




CHORRO VALLEY SHOOTOUT 2022 ★ SASS WESTERN REGIONAL

TThere's gold in them thar hills! The California gold rush began in January 1848 after James Marshall found gold on Johann Sutter's property near Coloma, California while managing construction of a sawmill. About 300,000 prospectors – later to be known as “forty-niners” – descended on California in search of “the color.”

They came from both sea and land and the trip for many was treacherous. And there was no law regarding property rights and protecting claims. As farms, grazing lands, and cattle herds grew so did the hordes of California cowboys who brought with them more lawlessness. It was a time of excitement, fear, and the sound of gunfire.

Years later California became the home of the Chorro Valley Regulators where several hundred cowpokes converge each August for a spectacular five days on California's Central coast to participate in the annual SASS Western Regional/Chorro Valley ShootOut. As one new shooter told us last year, “This match is golden.”

Chorro's range is located just eight miles from the Pacific Ocean as the crow flies, making the weather at the range as good as it gets, with cool mornings and moderate afternoons. And when the sun sets just right, our backdrop does look like golden hills.

“We had a great match last year, and we were excited to see so many shooters getting back into our sport after a brief hiatus from matches,” said Sinful (SASS #73672), the Western Regional's Match Co-Director. “We had 245 shooters, including about 25 new-to-the-Regional shooters, and attendance was better than our previous Regional.” We had 18 vendors who featured leather, clothing, special crafts, gunsmithing, and food. This year's new CVR Chuck Wagon food vendor provided breakfasts on Thursday through Sunday, lunches on Wednesday through Saturday, and a light dinner on Wednesday through Friday (Saturday night is our gala five-Star CVR dinner).

“When you put on an event of this magnitude,” chimed in El Lazo (SASS #13116), the other Co-Director, “it is really rewarding when you hear comments on how much folks really enjoyed themselves, how much they liked the scenarios, how much they enjoyed our attention to detail, and things like that.”

Sinful said he kept thinking about a comment from Camp Hag (SASS #84031) on our promotional video this year. She said, “This is one of the best matches you can come to; great stages, amazing weather, fantastic people...”

“Kind of sums it all up for me,” Sinful concluded.

Going against the old expression, “If it ain’t broke don’t mess with it,” the match directors did several things in 2022 to enrich the experience for attendees. The most obvious one was spreading the match over three days with shooters completing four stages a day. “We were sad to hear a few folks couldn’t make it because they couldn’t get the extra time off,” said Sinful. “We never want to do

something that would prevent folks from coming. But we recognize that we have more folks in the Elder Statesman, Cattle Baron, and Grand Patron categories, and we wanted to be sure everyone was comfortable and could shoot competitively. In the end, we received a lot of compliments on how much easier it was to shoot 12 stages over three days rather than two.”

“Our poker tournament is always a hit,” said El Lazo who runs the event. “To expand our activities, we added Bingo that was run by John Ringo (SASS #57159) and Calamity Annie (SASS #98556), which was also a hit. We added a music jam led by Roger Rapid where folks brought out their guitars, banjos, and voices, and gathered around our fire pit singing, eating s’mores, and just having a darn good time. Each of these evening events attracted about 40-50 attendees, and we’re definitely going to do them again,” said El Lazo.

With a focus of keeping the posses to a comfortable and efficient size,

El Lazo organized 24 posses that averaged 12 to 14 shooters each. It was just the right number of shooters to keep folks moving while not over-taxing any of the posse members who were spotting, picking shells, or working the loading and unloading tables. The scenarios were written by Sinful, and he always creates a perfect blend of challenges that are just right for everyone, with targets set at comfortable distances for each scenario.

Side matches included speed pistol, speed rifle, and speed shotgun. There was also cowboy trap and a long-range event with targets at 100, 125, and 400 yards.

A highlight early in the match was our traditional three-stage black powder night shoot where the coastal evening haze makes the gun smoke just hang there creating those moments where visibility is just a notch better than invisible. This is also the place where a few under-breath curse words are often heard both before and after the bang.

Another shooter favorite is Saturday’s top-notch dinner and dance, with music

provided by the heralded Monte Mills and his Lucky Horseshoe Band. "I'm glad we got a bigger tent this year," said Jacq Neat (SASS #93557), CVR's Banquet Manager. "Not only did we anticipate a bigger crowd, but we were also focused on social distancing and making our attendees comfortable." She added, "I worked closely with our caterers to ensure nothing would be missed from CVR's much heralded Five-Star Saturday night banquet – including real plates and silverware. Our caterers served shrimp scampi, freshly sliced top block beef, au gratin potatoes, salad, string beans, fresh rolls, and, of course, dessert. From what I heard from a bunch of folks, they all agreed it was a spectacular meal."

Sunday morning topped off the weekend with an early Cowboy Church service led by CVR's Bushy Blonco (SASS #104521). That was followed by a team shoot at 8:00 a.m. and then the Men's and Ladies' Top-16 shoot-off followed that brought out the best to shoot for the gold. By noon we were all back in the big tent for the Awards Ceremony.

"We have a fantastic team," Sinful said, "that is behind putting on our match. Hosting a match like this is no small task and takes a lot of dedicated folks who can attack a job and

get it done right the first time. We had façades to paint, new signs to make, a field to be plowed for easier access for trailers, campsite to be striped, fences to be installed, tents to put up, and much more. Somehow, it all came together... as it always does," he said. "I'm so proud of the CVR folks who really work hard to put on this great match."

"I think it is important to always evaluate what we do and what we provide our shooters, and how we provide it," said El Lazo. "Sinful and I continuously question whether we're on the right track and if we are delivering the kind of Cowboy Action Shooting™ event our attendees want to attend," he said. "It's a hard thing to measure, and we try to look at all the details. We rely on the comments and compliments we get during the match. But what really drives it home for me are the emails and calls we get after the match thanking us and our team for putting on an excellent match. When folks go that extra distance, we know it means something to them and we're doing the right thing."

The SASS Western Regional is a not-to-miss event that caters to top guns and first-time match shooters with equal care and attention. The 2023 match will be our 28th Annual and we're doing everything we can to provide an incredible

cowboy shooting experience.

The 2023 Annual Chorro Valley ShootOut will be held August 9-13, 2023. Registration and camping reservations can be processed on-line at www.chorrovalleyregulators.com using CVR's custom registration system. Our on-line camping reservation system lets you see which sites are taken and who is at that site so you can camp near your buddy.

For those who are not camping or tenting on-site, the CVR range is 15 minutes from the university town of San Luis Obispo to the south and about the same distance from the coastal village of Morro Bay to the north; both of these towns are loaded with motels. And, if you are okay with being 25 minutes away from the match, the motels in Atascadero (just over the hill from our range) are a bit less expensive.

As we do every year, our promotional video for the 2023 Regional will be posted to the SASSwire – watch for it!

SKINNY'S SOAPBOX

REMINISCING

As I write this, I'm just settling down after my return from END of TRAIL 2023. The World Championships of Cowboy Action and Wild Bunch shooting are now held at Ben Avery Range in Phoenix Arizona, which long-time SASS members will remember used to be the home to Winter Range (at the time, the National Championships). I've been in the game for about 30 years now so, as you might expect, I always run into old friends and fellow shooters at events such as this, and this one was no exception. This time around, I spent some time exchanging pleasantries and reminiscing with Cicatriz (SASS #11313) and Bronc (SASS #1885 — gulp! — much lower than mine).

Naturally, our conversations worked their way around to “the old days” and “how things used to be.” Bronc and I can both remember when there were three shooting categories... Modern (sixguns with adjustable sights), Traditional (fixed sights), and Ladies. And of course, all three of us worked our way around to where discussions of this sort always go... how much smaller and farther away targets used to be. It's true, I can remember one club at which you usually had to engage a rifle target shaped like a small skinny coyote that was placed on top of a hill about 70 yards away. The same club featured shotgun knockdowns in the shape of very skinny saguaros (they had a thing for skinny, maybe that's why I liked them) placed across an arroyo at around 15 yards. If you had four knockdowns, you could count on using up at least six shells. Needless to say, if you could shoot stages consistently in the 30s you had a good chance of winning.

