to be challenging without becoming procedural traps. They frequently provided an opportunity for shooters to make choices as to how to address the stage, giving participants a chance to really think through a stage instead of being told exactly what to do. The stages were imaginative, creative, safe, and fair for all—there was no favoring of right-handers over left-handers, pumps over side-by-sides, or gunfighters over regular style shooters. The scenarios included targets of various shapes, sizes, heights, and distances, with interesting and varied target acquisitions. There were also knockdown

pistol targets, a moving target (activated by a lever), a rifle knockdown plate rack, and a kickdown door to add to the variety. All four Cowboy Action Shooting™ firearms were required on every stage, and if you were looking for a “stand-and-deliver” or “spray-and-pray” stage, you were in the wrong place. Although there was no specific “theme” for the shoot, Annabelle Bransford, SASS #11916, made sure to provide a story line to help set the stage for each scenario. Shooters got to play good guys—quelling Indian uprisings, guarding prisoners, and ridding the territory of outlaws and thieves—and bad guys—oftentimes fighting their way out of situations they never should’ve gotten into in the first place.

By late Saturday afternoon, the posses had completed their stages for the day and firearms had been safely stowed away. Then it was time to once-again gather under the big tent—this time for a fabulous cowboy BBQ catered by the Everglades Restaurant. With a buffet consisting of mouth-watering BBQ ribs and chicken, several side salads, corn-

bread and dessert, there was no excuse for anyone to leave hungry! Once the 200 or so bellies were full, the rest of the evening’s festivities got underway. Pairings for the Top Gun Team Shoot-off were announced, “Cowboy Up” awards were presented to the CKR members responsible for renovation of “the town,” costume contest winners were announced, and the anxiously awaited free raffle drawings were held for a number of valuable prizes ranging from a Jimmy Spurs’ full race action job to a Ken Schmidt framed Western print to a Recollections banquet dress. Eventually things started to wind down, and before long the time had come for the shooters to head home to rest up for Day Two of the championship event.

No one could help but wonder what the chances were of Sunday’s weather equaling the previous two days of perfection. Well, the odds might’ve been against it, but the fact was, it was another spectacular fall day. Boy, did the CKR make a good decision when moving their shoot from June to September a few years’ back! By the time lunchtime rolled around, the last four fun-filled stages of the

match had been completed and the data entry folks were feverishly tallying the final scores. As this process continued, the majority of the shooters gathered to watch and/or participate in the Top Gun Team Shoot-off. The excitement was palpable as the top 16 cowboys, paired with the top 16 cowgirls, shot as teams until only one team remained. The enthralled spectators noisily rooted their chosen teams to victory with much cheering and clapping, until, in the end, Blackhands, SASS #70512, and Mustang Megs, SASS #60070, emerged victorious. And, alas, with that, the shooting portion of Heluva Rukus ‘09 drew to a close, and it was time to move on to the final awards ceremony.

Once again the shooters amassed under the tent—this time intent on learning the outcome of their lead slingin’ endeavors over the weekend. But first, sponsors and ROs were thanked, and a few special presentations were made. A \$1350 check was given to the local volunteer fire department as a “thank you” for providing emergency medical staff and equipment on site throughout the weekend, and another matching

check was designated as a contribution to the SASS Scholarship Fund. Charity raffle winners were announced with the seven lucky winners walking away with a custom knife, a long-gun case, and various firearms donated by EMF, Remington, Smith & Wesson, Cowboy Gunworks, and Turnbull Restoration valued at anywhere from \$200 to a whopping \$2400! Finally, costume contest winners were presented with their awards, followed by stage winners, clean shooters (29!!!), and category winners. The ceremony culminated in the announcement of the overall Top Gun, James Samuel Pike, SASS #53331, along with the ‘09 New York State Ladies Champion, Southpaw Slingin’ Sally, SASS #39737, and New York State Men’s Champion, Cartwheel, SASS #57342, both repeating their last year’s wins. And thus ended Heluva Rukus 2009, a heluva shoot which richly deserved its recent designation as 2009 SASS Shoot of the Year!

morning before lunch then two more after lunch on the first day. The stages were easy to follow and had a nice flow to them. Almost everyone in Sweden and Norway speaks English, and a vast majority of shooters from Finland, Denmark, and the other countries represented also spoke English enough to make a shooter from the USA feel right at home. Stages were explained in both Swedish and English. All SASS rules applied so there were no surprises during the whole match. Because of the location change, most of the competitors were camping on the range, as the new location was not near any cities. I suspect that with a little more time, hotel and B&B accommodations could have been found. We stayed in a nice camp trailer furnished by none other than Samuel B Carpenter, the Bandit, and enjoyed every minute of the camping experience with cowpokes from around the world. The cowboy spirit is alive and


well in Sweden!