Another subject was the “extracurricular” activity required on most stages,

in addition to shooting. Not only did you have a starting line (often said on the clock after the timer buzzed), you often had to do something else... throw a tomahawk, carry a saddle, stir a pot of beans, etc. I recall one stage at which you had to set a bear trap! A real one!

So why have things changed? Those extra activities were kind of fun, after all. Mostly because the sport has (thankfully) grown so much. The first big annual match I attended (Biscuit Flats in Mesa, Arizona in 1993) had an unheard of number of contestants (40 or so as I recall). So many that the posses ran late and had to shoot their last stages in the dark. As the number of shooters attending matches grew, something had to be done to streamline the process and move them through stages, otherwise an event like EOT with 600-plus participants would be impossible. Naturally, things like setting bear traps got eliminated first. Then alterations were made to facilitate shooting stages quickly. Targets were made bigger and moved closer, not only to enable more hits and more clean matches (a good reason in itself), but primarily to reduce the average time spent per stage.

And you see the results today, with SASS membership numbering in the tens of thousands, monthly and annual matches held nationwide and worldwide, and participation often reaching into the hundreds. Cowboy Action Shooting™ has evolved and changed, and I believe the changes were for the better.

THESE BOOTS ARE MADE FOR WALKIN'

The following story is true, the names have been changed to protect the innocent... Well, not really, but it is an incredible adventure about a pair of boots and their travels. The story begins on a cold, rainy day in November 2021, at the swap meet on the first day of North Carolina State Championship match. At the time, I was a new shooter, attending my first state-level match, and unsure of how things operated. I arrived at the swap meet later in the day and there were only a few items set out on the tables. I immediately spotted what looked to be a new pair of stove-pipe boots with red leather diamonds inset near the top. Sadly, there was no one around, and it being stormy, I abandoned the idea of trying to find their owner. After leaving the range for the day, I immediately regretted not pursuing the owner and subsequently, but to no avail, spent the remainder of the match trying to locate the Cowboy who was selling them. Over the course of the next few months, I continued my quest, posting messages on the SASS Wire and SASS Facebook pages, without any luck. As a new shooter, I spent the majority of 2021 and 2022 visiting clubs in my area, trying to decide which one I wanted to join. By the time Landrun 2022 came around, I had concretely decided on joining the Gunpowder Creek Regulators in Mine Branch (Lenoir), North Carolina. On the long drive to Oklahoma, my feet swelled up a little, which made for an interesting first few days at Landrun. On Wednesday morning, I was hobbling around the pavilion, browsing the items at the swap meet, and immediately spotted a pair of what looked to be new stove-pipe boots with red diamonds inset near the top, size 10½ EEE. As I was standing there counting my money on my fingers and toes, realizing I was \$15 short of the

asking price, a young Cowboy ventured by. Spotting the boots, he immediately tried them on, handed them to his dad, and they headed off towards the cashier. The feeling of disappointment came over me quickly, as I hobbled out of the pavilion to go sulk for a while. About an hour later, I ventured back through the pavilion to check on items I had for sale and again spotted a pair of stove-pipe boots with red diamonds inset near the top. Grabbing them up, I looked at the tag and the Cowboy selling them had the foresight to write down his phone number, which I promptly called and made an offer. He was gracious enough to not only accept, but immediately came by the pavilion to complete the transaction. While talking, he mentioned he was from North Carolina and was selling the boots for the widow of the Cowboy who had them custom made but never had the opportunity to wear them. Not only were the extra wide boots perfect for my swollen feet, but we quickly realized these were the same pair of boots I'd passed over at North Carolina State, eleven months prior. We got a kick out of how the boots had traveled to Oklahoma only to return to North Carolina. As I was walking out of the pavilion, the young Cowboy's dad, who had appeared to purchase the boots earlier that morning, was walking down the road. He rushed up and explained how happy he was that I ended up with them, as his son changed his mind because they were too wide for him. The Cowboy said he had looked all over to tell me that they were still available, but was unable to locate me. I was on Cloud Nine, ecstatic about the boots (my feet were very appreciative also). I went on to enjoy an incredible Landrun 2022 in comfort. I just could not get over how the boots came into my possession. It was like they had a mind of their own, and had "picked their owner," so to speak. Incredibly, the story didn't end in Oklahoma, as their journey continued to find their way home.

In November 2022, while preparing for the first stage of the main match at the North Carolina State Championship, an older Cowboy came up to me with a suspicious look on his face that could have been interpreted a couple different ways and asked, "where



did you get those boots?" I eagerly told him the story and could see his eyes visibly relax. He said, "well let me tell you about those boots," and I knew I was about to hear an incredible story. He said that years before he and his business partner formed a club and needed a "theme," so they took their initials which were M and W, placing one on top of the other, forming three diamonds. He then asked the size of the boots, as all the original members had ordered a pair from the custom boot maker, and knew exactly whom they had belonged to. As he reminisced, I was asking all kinds of questions as I was completely flabbergasted by the story I'd just heard. He further explained that the club was in Mine Branch, hence "Three Diamond Mine," home of the Gunpowder Creek Regulators. I had tingles up my spine as I explained to him that not only was that my favorite local club, but a few months prior I had made the decision to join as I had wanted it to be my home club, not only because it was an awesome Cowboy town with permanent stages, but the Cowboys and Cowgirls that belonged to it were the most welcoming, gracious, and helpful people I'd met. He went away all choked up with the realization that not only had the boots found a Cowboy who cherished them, but they found their way home after all this time.

EVIL ROY SET TO RETIRE

Gene Pearcey (Evil Roy, SASS #2883) has announced his retirement from Cowboy Action Shooting™ competition. Although he came to the sport later than many competitors, age and experience did not deter him. Vigilantly practicing every day, sometimes shooting more than 300 rounds a day, Roy not only made a name for himself in the sport of Cowboy Action Shooting™ as a multiple World and National champion, but became an elite member of the SASS Hall of Fame. Taking his moniker "Evil Roy" from the 1970s comic TV movie *Evil Roy Slade*, starring John Astin as the "meanest villain the West has known," he went on to compete and take home multiple awards.



He continues to express his love of the sport and share his knowledge and skills through training aspiring Cowboy Action Shooters™ across the country.

Cimarron Firearms' Evil Roy Model P single action revolver will ride off into the sunset along with its namesake. It will be officially retired after the last shipment hits retailers. Evil Roy often stated he put at least 100,000 rounds through his Evil Roy revolvers with no issues.

"Fans of the popular Evil Roy competition Model P, need not worry," Bryce Wayt, Vice President of Operations & Media for Cimarron Firearms, said. "We are in the process of updating this pistol and introducing it back into the lineup under the Cimarron Firearms name."

WILD BILL HICKOK DAVIS TUTT DUEL SIDE MATCH

After eight years of successful Eastern Canadian Regional matches hosted by the great folks at the Bar E

Ranch in Barrie, Ontario, the reins were handed over to the Prairie Dog Rebels in London, Ontario.


Then Covid arrived. Enough said. Finally the match got off the ground and was a huge success through five days in July — two days of Wild Bunch Action Shooting, one full day of side-matches and two days of Cowboy Action Shooting™ — and perfect weather for the WHOLE thing. It was worth the wait. The Currahee Kid (SASS #92341) and his small-but-indefatigable crew did a sensational job and Wild Bunch Match Director was Legendary Lawman (SASS #73160).

This is the story of an unusual side-match. I could see this being adopted by other clubs.

Five hard-cases stood staring downrange at the target array they were about to engage. "I don't know about this," one of them muttered. And I assure you — none of these characters scare easily. What he was referring to were four targets 50 yards away in seriously diminishing sizes. (Look downrange in the gap between shooters in the accompanying photo. The big red rectangle far left was for a different event -Long Range 1911.)

None of the shooters had any prior

knowledge of what they would face at this side match. They were all going in cold, so it was even for everybody. The first and largest target was a sort of emaciated cowboy figure that was all arms, legs, and hat, with lots of open spaces to put a round through. The hat was a reasonable size but was risky. It was way too easy to send your ONE round over the top. I should perhaps explain the rules of engagement now. This was a re-enactment of the legendary Wild Bill Hickok — Davis Tutt shootout, where in Tutt was killed from a distance. Each competitor was allowed ONE round in their single action revolver and was to engage the target duelist-style, unsupported. If you hit target #1, you stay in the game. If you miss, you are done. Thems that hit the first one move on to the next, smaller target. A unique and welcomed aspect of this side-match was that it had a start line... “I’ll have my watch back now Dave.” If there was ever a CAS shooter that embraces start lines, it is Cayuse King (SASS #100679). With his usual Sam Elliot delivery, he firmly announced it was time to get the ball rolling and that he would go first. He calmly loaded his one .45 Colt cartridge and raised the sight to align with the firstst target. Bang... ding! He was on, to the great relief of everybody. Now at least they knew it could be done. One after another, they all lugged their one cartridge to the firing line and took their shot. Most hit the firstst target. The Milton Kid (SASS #85788) wondered aloud about getting

Wild Bill Hickok Davis Tutt Duel *Background*

William Butler Hickok and Davis Tutt were gamblers in Springfield, Missouri. In the Lyon House Hotel, Tutt saw Hickok had won about \$200. In an argument over an alleged debt owed by Hickok, Tutt grabbed Hickok's Waltham Repeater gold pocket watch from the table and kept it as collateral. Negotiations between the two about the amount of the debt and return of the watch failed. At about 6:00 p.m. on Friday, July 21, 1865, Tutt stepped out from the courthouse onto the west side of the town square, carrying the watch. Hickok came up from the south side of the square, about 75 yards away, and asked Tutt to give up the watch. Tutt drew and raised his gun. Hickok saw this and drew, aimed and fired his Colt Navy Revolver. Some say he rested it on his arm to steady his aim, but this is unlikely since everything happened so fast. Bystanders thought there was only one shot, when in fact both men fired. Tutt missed. Hickok didn't.

This was the start of the legend of Wild Bill Hickok.

Wild Bill Hickok Davis Tutt *Side Match Rules*

- 50 yards, revolver, shot duelist (one hand) only.
- Any approved main match revolver may be used.
- Lead bullets only.
- Revolver will be loaded and checked at the firing position and cleared at the firing position.
- Shooter will come to the line with gun unloaded and holstered. One round will be loaded, the gun will be checked.
- Starting position is gun in hand.
- Shooter's line, "I'll have my watch back now Dave."

At the beep, the shooter will fire one shot duelist style at the large Cowboy target. The shooter will stand and the revolver will be cleared at the firing position, and the gun is holstered.

All those shooters who score a hit are eligible for a shoot off. The shooting procedure above will be repeated except that the target will be one size smaller. The process will be repeated until only one shooter among the eligible shooters scores a hit and this shooter will be the winner.

If all eligible shooters miss the target in a given round, the process will be repeated starting at the target just missed by all shooters. If the target missed is the smallest target, all subsequent rounds will be on the smallest target. However, the RO may decide to move back to the next larger target in order to expedite the match if it is deemed necessary.

a hit on the target using a .38 Special. Everyone else brought a .45 Colt. Ding! To the Kid's great surprise, he was in the game. The next target was a half-version of the first, as if that poor skinny cow-puncher had been cut in half under a train. And his hat had shrunk! There was no good aiming point on it. Only two guys got onto this target, one of them barely (these two are often found together at the long range events at big matches). By now the 80-degree air was getting thick with tension. Canadian Hondo (SASS #94235) had been eliminated but stayed and made sure all the safety etiquette and rules were adhered to. Plus, he wanted to see how this all turned out. In fact, all the shooters who had been eliminated stayed to see how this would end. The Milton Kid was loving all the quiet excitement, as he is a notorious gambler.

The next target was maybe eight inches tall and similar to the others. There were lots of places under the arms and between the legs to miss it. But the two remaining shooters both got hits on it. HOLY COW! Dogger (SASS #102912) came out from behind the spotting scope and just looked around at everybody, speechless. This was getting really hairy now. They were down to the last target. Who would triumph? Someone had the bright idea to add to the tension for this final target — a five-inch tall SASS Marshal figure — by wagering some cash on the next two shots, just for fun. A pile of Canadian two-dollar coins suddenly appeared. I should mention that each of the two remaining shooters was happy for the other's success so far. They were both grinning from ear to ear, drinking in all the drama. Highwall Drifter slipped a .45 into the cylinder and slowly rotated it five clicks. He raised the gun, cocked the hammer and immediately started struggling with a hold on the distant blur. He was just about to come down, rest and start over but everything felt right for a split second so he broke the shot. Bang... ding!

Unbelievable. Every person there was surprised, including the trigger-man. But there was no grandstanding. There was still another shooter in the game. Dead silence again as Canadian Major (SASS #38916) loaded his

single round and rolled the cylinder around to where it needed to be. Did I mention it was quiet? I have never heard quiet like that. My ears were buzzing. The birds and insects had gone quiet. The Major knew exactly what he had to do and just got down to business. It's really just another day at the office. Finally the moon and stars aligned and he gently squeezed the trigger with the light touch of the eye surgeon that he is't. The gun went bang but was met with silence. There was no ding.

It was over. What a relief. The two men shook hands and Highwall said it could have gone either way. One is a retired commercial pilot and the other spent his whole life working in live sports for television. They both laugh in the face of stress and challenges. Then there was much hooting and hollering by the gang, as the pressure had been released and all were jumping up and down about what a great event this turned out to be... the inaugural Hickok-Tutt side-match (conceived, designed, and built by Doc Lonesome, SASS #104799) at the inaugural 2022 SASS Canadian Eastern Regional at The Crumlin Sportsmen Association Ranges, hosted by The Prairie Dog Rebels at London, Ontario.

Since they are all refined gentlemen and good sports, they gave the winner a special one-handed "you're number one" salute, without using their index fingers. How clever! It was touching to see and Highwall had a bit of Cowboy sweat leak out the corner of one eye from all the camaraderie.

A memorable afternoon was had by all, during a memorable week. I've always felt that's what we are doing out there at SASS matches — making memories.

MY FIRST COWBOY ACTION SHOOTING EXPERIENCE**



THE SMITH AND WESSON NO. 3 RUSSIAN

I picked up a copy of the January 2022 issue of *The Cowboy Chronicle* at the Texas State Rifle Association Annual Meeting. In the S&W Model No. 3 article on page 36 it states "... Russia did reverse engineer the No. 3 Russians, producing unlicensed copies at their own arsenals. This caused S&W some fiscal hardship."

I think I read this about the Russians reverse engineering the S&W No. 3 around 12 years ago. Today Wikipedia calls this the "counterfeit game." This is what my notes have from the book, *S&W Sixguns of The Old West* by David R. Chicone: "Around 1878 Ludwig Lowe in Berlin, Germany also produced S&W No. 3 revolvers under a licensing agreement with S&W. The Russians bought machinery to make them from Ludwig Lowe which was delivered to the Tula Arsenal, which began producing them in 1886."

I managed to contact Roy Jinks the S&W historian — also about 12 years ago — about this. I believe he said the Russians produced S&W No. 3 revolv-

ers under license. The Russians used the S&W No. 3 in the Russo-Turkish War of 1877-78, the Russo-Japanese War, and WWI. One account I read had a few used in WWII. One of the members of the Cheka (Soviet Secret Police) execution Squad that killed ex-Tsar Nicholas II and family may have used a S&W No 3. I hope this is of some use.

They did produce them, that is a fact, and that translated into lost sales for Smith and Wesson."

DISPATCHES FROM CAMP BAYLOR, JANUARY 2023 MATCH GRADE SHOTSHELLS

You might be saying, “I don’t need to read this. I use factory ammunition.”

But wait! Don’t leave. You can use this too. Really. Read on.