The schedule on the second day was a repeat of the first. We found the weather to be very similar to what we enjoy in the Pacific Northwest, so a little rain did not dampen a thing. Mainly overcast sky and just a bit of the wet stuff. The stages were varied, with some being fast stand and deliver stages, and some with movement. Target size and distance seemed to please all shooters. It was a good match—safe and fun.

We chose to use borrowed guns on this trip. Because the shoot in Sweden was half way through our European vacation, we knew we would cross the borders of Norway, Germany, the Czech Republic, and Sweden. Each country has their own laws and policies regarding firearms, and this would be our first experience with border guards. As it turns out, we would have had no problems, as there really are no check points at the countries we visited. If you decide to make a trip to Europe to shoot, con-


tact the Match Director where you want to attend, and they will help with the local restrictions and regulations. Next year's European Championship shoot will be held in Sweden. The date for the match has yet to be set. It appears to be easier to fly into Oslo and then drive into Sweden, rather than fly into Stockholm. There is currently a fee of around \$50 (US) to bring your guns into Sweden. Norway and Sweden have quite a large population of hunters and shooters, so your firearms won't get anyone upset if you use common sense. Again, check with the match director for guidance.

Everywhere we went, we were

made to feel a part of the group, and we laughed whenever a group of Cowboy pards were gathered. From the look of things, we could have been in Texas, Seattle, or Maine—same guns, same outfits, and same personalities. Then someone would start talking, and I realized how far from home we really were. History

The story is as old as the legendary West itself.

A man rides over the horizon with his sweetheart by his side. They are moving west, looking for a little spread of their own in God's country, where they can make life safe for civilization, freedom, and the spirit of the game.

His name is Northern Crow, known as Crow to friends and usually greeted by loud cawing sounds. Sometimes he carries a hunter's crow call to reply. He is SASS #39113. Her name is Lady Smith, SASS #41871.

They found their spread, and chose their brand—the Bar-E Ranch. It's tucked cozily into the warm embrace of the Barrie Gun Club, founded in 1946, just after WWII, but at the time we're talking about, still a stranger to Cowboy Action Shooting™. It's an hour and a half's drive north of Toronto, where southern Ontario's summer recreation and lakeside lands begin.

This is their story.

"I guess my younger brother started it," says Crow. "I lent him a gun and after about six months he comes back jabbering on about something called

Cowboy Action Shooting™."

Younger brother had a powerful infection, which elder brother caught.

"I bought a rifle," Crow says with a sad chuckle, a .45 Colt Winchester '94 Trapper. "I spent hours trimming my brass so I could get 10 rounds into the magazine."

He bought Lady Smith a .45 Trapper, too. Why make a mistake just once? We're shooting repeaters aren't we?

"And I got her a nice little lady's 20 gauge, too," he laughs out loud at that one. The recoil would have blown Mongo from Blazing Saddles 20 feet clear of that fire he buried his head and shoulders in lighting his cigar.

But quit wasn't a word in their vocabulary, and they were learning.

"I sold two hunting rifles to get a pair of Ruger Vaqueros," he recalls and their dedication only grew as they wandered southern Ontario finding Cowboy Action Shooting™ matches and a wonderful welcome everywhere. They often drove two death-defying hours through genuine Canadian winter blizzards to get to matches.

"It was the people as much as the shooting that made you want to go back," he agrees, but something was wrong. "We only shot when we went to matches. We did respectably, but it was frustrating, especially if the targets weren't big and close," and the matches didn't always stick strictly to SASS guidelines.

Call the SASS Shooters Handbook mere "guidelines" and Crow goes up like Old Faithful, the geyser in Yosemite National Park. For him that little booklet and the other SASS "testament," The Match Director's Guide, should be followed as completely and as faithfully as Holy Writ.

Their home club, The Barrie Gun Club, didn't know what Cowboy Action Shooting™ was, and with more shooting closer to home being needed, it was high time for some serious missionary work.

What helped smooth the way was Lady Smith's position as secretary to the Board of Directors, but the pair took no chances on making an impressive impression.

"I took it upon myself to build a stage," he recalls. Being a welder and in the metal fabricating busi-



ness and someone who has developed a real passion for designing and making targets, he put together four rifle targets and four revolver targets and held a Cowboy Action Shooting™ demo for the Board. And, of course, he read to them from the book(s).

He explained the Spirit of the Game, went through all the safety factors, and made everyone aware of SASS's insistence on safety.

"And, I made it clear shooting the stage was not optional. I explained to them it was like a safety drill or fire drill at work, everyone had to experience it."

Well, you know what happened. In no time the board became a hootin', hollerin' genuine posse all having the time of their lives!

The motion to adopt Cowboy Action Shooting™ as a discipline totally under SASS guidelines and getting SASS club affiliation was unanimously passed at the next month's board meeting!

"That put me where I wanted to be ... in a position that if it's not SASS, I'm outta here," states Crow.

Unfortunately, this coup coincided with the onset of winter when even the toughest Canadian cowboys go indoors after hunting season.

Barrie has a wonderfully lit indoor range, but it was only sanctioned for centre fire pistol, rim fire rifle, and no shotgun whatsoever. Not wanting momentum to fizzle out,



they went ahead as best they could.

Crow built the targets, Lady Smith wrote the stages, and she is in complete accord with her husband.

"Keep it simple," is her credo.

"That first winter we started with our SASS pistols, .22 lever guns, and then began the Nights of the Hosers," Crow laughs. They loaded their shotguns with 12 gauge primers, no powder, and bits of rubber hose in the wad in lieu of shot. He still has some of these vintage cartridges in his collection.

"We shot these basically at pie plates," he recalls shaking his head at the memory.



al match that September.

"The match was a huge success and everyone had a lot of fun," our hero recalls.

What Crow doesn't get into is the sensation the match caused amongst Southern Ontario's growing number of cowhands. How did a brand new Cowboy Action Shooting™ club come up with such a great match?

"Sure we put in a lot of hard work, and yes, there was a lot of dedication and everyone put in a lot of hours," Crow explains, but then waving his two SASS books in the air he adds. "But, no one could say they didn't know what to do."

"If you follow SASS rules and guidelines on target size and distance and especially on costumes, then your match will work. The rules attract the kind of people you want. Just follow them—it's all there. If you scrimp, even just a little bit, you won't attract the people you want to the game, and you'll get the kind of people you don't want in the game. Somehow they've seen what went wrong in other disciplines and magically avoided the pitfalls.

"Where else could I send you off into another country and guarantee you'll meet 200 people you'll love? Only in SASS!

"Take target size. SASS states a minimum. Use it. It's a minimum because there isn't a target big enough to never miss. I made a cowboy 32" by 48", and he has been missed many times at 10 yards. If you go the other way with tiny, faraway targets, you only penalize the novice. And, everything is easy to understand in the Match Directors Guide. The shooters who want to go really fast will create all the chaos for themselves you could possibly want, however simple you keep it. If you complicate things, the novices are left scratching their heads in confusion and get discouraged."

What's happening now?

Because the bi-monthly matches coincide with the club level safety course, the prospective new members for the Barrie Gun Club observe Cowboy Action Shooting™ right off the bat. And, they get what is now famous as "The Crow Guarantee."

"I take them through our stage, and I tell them if they put the front sight on the target and squeeze the trigger they'll hit every time. They shoot clean, and they come back. I love working with new people. That is our claim to fame at the Bar-E."

It is. Along with Crow's targets which now grace the stages of almost all the big matches around Southern Ontario, the Bar-E hands are known as carriers of the cowboy way. A Buckaroo from the Bar-E came second in the Michigan State Championships and then first in the Pennsylvania State Championships, and everyone remarked on his ability and safety habits. He started shooting with his father at age 10 in those first Bar-E matches, and just two years later he was on the podium.

So what does the future hold for the Bar-E Ranch?

"In my own mind, big plans are small plans. Regular shoots bringing in new people and an annual match with everyone going home wishing they weren't going home just yet," is the simple answer.

They will continue their practice of always having food at every match ... a sit down social time to share together. And, they will keep using lines to set the buzzer off. It helps the atmosphere Crow believes. But, the most famous time with lines was when a stage recre-



ated the silent era of films. Saying one word to the RO to set the buzzer off, or uttering even the faintest "dang" when the steel didn't go "clang" during the stage, earned you a 10 second procedural. No one could keep their mouths shut! Almost everyone got a procedural and a case of hysterics that lasted for at least three stages!

So how did the Bar-E Ranch get its name? Being at the Barrie Gun Club, it would seem like the logical thing—but no.

One of their lady shooters, Mo M Down, SASS #39093, said one night she dreamt she was shooting in one of the bi-monthly matches and someone in the dream told her she was shooting on the Bar-E Ranch.

Needless to say, the vote to adopt the name was unanimous, so Lady Smith got out her sketch pad and designed the logo. Metal worker Crow is going to cast it into a real steel brand as soon as Lady Smith stops tweaking her design. It has to be cast in stone first, Crow insists. 🐾

Ten very devoted cowboys showed up twice a month all winter long having more laughs than they could stand with the somewhat uncertain pressures of their shot loads. They might go "phutt" or shoot a yard of flame and when someone snuck in some blackpowder, well, they could have sold tickets to the public!

Then came spring and the fun began outdoors twice a month with "real guns." By the second winter, the indoor range was approved for pistol calibre rifles and shotguns, and the numbers rose to between 15 and 20 regulars.

Because of these bi-monthly matches, confidence grew. They were hitting and didn't have to get out the hourglass to time each other. So in only their second summer, they applied to put on an annu-