A good shotgun round needs all the components installed correctly, a good crimp on top, and to fit in the tightest chamber for the gauge. Simple, right? I first heard that some shotshells had problems that caused them to stick in CAS shotguns when Evil Roy switched from a ’97 to a SxS. Some factory ammunition wasn’t within specs. Roy discovered his ribbed ammunition stuck instead of falling out. So he tried various smooth rounds, settling on Remington STS. He discovered some were oversized. Word got out. Reloaders had been checking their rounds by taking the barrel off and dropping shells in and then seeing if they fell out. There were always some that didn’t. Then users of factory ammunition started checking.

About then shell checkers started being popular. The first one I saw was by Cowboys and Indian Store. T. L. made them, I believe. Then the late Wild Bodie Tom made some. Unique Tek was selling some. We were finding out factory ammunition was sometimes out of spec.

Now several companies sell shell checkers. SliXsprings now has a checker/sizer combination, replacing separate tools (available from Bullets by Scarlett, Unique Tek, and Badman Bullets). The checker portion conforms to minimum SAAMI specs for a 12 gauge shotgun chamber. Not all shell checkers do. Some are basically tubes. If a round will fall out of this, it will probably fall out of your shotgun. But wait! There’s more!

MAKING YOUR OWN

If you’re making your own ammunition, what do you need to do?

Start with perfect hulls. For SxS that generally means Winchester AAs or Remington STS. I used to dump them from their bags into the case feeder. I missed too many marginal or bad hulls. So, I start with clean, round hulls with petals out straight. They are inspected one by one before I put them in the case feeder. As I inspect them, I wipe them with a shop towel with a little Windex on it to get crud off. If the shell has been stepped on, I don’t try to reshape it anymore. The ghost of that crease tends to come back on the completed round in storage and the round won’t go in or come out, or both. You have wasted a precious primer, powder, wad, and \$5 worth of shot (exaggeration, at least for now... \$0.17 is about right for 2/23).

The mouth must be round. If it’s been folded over or wadded up, I don’t use it. It won’t crimp properly. I have a big box of rounds for recycling. Some were out of shape and not repairable. Some were underweight. Some that didn’t crimp properly. Some mangled crimp rounds fall out of the shell checker, but I’ve found that such rounds tend to stick.

WEIGH EVERYTHING

Making sure all the components are there, I can check rounds for powder without taking the powder out, for example. If I think a round at stage three on my twenty-year-old Dillon SL900 (before I add the wad and shot) might not have a full charge of powder in it, I just pull and weigh the round, hull, primer, and powder. If it’s far off the target weight, I fix it then. I check frequently because there is no low powder sensor in the SL900 and Murphy still rules.

I’ve weighed all the components and came up with the numbers in this article. Don’t use them. Weigh your components for the recipe you use and make a chart of weights for each component.

WEIGHTS

Twelve gauge Remington STS Hull with primer—122 to 126 grains (Winchester AA hulls vary from 127 to 130 grains). If you know this, you can get

the approximate weight of a powder charge by weighing the hull after it has been charged. If the powder charge is 32 grains and the combination weighs 157-plus or minus, you don't have to weigh the powder separately. This is more difficult with smokeless loads because of the lighter charges. You might need to weigh the charge separately,

Powder—pick the weight from your recipe. Use only recipes printed in factory loading books and websites for smokeless manufacturers (or shooting-oriented Facebook pages full of sarcastic comments from people you've never heard of... just kidding... trust loading data from known sources *only* and follow all aspects of the recipe). I'm making BP with 40 grains BP or 32 grains American Pioneer Powder 3F (same volume).

WAA12 wad—36 grains. Shot.—1-1/8 oz is 492 grains. A 1-1/8 oz bushing might not make 492-grain loads with your specific shot. With the Dillon, I adjust the shot measure to drop 492 grains average with the shot used. If you have bushings, you must use what it drops. Also, weight will vary from the shot dispenser from one charge to the

next. Not to worry. One weighing 484 might be followed by one of 500. Both will fit.

WEIGH EVERY COMPLETED ROUND

Using these numbers, you can weigh a round at any time and know if it's in spec. If, for example, the target weight for a completed round is 685 grains (total of the above numbers using APP 3F, you can expect to see 670 to 700, usually from variations in shot weight. If it's high, and you're using black powder or sub, it's still acceptable. There is no "too much powder" with black powder, but if it weighs 655 grains it could have no powder, or a light charge of shot. You must assume the worst, that it has no powder (438 grains of shot is still an ounce). I pull rounds periodically at stage three after powder has been added and weigh them—165 with BP and 157 with APP are target weights. Close is acceptable.

My solution is to put rounds close to 670 grains into "practice" boxes. Lower than that I usually recycle. It has almost always been a shortage of powder.

Before weighing, stand the rounds on their bases on a smooth, flat surface. If the primer is inserted all the way in, the round will stand flat. If it rocks back and forth, the primer is too high. You

have two choices. Very carefully seat the primer using great force gently, or if you think it's dangerous to seat a primer on a loaded round, recycle it. I seat the primer, but don't use me as an example. I have no fear. I married a Redhead.


Then put the round into a shell checker. Use a SliXshot sizer to correct rounds that are correctible. If they aren't, you can put them in the "practice" box or recycle. See Final Sizing/Tapering for a possible cure.

If you haven't read it, read "Shot Shell Basics" by my old friend and mentor Larsen E. Pettifogger in the April 2023 edition of *The Cowboy Chronicle*. He mentions on smokeless loads, "Primers and other components are not freely interchangeable. So, is there a saving grace for CAS loaders? Fortunately, many are loading at the very bottom or in many cases below the minimum charges listed in the loading manuals and on the powder manufacturers websites. This has saved them from possible harm that might result from higher loading levels."

Black powder loads are more forgiving because BP and the subs have substantially lower pressure than smokeless. If you want to stuff 75 grains of Swiss 3F and 1-1/4 oz shot and it fits, have at it. Just don't tell anyone I told you to do it.

HELLO, PRIMERS!

Some primer/hull combinations are more likely to have high primers. Having said that, I use Cheddite 209 primers in everything. I can't remember seeing Remington 209 primers recently. Winchester 209 primers are available and work very well in Winchester hulls. However, the Remington hulls are tighter, and seating the Cheddite or Winchester requires extra force, or they won't sit flat. I don't use Winchester primers on Winchester hulls (or Remington on Remington hulls) in black powder loads because the Cheddite are visually different at a glance. I don't want to fire a smokeless load in competition by mistake. (If you use Winchesters on Winchesters, etc., get a wide Sharpie and paint all the bases with a wide line that tells you it's black.) When I load Remington hulls, I must work to make sure all the rounds have fully seated primers. As Larsen mentioned,



they're the best hull. I use them for major matches. Winchesters, which are easier to find, are more likely to stick, but if I do everything right, it's rare. Practice and local matches are all Winchester as long as Remingtons are hard to replace.

FINAL SIZING/TAPERING

At Land Run 2022 the Bullets by Scarlett tent had a bit of a crowd grabber. On Scarlett Darlin's Rugged Gear gun cart a strange contraption was mounted. Scarlett was running Winchester reloads through a SliX shotshell checker/sizer combo. When one didn't go through, she would put the round in the gizmo like loading a rifle with the bolt open. Then she closed the bolt, pushing the round into the receiver. She opened the bolt. Now the round went in the sizer and fell out when it was inverted. If you looked closely, you could see the round was tapered about .003. Tapered shotshells are "in." But more than just the latest SASS fad, they make the shells easier to insert and more likely to pop out. Are they legal? Heck no, I'm telling you how to cheat using illegal ammunition in the official SASS magazine. Just kidding again. OF COURSE THEY'RE LEGAL! Read the SASS SHOOTERS HANDBOOK. Do I have to tell you everything?

I posted an 18-second video of it on Facebook, and it got over 4,000 views on my page, and more on hers, resulting in a slew of orders. It's a Ryder Shotgun Sizer.

mounted on wooden gun carts. It is not cheap at \$364, but when I last checked, there was still a significant waiting list. No, I didn't get one for the article. The Redhead bought it for me for Christmas. Buy yours from Scarlett.

Not tested here, Unique-Tek sells a sizing die for MEC reloaders that tapers rounds. Good idea. If you use one you will want to check with a SliX Sizer at the range. Many reloads will, in time, try to "go back to their previous state" and open at the crimp, or bulge some, making them useless in a side-by-side shotgun. Scarlett was using Winchesters. She caught and fixed a few. It takes 3-1/2

minutes to size a box at your cart. Then you know they're ready. Sizing them just before putting them in your shotgun belt is fine. So is pre-sizing a box before stage one.

“WHAT DO YOU USE TO COAT YOUR SHOTSHELLS?”

For some time, contestants have been wiping their shells with some magic elixir before putting them in their belt. I have, before finding all these neat tools, tried wiping the rounds in a shop towel with Ballistol, Break Free, Armor All, silicon spray, KY Jelly, and “I Can't Believe it's Not Mucous.” Various shooters have suggested or swore by each of these items, well, all but the last two. But the rounds weren't sticking because they weren't slippery enough. They were too big, or the petals opened funny because they weren't made properly. Now I use... nothing. The rounds are clean and crud free. It seems to work. I haven't had any slip out of my hand, either.

“THAT'S A LOT OF WORK. I JUST SHOOT FOR FUN.”

Me, too, but when I lost a clean match on stage 10 because of a stuck hull it wasn't fun. Anyway, having ammunition you can count on is fun. Your mileage may vary.

HISTORY

THE LAST DANCE OF THE PLAINS INDIANS

During a solar eclipse on New Year's Day, 1889, a Paiute shaman named Wovoka fell into a trance. When he came out of it, he revealed he had met Jesus Christ, who had told him of his sorrow for the suffering of the Native Americans. In order to restore the world to its original state before the coming of the Europeans, God's Indian children were to perform a circular dance under explicit instructions. If everything went according to plan, white expansion would be halted and reversed and the Indians would be reunited with their ancestors. Ultimately, the world would be restored to its original state before the advent of the intruders.

Wovoka, whose day job was that of a ranch hand near Yerington, Nevada, was also known as Jack Wilson by the local whites. He had adopted the surname of his employer David Wilson. Obviously, Wovoka's vision contained elements of both Native American and Christian religions. Although it was apocalyptic in nature, Wovoka's movement was intended to be nonviolent. Everything depended on the performance of what came to be known as the Ghost Dance.

Word of Wovoka's vision spread far and wide among the Native American tribes. Eventually it reached the Sioux at Pine Ridge Reservation in South Dakota. A council was summoned that was attended by some prominent Sioux leaders. Red Cloud, Young Man Afraid of His Horses, and Little Wound were present. Eventually they decided a delegation would be sent to Nevada where they would meet with Wovoka to learn more about his message. The westward journey took about three months to complete.

Wovoka told the delegation a dance should be organized that would last five days. On the last night, the dance

was to continue until the morning of the fifth day when it would end, the dancers would bathe and then return to their homes. Something momentous would eventually happen. Christ would return, the dead would be resurrected, there would be no more death and disease, and the old would become young again. The dance was supposed to be repeated every six weeks until the world was transformed. They would know the time had arrived because "the earth would shake."


It took another few months for the delegation to make the return journey to South Dakota. During the spring of 1890, news of the Ghost Dance spread among both the Indian and white residents of Pine Ridge and other reservations. Although not all Indians accepted the "new religion," many of them did. It's quite understandable because mysticism plays a large role in Native American religious practices. Furthermore, the apocalyptic element would naturally appeal to a people who were defeated and dejected. It provided hope as well as the promise of cosmic vengeance. The whites, for equally obvious reasons, were quite unenthusiastic about the new beliefs. After all, the Christ of the Ghost Dance would be returning as the lion instead of the lamb. His anger would be directed at them. Although none of the whites thought the vision would actually come to pass, it showed the Indians weren't harboring warm feelings towards their "benefactors."

The timing of the Ghost Dance could not have been worse. Relations between the whites and their charges were already strained because of corruption in the Bureau of Indian Affairs. In addition, the U.S. Government's policy towards the Indians was to assimilate them by wiping out their culture. Indian languages and religious practices were to be phased out and eventually eliminated. Native American children were to be sent off to boarding schools so they could be taught to act like white people. The nomadic Plains Indians were supposed to own land and become farmers.

One of the problems with turning the Sioux into farmers was 1890 was a terrible drought year. Wovoka had also promised the Ghost Dance would bring rain. Rain would have helped,

but the reality was that the area around the Sioux reservations wasn't particularly suited to farming anyway. Since the buffalo herds had all but disappeared by that time, hunting wasn't going to solve the problem either. It's hard to blame the Indians for turning to the new religion.

The whites were divided into two camps about how to deal with the Ghost dancers. One group felt the new

religion would fizzle after the promised apocalypse failed to occur. The best thing to do would be nothing; the movement would run its course. After all, people can't dance forever. Another group felt the Ghost Dance should be actively repressed because it was a prelude to a general uprising. Some Sioux had, after all, donned "Ghost shirts" that were supposed to make the wearers impervious to bullets. Why did anyone need a Ghost shirt if they had peaceful intentions? In any case, later events would prove the Ghost Shirts didn't work very well.

In October 1890, Dr. Daniel F. Royer arrived to assume his post as head

of the Pine Creek Agency. Typically, he didn't know much about the culture of the Sioux. The Ghost Dance filled him with apprehension. He considered the dancers to be "troublemakers" and wanted to have them relocated to other reservations. There were indeed some tense moments between the tribal police and the Ghost Dancers. On one occasion a pistol was drawn during the attempted arrest of a Sioux by the name of Little who had illegally killed a steer. Fortunately the incident ended without bloodshed, but Royer was convinced that federal troops needed to be called into the area to prevent a possible uprising. By the middle of November, the

troops arrived.

Indian Agent Daniel McLaughlin, over at Standing Rock, had also become apprehensive about the Ghost Dance. Sitting Bull had been living there since leaving Buffalo Bill's Wild West show about five years earlier. Though the Sioux leader didn't personally take part in the Ghost Dance movement, he refused to suppress it. This put him and Agent McLaughlin on a collision course. At about 5:30 a.m. on December 15, a group of nearly 40 Indian police arrived at Sitting Bull's house with a warrant for his arrest.

Sitting Bull refused to go quietly. Soon a crowd of Sioux appeared at the scene. A scuffle broke out between Sitting Bull and one of the Indian police officers named Henry Bullhead. One of the Sioux in the crowd shot Bullhead with a rifle, who then shot Sitting Bull in the chest with his revolver. Another Indian policeman, Red Tomahawk, shot Sitting Bull in the head, killing him instantly. A general melee erupted which ended in the deaths of about 16 people. Somehow, the remaining policemen held off a much larger group of infuriated Sioux until a detachment of U.S. cavalry rescued them.

After the incident with Sitting Bull, about 200 Sioux decided to leave Standing Rock in order to join up with Chief Spotted Elk, aka Bigfoot, at the Cheyenne River Indian Reservation. On December 23, Spotted Elk and his band, plus the group from Standing Rock, left Cheyenne River to join Red

Cloud at Pine Ridge. It would have been a journey of more than 200 miles in the dead of winter. During most of the trip, the U.S. Cavalry was monitoring their movements, but occasionally Spotted Elk's band eluded them.

Near Porcupine Butte, on December 28, Spotted Elk's band was intercepted by a detachment of the 7th Cavalry commanded by Major Samuel Whitside. Spotted Elk was sick, his people were cold, and they offered no resistance. The cavalrymen escorted the band to Wounded Knee Creek, about five miles away. Along the way, Whitside's troopers were reinforced by more members of the 7th Cavalry under the command of Colonel James Forsyth. The Sioux were told to make camp. The troopers, numbering about 500 by this time, surrounded the Indian encampment. Four Hotchkiss guns were trained on the encampment. Hotchkiss guns were rapid-firing light cannons that used exploding shells. So far, no violence had occurred, but the situation was like a room full of gasoline awaiting a lit match.

Early the next morning, Colonel Forsyth made the fateful and ill-considered decision to confiscate the weapons carried by Spotted Elk's group. The disarmament started peacefully, but soon degenerated into a slaughter. There are several versions of what touched it off, and I will present the one that is generally the most accepted by historians.

The Sioux sullenly gave up their weapons as the troopers moved among them. Unfortunately, a medicine man in a Ghost Shirt began urging the Indians to resist. There is some disagreement about the man's name; generally, he is known as Yellow Bird, but he has also been identified by several other names including Good Thunder, Shakes Bird, or Good for Nothing. (If ever a name was fitting, the last one takes the prize.) At any rate, Yellow Bird threw handfuls of dirt in the air as a prelude to a Ghost Dance. At first, his actions seemed comic, but elsewhere in the camp a young warrior refused to give up his gun without a struggle. According to some accounts, he was deaf and couldn't hear the instructions to give up his Winchester. He and a trooper scuffled over the rifle, and it went off.

This was all it took. During the disarmament, there were troopers positioned with their rifles trained on the camp. They began firing indiscriminately. Some of the Sioux who hadn't given up their guns at that point returned fire. A cavalry captain later recalled that he "never in [his] life saw Springfield carbines worked so industriously." Then the Hotchkiss guns began firing. Most of the shells exploded among the tipis that sheltered the old people, women, and children.

By the time it was all over, between

200 and 250 Sioux were dead. About half of them were women and children. The exact figures are hard to tally because many of the wounded crawled off into ravines to die. Furthermore, the dead were piled into a mass grave without much of an account for who was who. Spotted Elk, aka Big Foot, was one of the first casualties. His body quickly froze. The medicine man also died quickly—his Ghost Shirt failed to do its duty. According to one source, a wounded Sioux pointed out the dead shaman to a trooper and commented

that he wished he were still alive so he could stab him.

In contrast, the U.S. Cavalry lost about 30 men. Most of these were victims of “friendly fire.” Given the way the troops were deployed, it was easy for them to shoot into each other once the Indians began to drop. Because the Sioux had fired back and since the troopers sustained casualties, the incident was called “The Battle” of Wounded Knee. Twenty Medals of Honor were awarded following this glorious feat of arms. On October 25, 1990, Congress delivered an official apology for Wounded Knee. Recently, there has been a bill introduced to rescind the medals, but as of this writing, it hasn’t gotten anywhere.

Contemporary newspapers tended to view the event favorably. The New York Times ran a story under the headline “A Fight with the Hostiles—Big Foot’s Treachery Precipitates a Battle.” There were articles praising the 7th Cavalry for avenging the defeat of Custer 14 years previously. “The slaughter is on the other foot this time,” crowed the Junction City Republican.

Most of the articles criticizing Wounded Knee centered around the 7th Cavalry’s “heavy losses” and who was to blame for them. Later, as more detailed accounts emerged, there was regret at the deaths

of the women and children, but that regret was often brushed off by comments like, “This is what happens in Indian battles.” William T. Sherman’s assessment was that “in a fight [with Indians] the coolest man cannot distinguish female from male.”

Wovoka, the Paiute shaman whose vision inspired the Ghost Dance, was horrified when he learned of the disaster at Wounded Knee. He was nearly half a continent away when the tragedy occurred and had never gone anywhere near the Dakotas. He doesn’t seem to have been blamed for it and remained a prominent figure in his community. Though the Ghost Dance was a huge factor leading up to the events of December 29, 1890, most people seemed to realize that Wovoka’s intentions were anything but violent.

There were other things to think about as the 1890s unfolded. If anyone thought much about the Sioux, it was in the context of their being “civilized” at last. Their bands were broken up, their children were sent off to boarding schools to learn how to act like whites, and they were settling down to lives

of ranching and farming. Of course, the future for the Sioux wasn't exactly rosy (an understatement if ever there was one) but there were railroads to be built, inventions to create, cities to modernize, and an international American presence to establish. It wasn't until the 1970s that perceptions of Wounded Knee began to change.

THE DAY MEAT FELL FROM THE SKY

On March 3, 1876, Mary Crouch of Olympia Springs, Kentucky was making soap in her yard. It was a pleasant, sunny day. She noticed something was falling on her back and shoulders. Later, she recalled that it felt like snow or hail. It turned out it was neither snow nor hail; it was chunks of meat that measured about two by two inches in size. Some of the chunks were as big as four by four inches. Enough meat fell on the Crouch farm to cover approximately the area of a football field.

Mary's husband Allen Crouch explained the phenomenon as an omen from God. If so, it couldn't have been a favorable one. Neighbors visited the farm and a few of them tasted the meat. (Yes, this happened; I'm not kidding around.) Apparently, it was kind of gamy. It reminded the tasters of venison, mutton, or perhaps bear.

The incident received a lot of attention. A week later, an account was pub-

lished in *The New York Times*. A local expert, Harrison Gill, described the chunks and how they had covered the ground in a wide area. Enough people had visited the farm to convince readers the meat shower was no hoax.

Several hypotheses were put forward to explain the meat's origin. A scientist named Leopold Brandeis concluded that the meat was a substance called Nostoc, which is formed by *cyanobacteria*. Nostoc can become flaky when exposed to moisture. Unfortunately for this theory, it wasn't raining when the phenomenon occurred. There had to be another explanation.

One of the more outlandish theories involving the mystery meat involved an exploding planet. According to this line of reasoning, a distant planet blew up and chunks of the planet's inhabitants rained down on Earth in a literal "meat-e-ore" shower. Folks in 1876 had little understanding of the earth's atmosphere, so this seemed like a reasonable explanation among the less educated theorists.

Eventually some chunks of the stuff found on the Crouch farm were sent off for scientific evaluation. It was indeed meat, or rather lung tissue from either a horse or a human infant. This led to what is probably the most plausible explanation for the Great Kentucky Meat Shower.

Writing in the *Louisville Medical News*, Dr. L. D. Kastebine noted that

when frightened, vultures tend to vomit up their latest meals in order to lighten themselves so they can fly faster. According to the vulture theory, a large flock of vultures may have been disturbed by a predator and simultaneously disgorged the contents of their stomachs onto the Crouch farm. Mary Crouch claimed the sky was clear when the incident occurred, but the vultures could have been flying at a high altitude when they performed their group vomiting response.

I would suppose this set off another group vomit response among the folks who tasted the meat. Or maybe not—folks were rather stoic in the late 19th century. "Ah well, so what if I ingested vulture vomit? It didn't kill me. Come over here, darling, I need a kiss."

Can you imagine what would have happened if the meat shower had occurred during the Middle Ages in Europe? It would have set off specula-

tions of some horrible judgment from God. Hapless crones from miles around would have been rounded up and immolated. The reactions of the good people of Olympia Springs showed remarkable restraint. They relied on science instead of superstition. Even though science was unable to completely explain the event, people accepted the most rational conclusion and moved on.

The edifying incident of 1876 passed into obscurity until the 21st century, when an art professor at Transylvania University, Kurt Gohde, found a dusty old bottle which contained a sample of the mysterious meat submerged in liquid. By the way, Transylvania University is located near Lexington, Kentucky and has no connection with the notorious principality of Romania. The name is a Latin derivative that means “across the forest” and was the original name of a land company associated with the settlement of Kentucky. Gohde had heard of the meat shower and became fascinated by it. As an artist, Gohde explained he had a “tremendous appetite for wonder.” Out of pure luck, he found the bottle and had the contents analyzed.

The sample was too old to yield any definitive results about the origin of the substance. Undeterred, Gohde decided to send off a tiny piece to a taste lab in Cincinnati. The flavor compounds were studied. The lab was able to identify the flavor and eventually it was infused into a jellybean. Modern people can now taste what fell on the Crouch farm so long ago. The persistent professor had more than a thousand jellybeans made. He still has plenty of samples left because the taste is “vile.” Nobody has wanted to try more than one jellybean.

Well might one wonder why an article about The Great Kentucky Meat Shower has appeared in *The Cowboy Chronicle*. The event has nothing to do with gun fighting, western settlement, Indians, or political history. However, it illustrates how people of the late 19th century dealt with the unknown. They doggedly tried to find an explanation for the event and embraced the most logical conclusion. Fingers weren't pointed and blame was assigned to nobody. We still don't know exactly what happened on the Crouch farm, but the vulture vomit theory has stood the test of time.

Who knows? Maybe the meat shower was indeed a portent. After all, the Battle of Little Bighorn was only a few months away. I imagine the vultures of Montana had a veritable banquet during the aftermath.

SHOOTING FROM THE HIP

I was recently giving some thought to claims made by both Winchester and Colt regarding “The gun that won the West.” As we all know, both the Winchester model 1873 and the Colt 1873 SAA make the same claim. In my opinion, the gun that really won the west was the shotgun. The more I thought about it, the more convinced I was, so I thought I should expand on my claim.

When you research the Westward Expansion you will find it began in 1807. At that time, neither Colt nor Winchester even existed. People moving westward carried single shot flintlock muskets, rifles, and pistols. With the introduction of the percussion cap in 1839, many flintlocks were discarded or converted from flint to percussion. Rifles and pistols were very accurate but they took three or four times longer to load than a smoothbore musket or pistol. Due to the inherent inaccuracy of the smoothbore, many muskets were loaded with birdshot, buckshot, or buck and ball, making them scatterguns. At close range these scatterguns were highly effective.

With the development of the self-contained metallic cartridge, things began to change dramatically. The first of these self-contained cartridges were the .22 BB cap developed in 1845, followed by the .22 short in 1857. Larger calibers such as the .44 Henry and the .56-56 Spencer were soon to follow. However, these were rimfire cartridges, which were unable to sustain high pressures. It was not long before they were replaced by centerfire ammunition, which we still use today.

It was this ammunition that led to the development of firearms using self-contained ammunition. Prior to that there were a few percussion revolvers in production. Savage, Colt, Remington, Spencer to name just some. With the development of the self-contained cartridge came Smith and Wesson, Merwin-Hulbert, and Colt, plus a few others. Winchester went on to improve the Henry and Colt began converting cap and ball revolvers. After the Civil War, there were a few multi-



shot rifles available such as the Henry and the Spencer but most other rifles such as the Sharps, Springfield, and Remington were still single shot. It was the Winchester model 1873 and the Colt 1873 SAA that finally gave the individual real firepower. However, not everybody could afford to own a Winchester or a Colt. A new Winchester could cost an individual about \$40.00 and a new Colt would run you about \$17.00. Those prices seem low by today's standards, but when you consider the average wage in 1873 was about \$2.00 a day, it was really a pretty steep price for a gun; a price few could afford for such a luxury.

However, nearly every household had a shotgun of some sort. It may have been an old smoothbore musket,

a single barrel, or even a double barrel. These scatterguns served two purposes. They put food on the table and offered protection. But most of all they were affordable. Besides, by 1873 the westward expansion had already been in progress for 66 years, long before the Winchester repeater and the Colt Peacemaker ever came on the scene

So what happened to the scattergun? Well, it was developed right along with all the other firearms at the time. Even with the development of modern fully automatic firearms, the shotgun remains in high esteem by those who know how to use one. Historically, short barreled shotguns were carried on coaches, thus the term “coach gun” or “riding shotgun.” When riding on a fast moving, bouncing stagecoach,

it was extremely difficult to hit a pursuer with a rifle and even more difficult with a sixgun. But a shotgun with its scatter pattern increased your firepower and the ability to stop a would be bandit or at least slow him down. When the sheriff or marshal wanted the edge, he reached for the double-barreled Greener. Doc Holliday carried what he referred to as his "Street Howitzer." It was a 10-gauge double barrel sawed off to 14 inches with a pistol grip. In 1892 Ed Kelly killed Bob Ford with two blasts from a shotgun. In 1896 Heck Thomas used an L.C. Smith 12-gauge to end the life and bandit career of Bill Doolin. Billy the Kid used a 10-gauge Whitneyville shotgun to make his escape from the Lincoln County Court House. The Bloodless Outlaw, Black Bart carried a sawed-off American Gun Company 12-gauge during his hold-ups. Belle Starr was murdered by two blasts from a shotgun. One of the guns famed outlaw John Dillinger packed was a


model 1897 Winchester. John Slaughter, Sheriff of Cochise County, Arizona was known to carry a 12-gauge sawed off Remington shotgun. Bonnie Parker and Clyde Barrow carried a variety of shotguns, including a 10-gauge model 1887 Winchester in addition to 12-gauge and 20-gauge model 11 Remingtons.

The shotgun was carried in the trenches of WWI, the foxholes of WWII, the jungles of Vietnam, and even the desert sands of the Middle East. It is carried by prison guards and in police cruisers.

As the years progressed so did the scattergun. It has gone from a single barrel to a double barrel to a lever action, a pump, a semi-automatic, and finally to a fully automatic weapon capable of firing 300 rounds per minute. Can you imagine 2700 pieces of 00 Buckshot in 60 seconds? Now that is what I call fire power.

So whether it was used on the side of the law or on the side of the law-

less, the shotgun deserves a place of esteem in our history. The next time somebody asks you which gun won the west, you might tell them that Winchester gave one man the firepower of 10, Sam Colt saw to it that all men were equal, and they both deserve to be recognized as guns that helped "tame" the west. However, when it comes to "the gun that won the West," the shotgun really deserves the honor of being at the top of the list.

TEN REASONS TO TRY WILD BUNCH ACTION SHOOTING

BY BACK 40, SASS #23910L

10. MORE SHOOTING — Wild Bunch stages can go up to 50-plus rounds per stage, although that's not the normal, as most consist of 28 pistol, seven to ten rifle, and usually six shotgun.

9. VARIETY OF TARGETS — It's not out of the ordinary to see targets such as Texas Stars, dueling trees, and smaller targets, but generally standard size targets are the norm. Occasionally there is a "shoot'em all" stage that requires a lot of ammo and is very high on the fun factor.

8. SHOOTING THE ICONIC 1911 PISTOL — Yes, one of John Browning's finest inventions. You can shoot two-handed (Modern) or one-handed (Traditional). You also load seven rounds per magazine.

7. MAXIMAZING THE PISTOL ROUNDS — Normally, a stage consists of 21 to 28 pistol rounds. The stage writer may delete the rifle and have the shooter engage targets with



more pistol rounds.

6. A NEW PERSONA TO PORTRAY — Although it is perfectly acceptable to shoot Wild Bunch in Cowboy cloths, you might want to become a World War I infantry soldier or a Wild Bunch movie lookalike. There are a couple of companies that are Wild Bunch clothing friendly, www.what-priceglory.com and [\[west.com\]\(http://west.com\). Both offer excellent service. Like you really need an excuse to spend more money!](http://www.cooncreekold-</p></div><div data-bbox=)

5. COOL RIFLES IN SIDE MATCHES — Two of the most fun side matches in Wild Bunch are Teddy Roosevelt and BAMB (which stands for Bolt Action Military Match). Bold action rifles must be an original caliber bolt action issued through the end of

WWII. Iron sights only and NO external modifications. Lead bullets only and gas check are allowed. One of the most popular rifles is the Springfield 1903-A3 in .30-06. Teddy Roosevelt uses a rifle-caliber lever action or pump action manufactured before WWI. The rifle caliber must have a minimum 1.8" cartridge case length. Iron sights only, peep sights allowed.

4. COOL PISTOLS IN SIDE MATCHES — Pocket pistol side matches are relatively new to Wild Bunch. Calibers include .22, .25, .32, and .380. The pistol must fit flat in a box that measures 4-13/16" X 6-13/16". Targets are shot at not less than 10 feet.

3. STOKING THE SHOTGUN — One of the most exciting guns to shoot in Wild Bunch is the shotgun. Shooters normally load six in the magazine. When the shotgun comes up in the string of fire, it's rock and roll time. The Winchester model 1897 or model 12 are legal to use.

2. THE PEOPLE — When I say, "the people," I'm talking about individuals that walk and talk Wild Bunch Action Shooting. These folks are experts on guns, calibers, leather, and period clothing. Some to mention (but certainly not inclusive) are Elwood James (SASS #99238), Dusty Boddams (SASS #1907), Hondo Tweed (SASS #99043), Legendary Lawman (SASS #73160), and Serenity (SASS #64982). These folks are walking encyclopedias when it comes to Wild Bunch. They are always there to help new and prospective shooters.

1. BEING PART OF A GROWING SPORT — Last year, there were 148 shooters at END Of TRAIL who shot Wild Bunch. More and more states are hosting State Wild Bunch shoots. The sport is growing. This year, there were around 168 registered Wild Bunch shooters at EOT. It's an exciting time for Wild Bunch Action Shooting, come and be part of it. And that's my view from the back 40!



(cat's outta the bag). The 2022 Southwest Territorial Wild Bunch Championship was held September 9-11 at Liberty Range, which is a private CAS and Wild Bunch range located near Branson MO. Good things have been said about this match and nothing was overstated. It really is a great match. Miss Treated and I had about a nine-hour drive because we were not in a big rush but it was an easy enjoyable drive with a lot of really scenic country, especially when you get up around Branson. The Bear Creek Volunteers club is

located next to a paved road, very easy to get to. They have apparently worked long and hard on the range because it shows first class in every way. All the folks here are so pleasant and fun to be around. Instant friends! But along to the meat and taters of this story...

Friday was side match day and featured a bunch of great matches that are Wild Bunch crowd pleasers: BAMB(Bolt Action Military Match); Doughboy using the BAMB rifle, 1911, and shotgun; Teddy Roosevelt, featuring a rifle caliber lever action, 1911, and shotgun; Sgt.York, with the BAMB rifle and a 1911; Fastest rifle, pistol, shotgun.

TEXAS STATE WILD BUNCH CHAMPIONSHIP 2022

The Texas Doughboys were proud to be bestowed the duty and honor to host the Texas WB Championship again in historic Bowie, Texas sitting outside the Dallas/Ft. Worth Metroplex and home to Gunrunner Shooting Sports, where this great match was held. Uniquely suited to host a true Wild Bunch match by blending very nice and large ranges that utilize berms in front, left, and right of the shooter, with a total of five ranges at the complex, including the newly finished Wild Bunch range featuring 80 yards across and 50 yards deep with the capacity to shoot at more than 200 yards.

Designed with shooter comfort and convenience, this range has Astro turf just like on a football field, providing clean sure footing and easy brass retrieval. Friday started the day with a cup of coffee from Fox 37, a local truck that has great coffee! With the threat of showers, we wanted to get some of the weather sensitive side matches out of the way. Texas Doughboys side matches are always lots of fun and men's and women's classes are recognized in Trench Sweep, GAMM (Garand Action Military Match) and CAMM (M1 Carbine Action Military Match). Trench Sweep featured 25 targets in a dry creek bed with lots of turns. The shooter moved through the river bottom and engaged targets, reloading and moving. This side match continues to be as entertaining for the spectators as for the shooter.

Lots of fast shooters in this one but the fastest man was Elwood James and fastest lady was Miss Treated. GAMM and CAMM was used to engage Running Man; this is a commercial grade high dollar target system that has a motorized target on rails at a variable speed that covers 60 feet with a fence panel at each end for the target to hide behind. The speed can be adjusted from a slow walk to a crazy hippy stalker! The course of fire was, at the beep engage the target with the Garand for eight rounds. If you didn't get all eight shots off, the target reversed behind a wood panel and engagement was finished. The carbine match was the same, but with 10

rounds. Target distance was around 45 yards. Movement adds a whole new dimension. Getting these matches done we all took a break and enjoyed a nice lunch from a local award-winning food truck that took really good care of us the whole weekend. They had burgers on Friday, BBQ Saturday, and fried catfish with all the trimmings on Sunday. After lunch, actions included Texas 30 where the shooter has 30 seconds to engage seven dancing dots with as many rounds as possible in the allotted time. Only hits count! A rarity happened at this side match. A three-way tie for first resulting in a shoot off with increased difficulty by increasing the distance to

the targets. One winner emerged — Shell Stuffer who, along with his grandsons, came from Illinois to attend this match. POP Gun (think Colt hammerless type pistols engaging three targets rapidly). Blindingly fast and fun to shoot. Doughboy used the BAMM rifle and pistol to effect along with Teddy Roosevelt, using a rifle caliber lever or pump rifle and pistol. These two stages Featured movement along with rifle shot through a barricade off-hand at targets around 50-60 yards. BAMM featured 10 rounds from the bench at various targets placed at around 75-80 yards. On Saturday after the main match a non SASS match called PCC4ME was held. It had more than 60 targets and the competitors worked their way across the stage using modern semi automatic pistol caliber carbines with one mag change mandatory. Ruger 9mm carbines, AR9 platform carbines, Thompson carbines etc. Iron sights and red dots. This stage was a crowd pleaser and much anticipated with Doc Ter Pepper and Miss Treated taking top honors. Texas Doughboys side matches are all very well attended with more than 80 percent of match competitors participating. Saturday and Sunday each had five well-thought-out stages that challenged and thrilled the competitors. All the stages featured movement to various TEA (target engagement area), along with some requiring the shooter to use a knife or start by holding a sack of washers, etc. Due to the down range movement, most stages had a barrel that the long guns were placed into muzzle down before traveling. Most stages had a short opening line, such as “Silver Washers,” “Easy Baby,” “Where’s my Hat,” and “Hey Down Range, Pancho!” Shooters also shot through window openings and fence slat openings. A few stages allowed the shooter to reengage targets, allowing the shooter seven additional rounds to reengage misses. As typical of Wild Bunch matches, the target distance varied but all were hittable, as proven by Timmy Ringo, who shot the match clean and fast.

A big thank you to our sponsors who, through their generous donations, allowed for a great prize table, which featured certificates from Chey-Cast and items from Skinner Sights, who make the great sights (but did you know they make a really slick two gun case that’s perfect for competitors? Guns slide in from each end and are well protected).

Norm and Robin Purcella, who own Quality Cast Bullets and strongly support the Texas Doughboy state matches drove in from Roswell to meet everyone and personally helped with the drawings. These folks are the big suppliers of all the BAMM bullets. Tripp Magazines donated every WB shooter’s favorite — magazines with welded bottoms. Kirkpatrick Leather donated one of their excellent Wild Bunch rigs and came up in person to shoot the match. Turns out he not only makes great leather gear, he is also a great competitor.

Wild Bunch Action Shooting continues to get better and better. It’s got plenty of action! It’s got plenty of shooting! It’s got plenty of fun! A simple sport to compete in but a challenge to do well in. Isn’t that what a shooting match should be?

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

The Cowboy Chronicle welcomes and encourages submissions of articles and match reports from any and all readers.

Please submit articles in MS Word or something compatible. Open Office and Apple Pages (saved as MS Word) are also fine. A count of 500-800 words is a good target to shoot for, but shorter pieces are also fine. Match reports on larger events, like END of TRAIL, Winter Range, and Regional and Divisional matches may run 1000-1500 words if necessary. We will accept lengthier articles, but may choose to break them up into two or more parts to run in consecutive issues, or heavily edit them.

Please do not embed your photos in the Word document. They can be extracted for use in the *The Cowboy Chronicle*, but it can be a chore to do that. Instead, send your photos separately, in one or more emails, as attachments. Three to six photos per email usually works best. It's best to send JPEGs, but other formats are acceptable, and it's best to keep them at about 300 dpi and 3000 pixels (10 inches) on the short side. That size is

ideal and will allow us plenty of leeway when it comes to cropping and adjusting them for publication. Photos should be at least 1000 pixels on the short side to be used for publication. If you're unsure of the size of your pictures, or how to size them, send what you have and we'll adjust them and/or inform you if they're usable.

Usually, two to six photos are sufficient for an article, but we will consider using more for a "big" event, if provided. Photos need not have captions, but captions always make photos more interesting. Ideally, the caption would consist of one or two sentences that say something about the picture that is not obvious and/or is not implicit in the body of the article. "Sam making smoke" is a title but not a caption. "Sam, SASS #XXXXX, shooting his first black powder match; after much deliberation, he decided to give it a try and now he's hooked" is much better. A caption may also serve to let everyone know why the picture is worthy of being published in an international magazine.
